BCC, sheriff lock horns over budget

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – County commissioners have approved a new county budget of \$294 million that carries an increase in the property tax rate and a last-minute reallocation of \$2.5 million from the law enforcement budget that has Sheriff Rick Beseler contemplating legal action.

The tentative tax rate of 7.85 mills – which passed 4-1 during a final public hearing held by the Board of County Commissioners on Tuesday, Sept. 27 – represents a slight increase over the current rate of 7.45 mills. Commissioner Wendell Davis dissented, saying he favored keeping the current rate.

A mill is \$1 in property taxes for every \$1,000 of assessed property value after exemptions. Most homeowners will see only a slight increase in property taxes because of declining property values and additional tax exemptions enacted by the Florida Legislature in recent years.

County Manager Stephanie Kopelousos said

Man cited obscure statute to seize home

GREEN COVE SPRINGS -- A man claiming to be a pastor at a Jacksonville church also claims he owns a once-vacant house in Oakleaf by right of an obscure Florida statute, but Clay County Sheriff's Office officials believe otherwise.

Marcelous Dunbar is out on \$150,000 bond after being arrested on Saturday, Sept. 24 on charges of grand theft and burglary when he refused to leave a home that recently had been sold for \$440,000. Dunbar claimed to own through the state's "adverse possession" law.

Adverse possession is a phrase contained in a little known if not controversial Florida statute that allows someone to claim ownership of aban-

doned property if the claimant pays taxes on the



property for seven straight years.

Dunbar, who says he is pastor of Fishers of Men World Harvest Church, has said publicly that he moved into the home legally, and that he is claiming ownership through the adverse possession process to help reduce the area's homeless problem. Published reports quote Dunbar as saying he had other people living with him at the time of his arrest.

Large black beetle is likely Giant Palm Weevil

Q. I cut off the Seasonal concerns from flower spikes from my palms and left them laying at the base of the tree for a few days. When I came back, I saw a large black beetle, with orange/red blotches on its back and a long snout, hovering around the clippings. Is this a potential problem for my cabbage palms, and if so, what should I do about them?

You are de-**R.** scribing the adult Giant Palm Wee-

vil. This beetle attacks the buds of palms and its young (a large orange to brown colored grub) can eat out the entire center of a palm in a matter of months. It can be a serious problem. Another sign to look for that indicates you have some in your palm would be a brown, fibrous football-shaped object about the size of a squashed golf ball. This would be the pupa stage of this insect – the stage at which it is changing over from its grub to adult form.

Normally Giant Palm Weevil Beetles are restricted to palms that are under some sort of stress, such as recently being moved, or having something that is destroying their roots. If you are seeing these beetles in your landscape, I would be concerned. To battle them, add a liguid form of Sevin to enough water to make two gallons of drench (the label tells how much to add) and then pour this into the top of the palm bud. You have to soak the bud well to get it to where they are feeding. You may want to give your trees a second application in a month or so, and then another in early spring while your palms are regaining their health. Fertilizing your palms in the spring with a "Palm Special" is suggested.

It can be tough to tell when citrus is ripe

I am new to this area and have not grown citrus before. When does it usually start to get ripe here?

Aside from the simple R. "taste test" - pick one and is ripe then most of the oth-

if it ers are too – there is really no way to tell when citrus are ripe. Color will not work because a citrus fruit is fully ripe before it is ever fully colored. If you wait until the fruit is fully colored, the fruit is usually over-ripe, less juicy and less sweet. Those bright colors you see at grocery stores have been artificially stimulated with special gases to change to full color.

Some of the early citrus varieties will begin ripening soon so the taste test is coming up.

If you have a tree full of fruit, tasting for ripeness is not a problem. But, if you have a young tree with only a few fruit on it, you probably don't want to pick very many to experiment with.


To give you a better idea as to when to expect your fruit to be ripe, so you can begin testing it at that time – here are the average earliest ripening times for our area:

Sweet oranges such as Navel, Ambersweet, Hamlin and Parson Brown begin ripening in October – depending on how quickly it starts to cool off. Later ripening sweet oranges such as Pineapple and Sunstar don't start ripening until December and Valencias don't start ripening until March and are often lost to the cold because of this.

Mandarins (Tangerines, Satsuma, Tangelos and their hybrids) start ripening in October (Osceola, Robinson, Fallglow, Page and Satsuma), in November (Orlando, Nova, and Sunburst), in December (Minneola Honeybell, Dancy and Ponkan), and in January (Murcott Honey Tangerine and Temple).

Grapefruit start ripening in Novem-

ber (Marsh and Ruby Red or Redblush) and then others in December (Duncan and Star Ruby).

Every tree is different based upon various microclimates in your vard and where they are located with respect to those – some areas are warmer or colder than others because of shade, nearness to water or a pool, the house itself or fences/ large trees that block wind.

In addition – fruit at the top of the tree usually start ripening first. After observing your trees the first year you have fruit, you should begin to know when the best time is to start checking to see if they are starting to ripen in years to come - good luck for now.





Poor economy puts elderly at risk

It seems as though problems with the economy are affecting nearly every area of our lives. Now, evidence is mounting that older adults are cutting everyday expenses to keep up with the economic downturn.

