## Man arrested following shooting

Four-year-old in the area when shots were reported fired

CLEWISTON -- A man was arrested in July after police say he confronted the victim at his home, opening fire when the victim tried to run inside his home.

A four-year-old child was in the immediate area when the scuffle broke, and investigators report she could have been injured when several bullets were fired into the home.

Desmond Ingram, 25, of Clewiston, faces multiple charges, including aggravated assault with a weapon, firing missile into dwelling, and cruelty toward child -- act that could result in physical or mental injury.

The incident happened July 20, at approximately 8:30 p.m., in the area of 7th Court.

According to the arrest report, witnesses said that a number of individuals arrived at the home of the victim, Freddie Clarence Dixon, and an altercation started in the yard.

One of those individuals is reported to be the suspect. Witnesses

## 'Tending to the division'

Forbes to residents: "Thank you"

CLEWISTON -- Many years ago, Dr. James Forbes and one of the hospital administrators, a "tough ol' gal," simply came to the understanding that they would lock horns.

He treated her and once had her sent to the hospital when her blood pressure had shot up. It was there that Dr. Forbes saw a thing which shook him -- and despite a memory that now and then is lost in a small fog -- he still remembers the moment.

"While I was talking to her, she started a sentence and couldn't finish it. She had a stroke and never said another word after that."

She had a nice home in

Clewiston, and Dr. Forbes made it a point to visit her each month, never failing to drive to make the appointments with his old friend. He checked her blood pressure and communication was limited to the expression of her eyes.

She died four years after her stroke, but Dr. Forbes never forgot about that day in the hospital.

"I had to just sit there and watch that lady's brain deteriorate right in front of me. It was the most helpless feeling in my life. She never said another word."

### 45 years

In Dr. Forbes' life, his occupation saw him constantly tending to the division between life and death. A doctor's role in a community is clear, and about that much Dr. Forbes was always cognizant.

Like the 5,000 residents of the

West Indies he would treat at the peak of the sugarcane season, Dr. Forbes' work was steeped in hard labor - the differences between back-bending beneath the sun in the fields, and the slow-marching hours in the clinic being slight.

After nearly 45 years of private practice and work at the local hospital, he is one of the old staples of the community. He has helped those who were sick get better, or helped to comfort those who became too ill, and did not get better.

During his residency, Dr. Forbes arrived at the county hospital in Jacksonville expecting to be one of 24 interns. The fact was that there were only eight.

"I'm gonna get three times as much experience as I would have," the young doctor thought.

And so started a long career

filled with longer days; One that until much recently, he had detested thinking about giving up.

During his career, he treated everyone from U.S. Sugar executives to residents of much meager means, and he enjoyed his calling.

He rallied younger doctors to resist the notion that they must not take personal interests in their patient's lives and poured his all into his work. He may have done so forever, but it was not meant to be.

## "Decision was made for me"

Eventually, the effects of his profession were becoming clear.

"It started bang like that, and it ended bang like that. One day you have more work to do than three doctors can do, and the next day, you have nothing to do. I found myself becoming depressed."

It was after one of those "dog-tired" nights last year, July 16 to be precise, when the doctor did not make it in to the office the next day.

"I went to bed that night and, physiologically, I was about 55 or 60 years old. That was in my own mind. When I woke up the next morning, I had the mentality of an 80-year-old person and the physical ability of an 80-year-old person."

Like the friend he cared for until the end, the doctor had suffered a stroke. Today, Dr. Forbes has lost half his vision in both eyes as a result of the stroke, and although he can make out the words in a book, he has trouble making sense of prose. He still reads medical journals, but prefers to stick to the summaries of the findings rather than trek through the hard details.

But it is his memory that has suffered. The stroke has left it fragmented, and asked what his mind veers to during his quieter moments of reflection, he shares that there is much that he still considers.

"I think about what happened ten years ago, 20 years ago. I can't remember what happened yesterday, but I can remember what happened back then."

He continues to make progress and takes his medicines daily, like any good doctor, and surprises his wife when he remembers things that even she had forgotten.

"I think it was God slowing me down.

I was real tired and I had a bad siege for a couple of months. I just had more work to do than I could do and I didn't know how to walk away from it. When I woke up and realized I had had a stroke and I could still think, I felt like God, he was protecting me. He got me out of the trap I was in."

