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The oak trees stay - at least until options considered

The large majestic oak trees on County Road 121 are safe – for now.

But that doesn't mean that they couldn't be removed at a later date, depending on what the County Commission decides.

Last week, the board was presented by a petition from more than 1,000 people opposed to the county's plan to remove two large oak trees included in a repaving project for the northeastern county road near Lake Miona scheduled to start later this summer.

When area residents learned of the county's plan to remove the two large oak trees, a petition drive was launched on Facebook to save them. Called Save These Trees, the Facebook site soon

picked up momentum with dozens of area residents commenting about how important it is to retain the trees for a variety of reasons ranging from their historical significance to their environmental benefits. Their support was echoed by those who agreed in the petition that the trees should not be destroyed.

The petition was presented to the County Commission on May 27 with numerous area residents addressing the board, asking commissioners to consider other alternatives to removing the trees.

Audience members told commissioners how important the trees are to the neighborhood and to the environment. Several people suggested that removing the trees would increase the incidence of speeding on the road.

Among the options, res-


idents asked the board to consider putting guardrails around the trees to help prevent accidents and perhaps acquiring additional rights of way from property owners to widen the roadway where the trees are located.

County Administrator Bradley Arnold said that to reroute the road to keep the trees "would require substantial right of way" and may mean other large oaks would have to be destroyed.

Right of way would either have to come from local property owners or through the process of acquiring it through eminent domain, he said.

"People's property rights are held in such high esteem" that an overwhelming need would have to be shown for the county to be able

Burglary suspect arrested

A video surveillance camera played a key role last week in the arrest of a former employee believed to have burglarized a medical center in Lady Lake.

The video showed a man entering Premiere Medical Associates, on Santa Barbara Blvd, about 12:31 a.m. Thursday, May 29, by breaking a window on the east side of the facility, according to a sheriff's office report.

Shortly after an alarm sounded following the break-in, deputies arrived and discovered burglary tools that included a crowbar, a reciprocating saw and a machete, the report states. Deputies also noticed that attempts had been made to gain entry to an adjoining pharmacy by cutting through a wall.

Ultimately, the pharmacy door was pried open. The suspect, who had gained entry to the pharmacy, was shown by a video camera leaving the premises almost immediately as motion sensors and alarms started going



Remis honors late coach with project

The late Larry LeCroy was memorialized years ago – a coach at Webster Elementary School, he was honored for his impact on the community and his students. A bench was placed on the school campus in memory of students sitting on the bench with their coach during physical education.

LeCroy had an impact on many lives, including that of Pablo Remis – he was just a couple of years into elementary school when the coach died in 2008, and already, Remis had great respect for LeCroy. He had a love for the job that kept him

working, even as he battled cancer.

"I thought of him as a role model and he helped me a lot at school. He was important to so many people," Remis, now 13, said.

A member of Bushnell Boy Scout Troop 439, Remis began considering his Eagle Scout project. He felt enhancing the memorial bench area was a way to show his gratitude for the impact LeCroy had on his life and the right project.

Webster Elementary had a bench and plaque honoring LeCroy, but Remis wanted to add to it – plants, mulch and a dis-

play with pictures honoring LeCroy.

"He was a very special man to Pablo and all of us," said Pablo's mother, Sherry. Of her son, she said, "He is only 13 and we are so proud."

Remis is the son of Sherry and Paul Remis of Webster.

"Most items were donated to make his project," and he has plans to add to it in the future.

His hope is that the project "honors Coach LeCroy's memory and service."

Remis is only 13 and the first Eagle Scout in their troop. He started out in scouting as a cub, seven years ago.

"I looked at the area there and searched memorials on the Internet," he said, of getting his plan together.

They put mulch under

it and added a large glass case "with a whole bunch of pictures of him, I polished the plaque and the bench and there's plants around it and big flowers."

Once the community heard what he was doing, they donated all the items that were used.

Remis said they also contacted LeCroy's widow, Peggy.

"We told her about it and she was very glad to help. She sent most of the pictures."

Mrs. LeCroy and Remis both spoke at the Webster Field Day Olympics event where they re-dedicated the memorial area, with the additions.

Honoring LeCroy and being the first scout to earn Eagle Scout in his troop, Remis was honored by the Bushnell City Council members during the May 5 meeting.

As a scout, he said one of his favorite things has been wilderness survival.

"I had to make a small structure to spend the night in - out of things I found in the woods," he said. Unable to find much to use, he created a structure from trash bags, utilizing a cord to tie it to a tree and create a frame.

"I used twigs as stakes to keep in the ground."

"I thought it was very interesting to learn about being able to survive in the wilderness," he said, adding that they were able to learn useful skills through the exercise.

