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'Strong faith is the greatest hope'

Crestview resident's essay published in Chicken Soup for the Soul

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CRESTVIEW — For over 20 years, Chicken Soup for the Soul books have lined bookstore shelves, with over 200 editions to date. Each edition highlights 101 inspirational stories submitted by ordinary people.

Works by Crestview resident Mary Beth Sturgis have been published twice in Chicken Soup for the Soul, with her latest submission available in the edition titled, "The Best Advice I Ever Heard."

Sturgis' personal essay, called "Exit Forward,"

highlights her experience coping with a failing marriage.

A nurse who retired after 40 years, she writes about the moment a friend encouraged her to seek therapy after anxiety about the divorce led to an outburst of emotions during a work meeting.

"I couldn't keep doing what I was doing," Sturgis said.

Sturgis came in contact with a therapist she trusted and actively sought help.

In the essay, she writes about the different techniques her therapist used.

In one session, her therapist gave her a difficult homework assignment — write a letter to her late father with an explanation about the divorce.

Though Sturgis faced trying moments, the essay ends on a positive note with lessons she values to this day.

"It's important to get the message out that when you need help: 1. Ask for it. 2. Listen to your friends that say you need to get help," the Crestview author said.


Sturgis said this moment in her life encouraged her to "reconnect with God."

"God was watching out for me and I didn't even know it," she said.

By acknowledging and expressing her emotions through therapy, she learned to remain optimistic about the future.

"There's always hope no matter that happens in life," Sturgis said. "...Strong faith is the greatest hope."

Today, Sturgis said she is happily remarried to her husband, Ed. She enjoys spending with family and gardening with her husband.

'This could've been Crestview'

Officials to have Crestview buildings evaluated for storm hardening

CRESTVIEW — An Oct. 31 tour of Hurricane Michael's destruction through hard-hit communities emphasized to Crestview officials how fortunate their community was when the storm veered east.

As a result of the tour, the City Council agreed at its Nov. 5 meeting to begin evaluating the storm readiness of Crestview municipal buildings. The city will have a structural engineer evaluate the buildings and proceed

from there, according to a statement by Mayor David Cadle.

Police Chief Jamie Grant, Cadle, council members Joe Blocker and Bill Cox, and Fire Marshal Rodney Lancaster visited devastated neighborhoods in Parker, Springfield, Calloway and Lynn Haven. Residential streets were lined with cut-up downed trees, limbs, and debris from smashed homes. Houses were covered in blue tarps.

From its windows, Bay Medical Sacred Heart Hospital in Lynn Haven dripped

giant, multi-colored ducts that pumped cool air from portable air conditioners into the facility, but what struck the officials most was the amount of damage to metal public buildings including firehouses, police stations, churches, stores and community centers.

Many of Crestview's public buildings employ the same inexpensive but storm-vulnerable construction, including the Whitehurst Municipal Building that houses

Deputy forced off road by alleged drunken driver

CRESTVIEW — A Baker woman was arrested Saturday on charges of DUI and child neglect after she allegedly forced an Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office deputy to drive off the road to avoid a head-on collision.

The OCSO supervisor was driving west on Airport Road near the intersection with Wayne Rogers Road around 4:30 p.m. Saturday when a green pickup truck heading in the opposite direction crossed over into his lane, Sheriff's Office officials said in a report.

The deputy went off the roadway but says the other driver took no action to avoid a crash, instead continuing eastbound in the westbound lane for a short

distance before getting over.

When the deputy conducted a traffic stop, he could smell alcohol and noticed the driver, 32-year-old Felicia Freeman, appeared impaired. Freeman later provided a breath sample indicating a blood alcohol level of 0.15, nearly twice the legal limit, officials said.

They said two juveniles were in Freeman's truck. One of the juveniles was an unbuckled 7-year-old who was riding in a folding lawn chair between the front passenger seat and driver's seat, according to the report.

She also helped her husband with his garden, blanching and freezing vegetables all summer. They enjoyed fishing for redfish together in their little boat under the Destin bridge. Carol sang silly songs to the fish to make them bite, and it often brought in a big catch! She was truly a blessing from God to her family.

Harry and Carol later joined Mary Esther United Methodist Church, where Carol became treasurer and then president of the United Methodist Women's group. She developed a heart for the homeless and spearheaded the Cold Night Shelter program at Mary Esther UMC, obtaining a state grant, and organizing supplies and volunteers, so that the church could care for the homeless weekly on Monday nights, when the temperature dropped below 40 degrees. She often said the Lord led her every step of the way during this process.

Carol was one of the original members of a bunco group that started November 6, 2001 and met monthly at the American Legion; she often spoke fondly of enjoying good times with these special ladies.

Carol was known by many names: Mom, Grandma, Nana, Aunt



Cow, and Aunt Carol, but they all meant the same thing to her family and friends: unconditional love. That is her legacy.





Okaloosa honors Vietnam veterans

SHALIMAR — "God, I feel ..."

The three words spoken by the Rev. Clint Akins, a local minister and Vietnam veteran, hung briefly in the Okaloosa County Commission chambers before, slowly, some of the more than three dozen Vietnam vets in the room answered his invitation to finish the sentence.

