VALPARAISO — For nearly half a century, the Heritage Museum of Northwest Florida has been preserving local and regional history.

Situated in the heart of Valparaiso at 115 Westview Ave., the museum offers a collection of artifacts, textiles and a library archive to those curious about the history of the community.

“We are dedicated to keeping history alive

in our community,” said Kelli Knudsen, museum manager.

In addition to the museum’s educational exhibits, the Heritage Museum regularly holds festivals, custom tours, craft classes, lectures and other interactive educational programs for the public.

The museum’s next event will have been scheduled for 7 p.m. Sept. 8. “Night at the Museum: Boggy & Beyond” is a fast-paced event that will take guests on a guided group tour that combines history and theater, creating a unique food, wine and beer tasting experience with a silent auction and raffles.

Actors from Stage Crafters Community Theatre, Inc. will bring history to life by portraying individuals significant to the city of Niceville’s history.

Food from Café Bienville, Cold Creek BBQ, Corner Café and Sawadee Thai Cuisine will be catered. Guests can sample craft beer from Prop Brewery and 3rd Planet Brewing or sample a variety of red and white wines.

LAUREL HILL — You could count the number of men on one hand at the Barn at Water Oaks Farm in Laurel Hill Saturday.

The venue was filled with women “in and behind the blue line” as The Ladies of Law Enforcement held their first event under their new name.

The Ladies of Law Enforcement luncheon was catered towards women who work for law enforcement in Escambia, Santa Rosa, Okaloosa, or Walton county, and women who are married, engaged or dating an officer.

Hannah Fortune, the

director of Ladies of Law Enforcement, said she spent several months planning the luncheon that was much more than just lunch. The event featured massage therapists, nail technicians, makeovers, a photo booth, lunch, and giveaways.

Fortune did most of the planning herself, which started at the beginning of April. She spent time calling and visiting with various sponsors and collected over time items like drinks and snacks while they were on sale.

Although planning an event this size comes with stress, Fortune’s hard work is not without cause.

Fortune said she came up with the idea of a group centered around women of law

CRA holds workshop on grants

CRESTVIEW — The Community Redevelopment Agency Board of Commissioners made recommendations at the workshop meeting Monday for changes to specifics on different grants offered to developers.

Although no action was taken at the meeting, the commissioners discussed changing wording and requirements for different grants.

The list of grants included the following: mixed use residential and commercial

development, asbestos mitigation, building code compliance upgrade, commercial investor property development, and facade and building improvement.

Applications were also listed with each description of the grants.

CRA Director Alisa Burleson said the goal of these grants is to give businesses an incentive to build in downtown Crestview.

“The purpose of having these grants are to encourage something that’s not already happening downtown,” Burleson said.

Burleson used the commercial investor property

development grant as an example of this purpose. The goal of this grant is to cater to businesses that will stay open after regular business hours and on the weekends.

The funds for each grant come from what Burleson calls a “bucket.” The funds are not specific to each grant.

This workshop meeting comes after the CRA voted on Aug. 27 to form a grant review committee that will make recommendations to the board of commissioners after reviewing grant applications in their meetings. The committee nominations are expected to be announced at the next meeting in September.








COL ROBERT (BOB) D. FOWNER 1933 - 2018





LT COL RONALD M. WALKER, USAF (RET)

In central NY, west of the Catskills Mountains, Ron and Sylvia Walker welcomed their first child, Ronald, on July 22, 1940. Followed in birth by sister, Ilene, and 4 half-sisters, Marian, Barbara, Laraine, & Rosemary, he was a natural-born leader from the start.