## A new morning in Maine

Taken as a whole, each day of his decades of medical practice, Dr. Forbes' wife might sum it all up clearer than even the doctor himself: He would leave his home well before the sun would set in the sky, leaving many times before 5 a.m., and often would not return until late in the evening.

But she did not keep him from doing what he loved.

"I could have asked him (to retire), but it wouldn't have done any good. When you live in a small town like this, and everybody knows you, he couldn't tell anybody no. He never told anybody no. He may have been very, very tired, but he'd always go."

Even at her friends' constant urging, Mrs. Forbes rarely knew if they were attending that latest social event until the last minute because of her husband's work.

The hours in between their encounters could have been enough to drive a wedge into their relationship, but somehow, the Forbes made do with the pace of their lives.

"Don't misunderstand me, we've had our problems, every married couple does, but we came through it. A lot of times, you would think that living such separate lives, him at the hospital, me here with the children, that when it came down to being just the two of us here together, we wouldn't know what to do. But we know what to do."

She loves him. And that much is clear. "He's my husband. He's a very caring person, sincere. He tells it like it is, and he puts his patients first."

They married when she was 17, and he was 18; Sharing the experience of medical school, and the Air Force, settling down in Clewiston from Ocala, raising their children, and growing old together.

So now they must take up the plan of growing older together.

Mrs. Forbes drives him everywhere they go now, although the doctor stresses that if "push comes to shove," he could drive just as well. They enjoy the simple things: He hunts and fishes, and they are ashamed to say they aren't the types to travel the world. They return frequently to a spot in Maine instead of venturing elsewhere. Although

they've been there many times, the doctor still looks forward to seeing another morning in Maine.

He is sure he will.

Despite his physical condition, and with his wife by his side, he assures: "To me, anyway, this past year has been the best year of my life."

## "Thank you"

On Monday, the second day of his retirement, the doctor pondered what it felt like not to work.

"Actually, it feels pretty good," he said.

He remains grateful to the community, saying a simple "thank you" to all those who ever knew him and trusted him enough to have him provide for their care.

Least of all no one should feel sorry for Dr. Forbes, since it is clear by the manner, and with what excitement he relays stories, that he has led a full life.

If he knew it were all to end tomorrow, he wouldn't lose any sleep over it.

"I don't fear death at all. Not in the slightest."

He still has the option of renewing his medical license when it expires in January, and has thought about whether he should so he can watch over the people who are closest to him.

"If I have to go through whole lot of trouble, I won't."

He regrets that he may be one of the last symbols of the medicine he once had a romantic notion of pursuing. In his later years, he noted how doctors were changing amid the confusion of technology. Medicine today is much more impersonal, he laments.

"Occasionally, these young doctors, occasionally they'd come and ask me something, but they were reluctant to do it. That's just pride. That's alright, it didn't bother me at all. I understand it."

And the doctor's memory is strong.

With his last days as a doctor drawing to a close, Dr. Forbes remembered one of his old classmates.

Drawing on the speech General Douglas MacArthur delivered before a joint session of Congress in 1951, as his own military career finished -- "Old soldiers never die; they just fade away" -- Dr. Forbes thinks about his old friend and what he would say, and smiles widely in repeating it.

"Old doctors never die," he says. "They just smell that way."

# Athletes Advantage gets Clewiston Tigers up to speed

Key improvements made by players in overall conditioning

CLEWISTON - For the past two months, the Clewiston Tigers have been working diligently in the weight room in anticipation of the upcoming football season.

Short on finances, Clewiston head coach Joe Roth decided to use his team's time wisely this summer.

Instead of traveling to camps, like most teams in the state took advantage of this summer, Clewiston brought summer camp to its hometown.

Enter Athletes Advantage, a well-respected fitness organization based in Wellington.

Since June 8, the fitness firm had been traveling west to Clewiston twice a week in efforts to improve the speed and conditioning of the Tigers football players.

Suffice to say, it has provided a much-needed boost to a program that seems to be lacking in depth this upcoming season.

In short, Athletes Advantage has given Clewiston somewhat of an edge come the beginning of football season, which is on Aug. 28.

