

## First suspect sentenced in sex sting

About a dozen suspects apprehended in March during a sheriff's office predator sex sting operation began filtering through the Sumter County court system last week, with one of the suspects being sentenced to prison.

It is the first sentencing in connection with a multi-agency undercover sting operation dubbed STAR-COP that resulted in the arrest of 22 suspects from various locations in

Florida who authorities say tried to meet under-age children for sex.

Most of the suspects appearing in court last week before Circuit Court Judge William Hallman were there for pre-trial hearings.

However, last Wednesday, Aug. 24, one of the suspects caught in the sting, Daniel MacDonald, 24,

Alachua, pled guilty to a charge of using a computer to lure a minor — a third-degree felony. MacDonald is the first suspect to be sentenced in the sting operation.

He was sentenced to 42 months in prison for the crime and 18 months probation, according to Dan Mosley, assistant state attorney. MacDonald is also

required to register with the state as a sex offender.

Mosley is the lead prosecutor for the majority of the sex sting cases.

Initially, MacDonald was arrested on three charges but agreed to a plea arrangement that allowed him to only face sentencing for the one charge, he said.

Mosley said he was pleased with the outcome.

"Because this was the first sentencing, we were anxious to see how the judge would rule and we're pleased," he said.

The sentence also brought a positive response from the sheriff's office.

"Our top priority is protecting our children and we hope that this prison sentence acts as a deterrent to those who are thinking about using the Internet to prey on our children, said sheriff's

## Always reaching

Joey Cilenti built a television antenna. While that may not sound like such a big deal at first, the basic materials he used and the reception he gets are enough to get your attention. His washer and copper and wood antenna pulls in television stations from the other side of the state and almost as many as his dad's 50-foot tower antenna attached to the side of their Bushnell home.

Oh, and Joey's only 12 years old. But just a few minutes with Joey and you see there's far more to consider than how he made his own antenna.

He and his younger brother Jonah, 10, are consistently curious and stretching. Neither of them really seems to have much hesitation about trying something new.

Joey is an All-Star baseball player — his team even played in the World Series in the 2010 season and both boys play basketball. Well-rounded is a term that seems to fit.

For Joey, it's seeing the mechanics of things and putting them together, making them work. He decided to make the antenna after reading a story in an issue of "Popular Mechanics."

Reading the magazine is kind of a family tradition and the boys get great encouragement from both their parents. Their dad Charles said when he was Joey's age he used to read his grandfather's copy of the magazine and now Joey reads his.

He made the antenna for fun, but in a recent science fair he made a solar powered box.

About four-inches by eight-inches, the clear plastic box he used would typically be used for index reference or recipe cards. Joey added a solar panel, some wires and a meter. Now, when it's outside in the sun, the box gathers enough energy to power a light bulb.

He's used studies on endocrines and stopping the aging process to write a school assignment for a futuristic newspaper in the year 2031.

After showing his solar box, he begins to share a bit of information about Nerf guns. He pulls out a collection and knows everything about each one and some of their counterparts. He talks about modifications he's

### Bushnell man gets prison for child sex crimes

The second of two Bushnell men arrested last year for sodomizing a 10-year-old boy was sentenced last week to spend 15 years in prison for the crime.

Anthony Shelt, 45, was sentenced to 15 years each on two counts of lewd and lascivious battery on a child under 12. Shelt was additionally sentenced to 5 years for cultivation of marijuana. All three sentences will run concurrently, according to the ruling by Circuit Court Judge William H. Hallman.

Shelt was arrested in July 2010 along with his roommate Charles Coleman, 34, in connection with the case.

Coleman was sentenced back in April to 25 years in prison with 10

years probation after entering a no contest plea to the charges. Coleman also was registered with the state as a sexual predator

following the sentence.

Coleman was arrested July 21, 2010, for sodomizing the boy. Shelt was arrested the same day for sex-related crimes on the boy and on a 7-year-old boy.

The youth reported the incident while visiting a relative in Citrus County,

according to police reports.

The relative then contacted authorities who interviewed the boy at a child advocacy center in Citrus County.

He reported being sodomized by the man on at least one occasion at a Bushnell residence.

STAR COP was conducted between March 14 and March 20 and logged over 500 hours of Internet time resulting in the arrests of 21 male suspects and one female who is reportedly married to one of the male suspects.

