BOCC approves lowest option tentative millage despite warnings

The Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) adopted a tentative budget and millage rate at their last regular meeting held Wednesday, Sept. 10 in Clewiston's City Hall.

The public hearing opened at 5:30 p.m. and commissioners voted first to adopt a tentative millage rate for fiscal year 2015. The county's finance department suggested several options for commissioners to choose from, which included increasing the millage rate by 1.1 mills, increasing the millage rate by 1.05 mills, increasing the millage rate by .77 mills or increasing the millage by .91 mills. In the latter two instances, it would be necessary

to take \$500,000 and \$250,000 out of the disaster relief fund, respectively, in order to balance the budget.

The finance department cited increased costs, such as insurance, retirement, inmate medical and Medicaid, as some of the reasons why it was necessary to increase recurring revenues, such as the millage rate, in fiscal year 2015. The finance department stated it was necessary to increase recurring revenues to meet the need of recurring expenses to balance the budget.

Commissioner Darrell Harris spoke first, saying he would not vote

Tigers Romp Over Crusaders

Clewiston used a quick-striking offense and a streaky defense to whip the Cardinal Newman 38-20 at Sam Budnyk Field in West Palm Beach last Friday night. The non-district win pushed the Tigers to a 3-0 season while dropping the Crusaders to 1-1.

The Tigers got off to an early start. Taking the opening kickoff, Clewiston rode the arm of senior quarterback Davis Witt for 74 yards in eight plays for their first score. On the drive, Witt completed four of five attempts for 70 yards, including the final 27 yard catch by wide open tight end Luke Bradford for the touchdown. Kicker Brandon Torres converted the first of his five PATs on the night.

The underdog Crusaders served notice early that they did not intend to go quietly into the night. They spliced together their own drive covering 75

yards in 12 plays. Using a mixture of run, pass and two untimely Tiger penalties, they scored on a one-yard plunge by tailback Jeramey Worthen and the PAT knotted the score at 7.

Clewiston was quick replying as tailback Dominik Spain covered all 80 yards of the following drive on three plays, the final being a spectacular 73-yard dash. Spain later scored on a 40 yard scamper in the third period. On the night, he rushed eight times for 125 yards.

The Tigers got two second quarter touchdowns by tailback Jarvirus Bradford on runs of 5 and 14 yards. The second score came on a short drive after defensive back KT Thicklin recovered a Crusader fumble on their 14-yard line.

Tables lined the sides of the foyer, displaying the prizes that could be won during the silent auction -- gift baskets full of local honey and the Everglades' most famous seasoning, Florida Gator paraphernalia and a certificate for a full day at the spa were just some of the prizes to be had.

The Presentation of the Colors

by Clewiston High School's Criminal Justice students began promptly at 7 p.m., followed by an invocation given by Chamber Director John Wellslager.

Dinner was served shortly thereafter -- a buffet-style spread served on the terrace, featuring chicken cordon bleu and prime rib, complete with down-home southern fixings.

A Systemic Problem: One Opinion - WWJD?

The recent rash of problems regarding space in airplanes made reflect on something that seemed obvious to me. In the past weeks, I've heard of people being removed from planes after encounters, sometimes physical or assaultive, with other passengers or crew. The problem is about "my space." A man sells a device to disable the seat in front of you from reclining and invading your space.

Airplanes have to make emergency landings to remove passengers, and I can only imagine what the additional costs of such interruptions might be. Police are involved; this means legal issues and delays for persons who wanted to get somewhere else and find themselves in strange cities. Sometimes it is a matter of questioning their mental stability; in Florida that might mean a three-day stay at a crisis center and being out of touch with friends, family and loved ones. In general, air travel has become more difficult, the "take-off-your-shoes" routines are certainly not because we're stepping on holy ground! Along with the searches and fear of terrorists, times have changed. In the meantime, people look for coveted seats at the beginning of a cabin section, where there are no people in front of you. One TV photo showed a person with his legs propped up against the bulkhead; feet way above his head as he slouched down in the seat and sought to be "comfortable." What struck me about these TV reports is that nobody questioned what I felt was the root of the problem: Airlines are trying to pack too many people in too little space.