"Pain," said one voice.

"Loss," intoned another.

"Comfort," added one veteran.

"Proud," said yet another.

"Lord, will you ...," Akins continued.

"Forgive me," responded one veteran.

"Stand by me," said another.

"Strengthen me," a third said.

Akins was the featured speaker for a Veterans Day event organized by Okaloosa County Tax Collector Ben Anderson's office as part of the ongoing national observance of the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War. Akins centered his remarks on Psalms 13, which opens with the words, "How long, Lord? Will you forget me forever?"

Noting the confused and sometimes angry reactions of the American public to the Vietnam War, Akins reminded his fellow veterans, "We never heard 'Thank you for your service.' 'Instead, he said, many returning Vietnam veterans experienced 'cold indifference or outright rage.'"

Then, after pausing for a beat, Akins added, "Thank you for your service."

Anderson also spoke about America's reaction to Vietnam.

"We in this community, how well we know the rigors of the Vietnam War," he told the room filled with veterans and a number of local officials.

"Today, I think we see a greater understanding of the role of our military."

American involvement in Vietnam began in 1955 and ended in 1975. In 2008, federal legislation called for a commemoration of the war and its veterans. A subsequent presidential proclamation set the observance for the 13 years between Memorial Day 2012 and Veterans Day 2025.

At Friday's ceremony, each veteran received a copy of a proclamation signed last year by President Donald Trump calling upon Americans "to offer each of our Vietnam veterans and their families a

thank you on behalf of the nation ..."

The veterans also were presented with a pin commemorating the 50th anniversary of the war. The state of Florida is a partner in the national observance, and recently sent commemorative pins to local governments for distribution.

The pins and proclamations were presented to the veterans by two of their fellow Vietnam veterans — retired Air Force Lt. Gen. Bruce L. Fister, whose career included service as a transport aircraft pilot in Vietnam, and retired Air Force Col. Howard J. Hill, who spent more than five

years as a POW after he was shot down in 1967.

After receiving his pin and proclamation Friday, veteran Rick Taylor, who flew helicopters in Vietnam, said he had "mixed emotions" about the ceremony. But, "It's an honor to be part of it," he added.

Charles Bowles, an Army veteran, briefly referenced the time it has taken many Americans to appreciate those who served in Vietnam.

"I guess the American people had some reason to delay," he said before adding that he was honored to be at the ceremony.

George Engler, an Army veteran who served in Vietnam in 1967-68, spent a moment Friday remembering the Choctawhatchee High School classmates lost in the war.

"I think there were two or three of them," Engler said. And because he lived in a military community, he said he didn't experience the rejection that other veterans did when they returned home.

"Since I'm from here, the transition to the civilian world was a lot easier," he said.

the police department.

During Michael's sideswipe, gusts that reached 50 miles per hour made the Whitehurst Building's metal panels shudder in the wind and its vehicle bay door flexed and rattled, often alarmingly.

A stronger strike on the building could've not only injured or killed first responders sheltering inside, but could also have confounded upcoming, ongoing and previous court cases and records been compromised, damaged or blown away.

"It's secure protection for communications, evidence, records and a place to shelter police officers and firefighters if a storm approaches" that is needed, Grant said as the inspection tour stopped in Springfield. There, the town's firefighters sought shelter in equipment lockers aboard a new firetruck as the hurricane peeled parts off their new fire station.

The week after the storm, during the CPD's first delivery of needed supplies for affected law enforcement agencies,

Grant saw how perilous Crestview's situation could've been.

Meeting with Parker Police Chief Dennes Hutto, the officials heard harrowing stories of trying to re-establish basic services and communications in a community that was so devastated that some streets were unrecognizable even to police officers who routinely patrolled them. Since the storm, the Parker police officials set up a command center in the town's firehouse, which had recently been storm strengthened through a federal grant.

Even with the reinforcement, "when the wind blew, the walls of that building were bowing out like bellows," Chief Hutto said.

Blocker, whose professional career had been in construction supervision, understands the structural and engineering challenges the devastated communities face, and their lesson to address the storm-readiness of Crestview's public infrastructure.

"I can only imagine if it (the storm) had hit us," he said. "We were sure blessed. From what I saw, we need to start looking at our own buildings. Not later but now."



Boyles: Okaloosa was unprepared

While Okaloosa County escaped mostly unharmed from Hurricane Michael, District 3 County Commissioner Nathan Boyles says the county must do better to fortify facilities that house first responders and equipment.

Preparing for the Category 4 hurricane “was good practice for our emergency response apparatus but truth be told, we were unprepared,” Boyles said in his latest newsletter on Friday. “While you can’t be fully prepared for a storm like that, I do believe we can do better.”

He said county emergency management officials are reviewing the storm preparations they made as Michael approached. But the county also needs to have some serious conversations on the resiliency of various county-owned facilities and infrastructure, Boyles said.