Detectives said their

Craigslist ads received hits within 10 minutes of posting them when they posed as 14-year-old minors and parents and guardians of minors interested in soliciting children for sex. Detectives placed ads and responded to ads placed by potential suspects on Craigslist.

The suspects utilized chats, emails, text messaging and phone calls to undercover detectives to set up meetings to engage in unlawful sexual conduct

with minors or in the presence of minors after traveling to an undisclosed residence.

When suspects arrived to meet with the minors, they were arrested by law enforcement officers.

Four law enforcement agencies, the sheriff's offices of Sumter, Citrus and Lake counties and Florida Department of Law Enforcement, took part in the investigation that resulted in the arrests.

# Couple sentenced to 12 years in snake case

An Oxford couple was sentenced to 12 years each in prison in the death of Shaianna Hare, 2, strangled to death by a pet Burmese python in 2009.

Last week, Circuit Court Judge William Hallman sentenced Jaren Hare, 21, and Charles "Jason" Darnell, 34, in the third-degree murder case.

Hare and her former live-in boyfriend had been convicted by a Sumter County jury in July for third-degree murder, manslaughter and child

neglect. Both had faced penalties of up to 45 years in prison.

They each additionally received 5 years probation after being released from prison.

Both Hare and Darnell went to trial together and received sentences together.

Defense attorneys argued that the death of Hare's daughter was an accident.

Prosecutors said the couple should have

known the more than 8-foot-long snake was dangerous because it had gotten out of its confines several times.

In July 2009, the snake crawled out of its aquarium and into the child's bedroom where it bit and wrapped itself around Shaianna and strangled her.

Hallman said the couple should have realized that the snake could be dangerous to the child.

# Village man dies after driving into pond

An unknown medical situation may be responsible for the death of a 60-year-old resident of The Villages last week.

James Bruce Hennessey died Aug. 25 after the 4-door 2001 Toyota he was driving submerged in a pond about 8:30 a.m. near Morse Boulevard, in The Villages, according to a Florida Highway Patrol report.

Hennessey was driving east on El Camino Real in the outside lane, just west of Morse Boulevard, when

witnesses saw him driving erratically, according to the report. His vehicle traveled onto the right shoulder of the roadway, over some shrubs and down an embankment.

The vehicle continued into a pond where it submerged, the report states.

The pond was reportedly about 10 feet deep.

The driver is suspected of having an "unknown medical event," according to the report. He was taken to Villages Regional Medical Center and later died there.

## Cold cases aren't just forgotten

Last week ended the final chapter of 12 stories taken from the Cold Cases file of the Sumter County Sheriff's Office.

The Sumter County Times featured one of the cases each week for 12 consecutive weeks.

We know from comments we've received that readers appreciated the stories.

Most of the cases were chilling. For the murder victims featured in these stories, their deaths go unsolved and their murderers remain free.

Each of the case files contains information, sometimes stacks of information, about the cases. The files include investigative reports, photos of the victims and photos of potential suspects, and other case-related material collected by the sheriff's office in an attempt to solve each of the 12 cases.

Some of the material is disturbing to view and read. Many of the photos were far too graphic to include in the newspaper stories we ran.

Reliving the cases, which dated back to 1970 and continued through 2007, only drives home the frustration that investigators, families and loved ones feel about having no ending to so many chilling deaths.

Of interesting note, although the cases are old, that doesn't mean they have been forgotten. To this day, the sheriff's office continues to work the cases. Investigators still send out information to various agencies in hopes that ever-advancing technologies can provide the pieces they need to make arrests in the cases.

In a few of the cases, investigators say they actually believe they know the identities of the killers. Unfortunately, the much needed pieces of evidence required for an arrest are missing.

These cases may be old, but investigators don't treat them that way. They are like painful splinters that can't be removed. The chilling murderous acts, the dealings with grieving family members all take their toll and keep investigators watchful.

While the publication of these stories has not resulted in any new arrests, it is hoped that bringing these stories to light again will spark something new – that persons in the community who know things about the murder victims will come forward and finally end the mystery and the heartache that accompany each of the 12 cases.



### False Alarms

As Sumter County has increased in population and businesses we have seen an increase in false or nuisance alarms. False alarms cause unnecessary panic and bring resources such as emergency services to a location where they are not needed. This causes undue dangers to responding Law Enforcement and the public.

