Clay jail contraband ring busted

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A three-month investigation by security officers at the Clay County Jail has uncovered a ring accused of smuggling contraband into the pre-trial center at the request of inmates.

As the investigation broadened, Clay County Sheriff's Office officials found that the contraband was also being concealed at at least three different county sites where it would be picked up by inmate trustees and taken back to the jail for consumption.

"There were batteries, pills, cocaine, cigarettes, light-

ers, dip tobacco, razor blades and other items being found that caused concern regarding the safety and security of the inmates and staff," stated CCSO Public Information Coordinator Mary Justino in a prepared statement. "Items were hidden in lobby bathrooms and visitation bathrooms

Teacher firing heads to challenge phase

ORANGE PARK – The Clay County Education Association is challenging the Feb. 21 firing of an Orange Park Junior High teacher for having had a stun gun in a locked cabinet in her classroom last year.

Tracy Butler, association service unit director, said the Clay County School Board vote to fire Helena Feuerborn did "not rise to the level of termination and the punishment does not fit the crime." Butler and the CCEA filed the legal challenge to Feuerborn's firing on Feb. 20. Feuerborn was fired on a 5-0 school board vote despite never having been charged with a crime in the incident.

Under Florida law, it is a third degree felony to bring a stun gun or other types of electronic weapons on the campus of a

Oh-No, Volcano

There's an eruption occurring in some yards in Clay County. You might see it in a neighbor's yard, along a lovely planted streetscape or in a parking lot you frequent.

As spring landscapes are refreshed, in some landscapes little volcanoes are cropping up like island chains, surging around the bases of trees and shrubs. Have you seen this phenomenon?



Seasonal concerns from gardeners

Perhaps you've even copied the volcano look, thinking that if so many people are doing it, it's a proper technique. If so, - quick, grab your rake and turn your volcanoes into flat desert isles, then rush back and read more to see why this practice should be discouraged in any landscape.

It's a common mistake that gardeners - and even seasoned professionals - make. By correcting it quickly, your landscape plants will thank you.

Volcano mulching, or the practice of piling much deeply against the trunk or stem, will ultimately hurt the health of any plant and may even be its death sentence. For shrubs and trees that have just been plant-

ed, the volcano encourages improper root development.

Soil at the surface level will become waterlogged under the volcano, creating the perfect conditions for rotting and suffocated roots. The roots will try to grow up through the mulch rather than out into the surrounding soil. Eventually the roots that develop in the volcano will dry out the mound of mulch as they seek moisture, inducing drought conditions that further stress the plant.

With certain mulches, the umbrella-shaped top surface can experience fungal activity that makes the surface resistant to water saturation. Water will then shed off the volcano surface to the surrounding soil, and worsen the drought conditions within the volcano. This is especially true for mulches that naturally have a high carbon content, such as chipped or ground wood and sawdust. Too much volcano mulch-induced drying out and the plant will eventually die without ever properly establishing its roots in the ground.

Established plants are at equal risk from volcano mulching practices, though the effects are different. The risk of root rots is much higher, as roots already established in the soil are smothered and fail to adequately get necessary oxygen. At the trunk base, the excess moisture also results in rot and decay, weakening the supporting structure of the plant. More damage to the trunk can occur from rodents

that may take advantage of the opportunity to hide in the volcano and gnaw on bark.

This type of damage opens the plant up to more potential fungal and rot problems. Volcanoes may also hide damage from girdling roots - those that circle the base and strangle the main trunk as they grow and expand. Just like a boa constrictor, a girdling or circling root may eventually cut off the circulation - in this case, of water and nutrients the plant needs to move up from the roots.

If you discover girdling roots when correcting a mulch volcano, you can carefully cut them to free the trunk as long as the root isn't more than a third of the trunk diameter in size. Young trees respond well to this treatment. A trained arborist should

be consulted for advice if the girdling root is large or if it's become embedded in the trunk.

Mulch is generally a great thing for plants. Properly placed, mulch is fantastic at keeping in moisture and distributing it more evenly to roots. It helps moderate soil temperature, protecting roots from cold and heat extremes. It can keep weeds at bay, and even help block some soil-borne diseases.

Mulch makes soil magic as it breaks down, enriching fertility and improving soil structure with better drainage and aeration. All of this greatly benefits your plants - but only an evenly distributed layer about two-inch to three-inches thick is helpful. Also, while mulch should be extended as far out as the drip line (or reach of the outermost leaves) whenever possible, it should never be placed right against the trunk or main stems of any plant. Leave a few inches clear against the trunk or stem of shrubs and up to 18 inches clear with large trees. Aim for at least an eight-foot diameter circle on large trees where it's not practical to mulch the entire drip line, or consolidate multiple trees into a flowing 'island' bed of mulch. Proper mulching will save your plants as well as saving you money on mulch. Above all, avoid the volcano - too much mulch will smother your plants in the long run.

Orange Park Medical Center not closing the ER

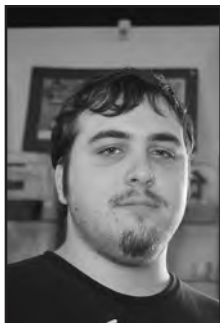

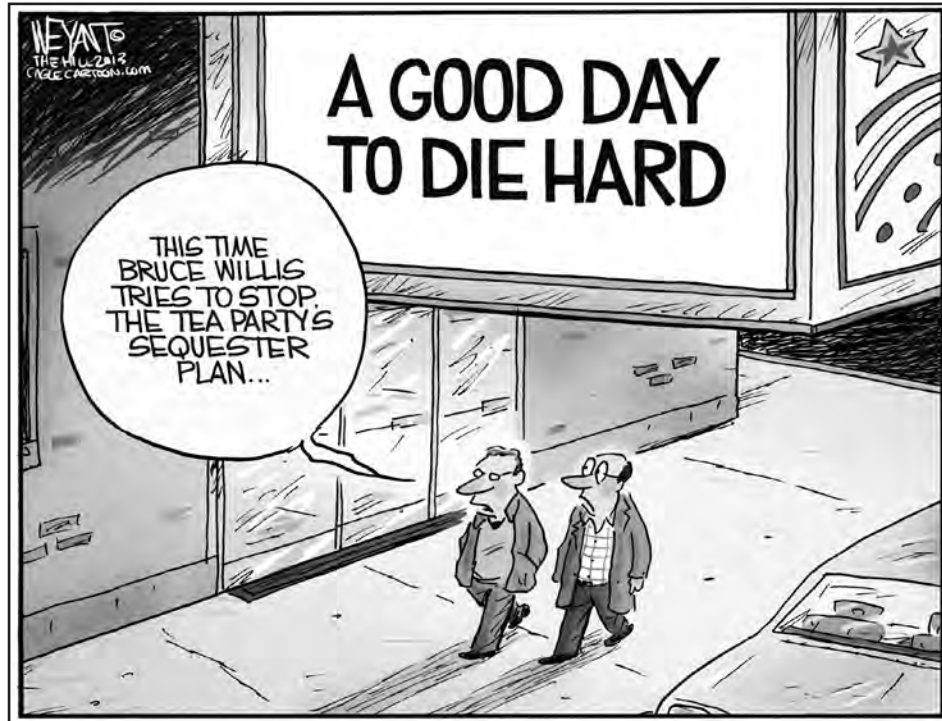

What you need to know before enrolling in this program Income based student loan repayment: is it really a good idea?

