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Cold weather has yet to damage crops

Agent: 'We're not out of the woods yet'

HENDRY COUNTY -- The forecasters have been wrong before.

Local farmers are hoping they'll be wrong once more.

Earlier this week, citrus producers scrambled to put plans in place in case a predicted freeze threatened to damage their crops.

Even for a Florida winter, this

week's weather has bit hard and cold, and the possibility of an extended freeze worried some. Weather watchers said Tuesday would be a cold day, especially for the areas like Western Palm Beach County and Hendry County, with the National Weather Center issuing freeze watches for most of the communities around the lake.

But the forecasts have fallen short and the cold, if anything, may have benefited the citrus crop. The question is whether farmers have seen the worst of the unseasonably cooler temperatures.

As the forecasts enter the week-end, the weather service reported the probability that temperatures would dip once more heading into Saturday and Sunday. To most, this simply means they'll be reaching for their coats and jackets a little longer; to farmers, it is tantamount to a battle against the destructive force of a Florida freeze.

To Tris Chapman, vice president of operations at Southern Gardens in Hendry County, the freeze conjures up memories of the freezes of the 1980s, when record temperatures in 1983, 1985

and 1989 in particular caused major devastation in the Florida citrus industry.

"We're hoping for the best, but planning for the worst," said Mr. Chapman, who was optimistic but not confident that the weather this year would come nowhere near those industry low points.

The irony in this is that citrus operations were moved further south to areas like Hendry County after the 1980s, in large part to reduce the possibility that the cooler

According to the American Association of Community Colleges, during the fall of 2005 more than 6.5 million 18- to 24-year-olds attended a two-year university.




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Prevention is the key

Prevention is the key ... educate yourself and take care of yourself!

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


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

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Walk in the Past: The Rules of War

The Battle of Hacheelustee (Jan. 8, 1837) could have been the last battle fought in the Second Seminole Indian War because it reinforced the futility of waging war against the United States to many of the war weary Seminoles. The ripple effect of the resulting battle came when several Seminole leaders approached the soldiers under a truce, to request a meeting with General Jesup.

After the meeting, General Jesup declared an armistice until February 18, 1837, when the Seminoles would return and resume peace negotiations. The negotiations were late in coming and started at a later date. On March 6, 1837, an agreement was finally reached, and the document called "Capitulation of the Seminole Nation of Indians and their allies by Jumper, Holatoochee, and Yaholoochee, representing the principle chief of Micanopy" was signed.

The principle provisions of the Capitulation document called for the relocation of all Florida Seminoles to the Indian lands west of the Mississippi. To comply, the combative Seminole leaders and their followers must relocate south of the Hillsborough River, where military arrangements would be made for their deployment west. It also granted all Blacks living in Florida freedom, if they accompanied the Seminoles west.

General Jesup's idea behind setting the Blacks free in Florida was to appease the Seminoles, who had integrated many Blacks into their culture. Jesup hoped that allowing the Blacks to go west with the Seminoles would be an enticement for the Seminoles to end the war. Unfortunately, none of these ideas ever materialized.

General Jesup had always called the Seminole War, a Negro War due to all the imaginations an armed, free roaming Florida Black conjured up in the minds of Southern whites. Jesup hoped that freeing all the Blacks in Florida and shipping them west would rule out the unresolved treaty complexities associated with: runaway slaves, Blacks living as free citizens under previous Spanish rule, Black Seminoles and mixed marriages.

The Capitulation document's call for the freedom of Florida Negroes quickly became "the straw that broke the camel's back" as Southern Slave holders protested fervently to state and federal officials that Jesup was freeing blacks at their expense. Even the loathsome slave hunters were quick to protest what they saw as an unfair ending to the slave business in Florida.

The Capitulation documents proclaimed an "Emancipation Proclamation" for all Florida Blacks. This radical thinking threw General Jesup into an unpopular political arena, where he was criticized as a traitor by parties sympathetic to Slavery. General Jesup was forced to cede to their political pressures and modify the Capitulation documents, so that only a segment of the blacks living in Florida would gain freedom, should the Seminoles agree to end the war and migrate west.

Peace appeared to be looming on the Florida horizon after approximately 700 Seminoles and their leaders, over a period of two months, had gathered outside Tam-

pa Bay for the long, boat trip to the west. However, on June 2, 1837, Seminole leaders, Osceola and Sam Jones, with the help of several hundred warriors, kindly persuaded the soon-to-be migrating Seminoles that it wasn't a good idea. So, in one night General Jesup's 700 Seminoles vanished like phantoms of the night.