In the last six months The Sumter County Sheriff's Office responded to 795 (seven hundred and ninety-five) alarm calls. Over 95 percent (ninety-

five) of these calls were false alarms.

An alarm system is a great tool in deterring crime and notification of other emergency issues (fire and medical).

The following are some recommendations on ways to reduce false alarms:

Make sure everyone is familiar with the alarm system operations. This should include visiting guest and relatives.

Secure doors of residence and or businesses before turning on the alarm system.

Notify the monitoring facility of any and all changes (i.e. house guests, name changes, new employees, etc.)

Equipment should always be routinely inspected and maintained by qualified personnel.

Make sure all authorized persons know the code and/or how to cancel a false alarm.

Always treat your system with care.

## DOH urges the public to protect themselves against mosquito-borne diseases

The Florida Department of Health (DOH) has reissued its prevention message for Florida's residents and visitors to protect themselves against mosquito-borne diseases.

This year in Florida, there have been 89 cases of mosquito-borne illnesses, such as Dengue Fever, Malaria, and West Nile Virus.

"While the chance of humans contracting a mosquito-borne disease is low, we still need to take precautions against mosquito bites," said Dr. Sanford D. Zelnick, director of the Sumter County Health Department. "These precautions will be important to limiting the spread of mosquito-borne diseases to humans."

Mosquito-borne infections in people include dengue fever, eastern equine encephalitis, St. Louis encephalitis, and West Nile virus, some of which can cause headache, fever, dizziness, confusion, movement disorders and coma.

The best defense against these mosquito-borne illnesses is prevention from bites. This can be done by eliminating the places where mosquitoes lays

their eggs, primarily containers that hold standing water:

To prevent mosquitoes from living and multiplying around your homes or businesses:

**DRAIN** standing water:

Drain water from garbage cans, buckets, pool covers, coolers, toys, flower pots or any other containers where sprinkler or rain water has collected.

Discarded old tires, drums, bottles, cans, pots and pans, broken appliances and other items that aren't being used.

Empty and clean birdbaths and pet's water bowls at least once or twice a week.

Protect boats and vehicles from rain with tarps that don't accumulate water.

Maintain swimming pools in good condition and appropriately chlorinated. Empty plastic swimming pools when not in use.

To protect yourself from mosquito bites and from the diseases mosquitoes carry:

**COVER** your skin with:

**CLOTHING** — if you must be outside when mosquitoes are active, cover up. Wear shoes, socks, long pants and long sleeves.

**REPELLENT** — apply mosquito repellent to bare skin and clothing.

Always use repellents according to the manufacturer's directions on the label. Repellents with DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, and IR3535 are effective.

Use mosquito netting only to protect children younger than 2 months old.

**COVER** doors and windows with screens:

Keep mosquitoes out of your house. Repair broken screening on windows, doors, porches, and patios.

annexations and pulled out what's no longer required by the state," Lee said.

On Sept. 13, the Bushnell Board of Adjustment and Code Enforcement will begin the process of submitting land annexation requests to the state that have been on hold, in some cases, for more than a year.

agency and typically was required to submit more information after state planners reviewed the locally submitted documents.



Executive Director Vicki Genz said the donation will be used to expand housing services at the facility by renovating a mobile home.

done and modifications he could do.

Joey originally planned to be an engineer and wanted to go to work for NASA, but with the shut-down of the program, his goals changed.

"I want to be a doctor," he said, clarifying he wants to be a heart doctor.

Joey is an A student - no Bs. As a matter of fact, when he got a B one time, he was very upset.

"I can't stand to get a B."

When Jonah, mellow and lounging on the floor gives a few words of encouragement to his brother, saying something about the teacher "giving him" a grade, Joey responds quickly reminding his brother that the teacher doesn't "give it to you, you've go to work for it."

While Joey's hammering washers and clipping wires and planning for medical school, Jonah's tilling the land and planting seeds.

His interest came from his time at the Sumter County Youth Center where they have a club garden. The club is led by Sumter County master gardeners on the center site.

For Jonah, it's more outdoors with a love of ani-

mals and a concern for people.

"Jonah has loved animals all his life. He runs through the woods bare-foot, looking for critters. He catches them and always wants to keep them," said his mom Nicey Cilenti. She teaches at South Sumter High School and serves as the volleyball coach.

