Wildwood bank robber sought

Wildwood police are hoping that the public can provide some useful information to help solve the robbery of a Wildwood bank last week.

A lone suspect robbed the BB&T Bank, at 837 S. Main Street, last Tuesday, Nov. 26.

The robbery happened about 3:41 p.m. when there were no customers

inside the bank, according to Wildwood police. The suspect entered the bank and presented a handwritten note to the bank teller demanding money.

The note demanded that she give him all of the hundreds, fifties and twenties.

The note also implied that the suspect had a handgun although no gun was ever displayed.

After the teller handed

the bank cash to the suspect, he then ordered her to enter the bank vault and shut the door behind her, according to police. The teller obeyed the suspect and entered the vault and shut the door.

The suspect then left the bank and fled on foot in an unknown direction.

He is believed to be between 5 feet 5 and 5

Flood-prone land is topic

Portions of central and southern Sumter County have historically had problems when water levels rise.

Lands roughly east of Bushnell and near Center Hill that are incorporated in Sumter County's Big Prairie watershed have been notorious for flooding during high water periods caused by heavy rains or storms.

In past years, the county along with the Southwest Water Management District have attempted to address and curb flooding issues in the area.

It was a main focus of drainage work back in the 1980s when the now defunct Sumter County Water Authority attempted to relieve flooding conditions throughout the watershed.

But water control problems still linger and they are back for discussion and review.

The water district is gathering information to improve identification of flood prone areas in the Big Prairie watershed. Most of the currently

Season ends for South Sumter Raiders

Lakewood squeezes by Raiders in 27-21 regional win

Friday night, the South Sumter High football team and coaches proved to be the classiest team on the field.

Unfortunately, the Raiders ended their year when a strong St. Petersburg Lakewood High team beat them 27-21 in the Class 5A Region Final at Raiders Field.

South Sumter ended with a 12-1 record while Lakewood is now 10-3. Lakewood will play Clay Friday in a state semifinal game. Clay beat Pensacola Catholic 9-7 Friday night.

Sadly, the game was marred by displays of unsportsmanlike and selfish behavior by Lakewood.

South Sumter Head coach Inman Sherman said there was bad blood and there was no shaking of hands because that might have evolved into a brawl.

"We played a good football team but a classless football team," said Sherman. "I'm proud of the way our guys played. I'm proud of the way they acted. I wouldn't trade a one of them for any of their kids. We will play

them again.

Lakewood scored the winning touchdown when their quarterback, Ryan Davis, scored on a one-yard sneak with 8:27 left.

Lakewood's Chris Davis intercepted Raider quarterback Levi Sapp late in the contest and that sewed up the victory for the visiting Spartans.

Lakewood scored first when Davis hit Darquez Watson for a 20-yard touchdown. The extra point kick failed. The score came with 7:52 left in the first quarter.

J.T. Taylor blocked a punt and recovered it at Lakewood's 22-yardline. The Raiders couldn't capitalize when they fumbled the ball away at the Spartan's five-yard line.

The Spartans scored when Davis ran eight yards for a score with 10:40 left in the second quarter. Davis passed to Watson for the two-point conversion.

The Raiders scored when Levi Sapp hit Chase Kelly for a 27-yard touchdown with 8:46 left in the second quarter. Wes Moir

available floodplain information is 10 to 30 years old and is outdated because of natural and physical changes caused by land use, development and erosion, according to water district representatives.

Dec. 12, anytime between 4 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. at the Sumter County Fairgrounds, 7620 S.R. 471.

District representatives will present preliminary floodplain information, explain the basis behind the findings, and gather additional information that may be used to identify areas that are flood prone.

After addressing public comments, floodplain information will be finalized and presented to the District's Governing Board for authorization to use the data for regulatory purposes.

The floodplain information will be used by the county for land use and zoning decisions, to help manage develop-

ment in and around floodplains and wetlands, to reduce flood risks, to preserve land and water resources, and for emergency planning. It will also provide valuable information to the public for decisions about purchasing and protecting property.

A Good Samaritan was critically injured early Thanksgiving morning when he attempted to help others involved in a traffic accident on the interstate.

Christopher Eric Jenkins, 37, of Sarasota, was

transported to Ocala Regional Hospital suffering from critical injuries he sustained when he tried to render aid to other individuals involved in a separate traffic crash north of Bushnell on Interstate 75, according to a Florida Highway Patrol report.

Jenkins had walked across both northbound

lanes on the interstate to help the motorists at about 5:26 a.m. and was standing in the inside travel lane when a vehicle approached, the report states.

The driver of the approaching vehicle, Joseph Farrell, 41, of Sarasota, was unable to avoid a collision and the front of the 2004 Ford Es-

cape he was driving struck Jenkins, according to the report.

The Escape stopped in the emergency lane on the east side of the road while Jenkins was in the center of the interstate, the report states.

No charges were filed by the Florida Highway Patrol in the crash.



feet 7, weighing between 160 and 180 pounds, according to Det. Donnie Smith. He is believed to be white or Hispanic between 25 and 35.

"We're hoping that someone may have seen the suspect," said Smith. "The bank is trying to complete a list of people who may have seen something on that day at that time."

It was the curse of the perfect holiday turkey

The year was 2002, a year that lives in infamy, or at least extreme annoyance, in my daughter, Alison's, life.

That was the year of the cursed perfect turkey.

Prior to that, Alison's Thanksgiving turkeys ranged from dry to just OK. But in 2002 she took a mad-cap leap of faith, risked everything and brined the bird — and it came out brown and crisp on the outside, moist and succulent on the inside. Perfection with drumsticks and wings.

Her husband heaped praises on her, and may or may not have offered to do the dishes. I think they lived in Maryland at the time, which isn't pertinent to the story. What is pertinent is the fact that Alison roasted a perfect turkey in 2002 — and where do you go from there?