That came in a series of multidirectional drills, with several of the 20-30 exercises using cones to help the Clewiston players improve in their agility, speed, positioning and form, to name a few.

"Clewiston really came together as a team and I think that helps a lot," said Erica Goldstein, who's a coach with Athletes Advantage.

"Physically, they were already good, but they took advantage of the experience we provided them to enhance their techniques."

Clewiston engaged in two days of testing provided by Athletes Advantage, with the first one coming on June 8 - it was simply an indicator of what the 34 players needed to do this summer to improve their speed, strength and conditioning.

By the second and final day of testing, which came on Wednesday, July 29, it seemed as if many of the Clewiston players were fired up and ready to run faster than they did earlier this summer.

That was particularly the case of Damian Smith, an incoming senior wide receiver/defensive back.

Touted by coaches as perhaps the best overall skill position player for the Class of 2010, Smith was clocked in the 40-yard dash at 4.49 seconds - the fastest time of the entire team.

"Damian was the fastest on our team last year," Roth said of Smith.

"He's done all that he needed to do to break the 4.5 time. Damian's been running track the last three years and when he works out, all he focuses on is getting better."

Roth, who doesn't publicly give out individual accolades much unless absolutely necessary, is basically a team-first coach who'll speak on behalf of the entire team unit.

He was proud to say that of the 34 players who tested, 24 of them improved their 40 times by one-tenth of a second.

And 16 of those 24 who made gains in the 40 bettered their times by at least two-tenths of a second.

"It's going to make our team a whole lot better," Roth said.

"We had a lot of gains as far as speed goes. Everyone improved their speed from

the beginning of the summer."

It must be noted that the team's overall confidence received a huge boost last week, in part to a surprise appearance by Miami Dolphins cornerback and Clewiston alum Eric Green.

Working out on his own runs in preparation for the Dolphins training camp and preseason, Green requested not to be interviewed regarding this story.

However, Green did take the time out of his schedule to watch the workouts and spend some quality time with the players and coaches while out on the Clewiston practice field.

"Eric Green has always got an open invitation to come and stop by," Roth said of the Dolphins cornerback.

"He's a role model for the kids. Eric teaches them everything that's needed to make the right choices in life and he's a living testament of that."

The next two fastest overall 40 times came from incoming junior Shomori Butler (4.65 seconds) and incoming senior running back Chris Herring (4.66 seconds).

The most surprising 40 time perhaps was recorded by incoming senior offensive/defensive lineman Willie Huggins, who was

reportedly clocked in at an average of 4.9 seconds - he ran a 4.82 40 time in one run last Wednesday.

The speed and conditioning drills were provided by Athletes Advantage, while the weightlifting sessions were handled by Roth and his coaching staff.

The full results of the summer workouts were not released by Roth or Athletes Advantage.

Nevertheless, Athletes Advantage officials believe Clewiston should be able to hold their own throughout the 2009 season, provided they continue to support each other.

"We did everything we could to prepare them for the upcoming season," said Sean Benavides, who's a co-owner of Athletes Advantage.

"Across the board, the players made great strides as a team and Coach Roth is going to be proud of how far they've come along this summer."

Fall practices begin on Monday, Aug. 10, with two-a-day workout sessions slated to occur on the first full week (Aug. 10-14).

# The First Seminole War

The large boat sat heavily in the brown, tannic waters as it moved sluggishly against the currents of the Apalachicola River.

Blue water sailors, who were accustomed to the broad, open sea cursed the river's relentless current as they poled and rowed the unwieldy craft up the confined, serpentine waters.

Soldiers on board laughed and joked among themselves, while children watched the rivers shoreline with adventurous eyes.

Female passengers sat contentedly, preparing noon time meals until a deer or bear appeared on the opposite shore, and then their excited voices rose, filling the air as they shouted for the children to look.

The day had been long and the passengers were weary as the boat neared its final destination, Fort Scott.

Just one mile from the fort, a sharp bend in the river meet the approaching boat with a surging current, forcing the helmsman to steer for the opposite shore.

The boat slowly responded and inched its way to the far shore, where death patiently stalked.

A murderous volley filled the air as musket fire from Indians and blacks swept across the boat.

Standing sailors were pitched into the black waters as bullets tore through their bodies.

Children fell silent, while the shrieks of the dying rose above the thunderous musket fire.

