Crestview student charged with making school threat

CRESTVIEW — A 15-year old Crestview High School student has been charged with writing or sending a threat to kill or injure, according to a news release from the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office.

A school resource officer was notified Monday that a girl had received threatening text messages from a freshman

boy at the school. He wrote how law officers had been at his home a few nights before because it was believed he was going to kill or hurt someone.

He also stated, "Every 1 is always making me getting to the point of where I'm gonna end killing sum1 or shooting up the school," according to the release.

The student also allegedly made several additional

comments referencing death.

He later admitted to sending the messages but said he did not really plan to shoot anyone. He said he was feeling depressed at the time, the release said.

The girl said the threats made her fear for her safety and the safety of others.

Sheriff Larry Ashley stressed that the Sheriff's Office has zero tolerance for

threats of school violence.

A similar situation occurred at Crestview High in May when a 14-year-old student threatened to "shoot up" the school. Two classmates heard him discussing his plan in the lunchroom.

The student pulled out a bullet and placed it on the lunchroom table. School administrators later found a 9 mm bullet in his pants pocket.

He told the school resource officer he had "been under a lot of stress" and did not have access to firearms.

\$400,000 in stolen coins unearthed

CRESTVIEW — Okaloosa County sheriff's investigators think they not only solved the mystery of who stole \$400,000 worth of silver coins from a safe at

a home, but also recovered most of the money.



Barnes

Stephen Aaron Barnes, 37, of Destin was charged last Thursday

with grand theft of more than \$100,000, according to a news release from the Sheriff's Office.

Investigators say Barnes took the coins from a safe at his mother's home on Lake Ella Road northeast of Crestview and buried them in three locations on the property.

The money reportedly belonged to Barnes' stepfather and was to be part of his divorce settlement with Barnes' mother, the release said. But when Barnes' stepfather went to retrieve the money Aug. 30, he was unable to get into the safe and had to call a locksmith, the release said.


CLARKE COE BELL


RICHARD A. 'DICK' BRIER 1930 - 2018



Simply talking about abortion is like walking through a minefield.

On social media, abortion is nothing less than radioactive.

Supporters of abortion are all about women’s right to choose or “Pro Choice.” They say it’s their body and they have the right to do as they please. Any talk to the contrary will ignite screams of anger about men or government wanting to dominate or control women and their bodies.

But that is just the beginning, supporters will parade in protest as walking vaginas and claim loudly that if you don’t have a uterus, you don’t get to vote.

Men are accused of everything from demeaning verbal assaults to enabling a practice of physically assaulting women and get a pass.

Those who call themselves “Pro Life,” are equally adamant that abortion is nothing less than murder. They believe all abortions must stop to protect the sanctity of life. Much of this is driven by religious and moral beliefs that says killing perfectly healthy unborn babies is not only wrong, but criminal.

Now consider these staggering facts: The CDC reports over the past decade legal abortions have been declining from over 1,200,000 to as low as 600,000 (plus thousands not reported or illegal) done each year in America and we are 10th in the world of all nations in the numbers of legal abortions.

The places with the highest percentage of abortions are Washington D.C., New York and New Jersey.

More facts from the CDC and Guttmacher Institute: in 2014, 19 percent of all pregnancies ended in abortion (not counting natural miscarriages) and unmarried women accounted for 86 percent of all abortions; White patients accounted for 39 percent, Black for 28 percent and Hispanic for 25 percent.

One in five women will have an abortion by age 30; one in four by age 45.

The more you dive into the full dimension of the abortion problem, it gets very complicated. There is simply no easy answer and the best we have is the famous Supreme Court decision on Roe v. Wade.

The decision “established a woman’s right to have an abortion without undue restrictive interference from the government. The Court held that a woman’s right to decide for herself to bring or not bring a pregnancy to term is guaranteed under the 14th Amendment.”

While polls show almost two thirds of Americans support this decision, there is fear that at some point the Supreme Court will reverse this decision. It may not be considered “settled law”; that is, abortion is unresolved and is still subject to legal dispute.

The case against Amendment 4 on felon voting rights

Florida leads the nation with over 1 million citizens disenfranchised and unable to vote due to felony convictions. The path to having their voting rights restored is long and difficult, and has been found unconstitutional by a federal judge. This November, Floridians who are able to vote will determine whether convicted felons who have completed their sentences, including parole or probation, will automatically have their voting rights restored. With two glaring exceptions: those convicted of murder or a sex offense.

The problem with Amendment 4 is that it perpetuates the discrimination and bigotry of disenfranchisement against a subclass of ex-felons – those convicted of murder or sex crimes. All the talk of Amendment 4 being about second chances, redemption and reintegration into the community rings hollow and opportunistic when it excludes certain former prisoners from the franchise. No other state constitution, according to The Sentencing Project, singles out citizens by conviction offense with respect to restoration of voting rights.

