Fireworks Show a Go for July 4th

The city of Clewiston will continue their years-long tradition of providing a free fireworks display for the community this year on the Fourth of July.

Independence Day 2014 falls on a Friday, and the fireworks show is set to begin promptly after dark at Sugarland Sports Complex, according to Public Works Director Sean Scheffler.

Scheffler, who has worked for the city of Clewiston for the past 35 years, said the city has been putting on an annual display since before he joined their team.

Though the show may not grow "bigger and better" as the years prog-

ress, the city utilizes the same amount of money each year for the show. Unfortunately, as costs go up from year to year, the show must go on with the same amount of funding, said Scheffler.

The city contracts through Zambelli Fireworks, out of Boca Raton, which provides everything needed for the show, including the explosives, permits, safety equipment and man power. Zambelli comes in, shoots, cleans up and goes, said Scheffler.

The fireworks show begins at dusk -- around 8:30 p.m. -- at Sugarland Sports Complex in Clewiston. There are no other city sponsored events on July 4 this year.

FCAT Scores Released for H.C. Schools

The results of the FCAT 2.0 Reading, Writing, Mathematics and Science were released by the Florida Department of Education earlier this month, including results for each individual school in all of Florida's counties.

In 2014, Hendry County schools saw both increases and decreases in scores across all subject areas, and failed to meet the statewide average in almost all grade levels in all subject areas, except for a few exceptions.

Clewiston High School

10th grade reading scores climbed

from 2013 to 2014, with 39 percent of students earning a passing score of 3.0 or higher this year, compared to 34 percent in 2013.

Ninth grade reading scores decreased, on the other hand, with 38 percent of students earning a passing score in 2014 compared to 42 percent in 2013.

10th grade writing scores increased 12 percentage points this year, with 48 percent of students earning a passing score of 3.5 or higher in 2014, compared to 36 percent in 2013.

This year's FCAT 2.0 Writing had students writing an expository piece, compared to a persuasive piece in 2013.

Clewiston Middle School

Eighth grade reading scores dropped three percentage points this year compared to last, with 39 percent passing in 2014 and 42 percent pass-

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Indoor Tanning Raises Risk of Melanoma: FDA Strengthens Warnings for Sunlamp Products

To help protect consumers and inform them about the risks of indoor tanning, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is strengthening its regulation of sunlamp products, such as tanning booths and tanning beds, and requiring that they carry a visible, black-box warning that sunlamp products should not be used on people under 18 years of age.

Using sunlamp products, such as tanning beds or tanning booths, increases the risk of skin damage, skin cancer and eye injury, according to the FDA and numerous other health organizations. A particularly dangerous result is melanoma, the deadliest type of skin cancer.

According to the American Academy of Dermatology and the World Health Organization, indoor tanning heightens the risk of developing melanoma by 59 percent, and the risk goes up with each use. Despite these risks, according to the American Cancer Society (ACS), thousands of Americans will opt for an indoor tan. The ACS estimates that nearly 13,000 people die each year from skin cancers — approximately 9,700

of which are from melanoma. The ACS predicts that in 2014, melanoma will account for 76,100 cases of skin cancer.

To help protect consumers and inform them about the risks of indoor tanning, FDA is changing its regulation of sunlamp products and UV lamps intended for use in sunlamp products. The changes strengthen the oversight of these devices and require that sunlamp products carry a visible, black-box warning stating that they should not be used on people under the age of 18.

This change is due to concerns that the effects of UV radiation add up over time, and children and teenagers who are exposed to indoor UV radiation are at greater risk for skin and eye damage.

"There is increasing evidence that tanning in childhood to early adult life increases the risk of skin cancer, including melanoma," says FDA dermatologist Markham Luke, M.D., Ph.D. In fact, according to an overview of studies published in the journal Pediatrics, melanoma is the second most common cancer in women in their 20s

and the third most common cancer in men in their 20s in the U.S. Luke adds that many experts believe that at least one reason is the increased use of sunlamp products by U.S. teenagers and young adults.

The overview in Pediatrics suggests that doses of UV radiation emitted by high pressure sunlamp products may be up to 10 to 15 times higher than that of the midday sun, an intensity not found in nature. UV-A radiation penetrates to the deeper layers of the skin and is often associated with allergic reactions, such as rashes. This is not to say that outdoor tanning is safe. In fact, the World Health Organization has classified all UV radiation as carcinogenic (cancer causing).

