## College gets new name

It will be several months before it is official, but Lake-Sumter Community College is in the process of changing its name and its designation.

The college will be known as Lake-Sumter State College in anticipation of becoming an accredited four-year degree level institution. The college's District Board of Trustees approved the name change at its June 19 meeting.

"The new name preserves the strong tradition and outstanding reputation of the college name while reinforcing our ongoing commitment to this community as we expand programs to the four-year degree level to meet the workforce needs of the residents and employers we serve," said trustee chair Margo Odom.

The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges board of trustees took favorable action at its June 21 meeting on the college's application seeking accreditation at a higher degree level in order to initiate offering bachelor's degree programs.

The approval means that the college can continue its plans for January 2013 to launch its first classes in the new bachelor of applied science in organizational management.

"The most important message we heard from our community and students in the focus groups and surveys was that whatever our new name would be, they wanted to

## New leads in 1971 murder

New scientific information may help solve a murder mystery that has haunted Sumter County law enforcement officials for more than 40 years.

While sheriff's department investigators have long believed that the 1971 murder victim dubbed Little Miss Lake Panasoffkee was of American Indian descent, new scientific techniques have determined that the woman was actually of Greek descent and probably had been in the United States less than a year before her murder.

The new information has sheriff's investigators hopeful that the identity of Little Miss Lake Panasoffkee will be determined.

"We're cautiously optimistic that the new information will give us some leads to follow up and that we'll at least be able to identify her," said sheriff's Capt. Kevin Hofecker.

The body of Little Miss Lake Panasoffkee was found on Feb. 19, 1971 under the Lake Panasoffkee Bridge on Interstate 75. Two hitchhikers from Illinois saw the body below them in swamps as they stood on the south end of the bridge in the northbound lane.

By the time the body was discovered,

it was partially decomposed. Investigators believe she had been murdered at least a week before her body was found. Her age was estimated between 17 and 24 years old.

The cause of death was determined to be strangulation. A brown belt was found wrapped around her throat. Her body was clothed but the clothing had deteriorated and was not identifiable — until just recently.

Her birth date is estimated between 1949 and 1952. She was 5 feet 2, weighing about 110 to 120 pounds with dark brown hair and brown eyes, small to medium build, and probably right-handed.

She wore a small, thin, yellow neck chain, a yellow ring with a clear stone on the right hand, a yellow metal watch (17-jewel Baylor) with a repaired metal band on her left wrist.

The victim had four lower and two upper teeth missing. Six teeth had silver fillings and there was one porcelain cap in the upper front. There were possibly two pregnancies. She probably suffered repeated ankle sprains and instability of the right ankle, which resulted in orthopedic surgery, utilizing the Watson-Jones technique, at about age 15 to 18.

# Storm leaves sinkholes, flooding

Sumter County residents are left with sinkholes and flooding after Tropical Storm Debby breezed up the Gulf of Mexico and across Central Florida this week.

Heavy rains began on Sunday, with two to four inches falling in different areas of the county. By Monday, creeping water

had moved toward homes in low lying areas and sinkholes had opened up in two Sumter communities.

David Casto, Sumter County's Comprehensive Emergency Management director, said one small sinkhole, about three feet had opened in Lake Panasoffkee, while four larger holes had opened in The Villages. The average hole size was between 10 feet and 20 feet, and two of the

five were threats to homes. By Tuesday, another two sinkholes had opened in the development bringing the county total to seven.

Casto said one of the six sinkholes was on a golf course and he believes another was due to some type of erosion, such as a

broken pipe.

Flooding concerns included the Lake Panasoffkee area, Croom-A-Coochee and a small community in Bushnell, off S.R. 48.

"The Lake Panasoffkee area received a lot of water," he said, noting that there are also some poor

drainage areas in the community.

"One home actually had several inches of water intrusion, he said.

As for the county's road and bridge department, they spent Sunday night monitoring the water situation, working with engineers to see if they could reroute some of the water.

Emergency Management did a life safety check to make sure residents were okay.

Earlier in the week, a flood warning had been issued for the Withlacoochee River in Croom-A-Coochee, but that was cancelled when rainfall levels were lower than expected on Monday and Tuesday, according to NOAA meteorologist Tom Dougherty.

But even with the river threat cancelled, resi-

## Information cards for voters are in the mail

Registered voters need to be on the lookout this week.

On Monday, the Sumter County Supervisor of Elections Office began mailing out new voter information cards to every registered voter in the county.

That's more than 71,000 Sumter voters receiving new cards.

While the cards aren't necessary in order to vote, they do provide some im-

portant information that should be reviewed before heading out to vote in the upcoming Aug. 14 primary election and other elections.

If you think you already know the location of your polling place, better check the new voter card.