My dad always says, "If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is."

With that in mind, let's take a look at an idea that is taking up much debate on the national level—Income Based Student Loan Repayment. Sounds wonderful, huh?

Another attractive feature is that when you continue to pay back your loan without missing any payments for 20 years, your loan balance would be forgiven.

So, if you are faced with \$80,000 in student loan debt, with a repayment schedule of \$925 per month and only earning \$45,000 per year, you might be thinking "sign me up." And some current students may think that it doesn't matter how much money I borrow, Uncle Sam will pay off any loan balance I can't afford.

You ask, "Is there a catch?" Here's some info from the fine print. Primarily, the interest on your student loan does not stop accruing when you sign up for this program. In essence, if your payment is less than the interest that is being charged, you

are not only paying down the principal, your loan balance is also increasing.

Compound interest is "the eighth wonder of the world" when it's working for you in your savings. It's a financial death toll when it's working against you. Let me say that again, you are making payments for 20 years and your loan balance is increasing.

You may be thinking, "Uncle Sam will pay it off no matter the balance, so it doesn't really hurt me, right?" On the contrary. You will need to know that the Internal Revenue Service consider "Loan Repayment" to be an income windfall, for which you will be subject to income tax at whatever the tax rate is in 20 years. And there is no free repayment schedule with the IRS.

This might make more sense if we put some real numbers to it. To be clear, these numbers are not reflective of any individual, just an example of what could happen under Income Based Repayment.

For example, the interest rate on Bob's student loan is five percent. Bob's income never changes, so his student loan payment remains the same over 20 years.

in Clay County.

"Being a veteran, I understand their needs or concerns," said Claridy Davis, who served in the Navy for 20 years. "If anyone has had trouble filing for claims, I'm here to supply excellent service and customer satisfaction."

The veteran service officer is the primary point of contact to help veterans with benefits. Any male or female veteran who served from any era or military branch and was honorably discharged is eligible for certain benefits, including monthly compensation, medical treatment, burial allowances, grave markers, presidential memorial certificates, and benefits for their immediate family.

"I will not turn any veteran away," Claridy Davis said. "I can also help with filing for education benefits and filing an appeal and benefits unjustly denied."

In the first month on the job, more than 10 families have received her assistance.

"There are usually just a couple of forms to fill out," Claridy Davis said, a native of Brenham, Texas. "A lot of people may not come in because they think there's a ton of paperwork, but it's not overwhelming."

Although Claridy Davis receives calls from military spouses, many family members are unsure of their eligibility and, she

said, rightly so.

"The families have served right along with the veteran and are eligible for certain types of coverage," Claridy Davis said. "They may have given up careers to travel with their veterans, or endured long separations. They deserve these benefits."

During the Vietnam War, Robert Phillips was drafted at age 18 and went into the U.S. Air Force. Like many veterans, Phillips had many duties, but primarily, he was a machine gunner and performed perimeter patrol. Today, Phillips is a retired photography teacher and volunteers at the Clay County Chapter of the Vietnam Veterans of America. The group's motto is: "never again will one generation abandon another," and offers its 100 members a support network, including spreading the word about the VSO position being filled again.

"Most of us exited the military with problems, mental or physical," Phillips said, diagnosed with post traumatic stress disorder after the war. "We're not all the same. We all have different issues. Agent Orange gave me a heart condition."

Reentering society after service is often a stressful time. A study by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs revealed that a vet commits suicide every 65 minutes. Last year, 349 military members committed suicide. Phillips said the transition from war is like coming back into a strange world. Unable to cope, some struggle with violent outbursts, drug abuse or alcoholism before taking his or her life.

"It's like a slow-growing cancer," Phillips said about mental health. "A lot of times, it's all in your head."

Phillips sees transportation as a primary challenge. One member of the Clay veterans group rides a horse for his main form of transportation. Phillips would like to see more support from the veteran's service office to help with transportation to and from doctor's appointments.

"The VA has millions of dollars in medical equipment, but if a vet can't get from Keystone Heights to Shands, it's pointless," Phillips said.

Retired Navy Capt. Vaul Haws Jr. is the Chairman of Clay County Veterans Council and Vice President of Chapter 1059 of Vietnam Veterans of America. He is pleased with the progress and cooperation with the county officials hiring Claridy Davis. In neighboring counties, the ratio is one veteran's service officer per 6,000.

"The county is working with due diligence on this," Haws said. "We've earned these benefits. Period."

public school. It is also against school district policy.

Clay County Sheriff's Office Det. Ken Rodgers said a substitute teacher found the stun gun in a locked filing cabinet in Feuerborn's classroom last September while searching for teaching supplies. Feuerborn was never contacted about the stun gun until January as she was out on maternity leave and, while out, was having health issues relating to her recent pregnancy.

"I was brought into the case at the conclusion of Christmas break and was given the information and told to contact any necessary people upon their return back to school," Rodgers said in a Feb. 26 telephone interview. "[Feuerborn] told me she had it for self-defense and had forgotten about it," Rodgers said. "She said that it didn't work and that she thought she had thrown it away."

After gathering all of the data surrounding the incident, Rodgers sat down and reviewed the case with Assistant State Attorney Khary Gaynor to determine the validity of the case. They mutually agreed there was no case to prosecute. Rodgers was brought in on the case Jan. 7 and met with Gaynor Jan. 10.

"It was decided at the time she would not be charged," Rodgers said. "The case was determined to be exceptionally clear and prosecution declined."

Rodgers said that on Jan. 28 and 29, he went back into the CCSO evidence locker -- where the stun gun had sat since September -- to retrieve the stun gun in order to photograph the inoperable weapon for Toni McCabe, assistant superintendent for human resources. McCabe did not return phone calls for this story.