This fictitious story is based on a tragic event that took place in the Florida wilderness.

It is time to take "A Walk in The Past" and read about the First Seminole Indian war.

In 1816, the U.S. Army and hundreds of friendly Creeks meet with an American flotilla (two gunboats and two schooners) at the Negro Fort, which was located 15 miles upstream on the Apalachicola River.

The Blacks and Indians at the fort saw the American forces as an imminent threat and attacked.

The final outcome of the battle was determined when "hot shot" (Cherry red heated canon ball) fired from a gunboat struck the powder magazine in the fort.

The powder kegs ignited and set off a great explosion within the fort that killed approximately 300 persons.

The fort's black leader, Garson and a Choctaw Indian Chief were captured.

They were tortured to death by the friendly Creeks under the command of the Muscogulge chief, William McIntosh.

Blacks in the area were captured and later sold to slaveholders in Georgia.

The destruction of the Negro Fort sent a chilling message to all blacks and hostile Indians living in Florida.

Its silent words were far louder and deadlier than the great explosion that destroyed the Negro Fort.

Blacks and Indians alike knew they now stood at the threshold of a new emerging Florida and that their fates would rest in the hands of the Americans.

In 1817, Chief Neamathla of the village

Fowltown, got into a dispute with the commander of Fort Scott over land boundaries.

Fowltown was located in southwestern Georgia, on the east side of the Flint River.

This land had been ceded by the defeated Creeks in the Treaty of Fort Jackson to the United States.

The Miccosukee didn't consider themselves Creek and therefore not bound by the treaty.

They contended that the Creeks never had the right to cede their lands.

General Gaines sent an Army force of 250 men to take Neamathla captive.

The Americans attacked and were driven back by the Miccosukee.

The next day the Americans attacked again and drove the Miccosukee from their village.

The village was then torched.

President Monroe had once secretly appointed David Brydie Mitchell as commander over the Georgia militia in the Patriot War that was fought in east Florida.

He was later appointed as the Creek Indian agent and was the Indian agent when Fowltown was attacked.

Mitchell stated in a report to Congress that Fowltown was the beginning of the First Seminole Indian War.

One week after the Americans attacked Fowltown, a boat carrying supplies for Fort Scott, under the command of Lieutenant R.W. Scott, was attacked on the Apalachicola River.

There were approximately fifty people on board the boat, including soldiers, women and children.

Most of the boats passengers were killed in the ambush.

One woman survived and was taken captive, while several men escaped to Fort Scott.

News of the attack reached Washington. The Secretary of War, John C. Calhoun ordered Andrew Jackson to invade Florida.

In 1818, Jackson moved his combined force of army regulars, Georgia militia and friendly Creeks to Fort Scott.

Later they marched down the Apalachicola River to the ruins of the Negro Fort and built a fort adjacent to it called Fort Gadson.

The army then marched to the villages on Lake Miccosukee.

The Indian villages called Tallahassee and Miccosukee were burned.

There were over 300 Indian homes destroyed.

This number of homes represented a large populace when you consider there were probably six persons living in each home.

Jackson moved south after he burnt and destroyed the Indian villages.

He arrived at St. Marks and captured the Spanish fort.

There he found a Scottish trader called Alexander George Arbuthnot.

Mr. Arbuthnot was a trader from the Bahamas that traded with the Indians for deer hides.

He had become a friend to the Indians and wrote letters to the crown requesting British intervention against the Americans.

Two Indian leaders had been taken prisoner prior to Jackson's arrival at St. Marks. They were captured aboard a British ship taken by the Americans.

The ship's identity had been decoyed by flying the British flag, the Union Jack.

When Jackson arrived, the Red Stick leader Josiah Francis and Homathlemico were brought ashore and hanged.

Jackson then proceeded to the Suwannee River to attack the villages along the river.

Most were black villages occupied by runaway slaves.

Some of the runaways living in these villages had fled the Negro Fort region when the fort was destroyed in 1816, and resettled on the Suwannee River.

While marching to the black villages, Jackson's men discovered a Red Stick village on Econfina Creek.

A battle took place and approximately 40 Indians were killed.

Over a hundred Indians were captured and the female captive taken from the ambushed boat a year earlier was rescued.

