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A Good Talk Spoiled

Debate about new, championship golf course in LaBelle

A presentation by the vice president of Billy Casper Golf led the Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) into a heated debate at their regular meeting in Clewiston on August 13. Billy Casper Golf is a golf course management firm named for golf legend Billy Casper. It manages over 140 facilities around the country and is currently setting its sights on LaBelle.

Doug White, vice president of Billy Casper Golf, provided the BOCC with an informative presentation on the firm's plans to build a brand new golf course in LaBelle, which the firm plans to have open by November 2014, according to White. The new, classic-style golf course would be designed by Jerry Lemons, president and owner of golf course designing firm Golf Links Inc., and would feature shorter fairways that are friendly to new golfers. Lemons said that, nowadays, golf courses are built "way too long, way too hard, take too much time and are too expensive to play." The shorter fairways would make play easier for beginners, while the strategically placed bunkers and other obstacles would make play challenging for more experienced golfers.

Shooting Strikes Fear in Local Family

Pedro Roman-Feliciano had only been home a few short days after a months-long stint working out of state when he was allegedly shot outside his home by a masked man on August 11.

Though it seemed Feliciano, 27, of Clewiston, was the only target, one bullet grazed the forehead of a five-year-old boy who witnessed the entire frightening scene play out in front of him.

The shooting occurred around 11:30 p.m. on Sunday, August 11.

Feliciano told deputies that he was talking on the phone outside of his home when two people "jumped" him. According to Feliciano's testimony, one of the two alleged attackers shouted "where is the money?" before Feliciano was struck with the pistol.

Feliciano's wife, Sarah Rodriguez, 24, of Clewiston, told The Clewiston News that she came out of her bedroom into the living room when she heard screaming outside. She could

see the gunman standing outside through the open door.

Rodriguez's mother, Sarah Yanes, 48, of Clewiston, also ran out of her bedroom when she heard a gunshot and Feliciano screaming. Yanes told The Clewiston News she heard two gunshots that night, though a second gunshot was not reported in the police report. Yanes also stated Ro-

Clewiston Budget Talks Continue

Discussion revolves around Clewiston Recreation Dept.

Clewiston City Commissioners scrutinized the city's budget for this fiscal year before their regular meeting on August 19. Finance Director Ted Byrd sat before the commissioners with a balanced budget and rifled through the extensive document with commissioners following closely behind.

The millage rate for this fiscal year will remain the same, with one mill generating \$496,980, according to Byrd.

While the Clewiston Golf Course was the topic of conversation at the last budget meeting, Clewiston's recreation department took center stage this time.

According to Byrd and Recreation Director Lance Ramer, the cost of the recreation department's programs are covered 100 percent by registration fees, with the department operating at approximately \$719,000, including the cost of administration, parks, auditoriums and

Musings on True Professionals: Respect for Real Educators

I have noted the proliferation of honorific titles people like today, one of the most common being "doctor." One medical professional is lobbying to have the title restricted to medical doctors (this came as no surprise to me!) and was reminiscent of years gone by when the "doctor" was involved in healing of people and given respect in his community. Nowadays, there are scads of "doctors." It's interesting to me to look at how the title is sometimes conferred.

Certain religious institutions offer doctoral degrees for a few summers of home reading and a rather lengthy "term paper." "Schools" offer them with varying degrees (no pun intended) of rigor and they seem to have an appeal to some who simply must have that title. For me, it came after three and a half years of full-time study and earning two Master's degrees, one from a secular university and one from a seminary. My school

was accredited (many are not accredited) by the U.S. Department of Education and regional accrediting agencies. My work was in one of the healing arts -- an adjunctive skill to my ministry.

In Jesus' day, "Rabbi" was a title of dignity and given to designate those specially revered. Jesus cautioned His followers that there was an equality among them, that they were to follow the one Master and Teacher (Matthew 23:10). He even took exception when a ruler called Him "Good teacher ..." (Luke 18:18), not being concerned about being called "teacher" or "rabbi" but "good." God alone was designated as "good," Jesus' teaching came with a sense of place and humility.

