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Morning Shooting Endangers Children

Early Monday morning, at approximately 6:40 a.m., shots rang out in Twin Lakes as residents were getting ready for work and children were walking to their bus stop. The Carrizalez family was doing the mundane things that most people do in the morning: making breakfast, showering, and watching television, when they heard gunshots and glass breaking inside of their home.

"I handed my five month old baby to my mother and ran outside to see what was going on," said Mariana Carrizalez, who lives in the home on Ridge Drive. "We saw a car speeding away, but we couldn't identify the color or who was driving it because there are no street lights in Twin Lakes and it was pitch black."

The Carrizalez family contacted the Sheriff's Department immediately, calling in at 6:41 a.m. They claim that deputies did not arrive on the scene until 7 a.m. It wasn't their only complaint.

"We weren't given a card with the case number and the officer didn't take any pictures or even try to locate the bullets," said Carrizalez. "My father was so upset about how the officers handled the investigation."

More concerning, however, was the fact that the shooting took place

Tigers Continue March to Redemption

Slams Dragons in District Game

The Clewiston Tigers took another giant step forward last Friday in their effort to advance to the Regional playoffs. They hammered Lake Placid, 43-6, and in the process, the Tigers improved to 3-1 in the district and picked up their first road win of the year.

As importantly, this district win delivers a positive mindset to players down on themselves after a bitter 40-30 loss to top district seed Dunbar.

"After last week, it was such a tough defeat, it was mentally tough to get back," Tiger Head Coach Joe Roth said. "We didn't have the best week of practice. But we talked to the kids before the game and told them we needed one win, we still had something to play for. The kids responded tremendously."

Now Clewiston has positioned itself to capture the runner-up spot in Class 4A-District 6. Only La Belle stands in the way. A Clewiston win over its county arch rival would give the Tigers an automatic playoff berth, a thought not

lost on the seniors.

"If we keep playing as we've been playing, we can be the team we wanted to be," senior center Miguel Perera said after the game. "We want to go back to Cocoa. We want revenge for last year. That's why we're itching to get back. We have playoff experience."

The road to Cocoa, or whichever team lies ahead in the playoffs, runs through LaBelle. The Tigers and Cowboys collide at Cane Field on Nov. 3 at 7:30 p.m. in Clewiston's homecoming game. The Tigers own a bye this weekend.

Clewiston led Lake Placid, 33-6, at halftime. The final result could have been much worse, but Coach Roth removed senior running backs Virthavious Robinson, Jon Gonzalez, and DeMarcus Terry, inserted freshman Maurice Murphy and sophomore Tyrone Washington, and called no passes in the fourth quarter.

The Tigers rolled up 492 yards of offense, 361 on the ground and 131 through the air. Robinson again paved the way, charging for 226 yards – most of it in the first half – on just 17 carries and two touchdowns. Quarterback Tyler Clemmons marshaled the offense with flawless effi-

Police Respond to Bear Call on Del Rio

Bear sightings are up, reports FWC

At around midnight on a regular Sunday, most people have their eyes closed and are trying to catch some sleep for work the next day.

That was the case this past Sunday, save for one particularly furry resident, who was spotted perusing the town without any clothes on.

We'll call him Barry.

"There was a bear in Clewiston last night," said Police Chief Gutschall.

The bear was first spotted on East Del Rio, where he began his journey through the town. State Biologists were called to control the bear, but were not able to come out and handle the situation. Instead the Police Department and Wildlife workers cooperated together and set up a perimeter around the bear, making sure that it did not come into contact with any civilians.

"The bear actually climbed a tree at one point," said Chief Gutschall.

While it is strange to see a bear roaming Clewiston, it is actually quite common around this time of year.

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Inland Birdwatching Fun: Fulvous Whistling-Duck (FUWD)

The Fulvous Whistling-Duck is one of the most widespread species of waterfowl in the world with separate populations occurring in Asia, Africa, Madagascar, South America, and North America. This subtropical bird was first reported breeding in Florida about 30 years ago. They are known locally as "Fulvous Tree Ducks" or "Large Whistling Teal."

These medium-sized ducks have long legs and necks with a distinct profile that appears more goose-like than duck-like. Adult males and females have a buff to tawny-cinnamon head, chest and belly. The wings and back are darker brown.