Following graduation from high school in Girard, Ohio, Ron followed his dream of flying and joined the Air Force. Beginning his career as an Electronic Warfare Officer on the B-52 in CA, he married Doris "Dee" Jarvis in February 1963. Ron soon trained to pilot the F-105 Thunderchief and left McConnell AFB, for his first tour of Vietnam in June 1968, when his baby, Rhonda, was 4 months old. Following his safe return home, his second baby, Renee, was born at Laughlin AFB, TX. After being stationed at Nellis AFB, he returned to Vietnam in September 1972 in the F-111 Aardvark and was stationed at Takhli, Thailand. After losing a staggering number of "brothers" suppressing surface-to-air missiles, showing the Vietnamese what "aerial offensive" was all about, and successfully being extracted from Laos by the "Jolly Greens", Ron returned home to receive multiple honors and medals, including a Purple Heart. Ron then attended Air Command and Staff College while stationed at Maxwell AFB, AL, before returning to Eglin AFB, FL, where he co-founded an airport, began an aerial advertising business, and retired from the USAF as a highly decorated Lieutenant Colonel.

Ron's passion for flight and aircraft spanned more than 5 decades and included adventures such as having staring contests with large birds as he flew power lines,



flying above perilous terrains to locate downed aircraft for the Civil Air Patrol, co-founding Sunshine Aero in Crestview, FL, building airplanes in the garage that he designed as a hangar, attending fly-ins and air shows, and honoring his fellow aviators through gatherings with the Red River Valley Fighter Pilots Association.

Ron was an inventor, trainer, mechanic, RC plane enthusiast and flight instructor who enjoyed helping people, providing solutions, and making others smile and laugh. He was blessed with one grandson, Stephen Peel, two sons-in-law, Michael Moronez (Rhonda) and Rick Quesenberry (Renee), a kind and understanding wife, Judith E. Walker (deceased), and a brave wife, Meredith Brazgon Walker, who shared in his adventures as he took on fixer-upper RVs, airplanes, and "I'll get around to it" projects.

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

First downs, autumn Saturdays and Steve Earle

We got a pretty good team, good boys, strong boys; District champs the last three years.” — from “No. 29,” as performed by Steve Earle

Two years ago on an autumn Saturday I lowered my home decorating magazine and said across the room, “What’s a first down?” My husband stared in wonder and surprise. In 37 years, it was the first football-related question I had ever initiated.

We talked about basic strategies and rules. Things evolved from there, and last year we purchased tickets and attended my first major college game in decades. I actually loved it.

The finer points and nuances of the game itself are still beyond me, though I cheer for our team. The winning and losing isn’t nearly as important to me as the quality of the evening. A spectacle under the lights on a college campus feels like autumn should. Maybe it reminds me of my own collegiate years. Regardless, it’s an exhilarating and powerful experience: the sounds of pre-game and halftime band performances; the passion of the students and fans; the color and pageantry of the scene. It’s all captivating. And football means fall is around the corner.


It is typical of my timing that just when college football attendance is experiencing its first serious decline in decades I have jumped on the bandwagon. Perhaps my long association with investing has created a contrarian’s approach to fandom. Investing is an activity that, by definition, rewards those who avoid following the crowd. If you buy a security when everyone else is doing the same, frequently it has been bid up and it’s likely that you’re paying too high a price for it. This is not always the case; sometimes large numbers of investors purchase a security and it continues to increase in value. But, as the late financial journalist Louis Rukeyser once said, “Trees don’t grow to the sky.”

The trick is to locate a good company, and then buy it during a downturn, or when other investors are selling it. In this sense, a good investor must understand the value of a company, and then trust that a decline in share price is temporary.

Market dynamics are changing, but many basic investing principles still apply. Simply stated, buy a good company, one which you’ll be glad to own three to five years from now as well as today. And buy it at a fair or advantageous price. To do so, you often must have the confidence to go against the grain and buy when others are selling. Then, during the next downturn, you must have the tenacity to hold when others are bailing.

No one is above the law

The President of the United States can and should be indicted. This week, President Donald Trump’s former lawyer and trusted advisor pleaded guilty to tax fraud, false statements to a bank and campaign finance violations, and implicated the president in criminal activity.

Michael Cohen said under oath in open court that he acted “in coordination with, and at the direction of, a candidate for federal office” and “for the principal purpose of influencing the election.”

Prosecutors allege that “hush-money” payments Cohen arranged for Karen McDougal and Stormy Daniels broke the legal limit on individual donations to a political campaign and violated the law banning corporations from giving directly to a candidate.