Of becoming an Eagle Scout, "I'm very excited and honored that I achieved this rank," he said, noting he sees it as having additional responsibilities.

"I'm supposed to help my troop and others more than ever."

to take the property, Arnold said.

County Public Works Director Scott Cattrell voiced concerned about using guardrails.

Cattrell said guardrails should only be used as a last resort "because it becomes an obstacle to be hit."

Cattrell told the board

that the best safety measure would be to remove the trees.

Commissioner Garry Breeden said that guardrails would show the county's attempt to make the road safer.

"We can never make a road 100 percent safe," he said. "It's not possible to make every situation safe."

Commissioner Doug Gilpin said the road will continue to be a problem because traffic is constantly increasing there and "we

can't prevent people from driving on it."

After comments were heard from the audience and from commissioners, the meeting was moved to another topic without commissioners making any additional decisions about the road project.

Breeden quickly brought the subject back up.

"We need to give these people an idea of what direction we're going in out of respect," he told the board. Cattrell said the county

could look at options for the road project but it would create a delay.

Breeden said he would like to see additional information provided to the board about possible options.

Gilpin suggested that the project be delayed a year, into the county's next repaving schedule.

While commissioners took no action, Arnold said an amendment will be made to the repaving contract and be considered at the June 10 board meeting.



Remembering not to forget

On Easter, my husband and I visited a church in Tampa.

Located smack in the middle of the nightclub district of Ybor City, it's an urban church that attracts young people with its industrial warehouse look, its nightclub lighting, loud rock music, free food and emphasis on Jesus rather than the extraneous stuff that doesn't matter.

As my friend Steve would say, the place smelled like Jesus.

And thanks to a pair of complimentary ear plugs offered to us as we walked in, we thoroughly enjoyed the service.

Last Sunday we went back.

On that day, the entire service was about communion. The pastor talked about how Jesus invited his closest friends to a Passover meal, the one we call the Last Supper, the one that took place the night before he died.

At that meal, first Jesus washed his friends' feet. Then he broke the bread and gave a piece to each man present at the table, even the one who would betray him. He told them, "This bread is my body, which is broken for you."

Next, he lifted up the goblet of wine and said, "This is my blood, the new covenant between God and his people" (1 Corinthians 11:24,25 my paraphrase).

Jesus also told them, "Whenever you eat this bread and drink this wine, do it in remembrance of me."

The pastor said that's what communion is for, for remembering Jesus.

He said that as we go about our lives and our busyness, it's not so much that we forget Jesus, but that we forget to remember him.

That statement struck me: We — I — forget to remember Jesus.

"We are prone to spiritual memory loss," the pastor said. "We forget that he still performs miracles; he still gives us hope; he still gives new life. And he asked us to remember him."

A few years ago, I wrote a column about trying to remember Jesus. I had felt the memory of him fading, and I desperately wanted to get it back.

So, I picked up my dusty Bible and flipped through its pages and re-remembered his compassion for the immoral women of his day, how kindly he treated them as he offered them forgiveness and dignity. I re-remembered how he raised the dead only son of a poor widow, brought a little girl back to life, cast demons out of a man and made the blind to see.

I re-remembered his words, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will

give you rest," "Your sins are forgiven" and "Take courage. It is I. Don't be afraid."

This morning, too, still tasting in my memory the bread and the tart grape juice of last Sunday's communion, I purposed to remember Jesus.

As I dressed for work and dried my hair, as I packed my lunch and backed my car out of the garage, as I stopped to get gas and drove away, I remembered how he has never forgotten me.

That's what the pastor had said. That even when we forget to remember him, Jesus never forgets us. He always remembers his own.

I remembered how Jesus has remembered me. Even before I knew him, he knew me and was with me, remembering me when I was young and lonely and afraid.

All the times I chose to do wrong, all the times I tried in vain to control the universe without him, all the times I turned to a lesser god for comfort and meaning that inevitably failed me, he remembered me.

This is what I wrote on Christmas Eve 2009:

"It's Christmas, and I'm trying hard to remember Jesus, to think about how he set aside his glory and entered the world as a helpless human, to remember his poverty, the lowliness he chose to endure — all because he remembered me.

"Because he remembered me, he suffered. He died.


"Because he remembered me, he was buried. He rose.

"He remembered me from the beginning, remembered me all through my life, and even if I try to forget him, I can't."

Last Sunday, we had communion. We walked up to the front of the warehouse church, lights dimmed, music loud. We took the bread that was broken, as Jesus was broken, and dipped it into the substitutionary blood that was shed for us.

As we did, we remembered Jesus, remembered him because he first remembered us.