He was revered by the ruler because of what He did and taught, not because of titles. I regard it as unfortunate that we do not hold "teacher" in the same esteem as it once was held: an honorable profession worthy of being respected with the same dignity as that of all true profes-

sionals. Many of them have levels of education equivalent to those in the healing arts and have much to offer to those they serve. I was behind a teacher recently at a check-out counter. She was stocking up on school supplies -- crayons and pencils, notebooks and book-bags. There were too many items to have been a purchase of her own children; it was obvious to me that she was a teacher. I told her, "I hope they appreciate it!" and watched as a three-digit total was rung up. She smiled and commented that she was trying to take advantage of the tax rebate that comes annually for school items. Her purchase was sizeable enough to make this rebate worth seeking on a teacher's salary. I knew I was in the presence of a professional, one worthy of being called "teacher" in the fullest meaning of the term.

I have shared in their ranks, teaching at a Church school, at the college level, in ministerial training programs and in ministry for many

years. The work of being a pastor is teaching on many levels; much of the work is on a one-to-one level and involves sharing between two persons with the hope that the seeker may benefit from a fellow searcher. One of my mentors, a college professor who entered the ministry later in life, shared some Greek etymology. Education, he said, comes from Greek, meaning "to bring out," and has to do with being able to draw out of us what was already inside, making us realize what we knew all of the time.

"Education" is putting it into words, asking the right questions, pointing out what was there, making us realize for ourselves ... and being that genius who can do it. Education in faith is finding what fills that God-sized hole in a heart and showing us who fills it. The rabbi is the one who did it. Those who bring out the best in us, who we really are, deserve our respect and honor. Their presence, dedication and love for their work is an honor that no title can bring.

New Health Findings Can Help Combat Common Ailments

From high blood pressure to cancer, serious ailments often strike, despite efforts to maintain good health.

With the rapid pace of medical advancements and treatment options emerging, conventional medical wisdom can sometimes lag behind innovations in disease management. Furthermore, there's often little attention paid to nutrition's role in health conditions.

"Our healthcare system is a disease model, not a prevention model, and reimbursement is based upon sickness, not wellness. We need to better integrate all facets of care," says Dr. Steven V. patients experience gaps in control, putting them at risk for stroke and heart attack," says Joyal.

Joyal recommends considering the following: With an inexpensive at-home blood pressure monitor, take readings at multiple times throughout the day, tracking values over time. A doctor can determine whether to modify the current treatment regimen based upon the results.

Stay fit and exercise. A healthy body weight and high degree of cardiorespiratory fitness reduce hyp-

ertension risk, and can help one achieve better control if one is already suffering from hypertension.

Hold the salt. High sodium intake can make high blood pressure worse. Read labels. Even if one is not adding extra salt to meals, many pre-packaged convenience foods, meats and cheeses contain significant amounts of sodium.

Get plenty of beneficial nutrients, especially potassium and magnesium, which are important for vascular health.

Rheumatoid Arthritis

Rheumatoid arthritis could pose more than just a risk to comfort. Systemic inflammation hastens the onset of other age-related diseases, including cardiovascular disease.

"For optimal longevity, we need to integrate

lifestyle changes with pharmaceutical treatments, rather than blindly assume that all a patient needs is more medication," says Joyal.

In addition to doctor-prescribed treatments, Life Extension researchers have scoured medical literature, finding several nutrients that help support health in rheumatoid arthritis patients: fish oil, krill oil blend, Gamma linolenic acid, vitamin D, vitamin B6, green tea extract, quercetin, and folate.

Inland Birding Fun: Common Grackle

Common Grackles breed in most areas in North America east of the Rocky Mountains and south of the tundra. Of the three subspecies of this bird, the one known as the Florida Grackle (*Q.q. guiscual*) lives year-round from Southeastern North Carolina south through Florida. The existing subspecies of Common Grackle are distinguished by the color of their back, tail, belly and, to a lesser extent, their head.

Florida Grackles appear to be black from a distance, but normally have a greenish-black back, blue-green tail, purple head and purple-blue belly. These large, lanky birds are smaller than Boat-tailed Grackles.

Their head is flat and they have a slightly downward-curved bill that is longer than those of most blackbirds. Males are slightly larger than females. Young birds are dark brown with a dark eye that turns bright gold when they become adults.