According to Politico, candidates are permitted to make unlimited contributions to their own campaign, but that money must go through their campaign committee. Cohen facilitated the payments through an outside company, not the campaign — an unlawful act.

During the Watergate investigation, a memorandum prepared for Special Prosecutor Leon Jaworski concluded that there was no legal bar to indicting President Richard Nixon. The memorandum concluded, “As we understand it, the conclusions regarding indictment of an incumbent president reached by the Department of Justice, the

U.S. Attorney’s office, and this office, are all consistent: There is nothing in the language or legislative history of the Constitution that bars indictment of a sitting president.”

Some Constitutional experts have argued that the president should have immunity. If the president were indicted he would be burdened by pretrial matters, the preparation for trial and the commitment of weeks or months in a courtroom.

Constitutional scholar Jonathan Turley suggested in a recent Washington Post piece immunity for the president “ignores a couple practical considerations. First, it is highly unlikely that a president would be tried, let alone convicted, while in office ... Even when sentenced, appeals can take years.”

In May 1998, a distinguished constitutional scholar Ronald W. Rotunda reached the conclusion that a sitting president can be sued or indicted. According to The Atlantic, Rotunda confidentially advised then-independent counsel Kenneth Starr that President Bill Clinton could be indicted. “The U.S. Supreme Court has repeatedly reaffirmed the state(ment) that no one is ‘above the law,’” Rotunda wrote.

Starr’s team concluded that “(I)t is proper, constitutional and legal for a federal grand jury to indict a sitting president for serious criminal acts that are not part of, and are contrary to, the president’s official duties.”

Walter Dellinger, a former assistant attorney general and the head of the Office of Legal Counsel at the Department of Justice, writing for the New York Times, cited Clinton v. Jones. President Clinton had long fought to stop

a civil suit brought against him by Paula Jones. The case ultimately reached the U.S. Supreme Court. The entire court agreed that the fact that a federal court’s exercising of its constitutional power to hear a case “may significantly burden the time and attention of the chief executive is not sufficient to establish a violation of the Constitution.”

Dellinger concluded that “the mere indictment of a president would not meet the stringent standard in Clinton v. Jones for presidential immunity from ordinary legal processes.”

The argument that an indictment would be too demanding on a sitting president is further blunted by the 25th Amendment that allows a president to voluntarily transfer powers of his office to the vice-president for a limited period of time.

When asked if a sitting president can be indicted Deputy Attorney General Rod Rosenstein said. “(T)he Department of Justice has in the past, when the issue arose, opined that a sitting president cannot be indicted.”

The opinion of the Department of Justice is not precedent. The position of the DOJ can change and Rosenstein himself could change the scope of the Mueller investigation. Trump can be indicted. The question is will some prosecutor take the unprecedented action of indicting a sitting president to affirm the notion that no one is above the law?

Peppers are still plentiful into the fall

Peppers are a staple in my meal planning. From the popular bell pepper to the hot jalapeno, peppers add flavor, zest and color to make a plain dish into a culinary success.

Many garden plants are spent by now, but peppers continue to thrive in hot weather. This is especially true of the hot pepper.

After trying a variety of peppers throughout the years, I found that the jalapeno and bell continue to produce into the fall months.

So, what do you do with all those peppers? If they're still producing, you can freeze them to use for later. You can also make jelly.

One of my favorites is pepper jelly using the jalapenos. When making pepper

jelly, you need to be careful and wear gloves while preparing them as the hot peppers can irritate your skin.

Peppers are also good grilled and served on top of tacos, chili or pizza. Some are hotter than others, so it is a good idea to taste before serving to your guests to give them a warning. Jalapenos can also be pickled.

Peppers are high in Vitamin C and low in calories. Red peppers are high in Vitamin A. Store peppers in the refrigerator after washing. They should stay crisp and fresh for up to two weeks. Once cut, you should wrap in plastic wrap or store in an airtight container.

Follow these directions to freeze them for short term use in cooked food.