Because of substantial changes that were made following the 2010 Census results, many voting districts and polling place locations have changed.

It's the reason the new cards are being distributed, said Karen Krauss,

supervisor of elections. With so many changes to district lines and precincts, many voters will find that they no longer will be voting at their former and familiar voting polls.

The cards are important to review because they will ensure that the elections office has your information accurate and they will display your precinct number. Once you determine your precinct number, you can visit the elections office

Since her body was discovered, stacks of folders, videotapes, X-rays and other evidence has been collected in the murder case.

Throughout the decades, substantial attempts have been made to identify the woman and to find the person responsible for her murder.

Her murder was featured in an episode of Unsolved Mysteries back in the early 1990s when Jamie Adams was sheriff. Adams was determined to

solve the case.

During his term in office, in another attempt to identify the woman, her remains were exhumed in 1986 from the Oak Grove Cemetery, in Wildwood, where she was buried. Adams called in a forensic anthropologist to provide reconstructive facial drawings of what she looked like at the time of her death and as a child. The specialist was also used to determine her height and weight – all in attempt to identify the mysterious woman.

Unfortunately, none of the attempts to identify her were successful.

But with recent assistance from the anthropol-

ogy department at the University of South Florida in Tampa and the geological sciences department at the University of Florida, a new composite drawing was created and more specific information about the murder victim was discovered from hair and teeth samples.

Examiners were even able to determine that the woman was probably from the small town of Lavrion, about 60 miles southeast of Athens, Greece, Hofecker said. They determined the location from the high level of lead that was found in her teeth. The lead is associated with mining opera-

tions in the region.

Examiners also were able to better identify the clothing she had on (plaid green pants, a matching solid green shirt and a shawl with a green and white print) and the model of the watch she was wearing.

As a starting point in an attempt to identify her, the sheriff's office is prepar-

ing to mail out about 6,000 flyers to residents and businesses in the Tarpon Springs area, Hofecker said.


Based on the time of her death, investigator suspect the victim may have been in that community during the annual Epiphany celebration held on Jan. 6.

"We've been in contact

with representatives of the Greek Orthodox Church there and the Tarpon Springs Police Department for support," he said.

"We'll start there and then move out.

"To solve this case and be able to return her to her loved ones would be the crème de la crème," Hofecker said.

website at [www.sumter-elections.org](http://www.sumter-elections.org) and find its location; just click on the "Where do I vote" button and follow the instructions.

Since the last election, the number of polling places have been consoli-

dated from 46 down to 24, Krauss said.

"Once voters determine where their polling place is, it would be a good idea to go out before voting day and find their voting place so they know where it is ahead of voting time," she said. "Don't wait until Election Day to find it."

Krauss also suggests that voters be cautious when dealing with their mail. Be-

cause it's election season, the mailed information from the elections office could be mistaken for other political material.

"Voters who haven't received a card in two weeks should let us know," she said. "We'll either resend it or see what the problem is."

dents had to deal with local street flooding and winds between 30 and 40 miles per hour.

The storm track changed throughout the week, eventually curling into Central Florida and making landfall near the Gainesville/Suwannee River area, while weather warnings that ranged from tornado and flood warnings, to high wind advisories played out for days.

When the landfall began and the weather began to alternate between cloudy and gusty and sunny, Casto said, "I think the worst is over."

But he did have a suggestion for local residents, urging them to gather information on storms and other disasters now. He said his department received come calls late on Sunday night from people "Wanting to know the difference between watches and warnings."

They're not able to respond to those type questions when dealing with damage and assisting people in disaster situations. He urges residents to take the time now, when there is no threat, to learn the terminology. He said the information can be found on their website or at

floridadisaster.org

He also urges residents to obtain and use a weather radio.

Sumter Electric spokesman Barry Bowman said SECO "faired pretty well," through the storm.

They had a total of 7,000 customers in Sumterville and The Villages without power at some point. Their average restoration

time was just over an hour and a half.

Bowman said they dealt with far fewer problems than in the past, attributing the change to an "aggressive tree trimming program" that has been under way for the past five years.

As for Progress Energy, 49 of their 7,000 customers lost power at some point during the storm.





## Know where you're going to vote

Don't be disappointedly surprised when you visit your good old voting poll later this year. It just may not be there. As a matter of fact, chances are very good that it won't be there.

With all the redistricting and precinct changes that have happened during the past two years, it's very likely that your location for voting has been changed. Since the last major election, the polls have been consolidated by the Supervisor of Elections Office. More than half of the voting locations have been eliminated. And with state and local redistricting, precincts have also changed.

All voters in Sumter County, more than 71,000 of them, will shortly be receiving new voter information cards in the mail. The cards will provide voters with the information they need about changes to their precincts and polling locations.