Awhile ago, when we were thinking about a

nursery in our school, we learned of the minimum number of square feet per child that is required. There are required minimums for public service vehicles that transport people. All of this got me to wondering if such standards exist on aircrafts, and if they would be different for each country. The problem seems to have arisen when more people are "compressed" into less space. The incidents never occur in sections of the planes where there is more seat room available. I am sure someone can come up with a litany about "costs" and what the airlines would have to add to each ticket if spaces were increased; I wonder if that should be weighed against the costs of unnecessary landings, the emotional costs to all the people involved, including all of the other passengers who are delayed, and the costs of employee time in intervening, defending, appearing in court if needed, and negative publicity in general.

My reading of scriptures show a Lord getting to the heart of the matter when He is confronted or confronts. Paul, likewise, is direct; he goes to the heart of issues. "Owe no one anything except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments ... are all summed up in this word 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'" (Romans 13:8ff). I am not so naive as to think that you can remind two cramped and irate passengers on a long flight that they need to love each other; I would rather see a solution to the issues that would cause them to be indifferent and become hostile. Help could be on the way when the aircrafts have their seats installed and long before tempers flare. An ounce of prevention could be well worth a pound of cure.

I am sure that airlines could cite figures on the number of ("cramped") passengers they carry without incidents but they might also remember

other safety devices in place that are rarely if ever needed. Overhead oxygen masks, first-aid kits, a host of avionics and scores of hours of training for crews; all running into many, many dollars of "just in case." Maybe seat-inch allocations need to be considered, as well, as another instance of "just in case." Who knows? Maybe more people would decide flying is enjoyable once more. Maybe that would also have a positive effect on the "bottom line," too.

Limited Harvest Starts in September for Snook, a Premier Florida Fish

FLORIDA FISH AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The recreational harvest season for Florida's premier game fish, snook, opened Sept. 1 state-wide. Unique to the region, snook are one of the many reasons Florida is the Fishing Capital of the World.

While the fishery is already more than 90 percent catch-and-release, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) encourages anglers to continue to use moderation when determining whether or not to take a snook home. Gulf snook populations were negatively impacted by a 2010 cold kill. Gulf snook numbers currently exceed FWC management goals but are still rebuilding to pre-cold-kill levels, which is one of the reasons why it is important to handle fish with care in this region and use moderation when determining whether or not to harvest one.

When releasing a snook, proper handling methods can help ensure the species' abundance for anglers today and generations to come. To learn more about catch-and-release and the best way to handle a fish, visit MyFWC.com/Fishing and click on "Saltwater" then "Recreational Regulations."

Regular season closures are designed to help protect the species during vulnerable times, such as cold weather and spawning. Snook are closed to harvest Dec. 1 through the end of February and May 1 through Aug. 31 in Gulf state and fed-

eral waters, including Monroe County and Everglades National Park. In Atlantic state and federal waters, including Lake Okeechobee and the Kissimmee River, snook is closed Dec. 15 through Jan. 31 and June 1 through Aug. 31.

Management measures, such as the one-fish-per-person, per-day bag limit, annual closed sea-

sons and size limits, will help continue rebuilding snook populations on both coasts.

Minimum and maximum size limits help protect juvenile and older breeding fish within the population. In the Atlantic, snook must be not less than 28 inches and not more than 32 inches total length, which is measured from the most

forward point of the head with the mouth closed to the farthest tip of the tail with the tail compressed or squeezed while the fish is lying on its side. In the Gulf, they must be not less than 28 inches and not more than 33 inches total length.

A snook permit, as well as a recreational saltwater license, is required unless the angler is exempt from having a license. Snook may be targeted or harvested with hook and line gear only. Snagging is prohibited.

It is illegal to buy or sell snook.

Anglers can report their catch on the Snook & Gamefish Foundation's website at Snook-Foundation.org by clicking on the Angler Action link. Researchers also ask anglers who harvest the fish to save their filleted carcasses and provide them to the FWC by dropping them off at a participating bait and tackle store. For the county-by-county list, go to MyFWC.com/Research and click on "Saltwater," then "Snook" (under "Saltwater Fish") and "Snook Anglers Asked to Help with Research."