Also, the scalps of 50 whites were found and thought to be the scalps taken from passengers on the boat.

During this time period another British subject was captured.

Robert Ambrister, a former Royal Marine and a British agent.

After the destruction of the Red Stick vil-

lage, Jackson moved on to the black villages along the Suwannee, but found them all abandoned.

Jackson's major military objectives had been achieved, so he returned to St. Marks.

A military tribunal convened and the two captured British subjects were put on trial.

Ambrister and Arbuthnot were accused

of aiding the Seminoles and encouraging them to make war on the Americans.

Arbrister threw himself at the mercy of the court, while Arbuthnot maintained his innocence.

Both men were sentenced to be hanged by the military court, which later relented and sentenced Arbrister to 50 lashes and a year of hard labor.

Jackson wasn't happy with the change and reinstated the death penalty for Arbrister.

The Bahamian hide trader, Arbuthnot, was hanged from the yardarm of his own ship and Arbrister was shot by a firing squad.

Jackson then returned to Fort Gadson where he learned that the Spanish were supplying the Indians with arms in Pensacola.

Jackson formed an army numbering 1,000 and marched to Pensacola.

The Spanish governor of West Florida claimed that most of the Indians at Pensacola were women and children.

He also stated the male Indians were unarmed, which sounds suspicious.

General Jackson disregarded the Spanish governor's messages and continued to Pensacola.

He attacked the Spanish garrison, forcing the Spaniards to retreat to Fort Barrancas.

The battle lasted two days and ended with a Spanish surrender.

After the surrender, Jackson then left Col. William King as military governor of West Florida and returned home.

USDA Farm Service Agency Administrator Jonathan Coppess today announced that biomass conversion facilities can begin signing up to participate in the Biomass Crop Assistance Program, which will help increase production of renewable energy.

The program, authorized in the 2008 Farm Bill, provides financial assistance to producers who deliver eligible material to biomass conversion facilities and FSA will provide financial assistance to collect, harvest, store and transport eligible materials.

"This program will benefit producers, the developing biomass industry, the general public and the environment as we continue working to expand production and availability of renewable energy," said Coppess.

"Owners of eligible material can receive financial assistance for delivering qualified biomass to conversion facilities that use biomass for heat, power, bio-based products or advanced biofuels."

Biomass conversion facilities and material owners or producers should contact their FSA state offices or visit <http://www.fsa.usda.gov/> for more information.

FSA will begin accepting applications from biomass facilities interested in partici-

pating in the Biomass Crop Assistance Program (BCAP).

Once an agreement is signed between FSA and a facility and funding through the program is provided, the facilities can begin accepting materials.

Producers who sell these materials can apply for matching payments under the collection, harvest, storage and transportation (CHST) component of BCAP.

The matching CHST payments are paid at a rate of \$1 for \$1 per dry-ton equivalent received from a qualified biomass conversion facility, not to exceed \$45 per dry-ton equivalent.

A biomass owner is eligible to receive payments for two years.

The purpose of the matching payments is to assist biomass producers with the CHST cost of delivering biomass to a qualified biomass conversion facility.

For example, if a qualified biomass conversion facility pays a producer \$30 per dry ton for biomass, the material owner or producer would be eligible for a matching payment of \$30 per dry ton from FSA.

This payment will help offset the costs of CHST.

Biomass conversion facilities may become "qualified" by submitting a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to the FSA state offices.

The MOU generally provides the requirements for becoming a qualified biomass conversion facility.

Once a facility becomes qualified, eligible material owners or producers who deliver biomass to that facility may be eligible to receive CHST payments.

Eligible material owners or producers, who market eligible material to a qualified biomass conversion facility, may apply for the matching CHST payment at their FSA county office.

An application must be submitted before the eligible material is sold and delivered to a qualified biomass conversion facility.

After the product is delivered, a producer must provide FSA with documentation of product quantity, quality and payment rate.

County offices will validate payment requests with information in the county office and information provided under the terms of MOUs with the qualified biomass conversion facilities.

CHST payments will not be authorized until after an appropriate environmental analysis has been conducted.