There is a silvery border of white tipped feathers between the belly and wings. They have a large blue-gray bill, gray legs, and a white rump patch that is visible when they are in flight. Juveniles have similar plumage, but are paler than adults. Their "kit-tee" call is a noisy high-pitched, two-syllable whistle which is often heard before

these ducks are seen. These gregarious birds are often found in shallow freshwater wetland marshes, lakes and flooded agricultural fields as well as pastures and grasslands with standing water. They are mainly

nocturnal feeders whose diet consists of seeds of water plants, rice, and aquatic invertebrates. Fulvous Whistling-Ducks breed in Florida and raise one brood annually from March through August. Their nest is a simple bowl of dense

floating or flooded emergent vegetation. Surrounding plants are often pulled around the nest to conceal it from predators.

Females lay an average of 13 white to buffy white eggs. These eggs are frequently laid in other Fulvous Whistling-Duck's nests or the nests of other duck species. Both parents incubate the eggs for 24 to 26 days with the young fledging at 55 to 63 days of age.

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
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South Florida Forecast: An Uncommonly Average Dry Season

With water levels currently above average in key areas, the region will likely not see the drought conditions or the water supply challenges of previous years.

South Florida is forecast to experience one of the few dry seasons with near-average rainfall in the past 14 years, officials announced today at a joint briefing by the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) and the National Weather Service (NWS).

"Water managers like to see water levels at their highest safe levels going into the dry season to protect water supplies," said Susan Sylvester, SFWMD Chief of the Water Control Operations Bureau.

"While we still have the potential for significant rainfall this wet season, an average dry season should prevent the water supply concerns of the past several years."

Only two South Florida dry seasons, 1998-1999 and 2003-2004, have actually been about average in the past 14 years, with two above average and 10 below average dry seasons. Released this week, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Climate Prediction Center forecast calls for equal chances of slightly above or slightly below average rainfall for the first three months of the upcoming dry season.

But both NWS and SFWMD climatologists and meteorologists caution that the uncertainty associated with a weather pattern known as El Niño means this dry season forecast has a lower confidence than previous years.

Among the official forecast highlights for the 2012-13 South Florida dry season:

Near normal precipitation is mostly likely during the first part of the dry season, from November to February

A drier-than-normal trend may characterize March and April

Average dry season precipitation: 12 to 15 inches in the interior/west to 15 to 21 inches in

the east

Long-term average winter temperature: 64 to 66 F in the interior/west to 67 to 69 F in the east

Wet Season Update

The new dry season forecast follows a 2012 wet season that has seen above average rainfall in nearly the entire 16-county District, from Orlando to the Florida Keys. District-wide, an average of 41.73 inches of rain, or 6.65 inches above the average, fell between May 8 and Thursday, Oct. 18.

Palm Beach, Broward and Miami-Dade counties, along with the Kissimmee region, experienced the largest rainfall totals, including the historic deluge from Tropical Storm Isaac.

In Palm Beach County alone, nearly 15 inches of rain fell in a 72-hour period. In its flood control operations, the District moved an estimated 105 billion gallons of water away from residents in several counties.

The historic rainfall pushed Lake Okeechobee to 15.9 feet NGVD on Friday, 0.84 inches above its historic average for this time of year.

Highlights of South Florida's Weather Roller Coaster

Normal: Florida receives an average of 52 inches of rainfall a year, with 70 percent falling during the five-month wet season from approximately June through October.

•Record Wet Conditions: Tropical Storm Isaac in late August 2012 proved to be a 1-in-100 year storm event.

•Record Dry Conditions: January 2012 was the driest January in the agency's 16-county region since recordkeeping began in 1932.

•Record Dry Conditions: The 2010-2011 dry

season saw one of its latest starts in 20 years. October 2010 was the driest October on record in South Florida since 1932. The drought continued, with the driest October-to-mid-June period on record.

•Record Wet Conditions: In 2009, the sea breeze cycle ushered in the wet season in May. With 9.04 inches of rain falling across the District, May 2009 became the wettest May on record, according to District records dating back to 1932.

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Florida Soil a Patchwork Quilt for Carbon Content

lieved to be a cause of global climate change. Some landowners may be able to make money by allowing their properties to be used as sites for carbon sequestration.

In a presentation today at the joint meeting of the American Society of Agronomy, Crop Science Society of America and Soil Science Society of America, researchers with UF's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences reported early findings from a statewide study analyzing soil carbon content across areas the size of a football field.