“One clear example is our patchwork quilt of volunteer fire departments that are the effective first responders to large areas of north Okaloosa County,” said Boyles, whose district includes a part of Crestview. “Most

departments work out of light duty metal buildings built to older and less stringent standards, buildings that would likely not have survived a direct hit from Michael,

damaging the vehicles sheltered inside and effectively crippling our first line of emergency response.”

He has similar concerns for some Sheriff’s Office and

EMS facilities in both the north and south parts of the county.

Before the next hurricane season starts June 1, Boyles said he hopes “to push for

a thorough review of what additional steps we can take as a county to be resilient and prepared to help ourselves in

8 money-saving tips many homeowners overlook

Reader Question: Do you have a list of things that homeowners tend to forget in caring for their home where they could save money?

Monty's Answer: Your question inspired the production of a list based upon my experiences of owning a home. Full disclosure: You asked someone whose wife rolled her eyes when she caught me rationing toothpaste. A little dab'll do ya! Using a magic marker to date light bulb installations lit her up, too — will it last 5,000 hours?

Improve safety and save cash

Unplug appliances when not in use. As children

leave for school, people take vacations or leave a vacation home, some will use their internet service provider's vacation mode service or return a set-top box, but not unplug the TV or other electronic devices. Many devices keep drawing power. Disconnecting them also reduces the chance of fire.

Invest in window shades. Shades prevent the sun from fading a variety of materials. The sun is hard on carpeting, fabric on couches, drapes, chairs, bedspreads, wood furniture and more. Counterpoint: Some people believe leaving shades open during the day discourages intruders. Shades also act as an insulator to reduce energy costs year round.

Water conservation can reduce your municipal water bill. According to the Alliance for Water Efficiency, the average shower is 8.2 minutes and consumes 17.2

gallons of water. Get wet and warm then shut off the water and wash your hair. Turn the shower on again to rinse. Then repeat to scrub your body. In a four-person household bathing daily, the savings can be significant.

DIY projects to avoid. Some of us are adept with DIY projects, but there are projects that all but the most talented should avoid. DIY kitchen cabinet refinishing, followed closely by pouring and finishing concrete flatwork top the list. Do-it-yourself TV makes these tasks appear easy. Practice on someone else's house before your own. A miss on these projects affects future market value.

Painting tips. Mop boards in the hallway should have different paint than a bedroom ceiling. Paint ingredients vary, which makes them more expensive to obtain specific results. Some paint is washable, some are not. There are

different types of paint finishes and some work better in a bathroom or kitchen than others. Paint is the most visible component in your home. Understanding these variables makes a remarkable difference in how long it holds a sheen.

Filters. Change the air filters regularly. Please don't wait till you can't see the light come through to change them. The furnace will operate more efficiently, and dust will be slow to accumulate. Anecdotally, several service techs have suggested the lower cost filters are sufficient for the task. Humidifiers and dehumidifiers have filters, as do some refrigerators, so do not forget them.

Fire prevention. Remember to recharge your fire extinguishers. Replace the batteries in your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms simultaneously. Fires are expensive and can be deadly. Statistics from

the Chimney Safety Institute of America at <https://www.csa.org/statistics.html> suggest about 22,300 chimney fires occur annually. If you use a wood-burning fireplace regularly check the flue each year or hire a chimney sweep.

Appliance use. Do not use the dishwasher heat-dry cycle. Open the door and air dry. Dry your clothes to damp dry and hang them on hangers. Washing machines wear out blue jeans. Instead, spot-clean them, seal in a plastic bag and freeze them for two days. These tricks save water, wear and tear and energy.

Criminal justice reform big winner on election day

The big election night winner was criminal justice reform. Ballot initiatives focused on softening the impact of crime and punishment were successful in blue and red states.

Florida voters approved Amendment 4, which restores voting rights for people who have completed their sentences after being convicted of a felony, excluding those convicted of murder or certain sex offenses.

Could those potential voters have had an impact on the very competitive Governor and U.S. Senate races in Florida?

Marijuana advocates scored a number of substantial ballot victories, and Michigan became the 10th state in the nation to approve recreational use of marijuana. Now nearly 80 million Americans, 1/4 of the U.S., live in a state or jurisdiction that has legalized recreational marijuana. Medical marijuana was also approved in Missouri and Utah.

Not all news was good for marijuana advocates. North Dakota voters overwhelmingly rejected an initiative that would have legalized marijuana without setting possession limits or regulatory structure.

Ohio voters rejected an initiative that would have lessened the severity of some drug offenses.

An initiative in Washington will make it less difficult for prosecutors to pursue police officers who unlawfully use deadly force. Initiative 940 means that prosecutors will no longer have to prove law enforcement officers acted with "evil intent" or "malice" when considering whether to file criminal charges such as manslaughter.

Abraham Lincoln once said, "The ballot is stronger than the bullet." Colorado wasn't on Lincoln's mind when he said that, but on election day — more than 150 years after the ratification of the 13th Amendment — Colorado voters officially abolished slavery. The state will no longer permit prisoners to do slave labor, The Associated Press reported.