The oldest recorded Common Grackle lived to be 22 years and 11 months old. Common Grackle fossils, which have been found from

Florida to Ontario, have been dated to the Pleistocene Era 12,000 years ago.

These noisy, gregarious birds communicate with body motions, as well as sounds. Males will make a threatening bill-up display, which consists of an upward movement of the head so the bill is almost vertical, or they will spread their tail feathers into a keeled "V" shape accompanied by exaggerated flapping of the wings in response to another male.

Common Grackles songs include a variety of squeaks, whistles and croaks. The typical song of males and females is a guttural "readle-eak," followed by high-pitched clear whistles. They

make a short harsh "chaa" or "chitip" call when alarmed, taking flight or being approached by other grackles. Males' singing decreases through incubation, but they will make a short nasal call while perching in the nesting colony.

These birds prefer habitats near fresh water in cypress swamps, pine forests, hammocks, orange groves and suburban areas. Large flocks are often seen foraging on lawns for seeds or in feedlots and on agricultural fields for grains such as corn or rice. They also eat invertebrates and mice, wade into water to catch small fish, rob eggs from birds' nests and eat adult birds.

Migrating Common Grackles return to their nesting ground from mid-February through early March, with males arriving about a week before the females. In Florida, egg laying may begin as early as March or as late as July.

Females usually choose the nest site and build the nest with occasional help from the male. The bulky nest is built in trees, cattails, bushes, broken stubs, old woodpecker holes and, occasionally, the underside of an active Osprey nest. It is located about two feet above ground or water and is made of coarse grasses, pine needles, roots, twigs, roots and mud. The female lays one to seven slightly glossy eggs, which she incubates for 10 to 14 days while the male remains close-by, guarding the nest from predators. Both parents feed the helpless young by forcing food into the hatching mouths. The young fledge at 16 to 20 days of age.

Panther Sightings Reported in South Florida

The public has reported hundreds of sightings of Florida panthers to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's (FWC) website. The website was launched a year ago and is a place for people to record when and where they saw a panther or its tracks.

As of August 2013, the public had submitted 790 sightings to MyFWC.com/PantherSightings.

Only 12 percent of the reports included a photograph and could be evaluated by Commission biologists. Of those with photos, the majority were

confirmed as panthers. Other animals identified by FWC biologists were bobcats, foxes, coyotes, dogs, house cats and even a monkey. Most often, the reported animal or tracks belonged to a bobcat, not a panther. The verified panther reports were largely confined to Southwest Florida, the well-documented breeding range for panthers in the state. There were also several verified sightings in South-Central Florida.

"The public's willingness to share what they have seen or collected on game cameras is in-

credibly helpful and shows us where panthers presumably are roaming in Florida," said Darrell Land, who heads the FWC's panther team. "We thank everyone using the Report Florida Panther Sightings website and encourage others to participate in this citizen-science venture.

"As the population of this endangered species grows, the FWC expects more Florida panthers to be seen in areas of the state where they have not lived for decades," Land said. "To properly plan and manage for the expansion of the pan-

ther's range in Florida, information about where the panthers are is vital."

The FWC has a new "E-Z guide to identify panther tracks," available at www.FloridaPantherNet.org. The Florida panther population is estimated to be 100 to 160 adults and yearlings, a figure that does not include panther kittens. As recently as the 1970s, the Florida panther was close to disappearing, with as few as 20 animals in the wild. Learn more about Florida panthers at www.FloridaPantherNet.org.



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
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Raising Awareness Naegleria Fowleri Infection

The Florida Department of Health in Hendry and Glades counties continue to raise awareness about *Naegleria fowleri* in light of the recent confirmed case.

There is a standard process that the Department of Health follows for all diseases, regardless of the disease. That process involves interviewing the family to ask about possible exposure sources.

The Department of Health is working closely with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the CDC provided the testing that confirmed the case in Glades County.

The exact water source of exposure cannot be exactly identified because the amoeba occurs naturally in warm freshwater sources such as rivers, lakes, ponds, canals and ditches.