These carcasses provide biological data, including the size, age, maturity and sex of the catch. This information is important to the FWC in completing stock assessments on species such as snook. If you see a snook fishery violation, please call the Wildlife Alert Program at 888-404-FWCC (3922).

Gas Price Update

Average retail gasoline prices in Florida have fallen 3.6 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.30/g Sunday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 8,237 gas outlets in Florida. This compares with the national average that has fallen 4.2 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.39/g, according to gasoline price website GasBuddy.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Florida during the past week, prices yesterday were 19.5 cents per gallon lower than the same day one year ago and are 4.2 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has decreased 6.7 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 14.9 cents per gallon lower than this day one year ago.

"The brief increase in the national average now appears over, as gas prices this past week have resumed their decline," said GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "Not a single state saw its gas price average rise in the last week- certainly an impressive feat compared to last week. The good news doesn't end there, either: prices will likely continue declining in the week ahead as EPA summer gasoline requirements end today in much of the country, ushering in cheaper to produce winter gasoline. Over the next month or two it is likely the national average will fall another 10-20 cents per gallon to some of the lowest prices of 2014." DeHaan said.

Rachel's Challenge is a school assembly program designed after the writings of Rachel Scott, a victim of the Columbine High School Shootings in Colorado. Rachel Scott was the first person killed at Columbine High School on April 20, 1999. Rachel's acts of kindness and compassion coupled with the contents of her six diaries, have become the foundation for the most life-changing school program in America. Her brother, Craig, was in the library that day and lost two close friends and narrowly escaped death himself. He was the only student at Columbine who was in the library and also lost a sibling.

RACHEL SCOTT WAS THE FIRST PERSON KILLED AT COLUMBINE HIGH SCHOOL ON APRIL 20, 1999. RACHEL'S ACTS OF KINDNESS AND COMPASSION COUPLED WITH THE CONTENTS OF HER SIX DIARIES, HAVE BECOME THE FOUNDATION FOR THE MOST LIFE-CHANGING SCHOOL PROGRAM IN AMERICA.

Powerful audio/video footage of Rachel's Challenge holds students spell-bound during a one hour school presentation that motivates them to positive change in the way they treat others. This is followed by a 90-minute training session involving both adult and student leaders. This is an interactive session that shows how to sustain momentum created by the assembly. That evening the Rachel's Challenge presenter conducts a powerful session with parents and community leaders. To sustain the positive climate change in a school, Rachel's Challenge offers a year-long curriculum called the Friends of Rachel (FOR) program that continues training students and plugs them into activities that continue the chain reaction of kindness.

A few weeks after the tragedy, Darrell Scott, Rachel's father, spoke to a congressional House Judiciary Committee regarding issues of school violence. His speech has become one of the most widely read on the Internet. Shortly afterwards, he founded "Rachel's Challenge," a bullying and violence abatement program. The universal message of kindness and compassion told by Rachel's story has been heard by students in several other countries. The Scott family and other certified presenters have spoken to over 11 million people in live settings, and has reached millions more through being featured in popular media outlets like CNN, Fox News, The Today Show, Good Morning America, Larry King Live, Oprah, Dateline, O'Reilly Factor, Hannity and Colmes and numerous others. Mr. Scott has also authored three books, including the best seller "Rachel's Tears."

Rachel's Challenge will be in Clewiston on Monday, Sept. 22. Clewiston Middle School students and Clewiston High School ninth graders, will attend an assembly and selected students

and teachers will attend the Leadership Training later in the school day. The community presentation will begin at 6:30 p.m. in the Clewiston Middle School Gymnasium. The presentation is free of charge and everyone is invited to attend!

Editor's Note: The following was taken directly from FWC's passdown, week of Aug. 29 to Sept. 4.

K-9 Officer Lilley and Officer Hofheinz were on water patrol on the Caloosahatchee River conducting safety inspections. The officers noticed a boat keeping a wide berth from them pulling up to a set of docks at a local park. The subjects from the boat began to walk up the bank when the officers advised the occupants to return to the boat for an inspection. The Captain advised that they were going to use the bathrooms when the

officers observed one of the male subjects begin to run from the park and across the highway into a nearby neighborhood. The officers were able to locate the house that the subject had run to, but the occupants were being very difficult and would not allow them inside. At that time, the home owner pulled up and K-9 Officer Lilley advised her of the situation and she immediately let him inside where he located the subject's wet, red shorts that he fled in; he had obviously changed his clothes. The officers were able to ascertain the subject's identity and continue to investigate the incident.