Stronger Regulations, Better-Informed Consumers

Manufacturers of sunlamp products (including tanning beds and booths) must comply with applicable FDA regulations for both medical de-

ing in 2013. Seventh grade reading scores also dropped this year, with 38 percent passing in 2014 compared to 44 percent passing in 2013. Sixth grade reading scores stayed the same this year, with 42 percent passing in both 2013 and 2014.

On the FCAT 2.0 Mathematics, eighth grade scores increased this year, with 33 percent passing in 2014, compared to 31 percent in 2013. Seventh grade math scores also increased from 31 percent passing in 2013 to 33 percent passing in 2014. Sixth grade math scores also increased by one percentage point this year, with 41 percent passing in 2014 compared to 40 percent in 2013.

Both eighth grade science scores and eighth grade writing scores increased from 2013 to 2014, with 29 percent passing the science exam and 36 percent passing the writing exam in 2014, compared to 27 percent passing science and 28 percent passing writing in 2013.

Westside Elementary School

Fifth grade reading scores dropped this year by two percentage points, with 51 percent passing in 2014 compared to 53 percent in 2013. Fourth grade reading scores stayed the same this year, with 49 percent passing in 2014 and 2013, while third grade reading scores climbed 12 percentage points from 36 percent passing in 2013 to 48 percent passing in 2014.

Fifth grade math scores increased this year from 68 percent passing in 2013 to 71 percent passing in 2014. WES fifth graders also trumped the state average score of 56 percent passing.

Fourth grade math scores also increased from 57 percent passing in 2013 to 62 percent passing in 2014. Third grade math scores, on the other hand, fell one percentage point this year compared to last, with 40 percent passing in 2014 as opposed to 41 percent passing in 2013.

Fifth grade science scores were above both last year's scores and this year's state average,

with 57 percent passing in 2014 compared to 54 percent in 2013, and compared to the 2014 state average of 54 percent passing.

Fourth grade writing scores stayed at 29 percent this year.

Eastside Elementary School

Fifth grade reading scores fell three percentage points this year from 53 percent passing in 2013 to 51 percent passing in 2014. Fourth grade reading scores also fell from 59 percent passing in 2013 to 51 percent passing in 2014. Third grade reading scores, on the other hand, climbed from 38 percent passing in 2013 to 44 percent passing in 2014.

Fifth grade math scores decreased this year from 63 percent in 2013 to 58 percent in 2014, but that was still enough to beat the state average of 56 percent passing this year.

Fourth graders saw a similar situation, with scores decreasing from 85 percent passing in 2013 to 77 percent passing in 2014, while still beating out the state average of 63 percent passing this year.

Third grade scores stayed the same from last year to this year, with 45 percent of students passing.

Fifth grade science scores climbed from 45 percent passing in 2013 to 53 percent passing in 2014, while fourth grade writing scores decreased from 49 percent passing in 2013 to 39 percent in 2014.

Central Elementary School

Fifth grade reading scores decreased 19 percentage points from 2013 to 2014, with only 30 percent passing in 2014 compared to 49 percent passing in 2013. Fourth grade reading scores, however, increased slightly from 38 percent in 2013 to 42 percent in 2014. Third grade scores also increased from 27 percent in 2013 to 32 percent in 2014.

Fifth grade math scores decreased 22 percentage points from 2013 to 2014, with only 36 percent passing this year, compared to 58 percent passing last year. Fourth grade math scores also decreased from 44 percent passing in 2013

to 37 percent passing in 2014. Third grade math scores decreased, as well, from 30 percent passing in 2013 to 24 percent passing in 2014.

Fifth grade science scores dropped 22 percentage points from 38 percent passing in 2013 to only 16 percent passing in 2014. Fourth grade scores dropped 18 percentage points on the writing exam, with only 18 percent passing in 2014 compared to 36 percent passing in 2013.