Because the amoeba is found in most freshwater sources, and because of the inconsistency

in test results, the CDC does not recommend specific testing of freshwater sources.

For informational research, the CDC does collect information such as water temperatures, water depths, water clarity and air temperatures in the surrounding areas of where a case has been confirmed. The low number of infections makes it difficult to know why a few people have been infected compared to the millions of other people that used the same or similar waters across the U.S.

There were local news reports questioning

exposure risks from water sprinklers. According to the CDC, there are no reports of infections from this route of exposure in the U.S. and it would be very unlikely that this activity could lead to infection.

If the sprinklers are using canal water, there would be a slightly higher risk, but it would still be very unlikely to contract the disease, since people would not generally force that water up their nose.

The organism is most commonly found in warm freshwater (lakes, rivers, ponds, canals and ditches). It should be removed in treated

tap water that uses filtration and disinfection and would not be expected to be found in groundwater from private wells (the water is cooler than ideal for *Naegleria* growth and there would not be abundant bacteria for *Naegleria* to feed on).


Ways to reduce your risk of infection:

Limit the amount of water going up your nose.

Hold your nose shut, use nose clips or keep your head above water when taking part in warm freshwater-related activities.

Avoid water-related activities in warm freshwater during periods of high water temperature and low water levels.

Avoid digging in or stirring up the sediment while taking part in water-related activities in shallow, warm freshwater areas.



driguez's five-year-old son ran out from behind her towards Feliciano and hugged his leg just as the second gunshot went off, striking Feliciano in the upper right thigh and grazing the five-year-old boy's forehead as it exited the other side of Feliciano's leg.

The three witnesses identified the suspect as Kevin Spaulding, 24, having recognized his voice.

Feliciano was airlifted to Lee Memorial Hospital to be treated for his injuries. Rodriguez's son was transported to Hendry Regional Medical Center, where he received several staples in his head, according to the police report. Both were home the next day.

Spaulding was arrested after Clewiston Police Department's K-9 Unit was called in to assist. The K-9 unit followed Spaulding's scent from Fe-

liciano's house, across a canal with a pipe crossing, to another residence less than a mile away, where he was arrested on charges of battery, aggravated battery, robbery and child neglect, according to the arrest report.

The second person, who allegedly jumped Feliciano along with the shooter, was not apprehended, though Feliciano, Rodriguez and Yanes believe they know who the person was.

Rodriguez and Yanes both told The Clewiston News they recognized the voice and body type of the second assailant and identified her as Rodriguez's ex-girlfriend. The two also stated that after the incident, Rodriguez's five-year-old son repeatedly said that Rodriguez's ex-girlfriend and Kevin "shot him."

They also reported that Rodriguez's ex-girlfriend had made death threats against Feliciano prior to the shooting. Yanes stated that she "didn't think anything of the threats."

According to Rodriguez and Yanes, however, the HCSO said they do not have enough evidence

to arrest Rodriguez's ex-girlfriend, despite their testimony.

Since the shooting, Feliciano and his family are constantly on guard in their own home. With the lights turned off and curtains drawn, Rodriguez told a reporter that her five-year-old son is afraid to go to the bathroom alone and refuses to look out the windows. Yanes explained that she and the family are out of the house by 6 p.m., before it gets dark.

"I'm staying at a friend's house because I'm afraid for me and my children," said Yanes.

The situation escalated on Thursday, August 15 at Westside Elementary School's Open House. Yanes said that a friend of her ex-girlfriend's family allegedly attacked her in front of the school. According to Yanes, the woman was parked in a taxi at the front of the school and began yelling profanities at Yanes. Yanes then stated the woman got out of the taxi, slapped her across the face, pushed her into a park bench and began hitting her. Rodriguez, with her right arm in a sling, stat-

ed she then stepped in to try and pull the woman off of her mother and a fist fight followed.

A police report was filed, not by Yanes and Rodriguez, but by the woman.

According to the police report, the woman stated Yanes initiated the fight by yelling profanities and slapping her across the face. The woman also stated that Rodriguez joined in the fight and attacked her, according to the report.

All three women were issued trespass warnings against the school, according to the report, a condition that both Rodriguez and Yanes are upset about.