The General was said to have experienced a short bout of depression after the 700 Seminoles fled back into the swamps. He later wrote his superiors, "This campaign so far as relates to Indian migration has entirely failed." General Jesup may have experienced another state of melancholy had he known the Seminole War would linger another five years.

In General Jesup's view, the continuation of the war could only mean eventual extermination for the fighting Seminoles. It disturbed him to the point that he asked to be relieved of his command. A month later, he was offered the chance to remove himself from the Florida Theater, but declined. However, the damage was done because later in his command, General Gaines, as well as General Winfield Scott, tried to outrank him and take command of the Florida Theater.

A continuation of the war meant a new strategy, so a now hardened General Jesup threw wartime military protocol out the door and replaced it with his own interpretation. His policies could be likened to those of the later Civil War Hero, General Sherman, who made his infamous trip of destruction from Atlanta, Georgia to Savannah, Georgia, at the expense of the southern people. General Jesup and the later General Sherman thought alike because they both saw war as Hell and used unorthodox methods to bring war to an end.

General Jesup divided Central and South Florida into different sectors and started operating his mobile units inside these sectors. One mobile group was assigned the St. Johns River area. A second group operated along the Indian River. A third group operated on the Kissimmee River and southward, while a fourth group was assigned the Caloosahatchee River.

An Army group under General Hernandez surprised a camp of Seminoles outside St. Augustine. Nearly all the Seminoles were captured, including King Philip, the most important Indian captured, since the war had begun. One captive guided the Army group to another Seminole camp and the success was repeated again. Seminole leaders, Yuchi Billy and his brother, Jack, were captured on this raid.

During the same month King Philip's son, Coacoochee and Blue Snake, came in under a white flag to negotiate with General Jesup. General Jesup took them captive under the flag of truce. Several months later General Jesup ordered General Hernandez to follow suite, when the famous Seminole leader Oseola and Coa Hadjo asked for a meeting under a flag of truce.

General Jesup soon became unpopular with different folks for taking the Indian leaders under a flag of truce. Today, he is still criticized for the "underhanded way" he captured the Seminole leaders. General Jesup understood the proper rules of engagement he was to honor and play by in

wartime, but he soon learned they profited him nothing, so he adapted.

Today, Osceola is remembered as a great Seminole leader, who fought to keep the Seminole Nation's homeland in Florida. Regardless of how patriotic his actions were, he did plan and participate in the deaths of Indian Agent Thompson and five other persons, including one, who was a boy, to promote his objectives. He offered no flag of truce or parley to those six victims, only death in a time of peace.

Coacoochee and other Seminoles leaders coordinated the ambush known as "Dade's Massacre." Prior to the Second Seminole War, Major Dade and his men were marching to Fort King to reinforce the garrison because diplomacy between the Seminoles and Americans was growing ever dimmer. Major Dade and his soldiers introduction to the Second Seminole War was likened to Pearl Harbor because it came as a surprise ambush, followed by hot, lead bullets that killed all but three of the 108 soldiers.

In short, the Seminoles were fighting for their homeland and way of life, using every means to achieve that objective. General Jesup did like wise, throwing out the text book on "proper ways to conduct a war" and in turn, used every devious means he could to end the war. The Seminoles and General Jesup believed in their cause and each fought accordingly. The rules of war can always be debated, but are seldom tolerated when one is engaging the enemy in a life and death struggle.

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


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

Winter weather can be deadly for pets even in typically warmer climates such as Florida where pets are not accustomed to colder temperatures.

Follow these simple tips to assure your pet stays safe and warm during the winter season:

- If the temperature falls below 40 degrees, all pets need to be brought indoors or provided adequate heating to keep them warm (i.e. extra blankets, coats, heaters).

- During the winter, outdoor cats will search for warmer hiding places, such as under the hoods of cars.

Honk your horn or tap the hood of your car before starting the engine so they can escape.

- Puppies and many small breed dogs do not tolerate the cold very well.

If your dog is sensitive to the cold because of age, illness or breed type, be sure not to leave them outdoors for long peri-

ods of time.

- Never shave your dog down to the skin in winter.

A longer coat will provide more warmth. Consider getting a coat or sweater for short-haired breeds.

- Make sure your companion animal has a warm place to sleep that is away from all drafts.