The results confirm what researchers have suspected – that soil carbon content can vary widely on a small site, said Sabine Grunwald, a professor in UF's soil and water science department. That means efforts to amend soil with carbon-rich biomass will need to be tailored to local carbon levels.

The results also confirm that soil carbon variability has a lot to do with how the land is used and what material covers the land, factors known as land use and land cover.

"Land use is highly correlated with soil carbon values," Grunwald said. "So if you know the land use for a particular area, you can predict the amount of soil carbon there."

The findings will help Grunwald and her colleagues develop new digital soil maps that offer greater resolution than past efforts, she said. The maps are needed for precision agriculture, the practice of growing crops using computer-assisted technology that compensates for variable growing conditions. Soil carbon content plays a major role in soil quality, fertility, crop yield and food production.

High-quality digital maps can also assist conservation efforts by giving an accurate assess-

ment of subsurface conditions in an area, she said.

In the study, doctoral student Xiong Xiong took soil samples from five areas, each representing one of five types of land use and land cover commonly found in Florida. They are: pineland, dry prairie, improved pasture, mesic (moderately wet) mixed forest and xeric (dry) upland forest. Together, the five account for about 40 percent of Florida's surface area.

Three of the sites were located near Gainesville, one in the Panhandle and one in South Florida. At each, Xiong took 108 soil samples, starting with several at a home base. Then Xiong sampled at distances of about 2 yards, 8 yards, 25 yards and 75 yards from the home base.

The results showed that, in general, dry prairie and mesic mixed forest had the greatest capacity to store carbon, followed by improved pasture, while pineland and xeric upland forest had the least.

The statewide soil carbon assessment is one part of a three-year study funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Grunwald said.

She and Xiong are already well into a nationwide assessment, made in conjunction with the National Soil Survey Center in Lincoln, Neb., and researchers in Sydney, Australia. More than 6,500 sites have been sampled.

"We should have some data next year," Grunwald said. "The United States urgently needs new soil carbon assessments."

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

Potential Impacts

Wind: Elevated impacts east coast metro areas beginning late Thursday and continuing through Friday Night. Winds increasing on Thursday to NE 20-30 mph during the afternoon with some gusts to 40 mph or higher possible. Winds increasing to N 25-35 mph with possible gusts 45-50 mph most of the day

on Friday, beginning to subside Friday night but remain rather high until Saturday.

If system is larger and/or closer than forecast, even higher winds are possible. These winds would likely lead to downed trees and power lines with many power outages, as well as dangerous conditions for high-profile vehicles and on bridges and overpasses.

Interior and SW Florida: lower winds than indicated above but still gusty winds to as high as 35 mph possible late Thursday and during day

on Friday.

Surf/Beach Erosion: Potential for significant beach erosion and at least minor coastal flooding east coast beaches Thursday night and Friday.

Rain: Heaviest rainfall will probably stay just offshore, however enough rain bands could brush the east coast and lead to 1-2 inches Thursday through Saturday. If heavier rain bands expand farther west then amounts could be at least twice of what I'm indicating. Right now flooding potential is on the low side but will have to monitor very closely. Interior and west coast areas should have little if any rain impacts.

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Overview

The overall forecast thinking as far as track and intensity of Sandy hasn't changed much since yesterday. Models are generally in agreement in a northward track across the central or western Bahamas Thursday and Friday at high-end tropical storm intensity.

A concern for South Florida is the expansion of the wind field to the north and west of the center during this time. This has a direct impact on local winds and seas and is a classic example

Elusive El Niño Challenges NOAA's 2012 U.S. Winter Outlook

The western half of the continental U.S. and central and northern Alaska could be in for a warmer-than-average winter, while most of Florida might be colder-than-normal December through February, according to NOAA's annual Winter Outlook announced today from the agency's new Center for Weather and Climate Prediction in College Park, Md.

Forecasters with NOAA's Climate Prediction Center say a wavering El Niño, expected to have developed by now, makes this year's winter outlook less certain than previous years.

"This is one of the most challenging outlooks we've produced in recent years because El Niño decided not to show up as expected," said Mike Halpert, deputy director of NOAA's Climate Prediction Center.

"In fact, it stalled out last month, leaving neutral conditions in place in the tropical Pacific."

When El Niño is present, warmer ocean water in the equatorial Pacific shifts the patterns of tropical rainfall that in turn influence the strength and position of the jetstream and storms over the Pacific Ocean and United States. This climate pattern gives seasonal forecasters confidence in how the U.S. winter will unfold.