Local senior-care experts warn families to be on alert to make sure seniors aren't cutting too deeply. Warning signs include skipping medications, pulling the plug on air conditioning and canceling social outings.

In a report released in May by AARP titled "The Economic Slowdown's Impact on Middle-Aged and Older Americans," 59 percent of seniors 65 and older surveyed said they'd found it more difficult to pay for essential items. Those are things like food, gas and medicine. Nearly half (47 percent) said they found it more difficult to pay for utilities such as heating, cooling or phone service. Forty-six percent have reduced the number of times they eat out and 45 percent cut back spending



on entertainment.1

Cuts of essential items such as food and medication should be of immediate concern to seniors' families. Other reductions in spending can lead to less obvious issues. One of the biggest problems that we see is senior isolation. That issue has really been magnified during this troubled time in our economy with the high price of gas.


An older adult can get in trouble very quickly. Especially when families live a distance from their loved ones, or when Boomer children are busy trying to make ends meet themselves. That's why it's so important that someone look out for the well-being of seniors. You want to know they are safe in their homes and eating properly, taking their medications and able to maintain their appointments and social life.

Falling interest rates, fixed incomes and seniors' fears of past hardships can influence how they react to the current economic slowdown. That's according to Sheryl Garrett, author of Personal Finance Workbook For Dummies® and several other books on financial planning. Some seniors may be running short on money but, for others, there's always that fear of running out because they lived through the Depression. They know how ugly it can get, she explained.

It's important also for seniors to guard against fraud and too-good-tobe-true offers, Garrett advises. Seniors want to get the best that they can from their investments without falling for scams or overselling tactics. Older adults also should beware of CDs and fixed annuities that can promise higher interest rates, but force seniors to lock in their money for longer time periods, Garrett noted. Always get a second opinion, she advises.

Seniors at all income levels may be facing choices they haven't had to make in the past. They should know where to go for help before they put themselves or their health at risk. Area Agencies





Admin. judge's ruling on OP trauma center

won't stop plans: CEO

Shands Jacksonville and the other hospitals challenged the rule as they try to keep hospital-company HCA from opening trauma centers in Clay, Pasco and Manatee counties.

If approved, the new facilities - including Orange Park Medical Center in Clay County - likely would divert patients away from already-existing trauma centers at the other hospitals.

The case centered on a 1992 rule that outlined a process for approving trauma centers, including carving the state into 19 trauma regions. The Tampa Bay and Jacksonville hospitals contended that reliance on the rule was outdated, at least in part because of later legislative decisions

Hospital CEO Tom Pence said Monday that the hospital is in the process of reviewing the ruling, but it will continue to move forward with its application to the state

"We are disappointed in the Judge's decision," Pence said in an emailed release. "Regardless of this decision, we believe a significant need exists for a trauma center in our community and look forward to the Department's review and approval of our application. By adding a center, we will improve the outcomes for trauma patients by giving them access to life-saving care more quickly.

"Our neighbors, families and friends deserve faster access to life-saving care when it matters most," he said.

In a 75-page decision, Watkins wrote that the Department of Health "did not present any rational explanation of how the department determines current need for additional trauma programs" based on data that helped lead to the rule.

"The department's continued reliance on the rule as a determination of current need, without explanation of how or why the rule, which is based on obsolete data and an unknown methodology, is a valid reflection of current need, leaves the logic of such an approach within the mind or minds of department employees ...," he wrote.

Watkins, who held a hearing in June, also indicated in the decision that the proposed trauma centers likely would be approved under the rule. He also detailed how the new trauma centers could affect the other hospitals, such as Shands Jack-

The Jacksonville Area Florida Department of Transportation announced the following lane closings for the week of Sept. 26-30:

I-10 resurfacing and widening project between Lane Avenue and Halsema Road: I-10 eastbound from I-295 to Lane Avenue WILL BE TOTALLY CLOSED from 10 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 2 to 5 a.m. on Monday, Oct. 3. Detour signs will be posted. I-10 westbound between Lane Avenue and Chaffee Road WILL BE TOALLY CLOSED from 10 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. 29 until 5 a.m. on Friday, Sept. 30. Detour signs will be posted. The southbound lanes on the Chaffee Road bridge over I-10 WILL BE TOTALLY CLOSED nightly from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. on Sunday, Sept. 25 and Monday, Sept. 26. Detour signs will be posted. This project is scheduled to be completed in the spring of 2012.

I-10 pavement improvement project between Stockton Street and Lane Avenue: Eastbound and westbound lanes will be closed nightly between 6:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. from Sunday, Sept. 25 through Thursday, Sept. 29. Ramp closings will occur between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m. from Sunday, Sept. 25 through Thursday, Sept. 25 through Thursday, Sept. 29. Detour signs will be posted. This project is scheduled for completion in the

summer of 2012.

I-10 between SR 23 (Cecil Commerce Center Parkway) and the Baker County line: Single lanes may be closed in both directions nightly between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m. through Friday, Sept. 30 for roadway maintenance activities.