Lieutenant Steelman received a complaint

from archery hunters in Spirit of the Wild WMA in regard to palmetto berry pickers walking around their hunting areas. Officers Teal, Greene, McLendon, Bergwerff, and Lieutenant Steelman responded to the area. Officer McLendon observed a white van pull off of SR 29 and pick up three individuals who had jumped the fence from the WMA with eight bags containing approximately 800 pounds of palmetto berries. All subjects were issued Notices to Appear in court for illegal take of palmetto berries from a WMA.

K-9 Officer Lilley was contacted by the Hendry County Sheriff's Office for assistance. They advised that they had recovered a stolen vehicle

and were requesting an area search to attempt to recover the stolen vehicle's keys and to recover any other evidence that may be there. K-9 Officer Lilley responded to the area and deployed K-9 Roscoe and searched the area for a while. K-9 Roscoe recovered a small glass pipe and the stolen vehicles keys which were hanging on the fence directly above the pipe. Deputies charged the suspect with numerous violations. The stolen vehicle was returned to the registered owners along with the vehicles keys. The owners thanked Officer Lilley and K-9 Roscoe for their efforts.

Kitchen Fire Damages Triplex

Resident said he fell asleep after heating grease in a pan

A Clewiston man woke up to a startling kitchen fire on Sunday, Sept. 14, prompting the evacuation of not only his apartment, but the adjacent units at 318 N Francisco.

The Clewiston Police Department (CPD) responded to the structure fire at around 7:29 p.m. last Sunday, arriving at the residence located next to the Elks Lodge to find smoke coming from a window and the rear door, according to an offense report released by CPD.

The resident of the apartment, 51-year-old Matthew Collier, was standing outside when police arrived and reportedly told officers that

everyone was out of his residence and that no one was inside either of the two adjacent units.

He then told officers that he was heating a pan of grease on the stove and fell asleep on the couch before the smoke alarm woke him up, according to the report. It is reported that Collier also admitted he had been drinking prior to the incident.

The Clewiston Fire Department extinguished the fire and Fire Inspector Travis Reese deemed the triplex uninhabitable due to unknown structural damage.

The other two units were in fact occupied at the time of the fire, but both were evacuated and no one inside sustained any injuries, according to the report.

Two-car Crash Ends with DUI Arrest

Accident sends other car into canal

A Belle Glade man was arrested on DUI charges last Saturday night, after he allegedly collided with another vehicle and sent that car into a canal.

The incident occurred at around 9:15 p.m. on Sept. 13, according to an arrest report released by the Clewiston Police Department (CPD).

It is reported that Mason Tyler Bryant, 21, of Belle Glade, was driving a 2004 two-door Chevrolet westbound on W. Alverdez Avenue approaching Olympia Street in Clewiston, when he collided with another sedan.

The sedan was sent into a canal after impact, and Bryant reportedly told police he attempted to jump into the canal to save the driver and passenger, whose names have been withheld by CPD.

When police arrived, Bryant reportedly told officers that his brakes failed as he approached the stop sign on W. Alverdez and Olympia Street and could not stop his vehicle.

A witness on scene told officers that Bryant was traveling "very fast" and did not stop at the stop sign at the intersection, according to the report.

Officers allegedly saw an open liquor bottle in the back of Bryant's car, and asked if he had been drinking. Bryant reportedly told officers he had had a few beers earlier in the evening and had since eaten.

Bryant performed Field Sobriety Exercises and provided a breath sample, according to the report.

Bryant was then placed under arrest for DUI and damage to property. He was booked into the Hendry County Jail on Sept. 14 and released the same day.

on raising the millage rate more than .5 mills higher than last fiscal year's 7.7209 millage rate. Being less than the options given, if Commissioner Harris' suggestion were adopted, the county would need to take an additional \$479,000 from the disaster relief fund -- or find a way to reduce budgets -- on top of the \$500,000 that would need to be taken out at the lowest option of .77 mills.