Rodriguez said that this is her son's first year in elementary school and now she cannot take him to school or drop him off.

"It's my son's first year of elementary school and now we're banned because of what that girl did," Rodriguez said.

The new facility would also incorporate a practice putting range and a short-game practice area with PGA golf professionals on-site to help players with their game, said Lemons.

The golf course would be paid partly by a Municipal Service Benefit Unit (MSBU) program -- 78 percent, according to White -- and the rest would come from the commercial aspects of the course, including food and drink sales and any banquets held at the facility. Though Billy Casper Golf would build and maintain the golf course, any cash profits from the facility would belong to the city of LaBelle, according to White.

During his presentation, White delved into the numbers he and Billy Casper Golf believe would be achieved at the new course. According to White, the course is projected to bring 41,000 rounds per year -- 12,000 potential rounds from members, 34,000 potential rounds from the public and 7,000 potential rounds from seasonal visitors.

White also said the golf course could be maintained at \$450,000 per year, a relatively low number that White attributes to the golf course's initial "from the ground up" design. Because Billy Casper Golf is maintaining the course, they will

be in charge of the payroll -- a potential \$200,000 per year savings, according to White -- and the account books. The attractive presentation left room for skeptics to step in and question the numbers. Commissioner Al Perry was the first to speak up. "We have a very nice municipal golf course right up the road," said Commissioner Perry in reference to the Clewiston Golf Course. "We don't get 22 thousand rounds per year, I don't think we ever have. It's probably more like 15 to 16 thousand annual rounds. I don't understand how you can justify you're going to get 42 thousand rounds the first year in LaBelle. I love the game of golf and I'm not against this, it just doesn't make any sense to me. These numbers just don't add up and I don't know where you got them from. If you can convince me otherwise I'll get behind you, but I don't see you meeting these numbers."

White countered Commissioner Perry's argument by saying the course would pull tourists from the Fort Myers area because it carries the name of the fourth greatest golfer in the history of the game.

White also declared that Billy Casper Golf has the highest retention of golfers in the industry. The new course, White said, would bolster the largest growing area of municipal golf, ladies golf, and would utilize social media and other marketing techniques to bring in customers. The course would need to bring in \$1.2 million

per year in order to make a profit, according to White, and he seemed confident that the course would be able to achieve it.

Commissioner Perry was set and ready to argue a counterpoint when Commissioner Don Davis stepped into the conversation. "This has no ride-along taxes involved whatsoever. The businesspeople of LaBelle want to do this. It ain't got nothing to do with Clewiston, Pioneer or nothing. It's the businesspeople that want this," stated Commissioner Davis.

Commissioner Perry rebutted. "I represent the people of LaBelle and I don't think they're getting the true numbers and I don't think he's going to convince me otherwise," he said.

Commissioner Davis criticized Commissioner Perry for judging the new course by the "way Clewiston's been run," and insinuated that Clewiston Golf Course was losing money because of mismanagement. Commissioner Perry responded. "No, I'm not doing that and I'm sorry you don't like it. ... I know how to compare numbers. I'm questioning his numbers that are inflated, in my opinion, and the people of LaBelle need to know that," he said, matter of factly. The conversation was ended by Commissioner Davis, who told Commissioner Perry to "go ahead and do your thing, baby." White thanked the commissioners for their attention, and the board was left to ponder the presentation and to consider whether or not the golf course would live up to

Billy Casper Golf's expectations.

Apart from listening to the presentation, county commissioners voted five to zero to use Public Risk Management (PRM) for the county's property and casualty insurance policy for fiscal year 2014.

The vote came after a lengthy discussion about the appraisal company PRM uses to calculate the cost of replacing buildings and other such assets after a natural disaster occurs.

Chairman Karson Turner said the "county was removed from the equation" when contractors were brought in to rebuild after Hurricane Wilma in 2005, and he does not want to see that repeated.

The discussion ended when PRM representative Andrew Cooper assured commissioners that Hendry County would be happy with its contractor from day one.

Cooper also suggested the board find one or two contractors who would be willing to set up a pre-contract, that way the contractors would be waiting for the county's call should any type of disaster take place.