Fuller Warren Bridge on I-95: The emergency lanes will be closed in both directions daily between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. from Tuesday, Sept. 27 through Thursday, Sept. 29 for routine bridge maintenance.

I-95 pavement and highway improvement project between Atlantic Boulevard and J. Turner Butler Boulevard: No lane closings are scheduled for next week. This project should be finished by early 2013.

Dames Point Bridge maintenance project: Two lanes will be closed in each direction nightly between 7:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. from Monday, Sept. 26 through Sunday, Oct. 2. One southbound and one northbound lane will be closed permanently for construction activities until approximately the late fall. This work should be finished in late 2011.

Mathews Bridge repainting and repair project: All eastbound lanes WILL BE TOTALLY CLOSED on Tuesday, Sept. 27 and Thursday, Sept. 29 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. nightly and on Wednesday, Sept. 28 between 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. Traffic will be detoured across the Hart Bridge to Atlantic Boulevard to University Boulevard to the Arlington Expressway. All westbound lane lanes WILL BE TOTALLY CLOSED from 7 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 30 until 6 a.m. on Sunday, Oct. 2. Traffic will be detoured from the Arlington Expressway to University Boulevard to Atlantic Boulevard to the Hart Bridge. This project should be finished by the summer of 2014.

SR 9A south of Baymeadows Road: Single lanes in each direction will be closed nightly from Sunday, Sept. 25 through Thursday, Sept. 29 between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. for construction of the new SR 9B segment. Nightly lane closings on SR 9A are expected to continue through the fall. The new SR 9B section should open in the fall of 2012.

SR 9A between J. Turner Butler Boulevard and Baymeadows Road: Single lanes will be closed at various locations nightly in both directions between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m. from Sunday, Sept. 25 through Thursday, Sept. 29 for roadway maintenance.

CR 209 bridge replacement project over Black Creek (Clay County): Daily lane closings cannot occur between 3:30 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. Lanes may be closed at various times of the day, and twoway traffic will be maintained using flaggers. This project should be finished in the

fall of 2011.

CR 315C resurfacing from Christian Camp Road (CR 214) to SR 21 (Clay County): Lanes will be closed in both directions daily between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. weekdays. This project should be finished in early 2012.

US 17 at Black Creek north of Green Cove Springs (Clay County): Various lanes will be closed in both directions on Tuesday, Sept. 27 between 9:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. for a routine bridge inspection.

US 17 at Johnson Slough about one-half mile south of Kingsley Avenue (Clay County): One northbound lane will be closed on Tuesday, Sept. 27 from 9:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. for routine bridge maintenance.

SR 21 about 2.4 miles south of SR 16 (Clay County): Various lanes will be closed in both directions between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. 29 and Friday, Sept. 30 for routine bridge maintenance. Two-way traffic will be maintained with flaggers.

earlier that a millage of 7.97 would be needed to generate the same amount of revenue as this fiscal year, given the effects of the recession.

The new budget - which passed unanimously and goes into effect Oct. 1 -- comes in well under this year's \$325.6 million spending plan, and represents a third straight year of budget reductions by the BCC.

Beseler said he was surprised by the board's proposal to take \$2.5 million from his budget and place it in the BCC's reserve fund. The subsequent move means that Beseler - one of Clay County's five, independent constitutional officers -- will have to seek the BCC's approval to spend money on his department's operating and personnel costs throughout the next fiscal year.

'Basically, they eliminated my capital



outlay and my operating budget," the sheriff said. "Now I have to come back and ask for budget adjustments [from the reserve fund].

"I've never seen this happen like this before," he said. "I don't think they

have the authority to do that over a constitutional officer. They can tell me how much I can spend, but they can't tell me how to spend it."

Beseler, who locked horns with BCC chairman Travis Cummings at a previous BCC meeting over the sheriff's plans to provide \$1,000 across-the-board raises to his 547 employees, said he plans to meet with representatives from the Florida Sheriff's Association and FSA attornevs before making his next move.

"I would anticipate coming back before the board ... and asking for that budget adjustment to restore whatever the amount is that's going to be put into that [reserve] budget because I have to know during the coming year what I've got to spend," he told commissioners. Expect to see me back here in a couple of weeks for that budget amendment to restore adequate funding to be able to operate my capital outlay for the majority of the year,"

Beseler, who reverted \$2 million of unspent money to the county this year, said that giving his staff raises isn't likely to happen, given the unexpected scenari0.

Cummings said after Tuesday's meeting that county auditor Mike Price and other county staff members were aware of the reallocation concept, and that he is confident the board is acting within its authority.

"I don't think it's an issue," Cummings said

Commissioner Ronnie Robinson said he was surprised at the proposal to redirect the \$2.5 million, and that he agreed



was not one of the

equations I had in my mind. I might have something to say about it later."

Commissioner Doug Conkey said he favored the reallocation because the county needs to "build our reserves back up" in light of the "grim" economic outlook faced by the Florida Legislature.

"[The reallocation] just means that if the money is needed, it allows what I would consider a team discussion on addressing additional needs," he said.