An El Niño watch remains in effect because there's still a window for it to emerge. Other climate factors can influence winter weather across the country.

Some of these factors, such as the North Atlantic Oscillation, a prominent climate pattern, are difficult to predict more than one to two weeks in advance. The NAO adds uncertainty to the winter outlook in the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic portions of the country.

Areas ravaged by extreme drought over the past year are unlikely to see much relief from drought conditions this winter.

In the 2012 U.S. Winter Outlook (December through February) odds favor:

- Warmer-than-average temperatures in much of Texas, northward through the Central and Northern Plains and westward across the Southwest, the Northern Rockies, and eastern

Washington, Oregon and California, as well as the northern two-thirds of Alaska.

- Cooler-than-average temperatures in Hawaii and in most of Florida, excluding the panhandle.

- Drier-than-average conditions in Hawaii, the Pacific Northwest and Northern California, including Idaho, western Montana, and portions of Wyoming, Utah and most of Nevada.

- Drier-than-average conditions in the upper Midwest, including Minnesota, Wisconsin, Iowa and northern Missouri and eastern parts of North and South Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas, and western Illinois.

- Wetter-than-average conditions across the Gulf Coast states from the northern half of Florida to eastern Texas.

The rest of the country falls into the "equal chance" category, meaning these areas have an equal chance for above-, near-, or below-normal temperatures and/or precipitation.

This seasonal outlook does not project where and when snowstorms may hit or provide total seasonal snowfall accumulations. Snow forecasts are dependent upon the strength and track of winter storms, which are generally not predictable more than a week in advance.

NOAA's National Weather Service is the primary source of weather data, forecasts and warnings for the United States and its territories. NOAA's National Weather Service operates the most advanced weather and flood warning and forecast system in the world, helping to protect lives and property and enhance the national economy.



Under the new writing program, each TKA student will have completed a minimum of 60,000 proofed, cited, MLA formatted words before receiving their diploma at graduation.

bear related calls to the FWC are up this year in many parts of Florida. Since January in central and south Florida, the FWC has documented the highest number of calls per month for six of the past nine months.

Fall is a very active time for bears as they eat about three times as much as usual to put on pounds for the winter, even though Florida winters are fairly mild.

"If you are a Florida black bear, raiding a garbage can to eat stale doughnuts and the leftovers from last night's spaghetti may be more appealing than foraging in the woods for palmetto berries and acorns," said David Telesco, the FWC's bear management program coordinator. "Preventing bears' access to food is the most important thing people can do to keep bears and other wild animals out of neighborhoods."

While this particular bear did not forage through any garbage cans, it is still important to be aware of the dangers that bears can present when in a residential setting. As bears are trying to stock up for the winter, they will generally want to take the easier route when it comes to getting food, which can result in a mess or a confrontation.

"Luckily for us he wasn't doing any harm," said Chief Gutshall. "Our biggest concern was with keeping him away from civilians."

The bear's night trek had to end some time, and after a few hours of entertaining local deputies and wildlife workers, he headed Northeast, away from the stale doughnuts in Clewiston residents' garbage cans and onto bigger and better things.

Here are a few tips from the FWC to keep bears away from your home and neighborhood:

Feed your pets indoors or bring in dishes after feeding. Secure household garbage in a shed, garage, or a wildlife-resistant container.

Put household garbage out on the morning of pickup, not the night before.

Secure commercial garbage in bear-resistant dumpsters consisting of metal lids of metal-reinforced plastic lids and lock bars.

Clean grills and store them in a locked, secure place.

Remove wildlife feeders or make them bear-resistant.

Protect gardens, apiaries, compost and livestock with electric fencing.

Pick ripe fruit from trees and remove fallen fruit from ground.

Encourage your homeowners association or local government to institute ordinances on keeping food secure that would attract wildlife.



ciency, hitting 6 of 10 passes for 131 yards and throwing the ball with greater authority.

DeMarcus Terry looked like he had regained the form that he had before his injury. He rushed eight times for 59 yards and scored three touchdowns.

"I felt good, just having to come back and play," he said. "I gave one hundred percent."

Gonzalez added 17 yards on seven carries and his blocking devastated the Dragons and freed Robinson and Terry to wreak their havoc on the defense.

The Tiger defense earned kudos. It held Lake Placid to only 106 yards of total offense, six first downs, and one rushing touchdown after the Tigers had built a 21-0 lead.