Feuerborn was only notified 48 hours prior to the Feb. 21 school board meeting in which her case would come up for a vote. There was no open discussion regarding her case as most personnel issues are protected under the state's Open Records laws. However, school board attorney Bruce Bickner made a point at the meeting to explain why Feuerborn's case, and one other case involving a teacher resignation, had been placed on the agenda after the agenda had been posted, which would usually result in a violation of the state's Administrative Procedures Act governing open meetings.

Bickner said the agenda items had

met the standard for "good cause" to be placed on the agenda after he held a telephone conference with McCabe, Deputy Superintendent Denise Adams and school board Chairman Carol Studdard. Studdard, as chairman, approved the items being placed on the agenda. Bickner did not return phone calls for this story.

"To quote an attorney with whom I have discussed the case, she would have been more dangerous with a ketchup bottle than this inoperable stun gun," Butler said. "We are filing for wrongful termination because, it is our position that the school board broke her contract without just cause. We're not convinced Mrs. Feuerborn committed a felony."

Butler said Feuerborn, under the new school district leadership, never had a chance to face her accuser nor had a chance to respond to the charges prior to the school board taking up her pending firing.

"The teacher, or representative, is contrary to the law, being denied any information about the accuser, the specific claims, the basic allegation details, until the time of the final disposition," Butler told the school board prior to considering Feuerborn's firing. "Yes, the teacher is called in for questioning, however there is no other opportunity for defense, no opportunity for the teacher to face his or her accuser, no opportunity for questioning or challenging of the validity of the claims prior to the recommendation for termination. This is unacceptable practice and contrary to the Constitution of our country."

At the meeting, no school board members questioned McCabe's recommendation to fire Feuerborn. Instead, board member Janice Kerekes made the motion to accept McCabe's recommendation to fire whom Butler described as "a seasoned and highly-effective teacher." The motion was seconded by first-term board member Johnna McKinnon.

Butler said the CCEA seeks to have Feuerborn re-instated to her position and be paid for any back wages and benefits owed her in the interim.

In other school board business Feb. 21, board members voted to accept the resignation of a 20-year teaching veteran whom Butler also described as highly-effective. The teacher, whose name was withheld, was also nationally-certified and any prior charges against her had been dropped.

Board members also discussed a first draft of a policy governing public comment and how it will be handled during school board meetings, as well as when developing meeting agendas.

Date is set: Traveling Vietnam Memorial Wall coming to Green Cove Springs

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – When a Green Cove Springs Junior High student touched the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial Wall in Washington for the first time last year, he was so moved that he said he wanted all of his classmates to have the same experience.

The student, who has since moved out of state, had a chance to visit the memorial while his family was in the area attending his grandfather's funeral at Arlington National Cemetery. The student, whose name is being withheld, wanted to visit the memorial to pay homage to his grandfather's Vietnam comrades who never made it back from the war. He came back to his school and discussed the experience with his civics teacher, Michael Taft.

"He said after standing at that wall, he felt something that was 'magical and holy,'" said Taft who also serves as the school's Junior Beta Club sponsor. "He said he just wished everybody could go up there and see it."

After sitting down with Taft and talking about his experience, the discussion that began as a Beta Club service project idea, grew into a schoolwide project – why

not bring one of four U.S. moving Vietnam Memorial walls to the school's campus in 2013. Taft said he ran the idea by the school principal and gauged support among other Beta Club members and began putting together a plan to make one

student's wish come true. May 9 through 14, a three-fifth's scale replica of the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial Wall will travel to Green Cove Springs Junior High.

"I tell you, this has been one of the biggest undertakings of my life," Taft said. "It's going to all be worth it in the end here."

Taft said, if history repeats itself, what was once an illusory American war, will now become very real for the current generation of students who attend the Green Cove Springs school.

"One, for the educational experience for the kids, and two, I know from just this past year, that Vietnam veterans are dying faster than World War II veterans...and their stories are going to be powerful for the kids."

The school will not charge an admis-

sion fee for area residents to visit the wall. In total, they're still trying to raise the \$12,000 needed to cover all of the expenses for the exhibit. Meanwhile, Taft's fundraising efforts have been paying off. The Sunrise Rotary Club of Orange Park has donated \$500 as has the Clay County Cruzers car club, while the Sleep Inn on Fleming Island has jumped on board as a sponsor where it will donate a number of motel rooms to the event's work crew.

"We felt it was a good and worthy event," said motel General Manager Susan Soltys. "We are very supportive of our military both past and present. I think our Vietnam vets got a raw deal when they came home and some suffered terribly."

A local chapter of the Black Creek

Chapter of ABATE Florida also held a bike run last weekend to raise money for the exhibit. Run coordinator Herb Hildebrand said the motorcycle club raised "about a \$1,000" for the Beta Club. Taft has also been in discussion with the Branan Field Home Depot store to donate lumber and other supplies needed to help build a platform on which the granite memorial structure will be erected from May 9 through 14. Plans call for setting up the display on the Green Cove Springs Junior High football field so the public can come view the names and pay homage to the fallen.

"Overwhelming is probably the easiest way to describe it," said Greg Welsh who serves as wall manager for the Vietnam and All Veterans of Brevard County, the Cocoa, Fla. nonprofit that has taken the memorial as far as Eagle River, Wisc.,

El Campo, Texas, and Tempe, Ariz. Welsh – himself an Air Force Vietnam veteran – will manage the wall on 14 national visits this year.

"It's very emotional for a lot of people to see it. It's not only emotional for the Vietnam veteran, it could be emotional for a grandchild who sees their family name on the wall for the first time. It's intense for a lot of people."

And as fate, or magical and holy moments, would have it, bringing the wall to the junior high helps Taft and the school meet some of the requirements of the new civics curriculum that went into effect this year. Taft said by having the school's 500 seventh graders participate in the project, they will meet a new state requirement for taking part in a community service project.

"Mr. Taft has worked tirelessly behind the scenes to help bring this event to [our school]. Probably every other conversation I have with him is being updated on some of the latest logistical, technical, or financial challenges we're facing, and how

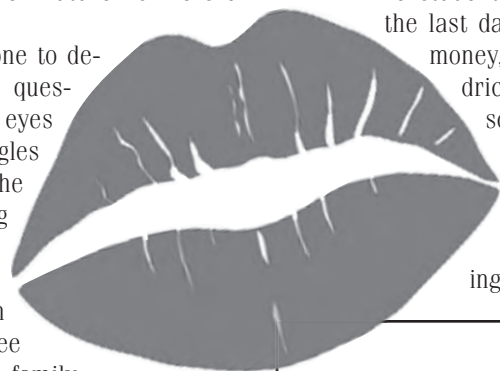
Word had spread throughout the school how Miller was still in second place as of Wednesday. That's when a group of his gifted students began to conspire a plan to put him over the top.