County Comparison

Clewiston and LaBelle schools earned relatively similar scores across all subject areas at the middle and high school levels, but saw LaBelle schools performing better on the sixth and eighth grade reading exams, the sixth and eighth grade math exams and the eighth grade science exams. Clewiston's middle and high schools scored higher on the seventh grade math exams and the 10th grade writing exams, compared to LaBelle's middle and high schools.

At the elementary level, both Clewiston and LaBelle schools saw instances where one school scored significantly higher on an exam compared to all other elementary schools in the county. LaBelle's Country Oak Elementary School, for example, saw 60 percent of its fourth grade students passing the reading exam, compared to 49 percent, 51 percent and 42 percent at Clewiston's schools, and 44 percent and 55 percent at LaBelle's schools. On the other hand, Eastside Elementary saw 77 percent of its fourth grade students passing the math exam compared to 49 percent, 63 percent and 71 percent passing at LaBelle's three elementary schools, and 58 percent and 38 percent passing at Clewiston's other elementary schools.

In another instance, Westside Elementary School's fifth grade students scored significantly higher, on average, on the math exam compared to all other elementary schools in the county, while Country Oak Elementary's third graders scored higher on the math exam, on average, compared to all other elementary schools.

Inland Birding: Wood Stork

Wood Storks are known locally by many names, including Flinthead or Iron Head, because of the wrought-iron look of their featherless heads.

Adult Wood Storks have a black face and a thick, down-curved, dusky, yellow bill. This long-legged, mostly white bird is the only stork that presently breeds in North America. On land, it appears all white, with blackish-gray legs and pink feet. When it flies with its out-

stretched neck, black can be seen on the trailing edge of the wings. Juvenile Wood Storks have duller feathers and are generally browner on the neck and have a paler bill than the adult. Wood Storks are usually silent, but make nasally, barking calls while in the nesting colony.

Their diet consists of fish and occasionally crayfish, amphibians, baby alligators or snakes. Wood Storks are tactile feeders who fish by touch. They slosh their bills around in the water or startle prey into their bill by stirring up the

water with their foot. When prey touches the bill, the Wood Stork snaps its mouth shut. This snap reflex is the fastest reflex measured in any vertebrate.

Wood Storks nest in colonies with up to 25 large, stick nests in one tree. Eggs are incubated by both parents in 27 to 32 days.

Chicks weigh about two ounces at birth and are unable to fly. Week-old chicks are fed by adults about 15 times per day. A colony is considered successful if at least 1.5 young fledge per nest.



The Trinity: Thoughts for the 21st Century

There are certain paradoxes for those who require simple answers to life's questions. What happens inside of my computer to give me all of the material it can generate? How does my body heal itself when I am sick? Why should relationships range from friendship to enemies even if I am the same person to all I meet? Why do people love each other? The list can go on and on. I don't ever expect to know all of the answers; there is no person on the face of the earth that has all of the answers to everything. In faith, there are paradoxes, too. Religion has its mysteries and has had them from the beginning. For Christians, the idea that the Lord is both God and man is a mystery.

How God reveals Himself as a Trinity is another great mystery, too. I try to share it by using familiar examples: "Water, ice, steam" – three manifestations of the same matter, but basically

the same stuff. Saint Patrick used the shamrock to explain to the Irish people about the three-and-one nature of God. All means to explain are useful, none are perfect. But there are others who want things simpler. One scholar felt we don't need a "committee God." Others still deny there is more than one nature to God; monotheism has been around for a long time. Others believe that there was a prophet that lived a long time ago and did good things, but certainly wasn't God. I note from the earliest times our spiritual ancestors understood God as one

paradox, a mystery not to be understood, but to be accepted. More important for me is that I do not have to understand but accept.

When I accept, I can make use of and be thankful for all of the paradoxes in my life. I can use the computer, I can be thankful I am healed when I need to be, I can be thankful for friends and come to terms with those who are not friendly, I can accept that I am loved by others and never understand why. Now, I can also accept the idea that God, too, is a mystery and I can accept it.

This revelation helps me live in the world that God has created. As I read the news and see it on TV, I cannot help but wonder what goes on in the minds of those who do many of the crazy things that I see. Recently, the President was disturbed about

the rash of school shootings. More recently we hear about people going berserk on an aircraft in flight and being dangerous to passengers and crew, as well as to themselves. What is it that makes such people not stand others to a degree that they will endanger them and themselves?