Hot peppers: Wash thoroughly. Freeze whole. Place in freezer bag or container.

Sweet peppers: Wash thoroughly and cut in half. Remove stems and cut into rings or chunks.

For longer term use, you should blanch for three minutes before freezing.

Mexican Cornbread with Jalapeno Peppers

1 cup yellow cornmeal mix
1/3 cup self-rising flour
2 tablespoons sugar
1 teaspoon salt
1 large egg (beaten)
1 cup buttermilk
1/2 cup vegetable oil
1 can cream-style corn
1/4 cup onion (finely chopped)
2 tablespoons bell pepper
2 tablespoons jalapeño pepper (finely chopped)
1/2 cup cheddar cheese (shredded)

Combine dry ingredients and stir together. Add the egg, buttermilk, oil, corn, onion and peppers. Add buttermilk and cheese to liquid ingredients after eggs. Place in a greased pan or iron skillet. Bake at 375 degree oven for 30 minutes.

Fish and Wildlife commission offers online boating safety exam

Access to Florida's Boater Education Temporary Certificate Program has been expanded, thanks to work done by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) to make allowances for online course providers to offer the required courses over the internet.

In August of 2017, the FWC amended Florida Administrative Code 68D-36.108 to allow the temporary certificate exam to be offered in an online version.

This change makes it easier and more convenient for both vessel operators and vessel liveries to comply with Florida's boater education laws, which require liveries to verify that customers born on or after Jan. 1, 1988, have met Florida's boating safety education requirements before allowing them to rent their vessels.

Online temporary certificate exam providers will create a system that allows 24-hour, seven-day a week accessibility to the exam using tablets, laptops, or other electronic devices. This added convenience will make it easier for both visitors and

residents by allowing them to take the test before a vacation to Florida.

Currently, one online boating safety education provider, Boat Ed, has completed the process to offer the exam online. Study or learning materials are available on the Boat Ed site to

prepare students for the exam, improve their boating knowledge and increase their chances of successfully completing the exam on the first try.

The exam costs \$3 and study materials are available for an additional charge. A link to the exam can be found at Boat-Ed.com/FloridaRental/.

Prior to this change, paper exams were the only option and were required to be completed and passed by rental vessel operators. The ability for liveries to continue to offer paper exams has not changed with the addition of this online option. Liveries can

still purchase and administer the paper exams, as long as their contract and insurance are valid.

The temporary certificate exam is a knowledge check, not a full education course. It cannot be converted into a boater safety identification card that is valid for life. Temporary certificates are not valid in any other state and do not meet boater safety education requirements in other states.

The online exam will consist of 25 questions randomly selected from a large pool of questions.

The cost for the exam will remain \$3. Upon successful completion of the exam, students will be provided an electronic proof of their achievement and their passing score. A livery will be able to inspect this proof to ensure that a prospective vessel renter has met Florida's boating safety education requirements.

The FWC encourages liveries to transition to the new online exam system to increase accessibility and streamline the testing process for renters interested in enjoying Florida's beautiful waterways by boat.

Financial Tips for Alzheimer’s Caregivers

If you are, or will be, a caregiver for elderly parents or another close family member living with Alzheimer’s disease, you may experience some emotional stress – but you also need to be aware of the financial issues involved and what actions you can take to help address them.

You will find few “off the rack” solutions for dealing with the financial challenges associated with Alzheimer’s. You’ll find it much easier to acquire durable power of attorney when the individual living with Alzheimer’s is still in the early stage of the disease and can willingly and knowingly grant you this authority.
- **Gather all necessary documents.** You’ll be in a better position to help the individual living with Alzheimer’s if you have all the important financial documents – bank statements, insurance policies, wills, Social Security payment information, deeds, etc. – in one place.
- **Get professional help.** You may want to consult with an attorney, who can advise you on establishing appropriate arrangements, such as a living trust, which provides instructions about the estate of the person for whom you’re providing care and names a trustee to hold title to property and funds for the beneficiaries. You also might want to meet with a financial advisor, who can help identify potential resources and money-saving services. And a tax professional may be able to help you find tax deductions connected to your role as caregiver.