JACKSONVILLE -- After a successful debut Riverfest Memorial Day Weekend including the inaugural Freedom Marathon Inc., 8km running race in Green Cove Springs, FMI CEO Manny Cordero presented checks to U.S. Gunnery Sgt. John Hayes of Middleburg and the Wounded Warriors Project in Jacksonville Wednesday at the headquarters of the Wounded Warriors Project in Jacksonville.

"We tried to put on a world-class event, the Freedom Marathon 8km Series kickoff race, as well as a world class weekend of Memorial Day events just so I could help this great organization, the Wounded Warriors Project, and also to a great American serviceman injured in the line of duty, Gunnery Sgt. "He has undergone nearly 50 surgeries and is now progressing in his therapy to regain some of his abilities to move around," said Rex Hall. "He is working very hard to come back from this."

Hayes was injured in December and is at Walter Reed Army Medical Center.

Along with the checks presentation, \$1,200 to Hayes and \$8,885 to Wounded Warriors Project, Cordero and the invited guests were able to hear from retired Army Staff Sgt. Dan Nevins, director of major gifts at Wounded Warriors Project, who gave a gripping account of the explosion that would eventually take both his legs. Nevins told of his interaction with Wounded Warriors Project and his tearjerking inspiration to return to his very athletic life.

"We, at Wounded Warriors Project, do not take any government money and today's presentation from the Freedom Marathon, Inc., personnel is a wonderful gesture that I personally can attest that moneys like this can turn a man's life around," said Nevin. "I was laying in a bed at Walter Reed with one leg missing just thinking about the things I could not do

Clay Coalition holds teen leadership workshop

ORANGE PARK -- A handful of Clay County teenagers spent their Saturday, Sept. 24, learning about alcohol and tobacco abuse, peer pressures, tactical approaches to making changes within their communities and how to influence change as part of the Clay Action Coalition's 2012 "Leadership U" Teen Leadership Workshop at Thrasher-Horne Conference Center.

The program also including information from the Clay Department of Health's Tobacco Prevention Program which includes Students Working Against Tobacco (SWAT).

"I learned a lot about the dangers of alcohol and tobacco that I did not know," said Lakeside Junior High's Jack Fitzgerald, a seventh grade football player. "I was given the flyer for the event from my teacher, Mrs. Bumpers, and decided to attend. I didn't know that the effects of abuse stay with you for your entire life."

The students, among them Lakeside, Oakleaf Junior High, Orange Park High School, Middleburg High School and Fleming Island High School attended various breakout sessions with different projects and information concerning the inherent dangers of alcohol and tobacco usage by young students.

"I'm not really friends with a lot of people that are involved with tobacco or alcohol because I am part of an athletic group at my school," said Megan Buzby, a freshman at Orange Park High School. "I run cross country and that would definitely not help me. I am learning a lot about what it does to your body and I think if others knew the dangers, they would think twice about taking a drink or smoking a cigarette.

Part of the day was spent with Green Cove Springs historian Art Yeaman as well who entertained the students in his Benjamin Franklin costumed reenactment of the eras around the inceptions of the Bill of Rights and Declaration of Independence.

"I think the early historical part of our

at an event like this, because it shows that a small, educated and informed group can make a vast difference in how not only their community works, but how an entire country can be affected," Yeaman said afterward. "Our laws were formulated by just a small group of men."

Groups were put in seminars concerning citizenship, local improvements and policy change as well as utilizing media messages and social networking to get messages out.

"We essentially wanted to give the students the tools to be leaders in their community," said Stephanie Geoghagan, Clay Action Coalition coordinator. "We have seen some measurable results from our recent surveys that these type of conferences are very effective in getting the word out about the dangers of substance abuse.'

One statistic that Geoghagan noted positively was a decreasing trend in alcohol use by teenagers in Clay County. In 2004, Clay County was above the state average for teens surveyed as to alcohol use in a monthly survey.

'The state does a study each year and gives the county percentage of teens who answered they did or did not have an alcohol drink within a 30 day period," said Geoghagan. "We were above that state average and decided to put some education programs in place."

Geoghagan gave statistics that showed a steady decrease from 65 percent of more than 1,000 Clay County teens who did not drink in 2005 to 74 percent what answered last year that they did not have an alcohol drink within 30 days of the survey.

"While we see that as a positive trend and hope that it is because of education, we are hopeful to get that number higher," said Geoghagan.

At the Leadership U conference, moderators had teens making T-shirts with information messages, brainstorming for ways to influence larger numbers of their peers and taking steps to educate themcountry is important for the students, even selves to participate in local town hall

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

Oakleaf hosts regional agriscience conclave

ORANGE PARK -- OakLeaf High hosted educators from four other school districts Sept. 21 to discuss Clay County's agriscience education program's plant biotechnology track. The district representatives came to get ideas for their own programs, taking notes and photos and asking questions.

In Plant Biotechnology, students learn techniques and practices important to the plant industry.

OakLeaf High prinicipal David Broskie welcomed the visitors, who came from La-Fayette, Charlotte, St. Johns and Gadsden counties.

A repeated theme throughout the event was that with today's technology, the program is not just "cows, sows, and plows" anymore.

Paul Parker, Clay County's Career and Technical Education director, spoke about why plant biotechnology was important for schools.