Is it perhaps that they cannot accept some of the paradoxes of life, that others are different

and not to be understood, but to be respected in their right to have life and peace too? Is it perhaps that their world is full of fear of the unknown and it manifests itself by lashing out in destructive ways? People are different, they are not understood, I don't have all of the answers. If somehow I interpret their actions as "bullying" or hostile toward me, does that somehow give me the right to do damage? Rather, I have to come to terms with the things I don't understand. I accept the differences, avoid them if need be, and, yes, they cause me problems, but I know there are mysteries out there and I live accordingly. Maybe God is revealing His nature to us to say we will not fully understand, but we can appreciate, enjoy, tolerate, respect. No need to lose your bearings and go off the deep end. It works for the faithful, it can work for you too.



Medical Marijuana Legislation Signed by Gov. Rick Scott

What Floridians need to know about senate bill 1030, "The Compassionate Medical Cannabis Act of 2014"

FLORIDA MARIJUANA INFO

Florida has become the 22nd state in the nation (23rd to legalize, including Washington, D.C.) to pass legislation supporting the use of marijuana for medicinal purposes. Governor Rick Scott signed Senate Bill 1030 -- the "Charlotte's Web" bill -- on June 16, with overwhelming support from Florida citizens and the Florida legislature. The bill passed 111-7 in the House and 30-9 in the Senate.

"This is definitely a major step in furthering medical marijuana usage in our state," said David Cohn, editor-in-chief of FloridaMarijuanaInfo.org. "But it's important our citizens clearly understand what this bill means to people suffering from debilitating diseases, and the pros and the cons associated with it."

About SB 1030

In its most simple form, SB1030 decriminalizes medical professionals' recommendations and patients' use of a particular strain of a low-THC cannabis for specific medicinal purposes. It means a doctor can 'order' the usage of a certain strain of cannabis for treatment of specific ailments as outlined in the bill. These ailments include cancer, Parkinson's disease, multiple

sclerosis, other physical medical conditions that chronically produce symptoms of seizures or severe and persistent muscle spasms, and its original intended purpose -- pediatric epilepsy. (The strain was named 'Charlotte's Web' after Charlotte Figi, a five year old who experienced a

reduction of seizures after taking the drug.)

The physicians must be appropriately licensed and patients must be Florida residents. The physician must add the patient to the newly formed "compassionate use registry."

It allows for five companies to be licensed

to cultivate, process and dispense the approved strain in an oil format. These companies will be based in four corners of the state, and one in the center of the state.

It does not allow a smokable form of marijuana; only the oil form is included in the legislation.

"We are following this story intensely," said Cohn, "and we have outlined some items we believe the public should be aware of. As we get closer to the November 2 ballot initiative, we will be commenting on how the legalization of marijuana for medical use will impact the state of Florida, including Florida's economy, health-care system, the travel industry, etc."

'Drain and Cover'

FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

The Florida Department of Health in Hendry and Glades Counties would like to remind residents and visitors that it is important to "Drain and Cover" this National Mosquito Control Awareness Week. Please take simple precautions to protect from mosquito-borne illnesses which have received increased attention recently in Florida. "One way folks can help to prevent mosquito-borne illnesses is to follow the "Drain and Cover" method," said Pat Dobbins, Administrator/Health Officer for the Florida Department of Health in Hendry and Glades Counties.

DRAIN standing water to stop mosquitoes from multiplying. Drain water from garbage cans, house gutters, buckets, pool covers, coolers, toys, flower pots or any other containers where sprinkler or rain water has collected. Discard old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken appliances and other items that

aren't being used. Empty and clean birdbaths and pets' water bowls at least once or twice a week. Protect boats and vehicles from rain with tarps that don't accumulate water. Maintain swimming pools in good condition and appropriately chlorinated. Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use. COVER skin with clothing or repellent. Clothing: Wear shoes, socks, and long pants and long-sleeves. This type of protection may be necessary for people who must work in areas where mosquitoes are present. Repellent: Apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing. Always use repellents according to the label. Repellents with DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, and IR3535 are effective. Use mosquito netting to protect children younger than two months old. COVER doors and windows with screens to keep mosquitoes out of your house. Repair broken screening on windows, doors, porches, and patios.