Transportation planners ponder bikepaths, more

Organization has heard from 2,000 Northeast Florida residents about paths

ORANGE PARK – More bicycle and walking paths could be coming to a neighborhood near you.

The North Florida Transportation Planning Organization has heard from 2,000 Northeast Florida residents about a plan to enhance biking and walking paths in a four-county area, including Clay County. It recently held a public meeting at Orange Park Town Hall to further gauge support for improving the pathways in our area.

“We’re trying to learn where there

like to ride the Black Creek Trail or Doctors Lake trail, but getting from one to the other was tricky.”

Petritsch said the needs are different in each county.

“The needs of getting around downtown Jacksonville are likely to be different than people at beaches who want to beach cruise around and get across U.S. 1,” said Petritsch, a serious cyclist for 27 years. “A lot of people want more outreach to motorists with regard to the fact that bikes are out there and the safety issues surrounding them.”

Avid jogger Bob Fernee purchases foot-

might be gaps or barriers,” said Public Affairs Manager Marci Larson. “We want feedback about areas that need improvement, an upgrade, or changed. That’s what these meetings are about: looking at inventory of facilities already in place.”

Nassau, St. Johns, Duval and Clay Counties are included in the NFTPPO’s master plan study to improve or connect paths and build new ones. One public meeting has been scheduled for each county and two in Duval. The meeting for Clay was held Feb. 20. Fifteen residents attended the meeting to give input during phase two of the 20-year plan.

“Every five years, we do a long range plan update,” Larson said. “We have to plan for 20 years out. So right now, we’re trying to figure out transportation needs for 2040.”

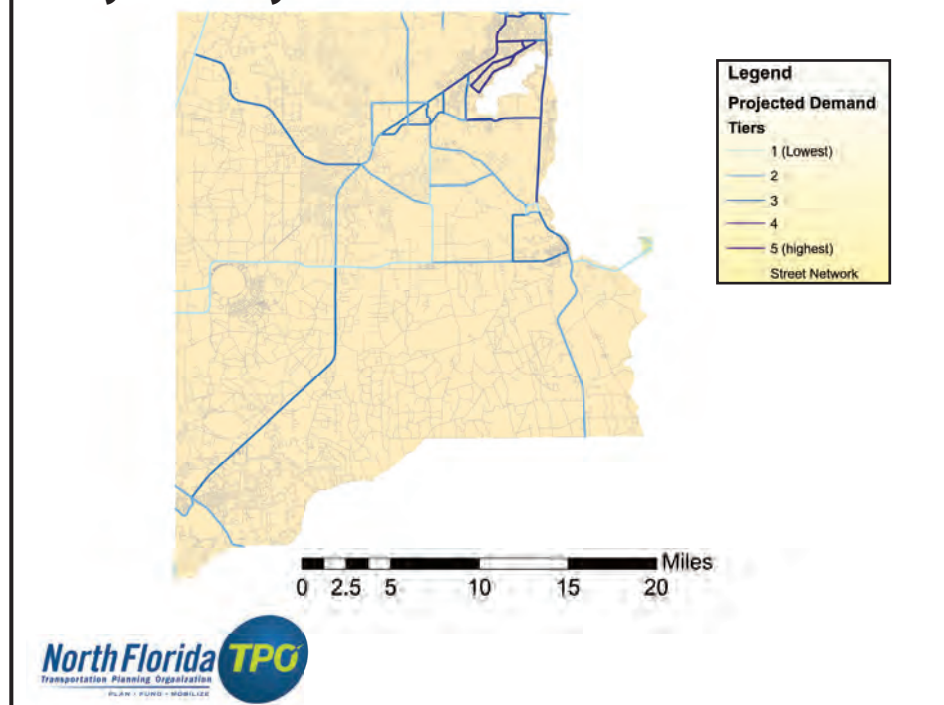
All modes of transportation are taken into account, including bicycling, walking, transit, light rail, bus, and commuter rail. The trails and paths are necessary not only for recreation, but for personal mobility to work or school.

“With the transportation network, it’s how you connect the various modes and the conveyance to get from point A to B,” Larson said. “Our mobility to achieve that affects our quality of life.”

Theodore Petritsche is a senior transportation engineer for Tampa-based Sprinkle Consulting that is working with NFTPPO on the master plan. He led the discussion at the TPO input meeting in Orange Park. Sprinkle Consulting has worked with the federal government, as well as other transportation organizations in Colorado, Texas, Washington state, and Arizona.

“There are very localized connections people wanted to make in Clay County,” Petritsch said, “We’ve found out that bikers

Animal lovers walk to raise awareness

OAKLEAF -- Cassandra the Golden Retriever sat patiently on the manicured green lawn in front of the Eagle Landing Golf Club on Feb. 24. Little did she know she would play a small role in helping educate future pet owners about one of the newest entries in the animal rescue community in Northeast Florida.

Pet lovers and other animal enthusiasts turned out for the inaugural "Walk for the Animals" sponsored by Ayla's Acres, a no-kill animal shelter in Greenville, Fla. that uses a network of home-based foster families in Clay and other Northeast Florida counties to help carry out its mission -- improve the lives of animals. Sue Brink,

a resident of Eagle Landing since 2006, organized Sunday's one-mile walk. As a fellow volunteer and pet lover, she wanted to help raise awareness about the organization.

"The goal of Ayla's Acres is to educate people more on how to treat their animals," Brink said. "We'd eventually like to go out to the schools and reach the children."

Ayla's Acres runs a 45-acre animal sanctuary that is home to dogs, cats, horses, goats, turkeys and donkeys that have been deemed un-adoptable due to age, health or behavioral issues.

"We even have a chinchilla that someone abandoned," said Executive Director Fran Charlson.

Some animals ended up at the sanctu-

ary after being abandoned, while others were simply brought there to live out the rest of the lives. The organization's name even pays tribute to an abandoned animal. Ayla was an abandoned Great Dane that a Jacksonville family surrendered.

"We need to raise money to feed and provide veterinary services to the animals. We go through 800 pounds of dog food a week and that doesn't include any of the expenses we have for the other animals we keep," said Charlson, who drove up from St. Augustine for the event.

The nonprofit has placed dogs into homes as far south as Cocoa Beach, Tampa

and Eustis and has taken in abandoned pets from as far south as Palm Coast since its incorporation in May 2012.

Another Clay County volunteer said she hoped the first-ever Clay event for the organization helps spread the word about what the organization is trying to accomplish because the need is great.