Supervisor of Elections Karen Krauss has made a very good suggestion. She suggests that voters make sure they visit their polling location early to ensure that they know the exact location.

Election Day could become very confusing if voters haven't checked and aren't aware of their new voting locations.

Sumter County typically has very high voter turnout for elections.

In the past, the county has done an exemplary job of collecting and compiling voting information.

Hopefully, these new voter information cards will be used and help avoid potential confusion at the polls.

## A Fortnight for Freedom

The workers at St. Vincent DePaul are answering a call by the Bishops of the United States to host a Fortnight for Freedom that started last week on Wednesday, July 21 and carry through to Wednesday July 4.

The church is setting it aside as "a special time of intensified prayer for religious freedom and the protection of conscience rights" - a series of special services and continued prayer.

According to event coordinators at St. Vincent DePaul, the Fortnight for Freedom is in response to the 2010 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (the new health care reform law). They believe the mandate is basically re-defining the First Amendment.

From the national level, the bishops have requested an outline of prayer and general intercession of prayers each day for mass, according to St. Vincent DePaul's Father Peter Sagorski.

They will be praying that leaders in Congress will listen to God's inspiration, he said, explaining that the church believes the basic issue is religious freedom.

According to a release from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the "mandate requires almost all private health plans to cover contraception and sterilization as "preventive services" for women and "forces individuals and groups with religious or moral objections to purchase and provide such coverage if they are to receive or provide health coverage at all."

The release goes on to say that "the mandate poses an unprecedented threat to individual and institutional religious freedom" and that the rule does include a religious exemption, but the church considers it too narrow.

The release explained, "It covers only a "religious employer" that has the "inculcation of religious values" as its purpose, primarily employs and serves persons who share its religious tenets, and is a church organization under two narrow provisions of the tax code. A great many religious organizations - including Catholic colleges and universities, as well as hospitals and charitable institutions that serve the public - will be ineligible. Individuals and religiously affiliated health insurers will not qualify for the exemption. The new rule would force insurance plans to cover "all Food and Drug Administration ap-

proved contraceptive methods, sterilization procedures, and patient education and counseling for all women with reproductive capacity." Never before has the federal government required private health plans to include such coverage. The FDA-approved "emergency contraception..."

"It's important to note that religious freedom is our first civil freedom - it's first in the Bill of Rights in the United States Constitution," said Dan Miller of St. Vincent DePaul.

If the Catholic facilities providing medical care were forced to shut down, "a very large part of the population will be without health care," he said.

According to the Catholic Health Association of the U.S., Catholic hospitals are 12.6 percent of all the hospitals in the nation.

They account for 15.6 percent of all admissions in hospitals, 14.5 percent of all hospital expenses, 16.6 percent of Medicare admissions and 13.6 percent of all Medicaid admissions and finally, 33 percent of all Catholic hospitals are located in rural areas where patients have few other options for care.

"I think all life should be respected. From conception to natural death, we have to respect all life," said Sagorski, explaining that in his opinion he does not believe the mandate does that.

The church is also providing the deadline date for comments before final rule as September 30, asking people to pray and to contact political representatives.

"Prayer is very important," said Miller.

Their event will include a 7 p.m. service on Monday July 2 with Ray Noble speaking on the United States Constitution and religious freedom in the nation.

On Thursday, July 4, services will begin at 9 a.m. with Eucharist Adoration and hourly prayer for military forces.

The hourly prayers will be led by members from different branches of the military, starting with the United States Army at 10 a.m. and ending with the United States Coast Guard at 2 p.m.

Veterans and those still on active duty are invited to attend and urged to come in uniform.





# Some things fishy

**Tracy's Point Fishing Lodge weekly fishing report for week ending June 24**

Hope everyone had a wonderful week! We did, the rain has really helped our beautiful lake.

**Do I need a license or permit?**

We frequently receive questions from our customers pertaining to a variety of issues. I have found that the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission has been a good source of information. Below is some information from myfwc.com which I hope you will find helpful. More to follow next week.

Florida residents and visitors need a Florida hunting, freshwater fishing or saltwater fishing license unless they are a member of one of the groups of people listed below.

A fishing license is required to attempt to take fish. If you cast your line, catch nothing, catch and release, or catch and keep and you are not a member of one of the groups listed below; you need a license. A saltwater fishing license is also required to attempt to take any native or non-native marine organisms, such as crabs, lobsters, and marine plants.

Some of these exemptions apply to "Florida residents" only. Please be aware of the Florida state residency requirements.

These exemptions may also apply to hunting, saltwater fishing, or freshwater fishing, or all three.