"Clay County is one of the top producers of industry certifications in the state," he said.

Keri Milligan, OakLeaf's agriscience teacher, present standards and lessons, discussed professional development opportunities, offered ideas for expanding the program and answered questions.

She also gave a tour of the facilities, which include indoor labs supply closet which doubles as a plant tissue culture lab, and outside there's a butterfly garden, vegetable garden a new plant nursery and a greenhouse. Milligan, a University of Florida graduate, is the state teacher of the year for agriscience. She's in her second year at OakLeaf.

"I've been working really closely with the junior high," to promote the program, she said.

Eileen Monck, associate professor and biotechnology program coordinator for Santa Fe Collge in Alachua, also spoke at the presentation.

Curtis Richardson, director of school improvement for Gadsden County, said the information he learned Wednesday would be helpful in expanding his county's firstyear program.

"Because we are just starting, we wanted to get an idea of the curriculum, the materials and the supplies needed and since we'll be starting an FFA, (we needed to see) how to get it started because that is an integral part."

He also said he came to learn what resources might be available to his county.

"We'll take advantage of the professional development opportunities" he said.

Larry Woodward, program specialist at Ponte Vedra High in St. Johns County, said even though the school only has a medical track right now, plant biotechnology is something he there's an interest in.


"We always are in talks about a second strand." He said he'd want to offer certification if the program were to be added in St. Johns, "because that brings money back to your program."

Candy and fruit flavored tobacco products—cigars, cigarillos and chewing tobacco-act as "starter" products for young people beginning a life endangering addiction to nicotine. These products, with flavors such as peach, strawberry and grape, are not widely known to adult tobacco users. In fact, a study conducted by the Roswell Park Cancer Center in 2004, found that teens are more than twice as likely to recall seeing any flavored tobacco products, the release states.

Clay County SWAT youth and Tobacco Free Clay members are working to educate local elected officials on the tobacco industry's "Sweet Deception" and asking local municipalities to adopt a resolution to support restricting youth access and exposure to these products. Wildlife study this summer at Camp Blanding may yield insights into black bear behavior

Florida National Guard Public Affairs CAMP BLANDING – A wildlife study at the National Guard's training post may soon give biologists insight into one of the state's most intriguing inhabitants.

The two-year study of Florida black bears at Camp Blanding Joint Training Center began this summer, and will be looking into the movement patterns and behavioral habits of the omnivorous mammals on the military site.

The study is a partnership between the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) and Camp Blanding, and may help answer questions about what appears to be an expanding bear population at the 72,000-acre training site.

"We want to see what the bears are doing here on Blanding, because we are seeing more and more bears everywhere," Camp Blanding Environmental Manager Paul Catlett explained. "I've got guys who have worked here for 35 years, and in the last five years have seen their first bear...Is it the fact that there are more bears now or the fact that they are losing habitat?"

Catlett, who lives on the post and has been working there for 17 years, said he thinks there are just more bear sightings because the population of the animals has gradually increased. He said sightings can spike when their habitats are encroached upon by development, but that doesn't appear to be the case at Blanding.

A robust bear population on the post could mean the habitat here is strong and healthy, Catlett said.

"As a land manager I want to know that we're doing the right things; that we're having a positive influence," he said. "It's possible this is a sign that the habitat is strong and we're doing the right things here."

Black bears are the only species of bear found in Florida, and the FWC estimates there are between 2,500 and 3,000 black bears in the state. Adult bears weigh between 125 to 450 pounds, and can be found anywhere in Florida.

The study itself is simple: biologists and volunteers place specialized tracking collars on the bears and follow their movements around the area via radio signals. The movements are plotted on a map with a latitude and longitude point for each signal, letting the team see when the bears move and where exactly they go.

Getting the collars on the wild animals is a much more complicated matter.

The study-team pinpoints high "beartraffic" areas on Camp Blanding, sets snares at the sites, and places scent lures (usually glazed donuts or fabric soaked in bacon fat) around the area. When a curious bear sniffs his way to the site and gets JOHN FAGAN

New 511 app has traffic cam info



TALLAHASSEE – For travelers who want to see what traffic looks like before getting on the highway, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has an app for that. The Florida 511 app now features traffic camera views associated with crashes, congestion and other incidents on all of Florida's interstates and toll roads. The app is for the iPhone, iPad and iPod Touch and is available for free download on the iTunes App Store.

The Florida 511 app is the newest addition to FDOT's suite of resources for traffic information. Florida travelers can call 511, visit FL511.com, download the 511 app and/or register for My Florida 511 personalized services to receive traffic updates from FDOT. Florida 511 is updated with crashes, congestion and travel time information. Traffic camera views are available on FL511.com and now on the Florida 511 app.

To view traffic camera views, users can tap the traffic camera image on an incident to view traffic near that location. To ensure accurate traffic information based on GPS location, users should elect to provide the iPhone access to the user's location. An app for the Android is in development.

The Florida 511 system is also updated during emergencies with critical information.

sonville.

"If the Orange Park trauma center is approved, it is reasonable to expect that all of Shands trauma patients originating from Clay County would instead be redirected to Orange Park," he wrote. "This would represent a loss of approximately 1,000 patients annually, or 25 percent of Shands current trauma volume."