A cozy dog or cat bed with a warm blanket or pillow is perfect.

- Provide your pet with plenty of food and water.

Be sure it does not freeze over if left outside.

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
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Florida's Lifeline enrollment sees dramatic increase

The number of Floridians who benefit from the Lifeline Assistance program grew by 236 percent this year, according to the Florida Public Service Commission's (PSC) Annual Lifeline Report.

The Lifeline program makes telephone service more affordable for low-income residents.

"I am happy that more Florida residents are signing up for Lifeline and staying connected to family, as well as to vital community services," said Matthew M. Carter II, PSC Chairman. "Our efforts to make sure that no one remains phoneless in Florida are reaping results."

As of June 30, 2009, 618,774 eligible residents participated in the Lifeline program, an increase of more than 434,800 participants over the previous year.

In its 2009 report sent to the Governor and the Legislature, the PSC attributed increased Lifeline participation to the automatic enrollment process initiated in April 2007 by the PSC and Florida's Department of Children and Families and to the significant enrollment of new Lifeline customers by SafeLink, a prepaid wireless phone provider.

Under the federal Lifeline program, telephone customers who participate in certain public assistance programs are entitled to receive a basic telephone service discount of at least \$13.50 per month, a savings of \$162 per year.

Link-Up Florida (Link-Up) provides a 50 percent reduction in the telephone service

installation charge, up to a maximum of \$30, for qualifying households that do not currently have telephone service.

Chairman Carter said, "The PSC continues to work with telephone companies, the Office of Public Counsel, and many other

groups to promote Link-Up and Lifeline, and we hope in 2010 people will continue to help us spread the word about these beneficial programs."

Eligibility for Link-Up and Lifeline includes participation in at least one of these

programs: Temporary Cash Assistance, Food Stamps, Medicaid, Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program, Supplemental Security Income, Federal Public Housing Assistance (Section 8), and National School Lunch Program's free lunch program.

A family whose income is at or below 150 percent of the federal poverty level guidelines may also qualify.

For a family of four, this requirement is a maximum monthly income of \$2,756.

Applying for Lifeline is easy. Florida residents may call their local phone company, the PSC at 1-800-342-3552, or the Office of Public Counsel at 1-800-540-7-039 for assistance.

Information is also available at www.floridapsc.com and www.floridaopc.gov/lifeline.cfm.

The PSC is committed to making sure that Florida's consumers receive their electric, natural gas, telephone, water, and wastewater services in a safe, affordable, and reliable manner.

The PSC exercises regulatory authority over utilities in the areas of rate base/economic regulation; competitive market oversight; and monitoring of safety, reliability, and service.



lege is \$25,143 annually; the average state school costs \$6,585. The price of a year's tuition at a community college? \$2,402.

But there are other factors at play. Working professionals enjoy the flexible schedule afforded by a community college. Community colleges offer more night classes than traditional universities and have smaller class sizes to encourage student engagement.

There are downsides, though. A limited curriculum keeps larger institutions in business. Despite the cons, enrollment figures for Florida community colleges has seen a steady increase -- jumping more than thirty percent between 2000 and 2009.

The recession has simply made more people aware of the benefits of attending a community college.

Palm Beach Community College saw a high number of registrations this semester, and in one case pleaded for help from the community in processing the vast number of applications it received for the January 2010 semester.

Representatives of the college point to the battered economy as a primary factor in the record registration figures.

"Enrollment has encountered a huge growth spell, it nearly doubled this year," said Melinda Biastre, PBCC's academic and financial aid advisor. "Unemployment has made community colleges more attractive. It finally gave people the chance to gain the education to obtain better jobs or the opportunity to change their profession."

The transformation

From its humble beginnings in 1933 with only 41 students, Palm Beach Community College (PBCC) has grown to four locations in Lake Worth, Palm Beach Gardens, Belle Glade and Boca Raton.

The year 2008 marked a milestone in the history of PBCC. The state board of educa-

tion gave approval for PBCC to offer its first baccalaureate degree in supervision and management and in applied science. With the designation, the college will undergo a name change of sorts, officially dropping the "community college" moniker and changing its name to Palm Beach State College this spring.

College officials believe the name change better reflects the institution's mission of providing a well-rounded education to the students who roam its halls.

A measure of that is the college's \$13 million investment in the Sugar Technology Institute. The 28,766 square foot facility being constructed in the college's Belle Glade campus will offer a curriculum specializing in one of the area's largest employment industries: agriculture.