City of Clewiston to Utilize CodeRED Emergency Notification System

The city of Clewiston has contracted with Emergency Communications Network to license its CodeRED high-speed notification solution. The CodeRED system provides city officials the ability to quickly deliver messages to targeted areas or the entire city.

Danny Williams, city of Clewiston Utilities Director, cautioned that such systems are only as good as the telephone number database supporting them. "If your phone number is not in the database, you will not be called." One of the reasons the CodeRED system was selected is it

gives individuals and businesses the ability to add their own phone numbers directly into the system's database, this is an extremely important feature. "No one should automatically assume his or her phone number is included," Williams said urging all individuals and businesses to log onto the city of Clewiston's website, www.clewiston-fl.gov, and follow the link to the "CodeRED Community Notification Enrollment" page.

Those without Internet access may call Clewiston Utilities' Customer Service Center line at 863-983-1454, Monday through Friday from 8

a.m. to 5 p.m., to supply their information over the phone. Required information includes first and last name, street address (physical address, no P.O. boxes), city, state, zip code, and primary phone number, additional phone numbers can be entered, as well. All businesses should register, as well as all individuals who have unlisted phone numbers, who have changed their phone number or address within the past year, and those who use a cellular phone or VoIP phone as their primary number. Williams explained, "CodeRED allows geographically based delivery,

which means street addresses are required to ensure emergency notification calls are received by the proper individuals in a given situation. The system works for cell phones, too, but we need to have an associated street address to provide relevant messages."

Williams stated, "CodeRED gives those who want to be included an easy and secure method for inputting information. The data collected will only be used for emergency notification purposes." Questions should be directed to the City of Clewiston Utilities, 863-983-1454.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER PBC System 11

TESTS SHOWED THE PRESENCE OF COLIFORM BACTERIA

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this incident was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do and what we did to correct this situation.

System 11 routinely monitors for the presence of drinking water contaminants. During April 2014, we took a total of 70 distribution samples to test for the presence of coliform bacteria. 17.1 percent of these samples tested positive for coliform bacteria. During May 2014, we took a total of 57 distribution samples to test for the presence of coliform bacteria. 10.5 percent of these samples tested positive for coliform bacteria. During June 2014, we took a total of 61 distribution samples to test for the presence of coliform bacteria. 14.8 percent of these samples tested positive for coliform bacteria.

The standard is that no more than 5 percent of our samples may test positive.

What should I do?

You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective actions. However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.

If you have a severely compromised immune system, have an infant, are pregnant, or are elderly, you may be at increased risk and should seek advice from your health care providers about drinking this water. General guidelines on ways to lessen the risk of infection by microbes are available from EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1-800-426-4791.

What does this mean?

This is not an emergency. If it had been, you would have been notified within 24 hours. Total coliform bacteria are generally not harmful themselves.

Coliforms are bacteria which are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, potentially-harmful, bacteria may be present. Coliforms were found in more samples than allowed and this was a warning of potential problems.

Usually, coliforms are a sign that there could be a problem with our treatment or distribution system (pipes). Whenever we detect coliform bacteria in any sample, we do follow-up testing to see if other bacteria of greater concern, such as fecal coliform or E. coli, are present. **We did not find any of these bacteria in our subsequent testing. If we had, we would have notified you immediately.**

What happened? What was done?

System lines were flushed, proper sampling taps were installed and samples were collected and tested. Further testing shows that this problem has been resolved.

vices and radiation-emitting products. Based in part on risk information and recommendations from experts at an earlier FDA Medical Device Advisory Committee meeting, the agency is reclassifying these devices from Class I (low risk) to Class II (moderate risk). FDA can exert more regulatory control over Class II devices, notes FDA medical device expert Neil Ogden. For example, once the reclassification is effective, sunlamp products will have to undergo a premarket review by FDA and comply with requirements relating to performance testing, software validation and biocompatibility.

FDA is also requiring that certain user instructions and promotional materials for sunlamp products and UV lamps intended for use in sunlamp products include the following warnings and contraindications (a contraindication means that the risk outweighs the benefit):

The product is contraindicated for use on persons under the age of 18 years;

The product must not be used if skin lesions or open wounds are present;

The product should not be used on people who have had skin cancer or a family history of skin cancer; and people repeatedly exposed to UV radiation should be regularly evaluated for skin cancer.