The real reason Crist fled the GOP

Recently Charlie Crist, former Republican house member, former Republican state senator, former Republican attorney general and former Republican governor now a Democrat candidate for governor has offered several different scenarios in an attempt to explain his reason (s) for fleeing the GOP. Before you decide which if any of Charlie's explanations you think is even remotely plausible, here are the indisputable facts.

In December of 2008, United States Senator Mel Martinez announced that he would not see another term in the Senate and would be resigning prior to the end of his term. Speculation about a possible successor focused almost immediately on former Governor Jeb Bush. Early in 2009, after Jeb Bush declared he was not a candidate, former speaker of the Florida House, Marco Rubio announced his candidacy. A few months later, Governor Crist declared he too was a candidate for the Republican nomination and immediately became the front runner. Initial polling gave him a more than a 20 point lead over any challengers.

Shortly thereafter, Charlie headed to Washington to seek the support of the Republican Senatorial Campaign Committee where he prevailed upon his old friend John McCain to endorse his candidacy. Recall that in 2008 Charlie's enthusiastic last minute endorsement of McCain in Florida's Presidential Primary helped McCain secure the nomination spurring speculation that Crist was interested in joining the ticket as the vice presidential candidate.

After a politically choreographed interview process where he interviewed an African-American, a Hispanic-American, and a woman, Gover-

nor Crist appointed his chief of staff George Lemieux to fill Senator Martinez's unexpired term and ostensibly to hold the seat for him.

With the support of the Republican establishment, a well funded campaign, an almost unknown primary opponent and a divided Democratic party, Governor Crist appeared to have not only the Republican nomination but the Senate seat itself locked up.

Cruising to what many believed would be an overwhelming victory, Crist announced his support for the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, a/k/a the stimulus "package" and the roof fell in on him. By April of 2010, Crist's twenty point plus lead had evaporated and he trailed Marco Rubio by that same twenty point margin.

In mid April of 2010, just before the filing deadline, Crist announced he would immediately abandon his career long relationship with the Republican Party and re-register with no party affiliation thereby avoiding a head to head contest with Marco Rubio for the Republican nomination.

The strategy merely delayed the inevitable. In November of 2010, Marco Rubio beat Charlie Crist by more than one million votes to become Florida's next United States Senator. Crist briefly aligned himself with the "no labels" movement before registering as a Democrat.

Americans are usually very forgiving when it comes to our political figures. Most of us accept the inevitability that from time to time they will change their opinions. However, most of us also find it unacceptable when political figures try to change the facts.

VA system blues

On the morning of the 21 of May, we finally heard from Mr. Obama as to the state of our VA system. Basically telling us he didn't know anything but it appears to be overburdened. Near the end of his speech he brought it to everyone's attention that there were 85,000,000 appointments scheduled this year for the VA! When do I prune azaleas? I have the kind that only bloom once yearly.

Answer:
The standard evergreen azaleas can be pruned after the spring flush of blossoms are done. You can prune them again during the warm weather to shape them, but do not prune after July 4th or you will sacrifice your blooms for next year. For those of you who have Encore azaleas, you can prune them right after the spring bloom; however, this type of azalea needs very little pruning. Remember: Right Plant, Right Place. If you chose the proper plant for the space, you will need to do little pruning anyway.

Speak out on bass management

It is time to speak out about Florida's proposed change to largemouth bass management by filling out an online survey or attending a local meeting (see MyFWC.com/Calendar). The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) wants to be sure management strategies optimize use and enjoyment of these fish in a sustainable manner.

Black bass -- among which the Florida largemouth reigns supreme -- are the most popular sportfish in North America.

A change is being considered to provide a five-bass daily bag limit, only one of which may be 16 inches in total length or longer. This means that each person would be allowed to keep up to five largemouth bass less than 16 inches, or four largemouth bass less than 16 inches and one largemouth bass 16 inches or longer each day.

This change would replace current length limits, but not the statewide bag limit of five bass. For the most part, this would become a statewide regulation, but limited exceptions for fisheries with special needs or opportunities would be possible and generally associated with fish management areas.

To take the survey, and learn more about largemouth bass as well as current and possible future management changes, go to MyFWC.com/Fishing and click on "Speak out on bass rules!" under the bass image near the middle of the page.

"The FWC takes public opinions very seriously," said Tom Champeau, director of the agency's Division of Freshwater Fisheries Management. "Combined with the best science and case studies that we have, public input helps us strive for optimal sustained use of these popular and valuable fish."

In 2011 the Black Bass Management Plan (BBMP) was approved, based on comments from more than 7,500 anglers. In addition to that, input from typical fishermen, Technical Advisory Group meetings involving guides, tournament anglers, marina owners, trophy bass fishermen, outdoor writers and tourism representatives were conducted to ensure a wide range of opinions.