Before the meeting adjourned, commissioners also voted five to zero to rescind the bid award to outsource the mowing of county facilities.

The county was able to use its own ground-keeping staff to mow the facilities, avoiding three layoffs that would have resulted had the county used a private company to do the mowing.

recreation programs. The recreation department would also be starting off fiscal year 2014 with \$47,500 in their budget.

This year, the John Boy Auditorium was removed from the recreation department's budget and analyzed as its own separate entity. By doing this, the commissioners were able to see exactly what it costs to operate the auditorium. According to Byrd, half of the cost of operation is covered by the fees paid in order to use to auditorium.

This revelation led to a conversation about who uses the auditorium. According to Byrd, roughly half of the organizations utilizing the auditorium are governmental organizations, as well as nonprofit organizations. Nonprofits are required to pay a fee of \$500 to use the auditorium, while governmental organizations are able to use the facility at no charge.

Florida Game and Fish is one of the organizations using the auditorium regularly at no charge. Commissioner Mali Gardner questioned why Florida Game and Fish would come to Clewis-

ton in order to conduct their meetings, instead of staying in the West Palm Area.

Ramer explained that Florida Game and Fish use the facility quarterly to discuss issues regarding Storm Water Treatment Area-5, as well as Lake Okeechobee maintenance. Ramer added that the members "gas up and eat at our restaurants," and he wants them to "keep coming."

The recreation conversation eventually led to the topic of East County Recreation (ECR). Mayor Phillip Roland explained that, at the moment, Clewiston businesses and residents are paying 11 percent of their taxes to recreation. ECR would create a per unit tax amount for all businesses and residents, including unincorporated residents in Eastern Hendry County. Currently, however, ECR cannot get off the ground to make the system work. Commissioners and other ECR board members are looking to West County Recreation, which has a well-functioning system, for guidance.

"If we can get this thing up and running like West Rec has, it is going to be better for every taxpayer on the east side of the county for recreation. ... It's going to be a tough two years to get this thing to go through the hoops and to level out," said Mayor Roland.

Commissioner Gardner asked if it was pos-

sible to have ECR in place for the next budget year. Mayor Roland responded that his hope was to have every unit taxed by 2014 or 2015.

The budget meeting was then followed by the city commission's regular meeting.

Ramon Iglesias of Clewiston Marina, Inc. asked commissioners to allow a special exception for the Marina to operate an RV Park within a residential district.

The park would be located on the Marina's property and would consist of 42 units housing non-permanent, seasonal residents. Iglesias also asked commissioners to allow a mobile home to be placed within the park to be used as the caretaker's home.

Commissioners voted five to zero to allow the Marina to operate the RV Park with certain conditions, including planting a vegetative buffer along the west side of the property and directing the lighting away from neighboring residents. Commissioners also stipulated that the caretaker's mobile home must "look like new" in order to be used on the property.

Commissioner Gardner commended the RV Park, sighting the improvements such economic development could bring to Clewiston.

Another agenda item at the commission meeting included a request by Clewiston resident

Mary Jackson to reduce the amount of a code violation against her home. In 2010, Jackson was issued a code violation for a sewer project. Jackson was under the impression that she took care of the violation, however, it was only partially fixed and fees continued to accrue over the next couple of years. What began as a \$300 violation cost, turned into \$18,000 after three years of daily \$25 fees.

Commissioners voted four to one -- with Commissioner Gardner voting against the motion -- to reduce Jackson's fee to \$10,000 plus the principal of the sewer lien, to be paid within 90 days.

The issue, however, led to a conversation about better informing residents when they have similar, daily-accruing fees.

Commissioners recommended that a system be in place to send letters out every 90 days or every six months to inform residents that a fee is accumulating.

Before the meeting adjourned, commissioners acknowledged the issue of downtown parking, after Commissioner Rodriguez entertained the idea of adding parking spaces near his business. Commissioners agreed to discuss the issue at length at the start of the new fiscal year in October.