Finally, use your experience as a caregiver to remind yourself of the importance of planning for your own needs. For example, a financial professional can suggest ways of preparing for the potentially huge costs of long-term care, such as those arising from an extended stay in a nursing home.

Caring for an individual living with Alzheimer’s has its challenges. But by taking the appropriate steps, you can reduce uncertainties – and possibly give yourself and your family members a greater sense of security and control.

changed all the batteries Jan. 1. How could they fail? Perhaps a bad battery?


Changing that battery worked.

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

Railey Connor, 17, is Baker School student. Crestview Rehabilitation Center nominated her as a Youth Florida Health Care Association Volunteer of the Year candidate and were notified that she won the award this month.

CRC Administrator Renita Infinger said FHCA represents over 82 percent of Florida's nursing homes, over 550 of Florida's 685 facilities, and Railey was chosen out of all the young adults who volunteer in member centers across the state.

In the nomination essay, Infinger stated, "Not only does she deliver Christmas gifts, but she also develops lasting relationships with many of the patients. She knows many patients by name, and she knows their hobbies, interests and life stories ... Railey helps our patients reach their full potential by getting to know our patients and by giving them something to look forward to each year."

Railey said working with nursing and rehabilitation residents has made her focus more on her studies as an

"What happens now won't necessarily matter in the future, so I kind of focus on my studies more than the whole popularity thing that a lot of people focus on in high school ... I want to focus on the big picture, because it's like you need to kind of do what's best for your future and take advantage of opportunities ... It's shaped me into the person I am today because I do spend a lot of time volunteering. It's made me more compassionate, I would say."

What started out as a charitable way to celebrate her 10th birthday in 2010 has become a way of life for Railey.

"It started because my grandmother was in a nursing home and had Alzheimer's for a number of years at that point, so we used to go to church and take her by the nursing home ... the first thing Railey wanted to do was make sure all the residents there got Christmas presents," Railey's mother, Angie Holland, said.

"It has varied from someone wanting red lipstick and red hair to wanting a thing of cheese puffs and a 12 pack of Dr. Pepper. And she makes sure that whatever they have asked for, they get that," Holland said.

Railey said the most popular requests are crosswords, word search puzzles; bingo;

large-piece puzzles suitable for young children and items with different textures for Alzheimer's patients.

"But really, they just like to see people ... if you have a day or two or three and you're willing to go out there and chill with some old people, that really means the most to them," Railey said.

Report: small football practice changes can reduce head impacts

GAINESVILLE — Shortening the time spent on the highest-risk football drills could reduce the equivalent of nearly a year's worth of head impacts over the course of a typical player's career, University of Florida Health researchers have found. The findings were published recently in the *Annals of Biomedical Engineering* journal.

Using helmet-mounted sensors, the researchers recorded more than 32,000 impacts during Gator football practices and scrimmages in 2016 and 2017. Researchers estimated that shortening time spent on the higher-risk drills by a total of 15 minutes could help players — especially linemen — avoid about 1,000 head impacts during their four-year college careers.

They identified three drills as the source for about 80 percent of the highest impact rates, according to James Clugston, M.D., a UF associate professor of medicine and a UF Athletic Association team physician. They are: "team run," a scripted running play

from scrimmage; "move the field," a scenario that spots the ball at different points on the field; and "team," a series of full-contact, scripted offensive plays.

Reducing the time spent on those three drills by as few as three or four minutes per practice could significantly reduce head impacts, the researchers concluded. Overall, a different practice routine involving those three drills could reduce the equivalent of nearly a year's worth of head impacts over the course of a typical player's career, Clugston said.

The research team, which also included UF Health neurology, neuropsychology and physiology experts, wanted to know if certain football drills had higher rates of head impacts.

"We thought we could design a better, safer football practice with minor adjustments instead of major changes such as converting an entire full-contact practice to a non-contact practice," Clugston said.