Commissioner Don Davis spoke out against Commissioner Harris' suggestion, calling the BOCC "broken" and worrying that if disaster struck, the county would not have enough money to deal with it properly.

"If we do what Darrell [Commissioner Harris] wants to do, we're going to do the same thing next year. ... We can't keep taking money out of reserves," began Commissioner Davis. "Let's run this county like a business. In a couple of years, we can lower the millage down for people. I think we ought to keep the mills at 1.1. Any business person or sensible person would say the same thing."

If the county raised the millage rate by 1.1 mills, which was reflected in the TRIM notice, the county would have enough money to give the Sheriff's Office \$110,000, the Clerk's Office \$13,500 and \$4,000 for the Supervisor of Elections over and above the cost-of-living adjustments, retirement and insurance increases.

Commissioner Davis made a motion to adopt a tentative millage of 1.1 mills higher than the previous fiscal year's 7.7209 millage rate, but the motion died for lack of a second.

Commissioner Janet Taylor then made a motion to adopt a tentative millage rate of .77 mills higher than last fiscal year's rate. Commissioner Michael Swindle seconded the motion, but before commissioners voted, County Clerk Barbara Butler interjected.

"When you start taking all this money out of the disaster relief fund, you're really going to have to watch your grants and your matching funds, because that's our cash carry for the grants and the matching. So we're not going to have money for some of these grants you want because we won't have the matching funds. DOT stuff that we're going to have to fund ahead of time -- we're not going to have the money," said Butler.

Taking \$500,000 out of the disaster relief fund would decrease the fund to roughly \$4.505 million.

Commissioner Taylor was also opposed to

adding wording to her motion that would force the county to pay back the money taken from the fund, because she couldn't "see how we could pay it back."

Despite these warnings, commissioners voted 3-2 to set the tentative millage rate at 8.4909 mills -- .77 mills higher than last fiscal year's rate -- and voted to take \$500,000 out of the disaster relief fund to help balance the budget. Commissioners Davis and Harris both voted against the motion, Commissioner Davis having wanted a 1.1 mill increase and Harris having wanted a .5 mill increase.

During the public hearing, commissioners also approved the tentative budget for fiscal year 2015, totaling roughly \$70.74 million.

The final budget hearing is scheduled for Sept. 23 at 5:30 p.m. in the LaBelle City Hall.

Ground Breaking Ceremony at Clewiston Florida Community Health Centers, Inc.

The Clewiston Florida Community Health Centers, Inc. (FCHC) location is expanding through the combined effort of FCHC, the Hendry County Board of County Commissioners, the Florida Department of Health and the Agency for Health Care administration.

Nardina Johnson, FCHC Center Manager, stated, "When we came here years ago, we had no idea that we would outgrow the building."

At the ground breaking ceremony, held on Sept. 10, Clewiston's mayor, county commissioners and members of the community expressed their enthusiasm for this long-awaited project.

Among those who have been invested since the project's conception were Dr. Michael F. Gervasi, President and CEO of FCHC; Patricia K. Dobbins, Administrator for the Florida Department of Health in Hendry County; Wilhelmina N. Lewis M.D., Chief Medical Officer for FCHC; and Janet B. Taylor, Hendry County Commissioner, Mayor Phillip Roland, and Clewiston City Commissioner, Julio Rodriguez.

"We are way behind in services for the children," Commissioner Taylor said at the ceremony. "This expansion will help not only them, but also the community at large."

The project includes construction of an addition to the current building, which will expand the dental department from four to eight dental operatories, and the renovation and expansion of the pediatrics department from eight to 14 pediatric exam rooms. Several of the exam rooms will be designated as "flex rooms," meaning they can be utilized for dental or medical procedures. This will allow for greater staff with more doctors. The total area of expansion is approximately 2,500 square feet, which will be constructed by adding on to the existing facility.

Dr. Michael F. Gervasi, of FCHC, to lighten the mood, jokingly stated, "For check-ups, we can convert a closet and get a few more bottles of hand sanitizer, but for dental you need plumb-

ing." He went on to say that the need was indeed great because FCHC is one of the few local establishments that accepts Medicare and Medicaid for dental services.