"I'm a Clay County contributor because people bring [animals] to me when they find them running loose," said volunteer Kathi Holder of Middleburg. "I'm the one who comes home to find a horse in her yard."

Vendors set up tents on the green in front of the Eagle Landing clubhouse as residents and other attendees who traveled into the development for the event, walked by and perused their wares. Brink worked hard to pull in such groups as Coastal Golden Retriever Rescue -- where Cassandra patiently waited-- to Sprint, an income tax preparer and even a vendor who makes homemade dog treats and others.

"We have a lot of dog walkers and owners in the neighborhood. A lot of the vendors here today live in the Eagle Landing neighborhood," Brink said.

She said a number of her neighbors she solicited, but could not attend, donated gifts for a silent auction that was held in conjunction with the walk, which was a \$25 donation per walker.

Brink said it was merely a coincidence that the event was held on National Pet Adoption Weekend. And like such national events, Brink said she really just wants to educate the public more on how to love and care properly for pets.

"We provide education on how to select a pet, how to raise them, how to pick an animal that fits into your family, educate them on proper nourishment and care because they become part of your family," Brink said, stressing the need to drive home the organization's message.

Asphalt plant in Green Cove a go, or not?

Gustafson's Cattle modifies rezoning application

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – Gustafson's Cattle Inc., has pulled its original rezoning application that would have allowed for an asphalt plant to be built, but will eventually replace it with a new application for a different type of zoning that would still allow for an asphalt plant.

The original application sought to rezone 92.4 acres of land between County Road 15A and U.S. Highway 17 from IS – or Industrial Select – to IB – or Heavy Industrial. Spokesmen for Gustafson's have said the company has a contract for the sale of the property, but needs the zoning change to allow for the construction of an

aggregate storage and distribution center proposed for the site. The asphalt plant has been mentioned as a possibility for the future.

The new application will be for a PID – or Planned Industrial Development, said Thomas O. Ingram, attorney for Gustafson's. Ingram said the PID zoning classification was chosen for several reasons.

"It will allow us to provide greater specifics as to what we are proposing," he said.

In addition, it will allow the owners to include information about a buffer for the westerly boundary of the property as "a specific part of the zoning," he said.

But most of all, it should allow for better communication between the owners and the residents.

"We think it would be best to meet with the citizens and talk with them," he said, adding that the company truly wanted to work with the community as well as the county.

It's not yet known when the new application will be filed, or when it would come before the county's Planning Commission or the Board of County Commissioners, Ingram said. But pulling the original application does mean that the subject won't be on the Planning Commission's March 5 agenda or the BCC's March 26 agenda.

The original rezoning proposal has been before both bodies several times in the past weeks, with opposition growing from surrounding property owners. Even the local Sierra Club's Northeast Florida Group, said it was going to take a look at the proposal, and a grassroots petition against the idea has been circulating.

Neighbors close to the property have expressed concerns about health issues, noise, the environment and lowered prop-

erty values if an asphalt plant is built nearby.

Deborah Poulton, a Ponte Vedra resident and Realtor who also owns a home and property in the area in question and

has been active in trying to get the word out about the asphalt plant, said she needed more information about the new rezoning classification before she could comment. But she did say, "I think development is good for Green Cove Springs. It just needs to be the right type of development."

Charles Petty, who now has about 150

signatures on a petition against the original rezoning application, said, "They just can't slide it under the radar this time," and added, "We're not going to be their serfs. At least we're going to stand up. If they are going to mow us over, at least they'll mow us over in front of the cameras."

The Bee Gees inspire CPR training

OAKLEAF – Placing one hand over the other, Jason Kwak laced his fingers together and placed them in the middle of the dummy's chest. The Bee Gees 1970s hit "Stayin' Alive" prompted the sea of fifth grade students kneeling over their "victims" to pump the chest in time with the beat. In the first few measures of the song, 155 students performed cardiopulmonary resuscitation in sync with the disco song made popular with the film "Saturday Night Fever."

"My hands are hurting," Kwak said Feb. 26 after a rigorous round of hands-only CPR. "I had to stop and shake them for a minute."

Hands Only CPR was developed by the American Heart Association in 2008. Moving the blood around the body during cardiac arrest is more important than giving breaths on a victim's lips. Hands Only CPR teaches proper hand placement in the center of the chest and pumping hard and fast until trained professionals arrive on the scene.

"Bystanders are more willing to give CPR to someone who has collapsed because Hands Only is simpler and easier," said Allison Misora of the American Heart Association. "It removes the mouth to mouth connection on someone they know or a stranger."

St. Vincent's HealthCare donated \$5,425 to Kwak's school, Plantation Oaks Elementary. Each \$35 kit included a plastic dummy with an air spout to blow it up. A clicking sound let the children know to press harder.

Terms limits discussed for planning board

GREEN COVE SPRINGS -- While filling openings on the Planning Commission, the Board of Clay County Commissioners decided at its Feb. 26 meeting to set aside time at their next meeting to take a look at term limits for Planning Commission members.

"We've got people on this planning board that are on their ninth term, their sixth, seventh term. There's other citizens of Clay County that would like to serve. They are very capable of serving," said Commissioner Ronnie Robinson, a long-term term limit supporter.

With eight members on the Planning Commission, seven are appointed by the BCC to a two-year term. The eighth represents the Clay County School Board. County Commissioners, on the other hand, are limited to two, four-year terms, to which they are elected.

Robinson also said he didn't mean to single out the current Planning Commission.

"This has nothing to do with the people on it, but I will say this. I think the people already serving, their time served is counted," he said.

Robinson also said he would be satisfied with four two-year terms for Planning Commission members. That would mean both members of the Planning Commission and the Board of County Commissioners would be limited to eight years of service.

BCC members decided they would place the term-limit idea on their next meeting agenda for a thorough March 12 discussion. If they decide to enact term limits, they will also have to decide whether to proceed with the idea as simply a policy of the BCC or as a law, said Mark Scruby, county attorney.

County Manager Stephanie Kopelousos said staff will take the term limits concept to the Economic Development Committee's March 4 meeting first, and then place it on the BCC agenda.

After grappling with term limits, com-

missioners made their appointments to the vacant spots on the Planning Commission. Originally, new appointments were needed for Districts 2, 3, 5 and the At-Large district. But due to the redistricting that took place after the 2010 census, a small part of District 1 was redistricted into Commissioner Diane Hutchings' District 3. Planning Commission member Marsha Dumler lives in that small portion that was redistricted, meaning while she has been representing District 1, she actually now lives in District 3.