To establish their findings, they fitted players' helmets

with six spring-mounted accelerometers to measure head impacts. Research assistants helped to log all of the players' specific drills during the 2016 and 2017 training camps and practices.

Linemen had the highest impact rates during the study, which included spring, August training camp and regular season practices. Researchers found minor adjustments to the time spent on drills with high impact rates or live scrimmages would reduce the impacts by almost 1,000 for linemen and 300 for other positions during their college careers.

Clugston concedes shorter practices aren't very likely to happen in a highly competitive college football environment. However, once a coach knows which drills were the highest risk, substituting time spent on those with lower-risk drills could reduce the exposure.

While there are differences in the way college teams conduct practices compared with high school and youth football teams, Clugston said the findings also have potential use for younger athletes.



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

We can use tidal energy in some places instead of burning coal and oil that contribute to global warming. Tidal generators (or turbines) work like wind turbines, except it is ocean currents, not wind, that turn them. The spinning turbine is connected to another device that produces electricity. The electricity then travels through wires to a city where people need it. Unlike the wind, the tides are very predictable. So it's easy to decide where to put tidal turbines and figure out how much energy they will generate.

Colt Drive problem worsens for residents

CRESTVIEW — Residents continue to plead for something to be done about Colt Drive — the only road from Stallion Drive to U.S. Hwy 90.

About 500 feet of the dirt road has large, deep potholes.

For resident Sabrina Gregg, Colt Drive's disrepair has complicated school mornings. The school bus that once traveled to Stallion Drive now stops at the corner of Colt Drive and Hibiscus Avenue, which means Gregg must maneuver her way around the holes on Colt Drive to drop her son off at the bus, adding about 20 minutes to their mornings. Colt Drive has become increasingly worse, according to some long-term residents. Cherish Weeks has lived on Colt Drive since 2009 and says the road is in the worst shape she's seen in four years.

She said the road has damaged her car, and her truck is unusable after repeatedly driving the road. "I understand we get the rain, but this is a little bit ridiculous," Weeks said. "This is making it so that if an ambulance needs to come in, they can't."

Residents also worry the problem could potentially be a life-or-death issue. "Heaven forbid a young infant or a toddler gets out here and falls into one of these puddles," Stallion Drive resident Scott Beal said. "I'm just telling you, they'd drown, and who's going to be responsible for it? The county? They said they're not

Committee members would be expected to fulfill a commitment of up to three years.

The purpose of the committee is to make recommendations to the CRA board after reviewing grant applications in their public meetings.

"Once we get the criteria set up for the four or five different grants that are available through the master plan, this committee will be the first line of defense for anybody that wants to apply

for the grants," Roy said at the Aug. 13 meeting.

Roy also said members of the grant review board can apply for grants but will not be allowed to vote for their own grants.

Council President J.B. Whitten said in the Aug. 13 meeting that members of the committee including the CRA director would not be permitted to speak with any of the CRA commissioners about the grant meetings.

Some CRA board members had mixed opinions on the committee.

2 new lawsuits target doctor

CRESTVIEW — A sixth and seventh lawsuit alleging sexual misconduct against a patient have been filed against Crestview gastroenterologist Dr. Khalid Moussa.

Attorney Gillis Powell of the Powell Powell & Powell law firm confirmed he filed the two new cases Tuesday. Gillis Powell is the brother of Dixie Dan Powell, who on May 18 filed sexual misconduct lawsuits against Moussa on behalf of five women.

women have identified themselves as victims of Moussa's alleged inappropriate groping. All the lawsuits filed thus far also name Moussa's employer, North Okaloosa Clinic Corp., which does business in Crestview as North Okaloosa Physician Group, as a defendant.

The allegations laid out in the latest

complaints mimic those of the previous five. A woman states she was alone in Moussa's office when he abruptly entered, began giving orders and, with little pretense, removed articles of clothing and touched the victim inappropriately.

One of the women in the latest court filing states she visited Moussa's office twice and was molested both times. Her second visit was a follow-up appointment after a colonoscopy during which the complaint claims Moussa fondled her breasts on the pretext of checking for pneumonia.