A constitutional amendment to end non-unanimous jury verdicts in Louisiana was approved by voters. The less-than-unanimous verdict was rooted in the state's ardent racism that intensified after the Civil War and during the Jim Crow era.

Voters in Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Nevada, North Carolina and Oklahoma approved a ballot measure known as Marsy's Law — the so-called crime victim's bill of rights. It aims to ensure that victims and their family members are informed about all criminal proceedings, present and heard, and protected from the accused.

Finally, in the wake of the GOP's election day loss of the House, President Trump asked his embattled Attorney General Jeff Sessions to resign. He agreed, and so begins a new chapter in the tumultuous investigation of Russia, the president, the White House and the president's advisors.

What did we learn from Tuesday's midterms?

President Donald Trump said at multiple rallies leading up to Tuesday's election that the vote was actually a referendum on him.

I would say he won. Could the results have been better for President Trump? Sure. After all, 21 of the 33 candidates he endorsed lost Tuesday night. That's not a great percentage considering the time and money he spent at rallies and on Twitter spreading the word.

But there was no "blue wave" either. There are more Republicans in the Senate now that there were before. The House will flip, but that is not uncommon for a midterm election. It was nothing compared to recent midterm elections.

I don't think race was the primary factor in those races. There were plenty of issues that kept the votes close. When the elections are close, race can still be the straw that breaks the camel's back.

Women are making strides, but the work isn't done

It is kind of sad that we are celebrating the first time in history that more than 100 women were elected to Congress. It's great to reach a milestone, but when the population is more than half women, representation in Congress at about 20 percent doesn't sound like something to celebrate. However, it is progress and success breeds success. I expect more strong female candidates

from both parties in the future. Even as I get way too close to my 50 s, the last thing I want to see is a bunch of entrenched elderly white men setting policy for a diverse country.

Change was expected and some came about

From Dana Rohrabacher losing in California (a big loss for Russia) to Scott Walker and Kris Kobach losing, all were good for America. Actually, those losses purged some bad seeds from Republican leadership, so I am all for it.

As are most elections, Tuesday night was a battle

Winning a war requires winning many battles. The Senate sets up better for Democrats in 2020 than it did in 2018. If a Democrat can run well against Trump in that same election, you would likely see a shift in that house as well.

With control of the House, Democrats have the power to see Trump's tax returns — which he promised to release. The Mueller investigation is also going to conclude at some point. Stop robocalls

Here are some ways to stop robocalls:

- Don't answer calls from unfamiliar numbers.
- List your numbers on the National Do Not Call Registry, www.donotcall.gov.
- Don't provide any information.
- Pushing a number or saying a phrase to opt-out only confirms your number is a working one, and the FCC warns to not even say "yes" — some spammers ask a question first like "Can you hear me?" to prompt you to confirm. They then can use your voice to authorize other actions.

Lunch prep hacks

• Spend an hour or so as a family preparing lunches for the entire week. Chop up veggies, wash and cut fruit, and make a bunch of sandwiches. Wrap your sandwiches in wax paper instead of using a zip-top bag — this will provide a little "placemat."



• Slice an apple, put it back together, and wrap it in plastic

wrap or with a rubber band to keep it from browning.

- Keep bananas fresher longer by separating them, then wrapping each top with plastic.

Save energy at home

- Replace your incandescent light bulbs with CFLs or light-emitting diodes. Energy Star-qualified LEDs use only about 20 to 25 percent of the energy and last up to 25 times longer than traditional incandescent bulbs. Be sure to read the packaging to make sure the lighting product is designed for the fixture or lamp you intend to use it with.
- Set your television to the "home" or "standard" setting to reduce the brightness and reduce your TV's energy use by 18 to 30 percent.

Expert tips for when you have to work on the road

A year ago, travel bloggers Radhika Basu Thakur and Johnny Hoy were looking forward to a productive week in a remote part of Guatemala. The owner of their rental had assured them it had solid Wi-Fi access.

But when they settled in, they realized it was spotty and slow. "We could barely load a page," Basu Thakur recalls.

The couple, who blog at FulltimeNomad.com, managed to buy mobile data online so they could use their smartphones to create a Wi-Fi hot spot. Now, they make sure to always buy phone data ahead of time so they can access the internet from almost anywhere.

Whether you're traveling for business or pleasure, you have to contend with Wi-Fi issues, distractions and noise, among other challenges. We asked working-while-traveling pros to share their best tips for staying productive outside of their normal habitat.

Prioritize reliable Wi-Fi, and have a backup plan

"When your work lives entirely online, the biggest challenge is finding reliable Wi-Fi, especially in other countries or smaller cities," says Stephanie Lee, staff writer for the website GrowthLab. She is based in Los Angeles but takes frequent working trips overseas for weeks or even months at a time.

And a slow connection, she says, can be even more frustrating than no connection.

To deal with that problem, she finds one solid Wi-Fi spot, such as a local Starbucks, and sticks with it, going there whenever she needs to work. If that's not possible, she will simply work on her writing offline or set up a Wi-Fi hot spot through her phone.

Matthew Karsten, a travel blogger and photographer at ExpertVagabond.com, makes a point of looking for reviews that mention Wi-Fi speed before he books a hotel.