Hutchings said she had talked to Dumler, who was agreeable to moving her representation to District 3. Commissioner Wendell Davis, who represents District 1, said Dumler had been a good commissioner and agreed to the move as well. She has one more year to serve.

That now leaves an opening for District 1. Applications for that position can be made online, Hutchings said.

Joseph Anzalone was appointed to serve as the District 2 representative. He is the owner of Mediatown Productions and

has been a Planning Commission member since 2011.

Gayward Hendry will represent District 5 as a new member. With 41 years in law enforcement, Hendry is employed by the Clay County Sheriff's Office as chief inspector.

Rick Bebout was appointed for a third term as the At-Large member. A resident of Keystone Heights, Bebout retired in 2005 after 28 years of U.S. Navy service followed by Civil Service work. All appointments were unanimous.

Capital Credits are any profits left over at the end of the year after expenses are paid that are assigned to members on a pro-rata basis. These profits, or margins, are refunded at future dates as Capital Credits. These refunds also help lower the cost of power for members of the cooperative.

Current members of the cooperative who are entitled to a refund will receive a credit on their March bills. The refund is determined by the amount of electricity used and by how long a customer has been a member of the co-op. The estimated average credit amount is \$16.22. Members entitled to a refund but who are no longer receiving service from the co-op will be mailed a refund check in late March. The estimated average check amount for these former customers is \$30.86.

Capital Credits are a source of equity for cooperatives. Capital Credits enable cooperatives to reduce the amount of money they must borrow for a variety of projects and purchases. This means less borrowed money and fewer interest payments.

into the next tax bracket. Since we don’t know what taxes will be in 20 years, and are currently in a low tax environment, we can assume they won’t be going down. Thereby forcing Bob to pay, let’s say a 40% tax on the \$88,000, or \$35,200 in additional taxes the year that Uncle Sam “forgave” his debt.

To recap, Bob, paid \$72,000 in loan repayment, and \$35,200 or a total of \$107,000. The significance being that Bob owed \$80,000 and paid \$107,000. How is this beneficial, again?

I urge caution. For some seeking higher education, student loans may be your only answer.

Just know all of the facts before you agree to a 20 year plan created by the government.

And did you consider your credit? Stu-

Stephen followed Jesus in forgiving. Let us by God’s grace do the same.

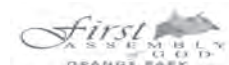

Bob’s loan balance is \$80,000. His income is \$45,000 and the new payment is \$300 per month. Making Bob repay, \$3,600 per year – 12 x \$300 – and the interest charged would be \$4,000 per year. Which leaves the loan Bob is repaying increasing by \$400 per year, not including the compounding.

Let’s jump ahead 20 years. This student has paid \$72,000 towards his debt and his new loan balance is \$88,000 dollars. Well, it’s 20 years later, so Uncle Sam is going to step in and pay \$88,000 to clear this debt. Guess who is going to be given the tax bill?

That’s right, Bob. In some cases, this “windfall” of \$88,000 pushes the person

press harder.

"We picked this grade level because of the maturity level," said Christine Veal, director of cardiovascular service line at St. Vincent's. "These kids may be riding their bike in the community and see an adult in cardiac arrest. This education could make a huge difference."

St. Vincent's Medical Center Clay County, which will open in October on Branam Field Road and Blanding Boulevard, will serve the Oakleaf community.

"Oakleaf is a brand new housing development and we asked how we could most serve the area surrounding St. Vincent's Clay County," Veal said.

Matthew Braddock D.O. led the demonstration along with a DVD also included in the kits.

"Before I was a doctor, I learned what you're learning today," Braddock said, a family medical physician at St. Vincent's. "It has saved many lives."

Plantation Oaks Elementary welcomed St. Vincent's for the second consecutive year and hopes to make it an annual educational event.

Braddock explained that a heart attack is different from cardiac arrest, where electrical impulses make the heart beat rapidly or chaotic rhythms. Either way, providing CPR to 100 beats per minute could save a life. Ten and eleven year olds are old enough to recognize the signs of trouble and the appropriate time to use CPR.

"First, I see if they are okay," said Cedavion Smith. "If they don't answer, I'll tell someone to call 911. Then I start performing CPR. I think I can actually do it if it happened in real life."

Smith's friend Brandom Read jokingly shook his dummy to simulate a person falling to cardiac arrest.

"I learned that pumping the blood is more important having crushed ribs," Read said. "If someone fell on the street, I could help them."

“I actually accomplished my dream,” Brinkman said. “The hardest scenes are crying scenes. I was so happy to be working with Isaiah, but I had to cry.”

Brinkman started modeling at the age of five and has posed for The Gap and filmed TV commercials. To prepare him for different types of acting, he took acting classes and participated in Orange Park Community Theatre summer camps where he earned the leading role in “Rumpelstiltskin.” He worked as a live model for a back-to-school clothing special during a live news broadcast. Man charged with sexual abuse

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – An Orlando area man has been extradited to Clay County to face charges of sexual battery on a victim under the age of 12.

Nelson Ross Summerall, 34, of Avon Park, was brought to the Clay County Jail on Feb. 25 and was officially booked for an incident that allegedly occurred last July. Summerall was extradited from the Avon Park Correctional Institution, a state prison.

A Clay County mother told authorities that Summerall had inappropriately touched her daughter and then forced her to touch his genitals.

According to the Clay County Sheriff's Office report, July 8, 2012, the victim told an investigator with the Florida Department of Children and Families that she waited a long time to talk about the incident because Summerall had threatened to hurt her if she went public.

The police stated the victim did not have a timeframe for when the incidents occurred, but went forward in July because she then felt safe and "that since Nelson is not living at the residence anymore she feels that the victim was comfortable enough to tell her what happened."

He is being held without bond in the county jail and has a court appearance scheduled for April 3.

Twelve-year-old charged with assaulting teacher

LAKE ASBURY – Clay County authorities have arrested and charged a Middleburg teen with battery on a school employee following an incident from Feb. 22.

Dalton Michael Taylor, 12, is charged with punching teacher Amy Batchelor in her left jaw with a

closed fist. The alleged battery took place after Batchelor asked Taylor to move out of the cafeteria lunch line where he was not supposed to be at the time. When Taylor refused to cooperate, he then cursed at the teacher who then made a second attempt to move him from the lunch line and return where he was supposed to be.

According to the police report, Batchelor and another undisclosed person "grabbed the defendant on both sides and he suddenly turned around and punched her on the left side of her lower jaw with closed fist."

Taylor was booked at the CCSO Middleburg sub-station and then transported to a youth detention center in Jacksonville.