Around the country, organizations led by former prisoners have made “All of us or none” a rallying cry against this very type of discrimination which seeks to divide and exclude. At a very base level, Amendment 4 pits

members of an impoverished and oppressed community against one another.

Nowhere in the history of the American franchise has extending the right to vote been conditioned upon depriving voting rights to another group of people. When Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. advocated for civil rights for Black Americans, he did so for all Black Americans, not just some and, more importantly, not at the expense of Latino Americans, Native Americans or Asian Americans. When suffragettes fought for voting rights for women, they did so for all women, not just some. Most recently, the struggle for marriage equality by the LGBTQ community did not seek marriage rights for only certain LGBTQ people; they sought it for everyone and not at the expense of any other group.

In these examples, those who worked to expand the rights of their community did not take the low road of excluding certain people or doing so at someone else’s expense for political expediency.

The proponents of Amendment 4 are spending well over \$15 million to get the measure on the ballot. But the most important voting has already taken place: by the people who decided to exclude murderers and sex offenders. With no sense of irony, the hundreds of corrupt Florida government officials who have been convicted for taking bribes and otherwise selling out their public offices will see their voting rights restored, as would anyone convicted of voter fraud or campaign finance violations. But sex offenders and murderers who have completed their sentences and are rehabilitated, productive

taxpaying citizens would not.

If Amendment 4 passes it will enshrine into our state constitution discrimination against convicted murderers and sex offenders that will make enfranchising them virtually impossible.

While some may point to the serious nature of their offenses, they have nothing to do with voting; the punishment of disenfranchisement does not fit the crime.

I was convicted of murder in Washington State in 1987 for killing a drug dealer during an armed robbery. In 1990, while serving a 25-year sentence, I started a nonprofit magazine from my prison cell which today, 28 years later, employs 18 people to advocate for just, humane and fair criminal justice policies. I pay taxes, work to improve my community and am a productive member of society. But the backers of Amendment 4 would deny me the right to vote.

Do you think Dr. King would approve of Amendment 4? I don’t, because you can’t fight discrimination and bigotry by perpetuating it. I encourage Florida voters to vote against this ballot initiative.





After the safe was opened, he found the coins and a rifle missing. He told investigators he had last seen the items during a visit in November 2017.

He also said his estranged wife was to receive the coins or be given a check for what they were worth, the release said. Barnes' mother told deputies she did not know what happened to the money.

Barnes was developed as a suspect and later confessed to taking the coins, according to the news release.

He allegedly said he was mad at his stepfather for the suffering he had caused his mother during the couple's on-going divorce proceedings. He said he buried the coins in three spots on the property, according to the release.

Investigators dug up nearly all the boxes of \$1 silver coins Sept. 20. The investigation is ongoing.



Crestview celebrates a Holliday holiday

CRESTVIEW — There was a party going on in Warriors Hall midday Saturday, and had the guest of honor been there, he would've been 167 years old.

That didn't stop Crestview dentist, Dr. Richie Thomas, and his friends from throwing a public wing-ding to honor Dr. John "Doc" Holliday.

Doc Holliday, portrayed in the western film "Tombstone" by Val Kilmer, is forever associated with the Oct. 26, 1881, gunfight at the OK Corral.

There, the Wild West dentist joined the Earp brothers who, at a distance estimated to be about 6 feet, and under a fusillade of more than 30 shots, vanquished five lawless cowboys.

Doc Holliday survived, only to die a few years later of tuberculosis.

There were no gunshots exchanged in Warriors Hall at Saturday's event, but plenty of weaponry was on display including vintage 1880s guns that contrasted with a Crestview Police Department SWAT team exhibit of modern tools.

Similarly, a late 19th-century doctor's buggy, part of Thomas' extensive collection of American western memorabilia, looked small when compared with the Crestview Police Department's rescue vehicle, which was displayed outside of

Warriors Hall.

Artifacts also included Doc Holliday's dental chair, a locally famous museum piece displayed in a small Doc Holliday museum Dr. Thomas created in his Family Dentistry practice.

Doc Holliday's reputation as an 1880s gambler was observed with a display of vintage gambling equipment.

Newspapers from Tombstone, Az., and displays by regional historic organizations including the Baker Block Museum and the Crestview Historic Preservation Board were likewise prominent.


Several of Doc Holliday's descendants visited Crestview for the occasion, much to the delight of history buff and Civil War re-enactor Rollin Cluff, a University of West Florida student.

"It was cool to shake his hand," Rollin said after meeting Doc Holliday descendant Lynn Thomas. "I enjoyed meeting him and hearing his stories about Doc Holliday."

A display of cool vintage cars arrayed under the trees in Spanish Trail Park, a complimentary buffet and live music by the North Okaloosa Community Band — which debuted its arrangement of a medley of western film themes — and a jazz trio featuring Dr. Thomas, Professor Dennis Mitchell and Dick Reinlie completed this year's Doc Holliday holiday in Crestview.