"Strong, working Wi-Fi is more important to me than how comfortable the bed is," says Karsten, who has worked from more than 50 countries, including Iceland, Nicaragua and Thailand.

A related problem is that sometimes certain content or applications are blocked in different countries, Basu Thakur says. If that's the case, they use a VPN service to connect through a different location to bypass the block.

Invest in high-quality headphones

Lee likes to work just about anywhere when she travels, so she packs high-quality headphones to avoid any noisy distractions.

"I've worked on a bench at a busy park in Japan," she says.

Headphones also come in handy on airplanes.

While some people invest in Bose QuietComfort headphones that retail for well over \$100, Lee says she is just as happy with her Apple earbuds.

She also owns a pair of Beats by Dre headphones, which she purchased as part of a deal. She typically listens to music with them through her computer.

Use routines to avoid distractions

When you're in a new place, you might want to sightsee more than you want to sit down with your laptop and work. But give in to those temptations and it will be hard to make a living, say Basu Thakur and Hoy.

The couple create a schedule ahead of time so they know when they will be working and when they have free time to explore.

"If we set our work expectations early, then we're not tempted to slack off," Hoy says.

Karsten goes so far as to use an app called Self Control to block sites like Facebook and Reddit on his computer while he's working. He also puts his phone in "do not disturb" mode to avoid getting notifications for long chunks of time during his workday.

Seek out an office environment

Eli David, creator of the blog and podcast BecomeNomad.com, says heading to a co-working space in his new city — whether it's in Lithuania, Portugal or Israel — helps him focus, so he doesn't feel like he's staying "home" in a hotel all day.

He's also found the internet to be more reliable in co-working spaces compared with hotels.

"If you take your work seriously, you have to pay the premium (for co-working spaces) to put yourself in an environment that simulates a serious office," he says.

Karsten agrees. "I'm more productive if I have a 'commute' of some sort, whether it's walking down the street to a coffee shop or taking a scooter to a co-working space," he says, adding that he doesn't tend to be very productive in his pajamas.

It's open enrollment season — pick the best plan

The main question for everyone needing health insurance is, "What plan is best?" Comparing plans and settling on one can be a perplexing process.

Open enrollment is the yearly period to enroll in a health insurance plan, and open federal enrollment for 2019 runs from until Dec. 15, according to healthcare.gov. However, insurance.com points out that some states offer extended deadlines.

Time to think about three main factors when considering the right plan:

1 Look at the four main categories of plans (referred to as the "metal" categories): Bronze, Silver, Gold, Platinum. With each level, the monthly rate increases while the deductible decreases.

2 Consider out-of-pocket expenses and deductible.

3 Determine which plan types allow visits with almost any doctor or health-care facility as well as which limit choices or charge more if an

outside-the-network provider is used.

Healthinsurance.org offers further advice:

- Consider the worst-case scenario and figure the numbers: "Add the total annual premiums plus the maximum out-of-pocket for each plan, and see how they stack up.

If you qualify for a premium subsidy, be sure to use the after-subsidy premium for each plan when you're calculating how much the coverage will cost."

- Be mindful of tiered networks; these

have lower co-pays and deductibles if doctors and hospitals in the top tier are used.

Health insurance planning questions suggested by insurance.com include:

- Do you have a chronic illness that requires regular doctor visits?
- Do you take expensive prescription drugs?
- Do you have a family or do you plan on starting one over the next year?
- Can you afford hefty out-of-pocket costs if there is an emergency?

Okaloosa health department to address public health care for older residents

FORT WALTON BEACH — The Florida Department of Health in Okaloosa County will work with the Florida Age-Friendly Public Health Collaborative and Action Network to identify the role of public health in improving the health and well-being of the older adults in our community. Trust for America's Health is facilitating their efforts with generous funding from The John A. Hartford Foundation.

Carrie Ziegler, DOH-Okaloosa assistant director, said, "This funding allows DOH-Okaloosa to expand its current Lean On Me program by

providing a wider range of public health resources and increases the services provided to vulnerable individuals 65 and older."

In 2016, nearly 30,000 residents in Okaloosa County were 65 years and older. Over one-quarter of them live alone, and it is estimated that 23 percent have a vision and/or hearing problem, according to FLHealthCHARTS.

In October 2017, 30 experts in public health, aging, research and policy in Florida explored how public health could contribute to the health and well-being of older adults. They developed a Framework for Creating an Age-Friendly Public Health System to advance

Okaloosa health department issues security breach notice

TALLAHASSEE — the Florida Department of Health in Okaloosa is issuing a federally required breach notice to patients of its clinics located in District 1, which includes Escambia, Okaloosa, Santa Rosa and Walton counties.

According to a Nov. 9 DOH-Okaloosa media release, the department completed an investigation and found that an unauthorized user compromised a Children's Medical Services employee's Microsoft Outlook 365 account between Oct. 8 and Oct. 16.