"We believe the reclassification will not only strengthen oversight of sunlamp products, but also help consumers be better informed about, and protected from, this sort of exposure," Og-

den says.

Practices to Avoid

Certain practices involving sunlamp products are especially dangerous. These include:

Failing to wear appropriate protective eye wear, such as goggles, which can lead to short- and long-term eye injury; starting with long exposures (close to the maximum time for the specific sunlamp product) which can lead to burning, and because sunburn takes six to 48 hours to develop, you may not realize your skin is burned until it's too late; failing to follow manufacturer-recommended exposure times on the label for your skin type (some skin types should not tan with UV radiation at all, for example, those with skin that burns easily and doesn't readily tan); and tanning while using certain medications or cosmetics that may make you more sensitive to UV rays. Talk to your doctor or pharmacist first.

Tobacco Free Hendry County is Encouraging Local Residential Buildings to Go Smoke-Free

Smoke-free policies can protect residents from secondhand smoke and smoking-related fires

Smoke-free multiunit housing, a growing trend throughout the country, is making its way to Florida. Across the state, there are more than 500 smoke-free multiunit housing properties and 73,000 smoke-free units.

Many residential properties have already implemented smoking-free policies.

For property managers and landlords, smoke-free policies can have economic benefits. More than 80% of Floridians are non-smokers. Many people who do smoke do not permit smoking in their homes. Given these numbers, many properties have very successfully marketed their smoke-free policy as an amenity, not a restriction. Smoke-free policies can save money by eliminating the need to repair or replace carpeting, floors, fixtures, countertops or appliances damaged by burns or nicotine stains. At the end of a lease, smoke-free units require less turnover time due to fewer preparation and repainting needs.

In one Florida survey of 421 managers of smoke-free properties, 99.5 percent of the managers agreed that smoke-free policies do not hurt occupancy and 30.1 percent believed that they increased occupancy.

Tobacco smoke can move along air ducts,

through cracks in the walls and floors, through elevator shafts, and along plumbing and electrical lines affecting units that are nearby. Therefore, there are also numerous benefits for residents as tobacco smoke contains more than 7,000 chemicals, hundreds of which are toxic and at least 70 known to cause cancer. Exposure, even for short periods of time, can be dangerous.

A home should be a safe place for everyone, especially for children, people with existing health conditions, and the elderly who are more vulnerable to the effects of secondhand smoke. By making sure that residential buildings are 100 percent smoke-free, property managers are protecting tenants from the dangers of toxic smoke and from the risk of deadly smoking-related fires.

The following are some of the reasons why it's critical to protect tenants from exposure to secondhand smoke.

Secondhand smoke exposure is causally linked to heart disease, stroke, several cancers, lower respiratory illness, and impaired lung function.

Each year, among U.S. nonsmokers, exposure to secondhand smoke causes an estimated 33,000 premature deaths from heart disease and about 3,400 premature deaths from lung cancer.

Nonsmokers exposed to secondhand smoke

at home or at work increase their risk of developing heart disease by 25 to 30 percent and their risk of developing lung cancer by 20 to 30 percent.

Secondhand smoke can trigger an asthma attack. A severe asthma attack can put a child's life in danger.

In the first two years of life, children exposed to secondhand smoke have more than a 50 percent increased risk of getting bronchitis and pneumonia.

Infants exposed to secondhand smoke are at a greater risk of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS). SIDS is the sudden, unexplained, unexpected death of an infant in the first year of life. SIDS is the leading cause of death in otherwise healthy infants.

Secondhand smoke is not the only danger associated with tobacco use at home. Smoking-related fires are the leading cause of fire deaths in residential buildings. These fires are eight times more likely to result in death than fires that start from another source. Smoking-related fires in residential buildings result in an average of approximately 365 deaths, 925 injuries, and \$326 million in property loss each year.

"Unfortunately, unscrupulous individuals will use the threat of a hurricane and the devastation it can cause to scam Floridians," stated Attorney General Pam Bondi. "By providing this hurricane guide, we intend to help Floridians prepare now so they can avoid being scammed." Some of the most common storm-related scams include: tree service scams, charity scams, disaster-relief scams, and water testing and treatment scams.