The goal of FCHC has always been to reach the medically underserved. However, the space and staff were so limited, as compared to the community need, that often the waiting period for dental was six to eight months.

Molly Ferguson, of FCHC, explained that the state grant for the expansion was made available through the Florida Department of Health, but was dependent on the condition that the county supplied matching funds. "We never have had a problem with community investment," said

Ferguson. "This is our first facility. We have now been here 38 years, since 1976."

Commissioner Michael Swindle stated, "We are very excited about this project which will bring better and more health care. We have been waiting a long time, and this is just one step. ... We are looking forward to more growth to meet greater community needs."

Clewiston Mayor Phillip Roland said, "This is a great facility. We all need this in the community. Two years ago it was a dream, but the community and the county have come together to make this possible. Unemployment is high, but this facility will help anyone." The mayor expressed that the children will most likely benefit

the most from the improvement "Bad teeth can poison a kid. But now, FCHC can service twice as many kids."

Dr. Armando Sanchez, of FCHC, agreed with the mayor. "When they go to school, how can they think straight if they have a toothache?" he said. Dr. Sanchez was also looking forward to further improvements to the Center.

Dr. Gervasi stated that the best aspect of Clewiston's FCHC is "locals helping locals."

"People move into our area because of our health care system. Health care is important for our community and the county. Which is why we will continue with a positive attitude and give the best service that we can," said Dr. Gervasi.

New Trees Planted on Bond Street

City decides on Adonidia Palms and plants 20 along the once bare street

The Bond Street tree conundrum has been resolved, and most of the new trees have already been put in the ground by Clewiston's Public Works Department.

After removing the olive trees that lined the one-way street in July -- leaving bare some crumbling infrastructure and stripping the street and its passersby of much-needed shade -- the public works department spent the first week of September putting in the replacement trees and resetting some of the electric boxes affected by the switch.

Considering input from business owners who have set up shop along the street, the city decided upon the Adonidia Palm, 20 of which have been planted in the past couple weeks. The Adonidia Palm is a less invasive species than

the olive trees that once stood in their place, and normally grow anywhere between 15- and 20-foot tall.

To add some color to the street during the spring months, the public works department is also planting a few Tabebuia trees in choice spots along the street, replacing some majestic palms that also caused the city problems. The Tabebuia tree, which usually reaches about 25-foot tall or less, produces beautiful, colorful flowers each spring when it blooms.

The olive trees were taken out of the ground two months ago because their root systems were damaging the water and sewer lines underneath Bond Street, and were dropping so much debris on the street that crews were sent out nearly every week to clear the roadway of leaves and branches.

The city hopes the new trees will be less of a "maintenance nightmare" than the old trees.

New TrophyCatch Website Meets 'I Do'

Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) staff were at the world's largest tackle trade show when it came to Florida, the "Fishing Capital of the World," in July. ICAST attracted 11,000-plus attendees, all of whom were professionals involved with recreational fishing.

FWC staff took this opportunity to thank the industry for its contributions. They also highlighted the importance of recreational fishing in Florida, while showcasing programs that benefit Florida anglers and resources. Among these are the latest TrophyCatch website and a new "I Do" campaign.

Recreational fishing provides an \$8.9-billion benefit to the state's economy, which supports 79,200 fishing-related jobs, greater than in any other state. Florida fishing license fees and federal aid provide critical investments to enhance recreational fishing and boating. State statutes ensure "revenues from fees paid by hunters and sport fishers may not be diverted to purposes other than the administration of fish and wildlife programs by the FWC." This is a guarantee that your license money will not be diverted to other purposes.

In addition to fishing license fees, a percentage paid on the purchase of fishing equipment and motorboat fuels, and import duties on boats, are placed into a federal trust fund administered by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. States and territories are then allocated their share based on the number of paid fishing-license holders and the state's land and water area.

On the freshwater side, these funds allow the Division of Freshwater Fisheries Management to produce more than three million sport fish per year for stocking public waters, including about two million largemouth bass. Biologists evaluate fish populations and angler use in fresh waters throughout Florida. When combined with

public input and research on the ecology, genetics and life history of Florida's freshwater sport fishes, this information allows the FWC to focus management activities, such as habitat restoration, stocking and aquatic plant management, to ensure sustainable use.