Deaf man arrested for assault

ORANGE PARK – An Orange Park man faces one count of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon without intent to kill following a fight on Feb. 23

Matthew Silvay, 24, was arrested after he got into a fight at a home in the 3500 block of Loango Road in Orange Park. The Clay County Sheriff's Office investigator who went to the home stated in the report that he was familiar with Silvay from previous encounters and knew he was deaf.

The investigator was able to sort out the fight after a sign language interpreter arrived at the home. Justin Kilgore told police that Silvay drove up to his home and exited his car while wielding a silver metal baseball bat.

"J. Kilgore advised that he told [Silvay] multiple times to drop the bat so they could handle the problem without weapons," the report stated. "He advised that while he was telling [Silvay] to drop the bat, the defendant made a movement towards him as though to swing at him with the bat."

Silvay was taken to the Clay County jail where was charged and booked. He has since been released on bond.

OP man charged with elder assault

ORANGE PARK – A Feb. 21 parking lot scuffle at the Blanding Boulevard Dairy Queen recently resulted in an arrest of an Orange Park man.

Jason Woodford, 48, is charged with one count each of simple battery and assault on an elderly person age 65 or older. Woodford is charged with allegedly striking Robert Glenn Belk, 65, while both men were attending a visit by the Monster Truck "Razin Kane" at the restaurant.

Woodford attempted to separate himself from the ensuing melee by walking away when Belk's son apparently walked up to Woodford's vehicle and "spit into the vehicle through the driver's window and on Mr. Woodford," stated the report.

The responding officer reported witnessing lacerations, bruising, redness and swelling to both Belk's and Woodford's faces.

Woodford was taken to the Clay County Jail for booking and has since been released on \$2,005 bond.

Jacksonville man charged with impersonating cop

ORANGE PARK – A formerly convicted felon was arrested by Clay County Sheriff's Office during a routine traffic stop for impersonating a law enforcement officer, driving on a revoked driver's license and possession of a weapon.

On Feb. 22 Terence Leon Pitts, 28, of Jacksonville, was traveling on Blanding Blvd when a Clay County Sheriff's Office deputy pulled him over for speeding. The police report indicated the officer began to question Pitts when he saw him wearing a Drug Enforcement Administration shirt, khaki pants, handcuffs and a holster without a gun. The report said Pitts did not have proper identification at the time of the stop. Reports show that he offered up false information of being special agent "Terence Dunbar."

The officer checked with several law enforcement agencies and proved Pitts's story to be false. During the background check, the officer discovered Pitts's license had been suspended indefinitely due to seven unpaid traffic fines, and five accounts of failure to appear to a traffic summons.

Pitts had a criminal history as well, so indicated by the officer's report, confirming he had felony convictions of aggravated battery with a deadly weapon, possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, and grand theft or smuggling of contraband.

During the arrest, a stun gun was found in the glove compartment. The report also indicates a female called Pitts in need of car assistance so the officer sent units to help her. The woman explained that for the past nine months, he usually wore the DEA shirt and impersonated a special.

Pitts was booked into the Clay County Jail where, at press time, he remained on \$55,009 bond.

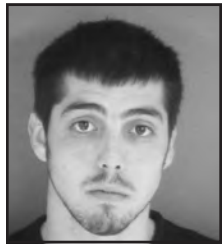

Teen charged with witness tampering, other charges

FLEMING ISLAND – A violent domestic dispute ended recently in the arrest of a Bryceville teen for charges of false impris-

onment, vandalism and tampering with a witness.

Clay County Sheriff's Office deputies arrested Donald Jackson Thomas II, 17, on Feb. 18 after an incident that occurred at a home in the 2100 block of Trailwood Drive on Fleming Island.

According to the police report, Jackson got into an argument with Kelly Marie Singleton, 22, over a prescription for Adderall. She told police that Jackson became violent and began throwing her cell phone and her house phone around when she refused to drive him to a friend's house to pick up the drugs.

When Singleton attempted to leave the home, Jackson allegedly blocked her exit four different times.

"[Singleton] then fled to her bedroom to get away from [Jackson] and he punched her bedroom door causing it to crack," stated the police report. When she did escape the home and entered her car, Jackson allegedly went to her vehicle and "kicked the passenger side front door putting a dent in it."

Jackson was booked at the Middleburg CCSO sub-station and was then transported to a juvenile detention center in Jacksonville.

Murder suspect extradited to Clay

GREEN COVE SPRINGS – A Jacksonville man remains in the Clay County Jail without bond in connection with a November

murder at an Orange Park motel.

Joseph Clark Thompson, 23, was arrested Feb. 15 and extradited to Clay County with help from the Glynn County Police Department in Brunswick, Ga., the U.S. Marshall's Service and the Clay County Sheriff's Office.

According to the CCSO booking sheet, Thompson had been in the Glynn County Detention Center.

Thompson faces one count each of first degree murder, home invasion robbery without a weapon and first degree burglary in the death of Andrew Michael Stiekman, who was 49 at the time of his death Nov. 6. A Nov. 8 examination by the Jacksonville Medical Examiner's Office showed that Stiekman was strangled to death in Room 175 of the Rodeway Inn motel on Park Avenue.

Thompson is the second man charged in Stiekman's death. On Nov. 9, Orange Park Police arrested and charged John Harold Buskager, 22, of Jacksonville with second degree murder and one count each of grand theft auto, unarmed robbery, grand theft of items valued between \$100 and \$300.

Buskager had been held in the Clay County Jail without bond, but has since been transferred to an undisclosed county

jail in Florida in order to keep him from having contact with Thompson, according to a spokesman for the Public Defender's office.

Orange Park Police continued investigating the murder based on produced probable cause to believe Thompson and Buskager were both directly involved in the killing of Stiekman, said a prepared statement. Follow-up investigation of the case is still ongoing.

Thompson is scheduled to have a court appearance March 7.

Bomb threat scare ends safely

ORANGE PARK – The Clay County Sheriff's Office said a bomb threat they responded to Feb. 21 at the Orange Park Mall ended without incident.

CCSO spokeswoman Mary Justino said the threat was called in to the agency by an anonymous caller. She said deputies worked with mall security to go through the steps required to ensure the safety of mall patrons and employees. They also cleared the premises of any threat.

No bomb was found in the threat. Mall management has the authority to evacuate or lock-down any area of the mall if necessary, which happened, in part, while areas and stores were checked for safety.

The specific words used in the bomb threat were not released at the time as they were considered active intelligence by law enforcement.

by visitors and later picked up by trustees who cleaned those areas.”

Officers first noticed an increase in the amount of contraband entering the jail in November 2012. Justino said items were concealed under U.S. Postage stamps, behind photos and in letters sent to inmates. But other smuggled items involved a detailed network of crime.