You do not need a recreational hunting, freshwater fishing or saltwater fishing license or a Florida waterfowl, migratory bird, deer, turkey, snook, spiny lobster, archery season, crossbow season, muzzleloading season permit or management area permit if...

You are a child under 16 years of age. (Also exempt from federal duck stamp requirements.)

You are a Florida resident age 65 or older possessing proof of age and residency or possessing a Resident Senior Citizen Hunting and Fishing Certificate. Residents age 65 or older may obtain, at no cost, complimentary hunting and fishing certificates from county tax collectors' offices.

You hunt or freshwater fish in your county of residence on your homestead or the homestead of your spouse or minor child, or if you are a minor child hunting or freshwater fishing on the homestead of your parent.

You are a Florida resident certified as totally and permanently disabled and you possess a Florida Resident Disabled Person Hunting and Fishing Certificate.

You are a resident who is a member of the Armed Forces of the United

States, you are not stationed in this state, and you are home on leave for 30 days or less, upon submission of orders.

You are hunting wild hog on private land. You are observing or filming someone else who is fishing or hunting and you are not assisting in the take in any way. If you help or assist in the take, whether you actively fish or hunt or not, you must have a license.

These exemptions do not apply for the federal duck stamp.

Quota Hunt Permit Exemptions

You do not need a freshwater fishing license if...

You have been accepted as a client for developmental disabilities services by the Department of Chil-

dren and Families. The department must furnish proof to such clients.

You are fishing in a fish pond of 20 acres or less which is located entirely within the private property of its owner. A fish pond is a man-made pond constructed for the primary purpose of fishing, entirely within the property lines of the owner and with no surface water connection to public waters.

You are fishing in a fish pond of 20 acres or more, whose owner has purchased a fish pond license at a fee of \$3 per surface acre.

You possess a Resident Freshwater Commercial Fishing License.

You are fishing in the St. Mary's River or Lake Seminole (but not including tributary creeks in Florida) and have a valid

Georgia fishing license.

You are freshwater fishing during Free Freshwater Fishing Days.

You are a resident who is fishing with live or natural bait, using poles or lines that are not equipped with a fishing-line-retrieval

mechanism, and you are fishing for noncommercial purposes in your home county. However, you must have a valid fishing license to fish by any method in a fish management

## Critter chatter

### Combined effort saves injured puppy

Sometimes a day starts out bad and things can look pretty grim. That is how the day started out for a little bulldog puppy found injured in a ditch in Webster. Unable to move and in pain, the puppy lay there awaiting her fate. But with a change of luck, fate smiled down on the puppy when two good Samaritans stopped to help.

While driving, Ray and Cyn Landry happened to see a little animal off the side of a road, struggling to lift its head. Stopping to see if there was a problem, they were shocked to find a beautiful puppy lying in a ditch, hot and bleeding. The puppy could barely move and was lying on an ant hill and barb wire fencing. Staying with the puppy and never leaving her side, the Landrys called Sumter County Animal Services for assistance.

When Animal Control Officer Anthony Stravino arrived, he saw a collar on the puppy, and called in to report the injury to Kennel Coordinator Tammy Be-

lancin. Belacin explains that if an animal is found injured and wearing a collar, Animal Services will take the animal to a veterinarian to be evaluated.

Meanwhile, Mr. and Mrs. Landry continued to call Animal Services to check on the puppy's condition and to let them know they wanted to adopt her. "We knew the minute we saw her we wanted to take her home with us, but were afraid to move her because of her injuries."

Dr. Yates' evaluation concluded that the puppy had a broken leg. "I knew that the Landrys were serious about adopting this puppy," states Belacin, "because they

called throughout the day to check on her condition." Knowing that the puppy's future medical needs would be taken care of by the Landrys, Belacin was sure the adoption would be a success. After the leg was set, the puppy was brought back to the Animal Services facility, where Belacin, Stravino, and the other Animal Service associates monitored and helped in the care of the injured puppy's recovery.

Anxious to adopt their new puppy, the Landrys were up early the next day, waiting at the Animal Services facility for it to open.

Now safe and cared for in her new home, the little

puppy has been named Thumper, because "she thumps around the house in her cast" laughs Mrs. Landry. We are told that Thumper is doing great and is a very sweet little girl.

A little puppy's determination and will to survive, along with two good Samaritans who cared enough to stop and help, and the efforts put forth by dedicated Animal Services employees Tammy Belacin and Anthony Stravino to help save a life, has turned a grim day in the life of a little puppy into a very happy ending. Because of all of these caring people, little Thumper has a bright and happy future with a family that will care for her injuries, and nurture and love her.

In developing an application for submission to DEO, the City of Coleman must plan to minimize displacement of persons as a result of planned CDBG activities. In addition, the City of Coleman has developed a plan to assist displaced persons.