Boating access and safety also benefit.

THROUGH TROPHYCATCH, THE FWC HAS PARTNERED WITH THE FISHING INDUSTRY TO REDUCE THE NEED FOR REGULATIONS AND TO BRING EXTRA VALUE TO ANGLERS. REWARDING ANGLERS FOR RELEASING TROPHY BASS, RATHER THAN PROHIBITING THEIR HARVEST, ACCOMPLISHES MANY OF THE SAME GOALS AND HAS ADDITIONAL BENEFITS.

Fuel purchases for boats are a major source of Sport Fish Restoration (SFR) funds, so 15 percent of those dollars go to boating programs. These include an average of 30 boating-access projects annually with local government entities. In addition, the FWC maintains more than 240 boat ramps statewide, and provides location and access information on about 1,700 public boat ramps (MyFWC.com/BoatRamps).

Through TrophyCatch, the FWC has partnered with the fishing industry to reduce the need for regulations and to bring extra value to anglers. Rewarding anglers for releasing trophy bass, rather than prohibiting their harvest, accomplishes many of the same goals and has additional benefits. TrophyCatch is a citizen-science, data-collection program that rewards anglers who document and release bass heavier than eight pounds. By providing valuable rewards, donated by industry partners such as those at ICAST, TrophyCatch acquires hard-to-obtain information about when, where and how trophy bass are caught in Florida. That information helps determine which conservation efforts are most effective.

It also encourages live release of trophy bass and keeps the mature females in their native waters.

Thanks to Brandt Information Services, a new TrophyCatch website (TrophyCatch-Florida.com) was introduced at ICAST. Every angler who fishes in Florida should go online and register. Registering makes you



NFL Announces Harsher Penalties

On Monday, September 8, TMZ released a video showing Baltimore Ravens Ray Rice strike his then-fiancé in an Atlantic City casino elevator. In the video you see Rice punch his now wife, Janay Palmer, knocking her into a railing. After viewing the new video the Ravens announced they would terminate Rice's contract with the team and the NFL announced Rice will be suspended from the league indefinitely.

Initially Rice was suspended for two games for violating the NFL personal conduct policy. Many were outraged that Rice was

given such a lenient penalty. ESPNW columnist Jane McManus wrote, "The NFL is sending a strong message by issuing such a weak suspension; it's about as meaningful as a yellow card in a soccer game." McManus cited how other NFL players have been handed harsher penalties for using performance-enhancing drugs or for smoking marijuana. As an organization the Ravens initially supported Rice and NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell stood behind the 2-game suspension decision. However, after growing criticism Goodell announced

harsher penalties for NFL players who violate the personal conduct policy regarding assault, battery, domestic violence, and sexual assault in a letter sent to team owners on August 28. In his letter Goodell apologized for how he handled the Rice case and promised to take a stronger stance against domestic violence. The NFL's decision to suspend Rice indefinitely sends a strong message to future offenders and may set precedent for how the NFL will handle domestic violence cases in the future.

- The biggest bass of the season wins a \$3,000 championship ring from the American Outdoors Fund, and if it happens to come from a major water body in Osceola County, Experience Kissimmee chips in \$10,000 in cash. The current leader is J. Morrell, with a 14-pound, nine-ounce bass caught and released on Lake Kingsley, last March.

• One lucky registered angler will win a \$40,000 Phoenix bass boat, powered by Mercury Marine and equipped with a Power-Pole. Besides getting a chance at the boat, just for registering,

servation-minded enough to create the first website free-of-charge. The FWC encourages all anglers to check out the site, register to be automatically entered in the boat drawing and be prepared to catch-and-release largemouth bass. One never knows when or where a trophy bass will appear, but checking the gallery and catch records at TrophyCatchFlorida.com may enhance one's opportunities. From Okeechobee, through the Kissimmee Chain of Lakes to Lake Talquin, trophies are being caught year-round, but trophy bass are also being caught on small local lakes and even golf course ponds. These places are accessible and good bets for opportunities to land a lunker.

every verified catch provides 10 extra chances for the drawing, which is conducted at the end of the season. TrophyCatch seasons run from Oct. 1 to Sept. 30 each year.