HCA argued in a legal document, however, that the rule challenges were about the Tampa Bay and Jacksonville hospitals trying to "monopolize the delivery of trauma services through restraint of trade or commerce."





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

He said Florida's adverse possession law was passed in the late 1860s, likely because of the number of abandoned properties created by the Civil War.

The law since has been revised to give property owners more rights to retain their property, Suggs said. He said that gaining possession of a "truly abandoned" home or piece of land requires the claimant to pay the property taxes for seven straight years, and that property owners must be notified of any possession claims to give them the opportunity to pay current or delinquent

If both parties pay the taxes, the revision gives payment priority to the property owner, according to Suggs.

"The claimant would need to start the process all over again," he said.

Suggs said the law needs further revision to help protect property owners who at one time could have had their homes claimants who paid

he said.

"These homes [in Oakleaf] aren't really abandoned," Suggs said. "There haven't been any breaks in the chain of title. Unfortunately, [the claimants] are picking high profile homes and not ones that truly are abandoned.'

Clay County Commissioner Wendell Davis, who also is immediate past president of the Florida Association of Realtors, said the adverse possession law has come into play a handful of times during his 33-year career in real estate.

"Most of the time it happens during a bad economy," he said. "Back in the late [1980s], there were several incidences. Whenever it does happen, it causes real problems."

ous bear sniffs his way to the site and gets caught in the snare, a radio signal lets the team know it has a catch. The captured bear is then tranquilized, weighed tagged, and fitted with the tracking collar.

"We can respond quickly, dart them, and get them out of the snare," explained Walter McCown, an FWC research biologist who specializes in bears.

After an hour or two the bear wakes up from the effects of the tranquilizer and is sent back into the forest.

"These collars are actually quite sophisticated," McCown explained. "They will acquire positions from GPS satellites and report the positions through a text message to a ground base on my computer. We don't have to follow them around. We'll be getting 24 to 27 locations a day, which we will use to identify travel-ways for bears."

The collared bear will get used to the device around its neck after a couple of days, McCown said. The thick leather collar weighs less than four pounds with the attached battery pack, and is programmed to drop off the bear's neck after about two years.

McCown and the study group have already identified and collared five bears on Camp Blanding, and have collared an additional two bears that were off the post. Five of the bears were males – the largest male captured weighed 320 pounds.

The FWC is receiving data from each collar and sharing the results with two local schools to help educate children and dispel misconceptions about the animals.

"Many people in Florida are surprised we actually have bears here," McCown, who has been studying the mammals for 15 years, said.

"They are not aware of it, although bears are becoming more of an issue in this state. I think part of my mission is to spread information about how neat bears are, how to live with bears, and the value of preserving and maintaining the bear populations in the state."

Another result of the ongoing study may clear up a bit of a mystery surrounding the bear population on Camp Blanding; it could explain why the black bears at the base all seem to have migrated from Ocala National Forest about 25 miles away.

Since the training base sits midway in a natural corridor between the sprawling Ocala National Forest to the south and the smaller Osceola National Forest to the north, biologists might expect to find bears from both forests at Camp Blanding. However, according to Catlett a previous study of the Blanding bear population found that it shared DNA exclusively with the Ocala bears.

Both Catlett and McCown said the data from this current study may help determine if the Ocala or Osceola bears are avoiding certain areas during their movements or are deterred by specific roads or other obstacles to travel between the two forests.

The data could possibly be used to help connect parcels of land to facilitate the bear movement and create additional conservation easements if warranted.

Based on initial data McCown said he thinks there are only a few resident bears on Camp Blanding, but other bears pass through regularly due to their penchant for the thick bottomland hardwood and well-preserved swampy areas of the post.

"There are maybe four to five resident animals now, but I hope there will be more in the future," he said.





MHS players face suspension over brawl

ORANGE PARK – Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSAA) officials will be busy reviewing statements and videotapes following a postgame brawl after Leon High School held off a late rally to defeat the visiting Middleburg Broncos 17-14 last Friday night in the emotionally charged District 3-6A opener in Tallahassee.

The brawl erupted during the standard postgame player handshake line which all teams do following high school games, however, a heated discussion began with a player from each team that quickly escalated into an all out brawl which sent Middleburg assistant coach Daniel Pearce to a local hospital - - Pearce required two staples near the top of his head to close a gash received during the melee according to Broncos head coach Rob Justino.

"We have sent letters of inquiry to both schools and they have three days to respond," Corey Sobers, Public Relations Specialist of the FHSAA said on Monday afternoon. "Right now we are awaiting further information and videotapes that we will review, a decision will be rendered once all the information is gathered."

"I saw one of our players and a Leon player in a heated discussion and the coaches separated them," Justino said. "The next thing I saw was coach Pearce on the ground bleeding from his head - all of my attention was directed to him after that."

According to the Tallahassee Democrat, Leon's local paper, multiple sources who have viewed video footage of the brawl including Leon County Schools athletic director Ricky Bell, said he expects a minimum of 5-7 players from both teams to face disciplinary action.