The department immediately reset the employee's login credentials to terminate any inappropriate account access and promptly reported the event to the Inspector General

and the Security Administration Team. It is possible that individuals served by the District 1 Child Protection Team may have had their names, psychological, and medical conditions accessed as a result of this incident.

Currently the department has no reason to believe that client information has been misused. Nor was there any evidence of access to Social Security numbers, bank accounts, credit cards or other personal or financial information. As a precautionary measure, clients are encouraged to review their credit history for any fraudulent or suspicious activities they have not authorized.

Clients who have had fraudulent activity occur may contact the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office at 651-7410.

The department took the following steps to prevent future

occurrences:

- remediated the breach and began an ongoing review of potentially impacted information.

- conducted a full review of department IT data to determine the circumstances of the breach.

- initiated new security awareness training and exercises to ensure proper security protocol and monthly testing of employees.

- is exploring additional security options to protect against further security breaches.

"The security of personal information is of critical importance to the Department of Health. The Department is committed to safeguarding personal information and to further safeguard the identity of our clients," a DOH-Okaloosa representative stated.

None of us can completely control all the things that happen to us. the event of a direct hit."

Boyles' concerns are shared by Florosa Fire Control District officials and Florosa residents.

If the local area is threatened by a hurricane that's stronger than a Category 2 storm, which has winds from 96-110 mph, Florosa Volunteer Fire Department firefighters must abandon their metal-walled station at 1900 U.S. Highway 98.

That happened in 2004 when Hurricane Ivan forced them to stay with their fire trucks at the Santa Rosa Mall, according to Brad Williams, the department's deputy chief.

Aware of such problems, 76 percent of Florosa voters in August approved increasing

the district's millage cap from the current rate of 1.0 mill to 3.0 mills. The anticipated additional funding will help pay for a new, storm-hardened fire station and provide paid part-time firefighters to help man the facility full-time.

One mill equals \$100 for every \$100,000 of taxable property value.

"We won't go all the way to that (3.0) cap," Williams said on Monday. "The new rate has not been set yet. That probably won't happen until next year."

Williams said construction of a new station might occur in 2019 at a "very preliminary" estimated cost of about \$2 million to \$3 million.

Honoring 'the peacemakers'

Veterans celebrated, remembered in local ceremony

FORT WALTON BEACH — The tie between Veterans Day and the end of World War I, when guns went silent at 11 a.m. on Nov. 11, 1918, marked the annual local Veterans Day Celebration.

The event, moved from its usual Beal Memorial Cemetery location to American Legion Post 235 as rain pelted the area, also included an observance of Remembrance Day, a British observance of the cessation of hostilities in World War I, which ended 100 years ago this year.

U.S. Air Force Lt. Gen. Brad Webb, commander of the Hurlburt Field-based Air Force Special Operations Command and guest speaker for the celebration, took the

crowd of nearly 300 people back in time to the Sept. 12, 1918, Battle of Saint-Mihiel, the first American-led battle of World War I.

Comprising a half-million American troops and thousands of French troops, the Allied forces emerged victorious after four days of fighting in wet, cold and muddy conditions.

"This American army met their challenge," Webb told the audience. Indeed, Webb added, "our veterans have answered every call" to defend the United States, as he praised veterans as people "who sacrifice in war, to give us peace."

"They share a bond," Webb said. "They are united in determination, united in service."

That service, Webb said, is something that continues among veterans long after their military service is done. Citing local examples such as Fort Walton Beach Mayor

Dick Rynearson and Air Force Enlisted Village president and CEO Brooke McLean, Webb noted that veterans "often form the very backbone of our communities."

"You enrich the lives of those around you," Webb told the room filled with veterans, local officials and others taking a moment to observe Veterans Day. "You are servants, and you are contributors."

Also speaking Monday was Royal Navy Commander Gregory Smith, currently at Eglin Air Force Base with other military personnel from

Great Britain, the United Kingdom and Australia as part of the F-35 Joint Strike Fighter jet program.

Smith talked about the horrific scale of World War I, in which nearly 10 million military personnel, and almost 10 million civilians, were killed.

"The toll was unthinkable by today's standards," Smith said.

"Its scale was unprecedented," he continued. "Its images," he added, "have never lost their power" to convey "the horrors of war."

Monday's observance also included the traditional assembly of the community wreath. One by one, military officers, local and state officials, representatives of the American Legion, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the

Daughters of the American Revolution and the Marine Corps League, and the veterans themselves, came forward to add a flower to the wreath. The flowers will be presented to residents of the Air Force Enlisted Village and its Hawthorn House assisted-living and memory-care facilities.

The ceremony concluded with a rifle volley and the playing of taps to honor deceased veterans, and included a wish for living veterans in the benediction offered by the Rev. David Knight, rector of St. Simon's on the Sound Episcopal Church.

"Let them be the peacemakers," Knight prayed. "Grant them lives of joy and bounty."



Rodney Walker retires after 56 years with Okaloosa schools

FORT WALTON BEACH — Rodney Walker says he wouldn't change a thing about his more than 50-year career with the Okaloosa County School District. Working with children is something he always wanted to do.

After 32 years as a guidance counselor and 24 years on the school board, Walker decided not to run for reelection.