Jonah's more in line for a career as a zookeeper.

He said he used to start every morning seated in front of the Jack Hannah show while he munched on an Eggo waffle.

Picking up on that love of the outdoors, he helps his dad with the cattle and when he decided to grow his garden, he got out the tiller and tilled the rows himself. He checked out other gardens too, to learn how to cultivate and get the best yield from his own.

Through the summer, family dinners included vegetables from Jonah's garden. The produce included squash, corn, okra and beans. His fertilizer was organic and the garden was pesticide-free.

Even now there are giant okra on the bush, zinnias, sunflowers and periwinkles still growing. With his garden still yielding, Jonah is already making plans for the next garden - larger and off to the side of the house.

There are also large pots of herbs growing on the porch, which Jonah said is a family effort.

They spend days with their dad and their fishing poles. Mr. Cilenti owns a tractor sales business in Bushnell, has a master's degree and was pursuing a career in law, but right now, his focus is on being a good dad - he spends time with them on their ventures, helping to fuel their desire to learn. They spend some days just fishing and other days stretching their minds.

Mr. Cilenti has his own theories about where his sons' personalities and drive will take them. For Joey, he believes it's probably going to be some big money career and for Jonah he mentioned politics - because of an ability to get along with everybody.

And on a lazy afternoon, like it's nothing to till the soil and grow a garden at age 10 or create a working television antenna at age 12, the boys meander off to climb the stairs of their clubhouse and sit in a chair in the shade of a big oak that towers overhead.

A few minutes pass and Joey disappears.

Somewhere, someone's playing the drums. It's Joey - self-taught.

And there, across from the drum set, lying on its side is an electric guitar ...







- 1 tablespoon soy sauce
- 2 teaspoons toasted sesame oil
- 1 teaspoon hot chili sauce (such as Sriracha)
- 1 teaspoon honey
- 1/4 cup canola or vegetable oil

#### Salad:

- 5 cups baby spinach, washed and dried
- 1 red bell pepper, sliced thin
- 1/2 medium red onion, sliced thin

Preheat oven to 425°F. Stir together tortilla chips, 2 tablespoons peanut flour, chopped peanuts, Mexican seasoning and garlic powder in a shallow dish.

Dip chicken into remaining peanut flour, then in egg whites, then into tortilla chip mixture, pressing to evenly coat. Place on a baking sheet and sprinkle any remaining crumb mixture over chicken. Coat liberally with cooking spray and bake for 20 to 25 minutes or until chicken is golden brown, coating with nonstick cooking spray several times during cooking.

## WHEN IS A PUBLIC NOTICE NOT PUBLIC?

Don't let Florida officials remove your right to know from the newspaper.



Proposed legislation SPB 7204 and HB 89 would remove your right to read public notices in newspapers – restricting them to government web sites only. The public's right to know cannot be abandoned in favor of presumed cost savings, which are elusive.

### Public Notices must be publicly accessible

- 53.6% of Floridian's over 65 do not have access to the internet\*
- 28.1% of African-Americans in Florida do not have access to the internet\*
- 34.6% of Hispanics in Florida do not have access to the internet\*

In addition to printed newspapers, Florida's newspapers provide a supplemental public notice web site, [www.floridapublicnotices.com](http://www.floridapublicnotices.com), allowing free and unlimited searchable access to public notices aggregated from Florida newspapers.

### Government posting of government notices on government websites takes away third-party neutrality

Making government officials responsible for notifying the public on their own websites carries with it a potential for abuse. For example, it may create the temptation to change or manipulate the timing of public notices. If a scheduled public notice is not published or contains false information, the newspaper is more likely to catch the mistake.

### Public Notices must be archived in a secure and accessible format

The internet does not provide as reliable an archival history of public notices as newspapers due to its vulnerability in the form of hackers, viruses, and downed servers.

### Governmental websites do not provide legal affidavits and written proof of publication and a secure and verifiable paper trail

State and local governments, attorneys and private citizens rely on this documentation to ensure that these notices were published timely and lawfully, as newspapers are required by law to do.

"It was a good turnout," said Jennifer Cramer, one of the event coordinators.




Completing one fundraiser and moving on to another, Cramer said, "We want to thank everybody for their participation."