Phone calls in and out of the jail between inmates and family members led to an intriguing string of locales used to hide the forbidden items. Clay County Animal Care and Control, the Clay County Agricultural Center and the CCSO vehicle maintenance facility – all places where trusted jail inmates are transported and supervised to perform such tasks as janitorial work – became drop-off and pick-up points for the ring.

“Jail Security Sgt. Jimmy Deese was instrumental initially in gathering intelligence about the contraband – who was bringing it in, where it was being dropped off and what was going on with it once it got into the jail,” Justino stated. “While there are occasional contraband issues we deal with, Sergeant Deese’s initial investigation indicated there was a bigger issue that needed immediate attention.”

Once the responsible inmates were identified, jail security staff conducted jail cell searches to find, collect and destroy



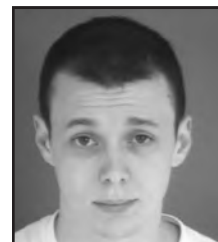

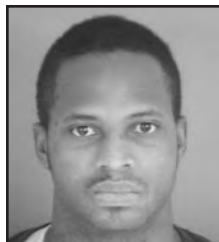

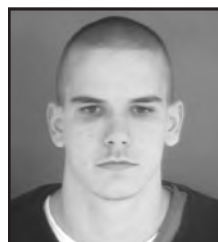

contraband in hopes of stopping its entry into the facility. Extensive searches of all cell blocks, laundry room area, trustee change-out area, recreation yards, multi-purpose rooms, visitation restrooms and outside dumpsters and loading dock areas were conducted by a team headed by Lt. Terry Arnold, Justino said.

The searches were paired with strategic surveillance, which led to the arrest of five people from both inside the jail and from the street. Justino said, as the investigation continues, they expect more arrests in the case. In the interim, a system of stepped up jail cell searches has been put in place to head off future similar incidents.

Part of the investigation involved officers going back into the files and listen-

ing to the recorded phone calls made by suspected inmates.

Daniel Roscoe Reese, 42, of Jacksonville, was an inmate between Oct. 18 and Oct. 26, 2012 during which time he called Kimbery Dane Fout, 40, his live-in girlfriend at the time. According to the police report, Fout and Reese discussed how she would drop contraband items at different areas within the county so jail trustees would pick them up.

“During one conversation [Reese] explains to [Fout] how to retrieve \$100 from inmate Adam Leys’ inmate account for the purchase of illegal narcotics that she would be dropping off at one of the predetermined locations in the future,” stated the report.

Reese was officially charged in connection with the ring on Dec. 20, while Fout was charged on Jan. 8. Ley, 25, of Orange Park was also charged on Dec. 20.


Keith Allen Ysbrand, 22, of Green Cove Springs, was arrested Feb. 13 and charged

with one count of conspiracy and solicitation to commit a criminal act, burglary and selling marijuana within 1,000 feet of a school. CCSO officials said Ysbrand conspired with his girlfriend, Kristi Ann Bowman, 26, of Green Cove Springs to drop off \$700 worth of pills at Animal Control and the Fairgrounds. Ysbrand, at press time, remained in jail, while Bowman has been released on bond.

“In general, there was a group of inmates – the men – who knew each other and had girlfriends who knew each other outside of jail,” Justino said. “They conspired over the course of time to stage these illegal contraband drops. Our detectives were able to gather intel about their conversations and plans from other inmates and by listening to their recorded phone conversations.”

The latest arrest occurred Feb. 14 when officers charged Tara Luann Epps, 28, of Jacksonville for smuggling contraband into the jail for inmate Reginald Rasheem Young, 31, of Jacksonville. According to CCSO records, Young made six phone calls to Epps on Oct. 1 and Oct. 2 to set up a way to smuggle sleeping pills, alcohol and other contraband to the jail via Animal Control.

Epps, Fout, Ley, Reese and Young were all charged with one count each of conspiracy and solicitation to commit a criminal act, which is a third degree felony under state law. All have been released on bond, but as the investigation continues, Justino said, more arrests are possible.

For David Steinberg, a hard effort at the Ortega race was paramount for him to be mentally prepared for March 9's Gate River Run 15km where he will not only

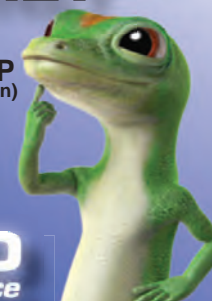

Avoid Hose Hassles

Check the hoses under your hood every month or two to avoid the hassle of a broken hose while you're on the road. With the car cool and off, squeeze the hoses. If they are hard or make a crunching sound, replace them. Ditto if they are extremely soft or sticky. With the car warm but off, examine hoses for bulges and collapsed sections. If you find any, the hose walls are weak, and it's time to replace the hose. Never drive with a ruptured coolant hose, or you are liable to overheat the engine and damage it. Other hoses are crucial to operation of your power brakes and cruise-control systems.

just not the bounce, but I'm proud as I can be at what this team did."

In the final moments, Ridgeview, led by 26 points from senior center Kurae Burns, fell victim to a 4-0 scoreless run by Pine Forest that mimicked the Eagles (29-1) 6-0 runs at the start of the game and also at the opening of the third period.

"It took us a while to settle down right out of the gate," said Feltner. "It took us a while to get our legs back under us in the third."

Down 64-60 with 14 seconds to go, Burns hit an explosive three pointer to put the game at one point, but a foul shot with five seconds put the game at two up for Pensacola before J.B. Nelson's halfcourt

shot went in and out of the basket to end the game.

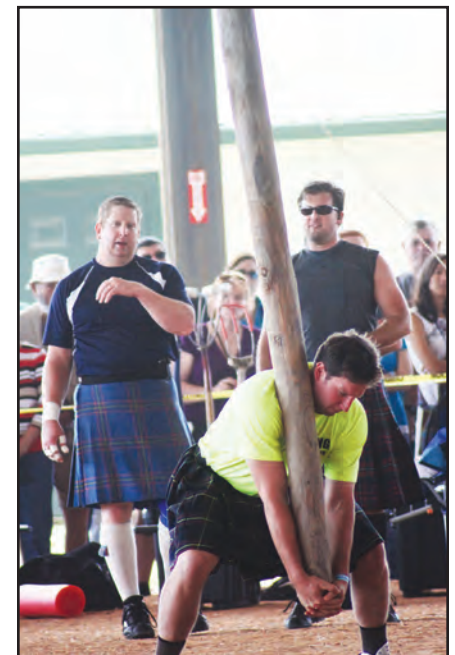