Construction is expected to be completed in early 2010.

Seizing an opportunity

Melinda Soriano, a 2008 graduate of Glades Day School, is one of many students who opted to attend PBCC.

"It was close to home and I received the Presidential scholarship which entitled me to two years for free," Melinda said, "Students can enroll in classes at PBCC for about \$250."

She expects to receive her Associate of Arts (AA) degree this spring and then transfer to Florida Atlantic University to continue pursuing a degree in Criminal Justice.

She feels that her time at PBCC has prepared her for university life.

"PBCC also allowed me to experience a taste of college by participating in clubs and campus activities," she said, offering her unequivocal recommendation to prospective community college students.

Vickie Boulin, a first-year student at PBCC and a 2008 graduate of Everglade Preparatory, said that this was her second time attending the Belle Glade campus. She said she was newly excited, nervous and even scared about the experience.

To her, being close to home was also important. Vickie plans on remaining at the

institution as it transitions into a state college to fulfill her dream of working in medical technology.

Christine Limoze, a 2008 graduate of Glades Central, had the same high expectation as her fellow classmates. Her plans after PBCC include attending the University of Central Florida to acquire her bachelors degree on a path to becoming a pediatrician.

Although change is coming soon to the Glades, PBCC promises that it will not forget its original mission established 76 years ago

-- to remain committed to providing open door access to higher education by continuing its commitment in addressing the needs of its students, community and workforce.

"PBCC's professionalism is tremendous here in Belle Glade," said Ms. Biastre. "This college offers a solid education by teachers who are more than capable. With an AA degree here, students can not only save money but are also able to apply anywhere to finish their education."

weather north would travel so far south.

Mr. Chapman also serves as president of the Florida Citrus Processors Association, and speaks for the group when he says that "we're all concerned about the possibility of a freeze."

He remains worried for other places in Florida. "Some of our friends in Polk County could be more concerned," he said, referring to the state's largest citrus producing county. "A degree or two could make a real difference."

He carefully gauges weather predictions. "I'm not the weatherman," said Mr. Chapman. "They have enough problems with their predictions and they've missed it a couple of times this week. Fortunately, it was on the high side for us."

Around the state, citrus producers debated whether, and how much, to water their crops to ward off the cold. During cold snaps, the danger of freezing is tempered by maintaining the moisture in the crops. With water being slightly warmer than air, the moisture creates a steam that holds temperatures higher.

Gene McAvoy, with the Hendry County Extension Office, though, cautions farmers on the process.

"We've been over watering this week," said Mr. McAvoy. "If you do this four, five, six nights a week, it causes the roots to rot and there will be an increase in disease in the fields over the next few weeks. Nothing catastrophic, but we're not out of the woods yet."

Others wondered if they should pull their crops out earlier, risking a loss in revenues or a drop in the quality of their product to avoid complete losses.

Most simply watched and waited.

"Since it all started Saturday night, the coldest we've had has been right at freezing or a little below for very short durations," said Jim Snidely, vice president of grove operations at Southern Gardens.

That means that temperatures have not dropped sufficiently to harm the crop.

According to Mr. Snidely, growers monitor a variety of conditions -- the awareness is increased when temperatures dip to below freezing for 10 to 12 hours at a time, or the more common bellwether of temperatures below 28 degrees sustained for a period of at least four hours. That's when the cold begins to damage the fruit itself, spoiling a given year's crop.

The worst case scenario is to have the same temperature hovering for up to 10 hours. In that scenario, cold not only affects the fruit but the tree itself and the damages affect future harvests.

Mr. McAvoy attributes the bad forecasts to other conditions.

"The clouds keep coming in at night, and are preventing the temperatures from falling," he said, as he peeked out of his window to the sky outside on Tuesday. "If it stays clear overnight, this might be the night."


But the cold snap isn't all bad news. According to Mr. Snidely, a "fourth generation citrus grower" who still remembers his first freeze as a 14-year-old, a milder cold snap actually benefits crops.

A gentler freeze preconditions the trees to withstand colder levels of weather, explained Mr. Chapman.

It may even make for a more delicious glass of orange juice down the line.

"Cooler weather helps the tree to slow down, increases the sugar and the ability for the fruit to make sugar," said Mr. Snidely. "It makes the orange sweeter, helps with the coloring and makes peel more orange."