More importantly, the defense's penetration

and tackling were rough and tumble. Coach Roth inserted strongman Perara at defensive tackle on various plays as he did last week, and Perara completely clogged the middle. Senior Vinny Llossas, and juniors Brandon Cortez and Raymond Molina, thrashed the Dragon running backs and quarterback Robert Walton, who was leveled flat on one play. Though it resulted in a flag, the play served notice that the Tigers were out of the cage.

If one area of defensive weakness stood out this game, it was in interceptions. About a half dozen times several Tigers put themselves in position to take away the ball from the Dragons. Instead, they let the pigskin fly through their paws, just dropped it, or didn't time their moves correctly. In a tighter game, those failed takeaways could have made critical differences. It's an area Coach Roth plans to address.

Clewiston scored on its first possession. The Tigers began on Lake Placid 44 after a short Dragon punt. The six-play drive featured a 19-yard pass from Clemmons to junior tight end Derrick Jackson and a one-yard dive by Gonzalez. Brandon Torres' extra point was good, and the Tigers led, 7-0, with less than four minutes gone in the game.

The Tigers allowed the Dragon offense one first down on its next possession, then began their second drive on their 32 after a Lake Placid punt. The drive was all of one play. The Tiger O-line opened a gaping hole up the middle. Robinson shot through, veering left. Up the field, he swiveled when one defender appeared to have a good arm around him. Few players ever get a good arm on Robinson, however, and he dashed up near the left sideline, wheeling to his right to elude a closing defender near the goal line. The extra point was good, and barely more than a minute after its first score, Clewis-

ton led, 14-0.

Clewiston scored its third touchdown with a short duration drive that began at the Tigers' own 47 with about 10 seconds left in the first quarter. The Dragons had gone for a first on fourth and seven, but their pass fell incomplete. All it took to score was a series of three runs by Robinson. He gashed Lake Placid for 17, 14, and 22 yards, the last touchdown.

The Dragons used their next possession to blemish an otherwise perfect Clewiston defensive performance. The Dragons returned the kickoff to their 30. The next four plays were an encroachment penalty against Clewiston, a holding penalty against Lake Placid, an incomplete pass, and a personal foul - roughing the passer penalty against Clewiston for decking Walton. That gave the Dragons a first-and-10 at their 40.

A little later in the drive, Walton connected a 39-yard pass that gave the Dragons a first-and-10

and demand this change," said Carrizalez.

While Twin Lakes residents hope to create a change in their community, Carrizalez is just relieved that nobody was harmed in the shooting.

"There were three bullet holes in the wall and a few things were damaged in our shed," said Mariana Carrizalez, "but these are all material things that we are not worried about. We are just happy that everybody came out of this with their lives."

The Sheriff's Department was working on a response in regards to the events that took place, but could not make the information available on the short notice.

at a time when children were most at risk.

"A lot of kids out here were heading to the bus stop around that time," said Carrizalez. "When they heard the gunshots they all started running back to their houses. Somebody could have been injured and we would have never known because we couldn't see anything."

Carrizalez said that her main concern was the safety of residents of Twin Lakes.

"Just because we live in Twin Lakes does not mean that we don't deserve street lights and proper service from police officers," said Carrizalez. "I feel that if this would have happened somewhere else in town it would have been handled differently."

Though the Carrizalez family is not entirely positive as to who did this, they do recall an incident that happened two days prior to the shooting, where words were exchanged and one of the men involved said "I've got something coming for you."

"It may just be a coincidence," said Carrizalez, "but it really stuck with me. I know that there were some kids bragging about being the ones who did it, and with this being such a small town word got around. But who is to say whether or not they really did it or just wanted the credit for doing it?"

In light of the events that took place the Carrizalez family is going to add extra protection to their home and are also starting a petition for the people of Twin Lakes to have street lights installed.

"We need to come together as a community

at the Clewiston 16. Three plays later, Eldon McKenzie rammed in for the Dragon score. The extra point was no good, and Lake Placid trailed, 21-6, with 9:20 left in the second quarter.

The Tigers responded with a four-play, 60-yard drive after they returned the kickoff. Terry followed his blockers and swept in from 20 yards out. A bad snap prevented the extra point, and Clewiston led, 27-6.

Clewiston gained 340 yards by halftime.

The Tigers added 10 points in the third. Sophomore Brandon Torres nailed a 24-yard field goal, and Terry scored on a 19-yard run.