Preparation of an Environmental Assessment and Scoping Meetings for Airglades Airport, Hendry County, Florida

SUMMARY: Pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969, Hendry County is preparing an Environmental Assessment (EA) to address the proposed privatization and subsequent development of a 10,000-foot air cargo runway and related cargo and aircraft maintenance facilities at the Airglades Airport, 1090 Airglades Blvd., Clewiston, Florida 33440. Once completed, the EA will be submitted to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) for the agency's decision to either prepare an Environmental Impact Statement or issue a Finding of No Significant Impact. To ensure all issues and public concerns related to the proposed actions are identified and considered in the EA, the county will hold one governmental agency Scoping Meeting and one public Scoping Meeting.

AIRPORT INFORMATION: The Airglades Airport is a public-use, general aviation airport. The airport presently has a 5,905-foot paved runway, access taxiways, aircraft parking apron, aircraft storage and maintenance hangars, and a passenger terminal building. The airport supports business flights (including jets), recreational flying, flight training, and sky diving activities. The airport also supports a relatively new industrial park. The Florida Dept. of Transportation shows that the airport had 24 based aircraft in 2011 and generated approximately 11,527 aircraft operations the same year.

PROPOSED ACTIONS: The FAA informed Hendry County that the preliminary application for Airglades Airport's participation in the Airport Privatization Pilot Program (APPP) was accepted on October 18, 2010. The letter also indicated that Hendry County may select a private operator, negotiate an agreement and submit a final application. The private operator has been selected; draft management and purchase agreements have been submitted to FAA for review; and a final application is being prepared for submission to the FAA in 2014. The proposed actions and airport development expected to occur if the application is approved include:

- Acquisition of the Airglades Airport by a Private Developer for the construction and operation of a new Perishable Air Cargo Complex
- Acquisition of approximately 250 additional acres of land to accommodate the new north/south runway development
- New 10,000'x150' Runway including parallel and connecting Taxiways
- New Perishable Air Cargo Distribution Center, including all associated inspection services such as U.S. Department of Agriculture, U.S. Customs and Border Protection, and Transportation Security Administration
- New Maintenance, Repair, and Overhaul (MRO) Facilities, including Aircraft Paint Facility and associated aircraft parking apron
- New Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting (ARFF) Facility
- New Ground Support Equipment (GSE) Facility
- New Aircraft Apron Areas to support 10 wide-body Aircraft
- New Air Traffic Control Tower (ATCT) Facility
- New Fuel Storage Facilities, including Apron Hauling Fueling
- New Warehouse and Distribution Facilities
- Vehicular Access and Automobile and Truck Parking Facilities
- Site Improvements including Drainage, Stormwater Detention, Utilities, Etc.
- Establishment of Two (2) Category III Instrument Landing Systems (ILS), including associated Approach Light Systems (ALS), Site Preparation, and Equipment Installation

EA PREPARATION: FAA actions related to the privatization of Airglades Airport and the development of a new air cargo runway (and related facilities) require environmental analysis, coordination, and documentation conforming to the provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) and guidance contained in the FAA's Airport Environmental Handbook (Order 1050.1E) and FAA's NEPA Implementing Instructions for Airport Actions (Order 5050.4B). Hendry County will prepare the EA and assess the environmental, social, and economic impacts associated with the proposed actions at the Airglades Airport. SCOPING COMMENTS: Comments and suggestions are invited from federal, state, and local agencies; governments; Native American tribe officials and representatives; the public; and other interested parties to ensure that the full range of alternatives and all issues and public concerns related to the proposed action are identified and considered in the EA. Written comments and suggestions concerning the scope of the EA should be mailed to Hendry County at the address listed below. Comments should be post-marked no later than October 19, 2013.

Public and Agency Scoping Meetings: Hendry County will hold one (1) public scoping meeting to solicit input from the public and interested parties and one (1) agency scoping meeting to solicit input from federal, state, and local agencies, governments, and Native American officials and representatives which have jurisdiction by law or have specific expertise with respect to any environmental impacts associated with the proposed project. The public and agency scoping meetings will be held September 19, 2013 at the **John B. Boy Auditorium, 1200 WC Owen Avenue, Clewiston, Florida 33440.** The public meeting will be held from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. The agency scoping meeting will be held from 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. and is being held specifically for agencies, government officials, and Native American tribe officials and representatives.