Moussa remains under investigation by the Crestview Police Department, but no charges have been filed against him.

"The investigation into Dr. Moussa is still ongoing, with nothing we can say as yet," said Police Department spokesman Brian

Hughes.

Moussa's license remains clear and active, according to the Florida Department of Health.

All the lawsuits seek a judgment against the defendants and compensation for damages.

Okaloosa County Circuit Judge Terrance Ketchel has issued a gag order limiting what those associated with the case can say to the news media.

responsible."

According to a parcel search on the Okaloosa County website, the county owns land on the east side of Colt Drive. Okaloosa County Public Works Director Jason Autrey said the county does not own the road but the right-of-way.

"It was never an opened or county-maintained road," Autrey said.

Residents of Eagle and Falcon Way – less than 1,000 feet from the front of Colt Drive – were in a similar situation and set up a Municipal Service Benefit Units fund, which allows residents to have a county-maintained road by requiring them to pay for road improvements. The charge would be similar to an HOA fee.

Autrey said there are specific requirements that have to be met before the county would accept responsibility for maintaining the road. The road would have to be brought to "county standards." Autrey said a paved roadway is the preferred option.

Mare Creek Farms Homeowners Association President Mike Banks said he presented the option of a MSBU to residents at a meeting two years ago, but no one wanted to pay the extra money at the time.

"I don't know if I have a solution other than money," Banks said.

The Field of Valor will display 360 flags in perfect columns and rows at the north end of the grounds. On each flag a tag will be attached with information on the service member — name, rank, hometown, branch of

service, and date of death.

The flags are arranged alphabetically and there will be an information table with volunteers available to answer questions and direct visitors around the field. There is no charge to the public who come to visit our Florida heroes and pay their respects.

The opening ceremony includes an Honor Guard, speakers representing The Fisher House, military and civilian community, and a National Exchange Club representative. Florida Rep. Matt Gaetz is key speaker.

Crestview-based company addresses security threats

CRESTVIEW — Guards, threat assessments and concealed-carry weapons training are among security services Trei McMullen offers at SYOTOS, LLC.

He and a staff of 10 have clients including the Destin Yacht Club; Brotula, a restaurant; and most recently the Emerald Coast Convention Center.

McMullen was a counter-intelligence special agent in the U.S. Army, and medically retired in 2013 after 10 years with the 7th Special Forces. He started SYOTOS as a military contractor overseas. He began running it from his home in 2017.

“SYOTOS stands for ‘See You on the Other Side,’” the Crestview resident said. “It’s a company that I dedicated to all my brothers and sisters that I’ve lost in this battle against terrorism.”

SYOTOS also takes on insider threats and vulnerability issues a client may experience. He said criminals may gain access to sensitive company information by connecting with company employees on a social level.

“People may target them in online dating or Facebook or something like that. They need to be aware of these type of things so that they can kind

of prevent themselves from falling into a situation where they’re wrapped up in a trial because they didn’t even know that a person was using them until it was too late,” McMullen said.

SYOTOS helped a Destin client end theft and trespassing issues by improving security measures.

“This place was super secure. They had cameras. Every door has a locked code, and somebody still broke into their (business),” McMullen said.

He said companies and high-net-worth individuals who need executive protection should consider their security efforts before they even break ground on a home or business.

“If you had the idea, think

about security. A lot of people will get cameras or an alarm ... and that’s great, but who’s reviewing that 24 hours of footage?” he said.

“So you actually don’t know if anything happened or not. You just know you have cameras, and since you don’t see anything missing,

you didn’t know it. “But really, there was a whole group of people that came up and have been casing your business for the last two weeks every day.

“Plus ... violence is kind of going up. Believe it or not. There’s been a lot of more ... terrorist-like attacks, and this area is not (immune). So I would rather them be more prepared, and it never happen, than be unprepared, and something happens,” McMullen said.

McMullen is writing a book, available by the fall of 2018 called “Taking the Hard Rights,” about his life experiences and his advice for people undergoing some of the same things he has.

He and his wife, Lesby, have two children.