Thanksgiving 2003 was deemed a total, humiliating defeat and came complete with minor hissy fits and a major meltdown of mammoth proportion.

Thanksgiving 2003 was deemed a total, humiliating defeat and came complete with minor hissy fits and a major meltdown of mammoth proportion. (I swear I don't know where she gets her flair for melodrama.)

I recall her describing mashed potatoes on the ceiling and sweet potatoes in her eyebrows, of weeping and wailing and gnashing of teeth.

I don't have a play-by-play of years 2004 to the present, although one of those years she and my granddaughter spent the holiday with us in Florida while her Army husband was deployed overseas. That was the year we were to eat at the restaurant my husband's Aunt Pat worked at and the year of reprieve for Alison's striving for turkey perfection.

However, Aunt Pat got sick

and Alison was nominated to cook a turkey, which was awesomely delicious according to everyone who ate it except Alison who knew it was not even close to the Perfect Turkey of '02 and, therefore, was a failure and, therefore, so was she.

A few days ago, she and I were texting about turkeys. Once again she was planning to brine hers, plus it came injected with some flavor-enhancing solution that she hoped would help, but I could tell that her "hope" was hopeless.

With texting it's hard to discern emotion, but I just knew her texts contained much sighing and hand wringing.

I told her, "It's tough having a perfect turkey to have to live up to. Stupid perfection."

A few years ago, she told me she used to love Thanksgiving — the planning and shopping and prepping, the smells, even the Charlie Brown Thanksgiving show where they serve popcorn and toast.

Michelle, who immediately fell in love when she saw the helpless little puppy. She took him home, got a crate and filled it with warm blankets, filled his tummy with puppy food, and so began a new beginning for the puppy who was to be named Webster.

It was a on a weekend when the county's Animal Services facility was closed, and also would be closed on Monday was Veterans Day. But the good Samaritan that found the baby puppy needed help now. The puppy was so young, too young to be without his mother, and yet here he was, found in the street, alone and scared. Because he was unable to care for the puppy, the Good Samaritan remembered that there is a Florida State Statute called the "Save Haven Law."

The law allows for unwanted babies to be surrendered at hospitals or fire stations. With no where else to go, the good Samaritan brought the baby puppy to his local fire station.

As luck would have it, firefighter and EMT Donald Foster and firefighter and paramedic Will Wilson were on duty.

"The tiny puppy was filthy and full of fleas, so we gave him a bath and cleaned him up", foster recalls. Foster called his wife

Webster had his first veterinarian visit where Donnie and Michelle were told that he was just under 6 weeks old when they took him home. Puppies should be with their mothers for a minimum of 8 weeks, with 10 to 12 weeks as ideal. Poor little Webster was way too young to be weaned and on his own. After a complete check up, the Fosters were given medicine for little Webster along with instructions on a path to raising a healthy puppy.

Now Webster spends his evenings curled up on the couch with his new family watching TV. Like a good little boy, he follows Michelle around the yard having puppy fun.

"Webster has a bed in my truck, another bed in Michelle's car, and his own bed at home", laughs Foster. Yet at night, if not already sleeping in his comfy crate, you will more than likely find Webster snuggled in bed next to his human mom and dad. These days, Webster is stylish wearing a new camou-

flage sweater or one of his two Florida State jerseys. Webster has a bright future ahead with a family that will love and care for him, and yes, spoil him a bit too. He is a very lucky little puppy!

Not all puppies are as fortunate as Webster. Puppies should never be separated from their canine families at such a young age. The majority of animals in these circumstances do not survive. Little Webster would never have survived alone on the streets for very long.

Thanks to one act of kindness from a caring citizen, a baby puppy's life was saved and suddenly changed for the better. He has brought joy, love, and a new purpose to Michelle and Donnie's life, and all together they have a very happy home.



ASK THE MASTER GARDENER

Cassia tree

Question:

What's the name of those tall, bright yellow flowering trees I see in yards & landscapes?

Answer:

I bet you are referring to the Cassia tree, which is also called Cassia bicapsularis or butterfly bush and blooms prolifically with yellow flowers this time of year. It is a host plant for 3 types of Florida butterflies – cloudless sulphur, sleepy orange sulphur and orange-barred sulphur. Cassia blooms even resemble yellow butterflies. This is a plant that is just waking up when others are getting ready for winter. These dramatic semi-evergreen plants

add great color to a yard. Plant in an area that receives full sun to part sun and is somewhat protected from winds & cold temps. Cassia plants can reach heights of 8-10 feet and will benefit from periodic pruning to reduce growth, while keeping it compact & strong. My Mexican petunia leaves are have a silvery gray substance on them. What is causing this?

Eriophyid mites

Answer:

What your Ruellia simplex or Mexican petunia has is damage by eriophyid mites that feed on the plant's leaves, causing abnormal plant growth, and white patches on leaves & stems. These mites are too small to be seen by the naked eye. This is not considered a disease but rather a growth distortion caused by these tiny mites. Since Mexican petunias are quite hardy, there is really no treatment. You can try pruning the affected areas or spray the leaves with organic horticulture oil.

Question: What are the benefits of horticulture oils you often suggest as treatment for some plant problems?

Answer: Horticultural oils are re-

fined mineral oils with impurities removed and an emulsifying agent added that allows the oil to mix with water for application.

These oils, which are less toxic & more natural, help control a wide variety of pests that feed of plants. The oil kills the pests by blocking their breathing holes & gumming up their mouthpieces. Neem oil is one of these products and has a naturally occurring pesticide in the seeds; an extract from the seeds is used in the oil. As always, it's important to follow label directions for preparation & application.