He will retire later this month.

"It's been such a privilege and honor to serve with the school district for all these years," he said. "I don't usually have much to say, except when I'm raising hell in the board meetings."

Walker was born and raised in Florida. When he graduated from Troy University, he immediately began working at Choctawhatchee High School in the guidance department.

Things were different then. He recalls a time when there were only two guidance counselors for 4,400 students. Students were allowed to smoke in designated areas on campus, and girls couldn't wear clothes that were shorter than knee length.

"I came here in 1962 as a guidance counselor," Walker said. "At that time, Choctaw was the only school in the south end of the county. ... We did guidance and discipline — the whole nine yards."

He eventually transferred to the district office and was the director of student services. When he retired, he immediately ran for school board and won.

Walker has been reelected five times since then. From 1996 to 2002, he served as chairman of the board.

Walker's last term will end on Nov. 20 when Linda Evancyk takes his District 3 seat.

"I've had the opportunity to work with some very great educators during my career. I've seen a lot of changes, good and bad," he said. "I've been fortunate because of the great community, students and teachers I've been able to work with all those years."

"I'm sure the person replacing me will do a much better job than I was able to do."

When asked why he's decided to retire, Walker's answer was simple.

"I'm 81 years old," he said. "I think it's time for new ideas and fresh ideas."

Walker plans to spend his extra time off doing the things he enjoys, like fishing. He fishes anytime and anywhere he can, he said.

"I've been very active in the community throughout my career, but mainly I've devoted my entire life to education," Walker said. "It's been very rewarding, and I'm

just thankful I was able to come to Okaloosa County."

Max Bruner was Walker's first superintendent. He learned a lot from Bruner, he said. Walker also spoke of his admiration for former superintendents Pledger Sullivan and Don Gaetz.

Gaetz and Walker worked for the school district together for 12 years — six while on the school board, and another six after Gaetz was elected superintendent. They were both elected to the school board in 1994.

During that time, the men were not only colleagues but also good friends. They remained close when Gaetz became senator and have been friends for 24 years.

"Rodney has been the brains and guts of Okaloosa schools," Gaetz said. "He is the most intelligent and informed person I know about Okaloosa schools, its finances, its people and its potential. And he is one of the gutsiest public officials I have ever worked with."

Walker said of Chief Financial Officer Rita Scallan.

Walker and Scallan worked together for 19 years, and he calls her "the glue that has held this district together."

"Mr. Walker has been a proverbial advocate for students and employees," Scallan said. "I believe his heart and soul is invested in the school district and has never wanted anything but the best."

Scallan said there will be a hole in the district without Walker there.

"He's had such an impact for so long. He has so much knowledge," she said. "For me, it's great sadness to see him leave because I know there will be a tremendous void there."

Although Walker won't be directly involved in the school district after he leaves office, he looks toward the future, hopeful that progress will be made in his absence.

Walker said he hopes the district will eventually pass a temporary sales tax that will repair or replace an aging infrastructure.

Most of the schools in Okaloosa County are about 50 years old, some even older.

"I think that all of the parents and citizens of Okaloosa County need to realize that we must have additional revenue to fix our aging buildings," Walker said. "I would hope in the future we can pass the sales tax that is desperately needed to fix our facilities."

In the end, Walker looks back on his 56 years with a smile, grateful for the time he's spent improving the lives of Okaloosa County students.

"I think it would have been difficult to ever find anywhere that I could've worked in education that would've been better than here," he said.





The practical cook uses garlic that peels like a banana, revealing a clove large enough for a single meal without a fuss. Typically, that garlic is hardneck. Big Garlic grows the other kind, called softneck. Chinese and Californian megafarms grow softneck in endless monocultures.

Big Garlic likes softneck because there is more money in it. A single head of softneck can contain 20 or more cloves, each one of which, when planted in the earth, will grow into a new bulb. A decent hardneck variety, by contrast, will only contain 4 to 8 large, beautiful, uniformly shaped cloves that

Your noodles are now ready for whatever else you have in mind, whether a simple topping of chopped parsley or a hearty Puttanesca.

shed their skins without a fight. That's what you want, if you're a cook.

Finally, softneck doesn't produce those pesky scapes, aka the delicious flowering stalks that sprout from the center of those plump, symmetrical hardneck bulbs when planted. Those flowering stalks must be picked off the plants so the bulbs will reach full size. While I — and most small farmers — don't mind harvesting (and selling, and eating)

the scapes, the extra labor required to pick a huge field of those curlicues is more deterrent against growing the good stuff.

Get the good stuff

If that isn't you, or you don't want it to be you, then it's time to go get some good hardneck garlic before the farmers go into hibernation, or hopefully some tropical location. Garlic has a season, and that season is

about to end. This time of year, in many parts of the country, the opportunities to acquire good garlic shrivel up. So here's how to make a move on a hardneck stash for this winter.

- Step one is to find the right stuff, most likely at some outlet for local produce like a farmers market or local grocery. Alternatively, ask around among your farmer friends.