To avoid being scammed when preparing for a storm or dealing with its aftermath, follow these tips: Ask to see Florida Building Commis-

sion product approval numbers on storm-proof products for your home and visit www.floridabuilding.com to verify products, check permits for installation of products, report any fraudulent claims on unapproved products, and follow-up with your insurance provider on discounts for hurricane or wind mitigation. Watch-out for price gouging. It is unlawful to raise hotel rental rates or housing leasing rates during a state of emergency. Essential commodities such as lumber, ice, water, generators, and shelter are also protected under the Price Gouging Law. If you suspect price gouging, save receipts and call 1-866-9-NO-SCAM. Never pay for services up front.

After the storm, beware of unsolicited workers, have evaluations of damages prepared by your insurance company, obtain multiple estimates and bids on repairs, research companies, check for proof of insurance and verify bonding agencies, and read entire contracts. Ask for references and verify business licenses for anyone who may be performing storm-related work on your property.

Always Tired? You May Have Sleep Apnea

Snoring may be more than just an annoying habit – you may have obstructive sleep apnea (OSA), a sleep disorder that, left untreated, can take its toll on the body and mind. With sleep apnea, your breathing pauses multiple times during sleep.

The pauses can last from a few seconds to minutes and can occur more than five times per hour, to as high as 100 times per hour. (Fewer than five times per hour is normal). Sometimes, when you start breathing again, you make a loud snort or choking sound. Sleep is momentarily interrupted when this occurs.

Untreated OSA has been linked to high blood pressure, heart attacks, strokes, car accidents, work-related accidents and depression. According to the American Sleep Association, OSA affects more than 12 million Americans.

Sleep apnea is almost twice as common in men as it is in women. Other risk factors include: being overweight, as extra fat tissue around the neck makes it harder to keep the airway open; being over age 40; smoking; having a family history of sleep apnea; and having a nasal obstruction due to a deviated septum, allergies or sinus problem.

Children also get sleep apnea, most commonly between ages three and six. The most common cause is enlarged tonsils and adenoids in the upper airway.

There are no drugs that are approved by the FDA to treat sleep apnea and there are a number of drugs that can actually make sleep apnea worse, including many for insomnia, anxiety or

severe pain.

Chronic Disease - Insufficient sleep has been linked to the development and management of a number of chronic diseases and conditions, including diabetes, cardiovascular disease, obesity and depression.

Diabetes - Research has found that insufficient sleep is linked to an increased risk for the development of Type 2 diabetes. Recent research suggests that optimizing sleep duration and quality may be an important means of improving blood sugar control in persons with Type 2 diabetes.

Cardiovascular Disease - Persons with sleep apnea have been found to be at an increased risk for a number of cardiovascular diseases.

Notably, hypertension, stroke, coronary heart disease and irregular heartbeats (cardiac arrhythmias) have been found to be more common among those with disordered sleep than their peers without sleep abnormalities.

Likewise, sleep apnea and hardening of the arteries (atherosclerosis) appear to share some common physiological characteristics, further suggesting that

sleep apnea may be an important predictor of cardiovascular disease.

Obesity - Laboratory research has found that short sleep duration results in metabolic changes that may be linked to obesity.

Epidemiologic studies conducted in the community have also revealed an association between short sleep duration and excess body weight.

This association has been reported in all age groups, but has been particularly pronounced in children. It is believed that sleep in childhood and adolescence is particularly important for brain development and that insufficient sleep in youngsters may adversely affect the function of a region of the brain known as the hypothalamus, which regulates appetite and the expenditure of energy.

Depression - The relationship between sleep and depression is complex. While sleep disturbance has long been held to be an important symptom of depression, recent research has indicated that depressive symptoms may decrease once sleep apnea has been effectively treated and sufficient sleep is restored.

The interrelatedness of sleep and depression suggests it is important that the sleep sufficiency of persons with depression be assessed and that symptoms of depression be monitored among persons with a sleep disorder.

As interruption of regular breathing or obstruction of the airway during sleep can pose serious health complications, symptoms of sleep apnea should be taken seriously. Treatment should be sought from a health care provider.