"If they {Leon players} were fighting, it will be a six-week suspension," Bell told the Democrat. "If they threw or used their helmets, it will be a year," he added.

Middleburg athletic director Allan Powers, who was reviewing the video footage late Monday into Tuesday night, confirmed that multiple suspensions will be handed down.

"There will definitely be a handful of suspensions on our team as well," Powers said on Tuesday morning. "I'm still in the process of reviewing the video and expect to have something back to the FHSAA later today or first thing Wednesday morning. According to FHSAA rules, which states, if a player leaves the bench area during a fight, they will be penalized, but this situation could possibly be viewed differently since it was a postgame handshake and players had already left the bench area. "The whole event ruined what really was a very good ballgame," Justino said. "We will deal with our kids accordingly but I don't believe we were the aggressors, I think the kids responded after seeing their coach down."

Panthers rally late to knock Orange Park

ORANGE PARK - The Ridgeview Panthers have had very little success playing at Orange Park's Hoyt Cotney Field, but that all changed Friday night thanks to the passing combination of Josh Moore to Mitchell Galloway. Moore connected with Galloway on a 25-yard touchdown pass with 1:32 left in the game to rally Ridgeview to a 14-10 come-from-behind victory over Orange Park in a District 3-6A contest.

"All the work over the summer has really paid off for us," Ridgeview head coach Tom Macpherson said. "We played every down and never gave up over the last two games. We are now 1-0 in the district and our next two district games are at home."

Orange Park took the opening drive and marched 84 yards in 13 plays culminating on sophomore running back Eddie Fuller's 14 yard TD run with 5:36 left in the opening quarter to jump out to a 7-0 lead. Fuller, who rushed for a game-high 144 yards on 19 carries, led the Raiders (1-2, 0-1) potent rushing attack which amassed 330 yards on 58 attempts.

On the ensuing kick-off Ridgeview's Divine Maloney was hit by the Raiders Austin Logue forcing a fumble that was recovered by Brandon Kuhn on the Panther 29 yard line. But four plays later Ridgeview



defensive back Chris Hepburn intercepted a pass at the Ridgeview 16 to thwart the drive.

"In years past we have given up," Macpherson said. "We withstood that initial drive and turnover, we turned our night around."

The game was played in a steady soaking rain for the first three quarters limiting Ridgeview's potent passing attack. Ridgeview drove 52 yards in 14 plays to tie the game at 7-7 on Moore's one-yard keeper on fourth-and-goal with 9:31 left in the opening half.

"The conditions were awful to throw in," Ridgeview junior Josh Moore, who completed 8-of-18, passes for 58 yards said.

Orange Park drove to the Ridgeview 21-yard line on its opening drive of the fourth quarter and settled on a 37-yard field goal from placekicker Connor Lofton to gain a 10-7 advantage with 3:21 left in the game. The Raiders drive featured 11 straight runs that lasted 6:01 as they held a 30 to 18 minute advantage in time of possession.

Ridgeview, which started their gamewinning drive on their 20-yard line, did something that they usually don't do. The Panthers rushed eight times for 44 yards led by senior running back Vic boring who rushed five times for 35 yards on the

game-winning drive.

Moore then hooked up with Galloway on a 25-yard TD pass on a perfectly thrown post-corner route to move out to a 14-10 lead with just 1:32 left in the game.

"We came out in power right and ran the ball right up the gut," Macpherson said. "In the past we could never run the ball against Orange Park. This is a tribute to all the off-season workouts in the weight room." The Raiders drove to the Ridgeview 16-yard line with three seconds left in the game on several effective double hand-offs between Fuller and Erick Hayward (19 rushed, 108 yards).

On fourth down from the 16 yard-line Orange Park quarterback Taylor Muth was stopped by Galloway at the Ridgeview fiveyard line as time expired sealing the win for the Panthers.




Bolles survives Golden Eagles second half rally

In the game, both teams had rallied from deficits, Leon responded with two touchdowns to take a 17-7 lead after trailing 7-3, but the Broncos pulled to within 17-14 after Tyler McCormick recovered a blocked punt and returned it six-yards for a touchdown - - less than three minutes remained at this point.

Middleburg wasn't finished yet - - they then attempted an onside kick that one official ruled the Broncos recovered, but a second ruled that Leon had possession. Following a lengthy delay, officials gave the ball to Leon, much to the dismay of Justino and the Broncos' sideline.

"I was almost sure we recovered that kick," Justino said. "The official closest to the play ruled we recovered but I guess the other saw it differently."

Nevertheless, Middleburg's defense forced a Leon punt and the offense drove into field goal range with the clock ticking down.

Middleburg's comeback attempt failed when quarterback Rick Lassiter threw a pass that was intercepted by a Leon defensive back inside his five-yard line and and receiver Brontrell hooked up on a 17yard fade pattern for the touchdown.

Dante Roberts completed 13 of 29 passes for 196 yards; eight of those passes went to Brontrell for 108 yards and two touchdowns.

But Bolles responded with a touchdown just before halftime as the Bulldogs were successful on fourth-and-goal as running back Tim Betros found the end zone from seven yards out.

