

A Long Time Coming: Guardrails Go Up

Rails installed as safety measure

After years of asking for guardrails to make State Road 80 a safer highway for motorists,

Glades residents can breathe easily knowing that the project has started.

Crews can be seen working on the installation of the guardrails just outside of Belle Glade. The first few feet of what will encompass an 18-mile barrier have been set.

The project is the direct result of an inordinate number of drowning deaths along State Road

80. Connecting the Glades cities of Belle Glade, South Bay and Pahokee to West Palm Beach, the canal-lined roadways have caused the death of mostly Glades residents across the years.

One recent tragedy involved the death of a 32-year-old mother and her two daughters.

Protect Yourself from Mosquito Bites

Now that the rains have finally arrived, it's time to start thinking about mosquitoes. It's so important for you to protect yourself and your family from mosquito-borne diseases.

Mosquitoes can carry West Nile virus infection, St. Louis Encephalitis, and Eastern Equine Encephalitis. Once a person is infected, they may have mild symptoms which include headache, fever, dizziness, and fatigue, but other severe symptoms are also possible.

Mosquito-borne diseases can cause serious illnesses and sometimes death in people of any age, but children and those over 50 are at greatest risk for severe reactions and disease.

Avoiding mosquito bites is the best way to prevent disease. Please remember the five D's:

- Dusk and Dawn – Avoid being outdoors when mosquitoes are seeking blood.

- Dress – Wear clothing that covers most of your skin.

- DEET – When the potential exists for exposure to mosquitoes, repellents containing up to 30 percent DEET are recommended. Oil of lemon eucalyptus can also be effective.

- Drainage – Check around your home to rid the area of standing water, where mosquitoes lay eggs.

Tips on Repellent Use

- Always read label directions carefully for the approved usage before applying a repellent.

- In protecting children, read label instructions to be sure the repellent is appropriate. DEET is not recommended on children younger than two months old. Oil of lemon eucalyptus should not be used on children less than three years old.

- Infants should be kept indoors or mosquito netting should be used over carriers and strollers

when outside.

- Never apply repellents to a child's hands. Adults should apply repellent first to their own hands and then transfer it to the child's skin and clothing.

- Apply insect repellent to exposed skin or onto clothing, but not under clothing. Do not apply repellent near the eyes or mouth, cuts, wounds, or irritated skin.

Tips on Eliminating Mosquito Breeding Sites

- Clean out eaves, troughs and gutters.
- Remove old tires or drill holes in those used in playgrounds to drain.

- Turn over or remove any empty containers (cups, pots, buckets, etc.).
- Check tarps on boats or other equipment that may collect water.

- Store boats upside down or with a cover
- Replace water in birdbaths and pet or other animal feeding dishes at least once a week.

- Change water in plant trays, including hanging plants, at least once a week.

- Remove vegetation or obstructions in drainage ditches that prevent the flow of water.



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Making Plastic From Discarded Plant Material

UF develops method to do so

Plastic may compete with paper in the grocery line, but it doesn't have to compete with the world's food supply, according to University of Florida researchers.

They've developed a way to produce plastic that doesn't use valuable natural resources, such as food or fuel, for raw materials.

The new method uses a strain of bacteria to create bioplastic from discarded plant material, such as yard waste.

Bioplastic, or plastic from renewable resources, is produced when an organism such as a bacterium creates lactic acid while fermenting carbohydrates. The lactic acid can then be converted into long chains of molecules to form plastic.

Current bioplastic production uses food carbohydrates, such as cane sugar or corn starch, as raw materials. Traditional plastic production requires petroleum.

Keelnatham Shanmugam, a UF microbiology and cell science professor, Lonnie Ingram, a distinguished professor in microbiology and cell science, and their co-workers made the development. Their research is published in the May issue of the Journal of Industrial Microbiology and Biotechnology.

"As we start using more and more bioplastics, we are infringing upon the use of food material," said Shanmugam. "We'd like to switch away from food-based carbohydrates to non-food-based carbohydrates for producing plastics."

Using discarded plant material to produce plastic helps keep commodity prices down. The plastic produced from the process is both biodegradable and recyclable, Shanmugam said.