"Anglers should carefully follow catch-and-release guidelines for these big bass and document the catch through a photograph of the entire bass on a scale with the weight clearly legible," said Tom Champeau, director of the Division of Freshwater Fisheries Management. The new TrophyCatchFlorida.com website makes it easy to register and review the rules and prizing details. Anglers should remember to take a camera and scale, and perhaps a tape measure to document the catch quickly and safely before releasing it.

helps FWC biologists enhance, conserve and promote trophy bass fishing. This will ultimately benefit anglers, fishing-related businesses and local communities. Corporate partners, including Bass Pro Shops, Dick's Sporting Goods, Rapala and Bass King Clothing, provide the rewards in return for carefully documenting these catches and live-releasing them in the same water system where they were caught.

This program provides extremely valuable data and encourages live-release of older, female bass, so they can continue to challenge other anglers and spawn in their home waters.

It's Time to Get Serious about the Diabetes Epidemic: Register for a Free Class

Several months ago, celebrity chef Paula Deen announced that she'd been diagnosed with type 2 diabetes. Almost immediately, search volume for the word "diabetes" on Google jumped 60 percent.

A few weeks later, "30 Rock" star Alec Baldwin announced that he'd been diagnosed with "pre-diabetes" -- meaning he was likely to get the disease unless he changed his eating and exercise habits. It often takes a celebrity to raise the public's awareness about an issue.

While these "endorsements" are welcome, it's going to take far more than an occasional high-profile diagnosis to cope with the massive -- and almost entirely preventable -- diabetes epidemic sweeping our country. It's going to take a sustained public education campaign on the scale of anti-smoking efforts from decades past.

Make no mistake, when it comes to public-health issues, it doesn't get much worse than diabetes. In Florida, about seven percent of the state now has diabetes and many more have pre-diabetes, meaning they are on course to get it. Nationwide, nearly 26 million people have type 2 diabetes, often called adult-onset diabetes, and another 79 million have pre-diabetes. Worse, there are about seven million Americans who don't even know they have it, according to the Centers for Disease Control, and these numbers

are growing fast.

Diabetes is the leading cause of kidney failure, lower limb amputations and new cases of blindness among adults. It is also a major cause

of heart disease and stroke. The dollar costs are just as staggering. According to a 2009 study, type 2 diabetes cost the health care system \$160 billion a year. One in 10 health care dollars goes to treat diabetes, as does one-third of Medicare's budget.

The most troubling thing about this epidemic is that it was mostly avoidable. Diabetes has risen because of the dramatic rise in obesity in the U.S. Scientific literature is now clear on the connection between type 2 diabetes and obesity. Today, more than one in three U.S. adults are obese (more than double the number in 1990). In Hen-

dry County, the obesity rate is 38 percent and in Glades County it is 39.6 percent (in the state of Florida, the rate is 27.2 percent).

Instead of treating the cause, patients are giv-

en many drugs to treat not just their diabetes, but the high blood pressure, high cholesterol, heart disease and other ailments that obesity causes.

So what can be done to reverse course? Here are some suggestions:

- Combating the diabetes epidemic means getting everyone better educated about the enormity of the risk. Do you think anyone would be indifferent to their weight if they knew it could cost them one of their legs or their eyesight?
- Better screening is needed. The longer diabetes goes undetected and unmanaged, the more likely it will cause serious complications.

The American Diabetes Association has a test that simply asks eight basic questions to assess a person's diabetes risk. (You can find the test at www.diabetes.org.) There is also a quick test to see if you are at risk of pre-diabetes at www.cdc.gov/diabetes/prevention.

• Better health habits are mandatory. Modest changes in weight (losing just five to seven percent of body weight is a benchmark for clinically meaningful weight loss - so someone weighing 200 pounds gets there by losing 10 to 14 pounds) and moderate physical activity (as little as three 10-minute activity sessions daily) not only can help prevent diabetes, but can help better manage it if you already have it, therefore, cutting down on the drugs needed and the complications incurred.

There is a proven way that helps reduce diabetes risk. A class is being offered by a partnership with the Florida Department of Health in Hendry and Glades Counties and Hendry Regional Medical Center for pre-diabetics!