Bolles took their largest lead of the night by virtue of Dante Roberts' first interception of the season. Bulldogs freshman Trenton McGee picked him off in the middle of the field, one play later, Betros again found the end zone, this time from 13 yards out and a 24-7 lead with 6:40 left in the 3rd quarter.

Having made a few halftime adjust-

returned for a touchdown, however, a penalty flag nullified the touchdown to end the game - - and the fireworks began.

"We will let them {Leon County Sheriff's Dept. and the FHSAA} deal with this," Justino said. "I don't know if our kids could have done anything differently, they were trying to protect themselves."

Leon County Sheriff's Office Lt. James McQuaig said a criminal investigation is ongoing, and that his department has turned a copy of the video over to the Leon County School District for an administrative review.

"No arrests have been made at this time," he said. "No timetable has been set" for completion of a criminal investigation.

McQuaig said the injury to Middleburg assistant coach Daniel Pearce was the only one he was aware of that required a trip to a local hospital.

Justino said Leon High principal Rocky Hanna and head coach Bill Ragans apologized to him and the coaching staff following the brawl.

Attempts to reach Leon coach Bill Ragans were unsuccessful and messages were not returned.

Middleburg travels to Menendez this Friday night while Leon is on a bye this week.

Peters passed just nine times completed six of them for 73 yards but he converted two key third downs - - one through the air and once via his legs.


While the defense shutdown Bolles and took advantage of safety on a botched

ORANGE PARK – Last Friday presented district opening night for Clay County high school football teams and for Keystone, Oakleaf and St. Johns Country Day School, the openers did not go well, each lost on the road.

Even though the stats were relatively even when the Indians traveled to central Florida to face Mount Dora, they suffered a 35-6 defeat in its 4-4A opener.

Mount Dora (2-2) outgained the Indians by just 50 yards and had just one more first down, but the Hurricanes pitched a shutout until the final play of the game when tight end Matthew Dickinson took a short pass from Evan Harvey on a crossing route and scored a 33-yard touchdown.

"We just didn't get the job done," Keystone coach Chuck Dickinson said.

Harvey completed 8-of-18 passes for 112 yards, while running back Alex Gonzales gained 110 yards on 22 carries. However, the Indians (1-2) always seemed to have a play that would kill a drive before it could end with points.

"We'd either have a penalty or a missed blocking assignment, or get a sack or something like that," Dickinson said.

Flashes receiver OJ Williams returned the opening kickoff 100 yards and the (0-2, 0-1) Spartans never recovered.

St. Johns was held to less than 100 yards of offense as senior QB Joseph Chiafair completed just 3 of 14 pass attempts for 50 yards and JP Steinmetz rushed for 4 yards on 3 carries and Drew Petty gained 10 yards on 9 attempts.

Frank had already retired from the Navy, where he had attained the rank of Master Chief.

Frank was hired as Director of Maintenance, with 7 or 8 employees under him. He retires as Director of Buildings and Grounds and Safety Director, responsible for 42 people. He has always tried to hire the most capable workers available and insisted that they be well paid. During his tenure the Quad experienced a major renovation; the Pavilion for Health Care (and recently the new addition for Suncrest Rehabilitation), Barrows Hall, and the Commons Building were all constructed. Penmor Place received an addition that doubled its capacity: Bever House underwent two additions. Hagen Care Center has been improved and extended. Three new cottages have been added, plus new

duplexes on the south side of Caroline Blvd. Almost every cottage apartment has been renovated. Two- and three-room apartments have been created in the Quad. Closed circuit television has been provided to the Pavilion, Penmor, Beyer House, Hagen Care Center, the Quad, and the Commons.

Bob Rigel appreciated Frank's expertise in each of the areas his work covered: carpentry, electricity, plumbing. Jim Moore celebrated "a life dedicated to service" and Frank's success in "an exceedingly difficult job done extremely well." He testified that Frank listened carefully and thoughtfully to all that was said. Billy Kersey had first worked under Frank as volunteer Fire Chief at Station 44. He remembers many things Frank has taught him, for example, "A wire always shows its potential voltage." Billy will never forget what he's learned from Frank.

When residents were invited to speak, 10 different men and women stood to the microphones. Sid Rooy appreciated Frank's cooperation with the P.E.T. project. Janis Dyke "appreciated Frank even when she didn't agree with him." Jim Bailev said how useful and helpful he was with Arts and Crafts. Yvonne Vinkemulder had observed that Frank often came as first responder to anyone who needed help. Rex Lindemood expressed gratitude for all Frank had done for his wife's parents, aunt, and sister, the Simonson family, when they were residents here. Gary Brown appreciated Frank's advice on safety issues. "He brought us down to earth." Teddy Staser remembered how he had brought extra staff to stay on campus when a big storm was threatening.

Finally Frank's turn came. He confessed how he had first thought, "All these old people – and me in my 40's!" He found these old people to be "very loving, cooperative, educated, dedicated human beings. I've tried to operate as if we are all family – all God's children," he declared. He remembered in particular Mully Simonson and testified, "Because of him I'm leaving here a much better man." And he addressed his staff: "Every one of you makes me look good."