- Step two is to calculate how much you need. If you think you need a bulb a week, that's about 25 bulbs to get you through until next summer, when the next crop will be ready.

- Step three is to do the math and take the plunge. For less than the cost of taking an average family to the movies, you can own a stash of garlic for which you will be grateful every day. And you can bet that farmer will remember you next year.

- Step four is to make it last its maximum shelf life. Store it in a cool, dry, well-ventilated place. Fetch the garlic as needed from the stash, a bulb at a time, disturbing the stash as little as possible.

And if you are a true believer like I am, then you probably already know that now is the time to plant some garlic yourself.

For perfect pasta

If that is not thrilling enough, how about a technique that will improve every single bowl of pasta that you make for the rest of your life: Whether it's mushroom sauce, clam sauce or a simple marinara, from Bolognese to macaroni and cheese, whether it's your grandma's secret recipe or sauce from a jar, this is what you need to do to your noodles before you add that special sauce.

Raw garlic has a sharp spiciness, while cooked garlic is more aromatic. By coating the noodles with garlic when they are piping hot, the garlic cooks a little bit, which brings it, and the noodles to which it is applied, to a place of maximum flavor.

To go there, prepare the garlic to the point where the cell walls are destroyed, so its juice flows freely. You can press on it with a knife, mash it with a mortar and pestle, grate it or obsessively mince it.

'The legend lives on' ... food from the Edmund Fitzgerald

The SS Edmund Fitzgerald was an American Great Lakes freighter that sank in a Lake Superior storm on Nov. 10, 1975, with the loss of the entire crew of 29. The freighter was launched on June 7, 1958, and was the largest ship on the Great Lakes, and she remains the largest to have sunk there.

In honor of the men and women who continue to sail the Great Lakes on these massive freighters, this week I'll be sharing recipes from the "Ships of the Great Lakes Cookbook" by PK McKenna.

Steward George Yaworski sailed and cooked for 15 years on the Great Lakes and worked aboard the Edmund Fitzgerald. Here are a few of the crew's favorite recipes, along with Steward Yaworski's thoughts.

Knickerbocker Bean Soup

This is a hearty, rich flavored soup that will keep them asking for more!

- 1 to 1 ¼ pounds navy beans
- 2 gallons boiling water
- 4 ounces salt pork, cubed
- 2 ounces carrots, diced
- 6 ounces onions, chopped, divided in half
- 1 ½ gallon beef stock
- 4 ounces bacon, diced
- 3 pounds, 3 ounces tomatoes
- 2 tablespoons salt
- ½ teaspoon pepper

Cover beans with cold water

and soak 2 to 3 hours; do not drain. Combine beans with boiling water, salt pork, carrots and half of the onions; cook until beans are tender. Add beef stock and potatoes; cook approximately 5 minutes until potatoes are tender. Fry bacon and remaining onions. Add bacon mixture to soup. Add tomatoes, salt and pepper. Adjust seasonings to taste.

Chicken Paprikash

- 8 frying chickens, cut in quarters
- 2 cups flour
- 2 tablespoons seasoning salt
- 2 green peppers, diced
- 1 pound onions, diced
- 2 cups chicken stock
- 4 tablespoons paprika
- 4 ounces tomato paste
- 2 cups sour cream

Thoroughly mix together flour and seasoning salt. Dredge

cut-up chicken in flour mixture and place in roasting pan. Sprinkle diced green peppers and onions over chicken and bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Mix together chicken stock, paprika, tomato paste and sour cream. Pour over baked chicken. Cover pan tightly with aluminum foil and bake an additional 30 minutes.

Note: I prefer to make two batches of the sauce (chicken stock mixture) because it looks neater when poured over chicken prior to serving.



Pumpkin Spice Cake

As I write this article, our nation is reeling from another two senseless acts of violence: the mailing of explosive devices to persons who have spoken unflatteringly (in that persons' mind) about our current President, and the absolutely senseless killing of Jewish men and women who had gathered for a time of worship in a Pennsylvania synagogue.

We have not been created by our God to be at each other's throats. We were created to live in community with one another. Look at the way so many are responding with kindness, generosity, and service to the victims of Hurricane Michael. That's what we are supposed to be about all the time.

As Anne Lamott said, "You can safely assume you've created God in your own image when it turns out that God hates all the same people you do."

FamiliesFirst uses new adoption match technology

PENSACOLA – Child welfare caseworkers across the state of Florida can now take a more proactive and efficient approach in finding adoptive parents for children who are waiting in foster care.

A new technology is making it easier and quicker for FamiliesFirst Network of Lakeview Center (FFN) to find adoptive parents for foster children. Family-Match, an online program, produces a list of potential matches for caseworkers to consider for youths available for adoption. The program is a no-cost pilot for 18 months.

"FFN is the lead agency for adoptions in Circuit 1, the first to have trained on the program and the first agency in Florida to have matched a family using this unprecedented approach," an FFN media release stated.

"Family-Match is one way we are trying to modernize the adoption process to benefit children and their adoptive families," Shawn Salamida, FFN president, said. "It provides us with another source of information to make sure we are matching the right families to our children in need."