The BBMP encouraged using the least restrictive regulations feasible to enhance trophy bass fisheries, maintain healthy



bass populations statewide and provide diverse angling opportunities. Therefore, FWC staff reviewed biological data to evaluate effectiveness of various regulation strategies. In addition, public opinion came from almost 6,000 responses to a preliminary survey and open-house events around Florida in 2013. The resulting proposal would simplify regulations, allow more harvest of abundant smaller bass and further protect older fish, including spawning female bass. The FWC is seeking feedback on this proposed change and will continue to evaluate options for several months before submitting a final proposal. If the public supports the proposal, and FWC Commissioners accept it, it could be implemented in July 2016.

The FWC promotes TrophyCatch as a volunteer citizen-science program that rewards anglers for catching, documenting and releasing bass heavier than 8 pounds (see TrophyCatchFlorida.com), thus further encouraging voluntary release of the biggest, oldest bass.

Initial surveys in 2013 were completed primarily by non-tournament anglers (52 percent) and casual tournament fishermen who normally fish local club tournaments, with 9 percent fishing more than 20 tournaments a year. Most respondents primarily targeted bass and fished frequently. So FWC incorporated input from those most affected by any changes.

A few takeaways were that only 16 percent normally eat the bass they catch, and 57 percent are happy if they don't keep any bass. When asked about current regulations, 57 percent did not want to increase the bag limit and 21 percent wanted to reduce it. Since a five-bass daily bag limit is sustain-

able, there is not a recommendation to change it.

Currently, south and east of the Suwannee River there is a 14-inch minimum length limit, and in the Suwannee River and north and west of it there is a 12-inch minimum length limit for bass. Biological data show that protecting these smaller fish is not necessary. Furthermore, different size limits complicate regulations. What is advantageous is protecting bigger fish, which are rarer and take longer to produce -- hence the proposed harvest limit of only one bass 16 inches or longer per day. This regulation would be more lenient in the south fishing zone (east of Highway 441 and south of State Road 80), which currently allows only one bass over 14 inches.

There is no plan to alter the Bass Tournament Exemption Permit process (see MyFWC.com/Permits then click on "Freshwater" and "Black Bass Tournament").

Organizations holding bass tournaments may apply online for a temporary exemption to bass size limits. This helps ensure the health of Florida freshwater resources while encouraging fishing participation from small clubs to major tournaments. In return for a temporary exemption to allow weigh-in prior to live-release of the bass, tournament participants must forego any harvest, including what would otherwise be their five-fish bag limit. Any fish that die must be donated to charity or for research. Tournaments are not required to have a permit if they abide by existing regulations and don't seek an exemption.



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Saying no to tobacco

In honor of World No Tobacco Day, May 31, the Florida Department of Health in Sumter County commemorated the important progress made in the fight against tobacco while also shedding light on the latest facts released this year about tobacco use and its deadly consequences.

"Tobacco use is the leading cause of preventable death and disease in the United States", said Sanford Zelnick, D. O, director of the Florida Department of Health in Sumter County. "It will take a partnership effort to address the needs of our local community".

"Educating our community on the deadly consequences of tobacco use is an important goal for Sumter County," said Amy Wixted, program director USF, "As a community we must actively work with community partners and local youth to raise awareness about tobacco issues in our county as well as resources available to help current tobacco users quit."

Earlier this year, the U.S. Surgeon General released a report highlighting 50 years of progress in tobacco control since the

first report on smoking and health was published in 1964. Despite this progress, tobacco use remains the leading preventable cause of death and disease.

The new report also added several health effects to the long list of cigarette smoking's serious consequences. The report concluded that smoking causes liver and colorectal cancer, diabetes, rheumatoid arthritis, erectile dysfunction, ectopic pregnancies, impaired fertility, cleft lip and cleft palates in babies of women who smoke during early pregnancy, age-related macular degeneration, and immune system weakness.

"Tobacco is exacting a tremendous toll on our society, yet, I am encouraged by the progress made throughout the state and in Sumter County," said Tobacco Free Florida Bureau Chief Shannon Hughes. "An estimated 8 million American lives were potentially saved since the publication of that first surgeon general's report in 1964.

"Today in Florida, we are implementing a nationally renowned program - Tobacco Free

Florida - that is saving lives and saving the state millions of dollars."

Every year, on May 31, the World Health Organization (WHO) and tobacco control advocates around the globe mark World No Tobacco Day, highlighting the health risks associated with tobacco use and advocating for effective policies to reduce tobacco consumption.