## Trimming Trees

Here are some suggestions to protect yourself from damage to your trees or home, or from tree trimmers who may injure themselves while on your property:

Insurance for the tree industry is very expensive. Companies that give low-ball estimates often do not have sufficient insurance coverage. Ask to see a certificate of insurance, and then call the insurance company to verify its status. Avoid businesses that can't show proof of worker's compensation.

Qualify the business. Look for affiliations with trade associations. Some associations, such as the Tree Care Industry Association (TCIA) and International Society of Arboriculture (ISA), offer the industry accreditation and certification.

Ask if the business has a certified arborist on staff. Improper pruning (such as tree topping) kills more trees than any other trimming mistake.

Ask friends and neighbors for recommendations. Check to see if your home owner's association can provide references or referrals.

Ask if the company conducts worker drug tests regularly.

Make sure the company picks up all cuttings. Most cities do not pick up brush left by contractors. This could leave the home owner open to fines and other costs.

Don't pay in advance. Only pay when the job is finished. It is best to pay by credit card or check.





God of this city

The youth of my church came back fired up from a mission trip this summer. Shortly after they returned, I visited one of their youth fellowship gatherings. They played one of the songs they had experienced during the praise time on the mission trip, which involved running around with hands held high in celebration. One of the youth asked me if I was scared because of what the mission trip had "done" to them.

was approaching, got the keys and took off. The police did not take kindly to his escapade but felt he was too young to be charged. When asked what was the outcome of his "adventure", he said he was grounded for four days; no TV, no video games. He said he won't do it again, too. I wondered about the "inadvertent learning" that went on. He got a trip to New York, was on national television, was the center of attention with his fifteen moments of fame, and got to meet all sorts of exciting people. Maybe it was a first trip on an airplane, maybe the first time in a hotel. The message may have gotten through about "Don't take the family car" but were other messages communicated as well? Was it "If you do something 'creative' you'll get all sorts of attention?" One father was angry with his son when he was caught stealing from a local store and laid out a list of punishments. No TV, no friends over, being grounded, and for good measure he went to the store manager and told him that he wanted his son to work there for a month as a volunteer - to learn just how hard people had to work and to see the efforts of the store people, and to learn that the people he betrayed by his act were real and decent people. After awhile, the manager told the father "Your son really is willing to work, and I can't find anybody as willing, do you mind if I hire him?" Wrong lesson! I wonder what would have happened if somebody stopped to ask the now-famous seven-year old who took the car "What is it about Church that you don't like?" I've asked that question many times and have gotten some surprising answers. One successful business owner told me that he didn't go to Church because his mother made him go when he was a kid. I told him that I was sorry his mother did such a thing to him! Others have told me about what they liked or disliked; and were worth hearing. Awhile ago when a young person came to be baptized, I showed her where the event would be recorded in the Church Archives and then we went back and looked at other members of her family that were also baptized and entered in the records too. It was a special way for her of realizing she was now part of a family with others in her household, God's family. Finding out why a seven-year old didn't want to go was a question nobody asked. They missed something; a possible life-changing opportunity to listen, learn, teach and restore.

A man's condemnation or justification is not dependent upon whether he has sinned, "for all have sinned" (Romans 3:23); nor is it contingent upon the magnitude of sin, for the holy eyes of God have never seen a small, insignificant sin.

Moreover, all unforgiven sin is payable

by the standard wage scale - eternal death. (Romans 6:23)





say the man struck the victim several times with his fist following the argument.

That's when the victim reportedly ordered his family members in the yard, including a friend and a four-year-old girl, to go inside the house.

Witnesses say they observed the suspect carrying a black revolver and reported hearing two or three gunshots as the victim ran inside the home.

The suspect then allegedly fled from the scene into a nearby field after firing the shots.

"The victim's four-year-old granddaughter had just run into the bedroom through the hall where I later found the path of two

projectiles that had crossed that hallway at a level that the child would have been struck," Investigator Richard Waldron wrote in his report.

The investigator recovered at least one of the projectiles that had traveled clear across several walls in the home.

Back at the station, at least three witnesses picked the suspect out from a lineup. Two of them said the suspect was the shooter, with the third unable to identify who fired the bullets since she had run inside the home when the shooting occurred.

The witnesses said the shooter had clearly seen the little girl in the entryway of the home before he fired the bullets.

Investigators caught up with Ingram the next day, arresting him and transporting him to the Hendry County Jail for processing.