In the study, the researchers tested the bacterium — *Bacillus coagulans* strain 36D1 — for its ability to produce lactic acid in a variety of conditions typical of bioplastic production. The bacterium was collected from a geyser in Calistoga, Calif., which was one of the many places the researchers sampled for bacteria.

Previous attempts to produce lactic acid from discarded plant materials using microorganisms have not yielded enough lactic acid and weren't cost effective.

However, Shanmugam and Ingram found that by adding calcium carbonate to the process, they achieved lactic acid yields as high as those achieved by organisms that fermented food carbohydrates.

Additionally, the heat-tolerant bacterial strain also cut production costs significantly by allowing the process to run at a higher temperature, which reduced the amount of expensive, plant-digesting enzymes required by up to four times.

Cost savings are also achieved by eliminating



the need for food carbohydrates as raw materials since discarded plant waste is less expensive. For example, using straw as a raw material is 13 times less expensive than sugar and five times less expensive than corn or wheat.

Mark Ou, a UF biological scientist and the study's lead author, said increases in oil prices over the last several years have led to more interest in petroleum alternatives for plastic production.

"If we can save some of our oil and turn our plants into our plastic cups and packaging, then we can increase our national security by reducing our dependence on foreign oil," Ou said.

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

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

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Inland Birdwatching Fun: Tricolored Heron

Birdwatching and developing wildlife habitat can be fun for youth and adults. Food, water, shelter, habitat, and safety are important considerations when attracting wildlife.

Excellent resources to learn about "Landscaping for Wildlife" can be found on the University of Florida's IFAS Living Green website: <http://livinggreen.ifas.ufl.edu/> or at your local IFAS Extension Office.

One interesting bird built for marsh life is the Tricolored Heron. The Tricolored Heron is fairly common, but with decreasing numbers they are designated a Species of Special Concern in Florida.

This slim, medium sized heron was formerly known as the Louisiana Heron. Adults have a dark slate-blue head and upper body with a purplish chest and white belly.

During breeding season, the Tricolored Heron sports a short white head plume, a buffy throat and fore-neck, a blue face and a blue bill, tipped with black.

Non breeding adults have a yellow face, bill and legs; the throat and fore-neck are white. On juvenile Tricolored Herons, rusty red adorns the

head, neck, upper back, and front parts of the wing.

Long legs enable them to wade and see down through water while using long toes to churn up food and distribute its weight over soft mud. Foraging behavior is very active and it often runs after fish.

A long neck and bill help this elegant bird reach prey which consists of fish, crustaceans, reptiles and insects. Its vocalization is a soft nasal moaning or croaking similar to other herons or egrets.

Tricolored Herons usually nest in colonies with other heron and ibis species. A clutch may contain 3-4 blue-green eggs which hatch in about 22 days. Both parents feed the young.

The young can swim well for short distances at 14 days of age and fledge at about 16-21 days of age.

July Sees Increase In Rainfall

Glades, Hendry see dramatic numbers, Palm Beach needs more

More than half into the month of July and the current rainfall totals are looking more and more encouraging. Recovering from a near-record breaking dry season and a damaging drought, the amount of rainfall that is needed is lacking. It finally looks as if the wet season is finally here in South Florida.

For the Hendry County area, the average rainfall total so far is 4.65 in. What has helped had been the extreme downpours that have been occurring lately. The beginning of July did not post impressive rainfall totals. Around July 7, totals began to rise as storms were more frequent. If rainfall continues in the same pattern for the rest

of the month, Hendry could have a monthly total of 6 - 8 inches. An interesting fact shown in the reports is that 4 in. of the rainfall total occurred during one storm period.

For the Glades County area, the rainfall is very similar to what has been reported in Hendry County. Rainfall did increase in the past two weeks raise the current total to 4.66 in.

Reports are also predicting that 6 - 8 inches will be the total for the Glades County area by the end of the month. The largest amount of rain that was dumped by a single storm period was 1.31 in.

For Palm Beach County, they have reported the largest amount of rainfall of the tri-county area with a current total of 5.73 in. As with Hendry and Glades, the same spike in rainfall can be seen as beginning two weeks ago.

The largest amount of rain that was reported from a storm period was 2.17 in. The forecasted amount of total rainfall for the month is expected to be from 7 - 9 inches of rain.

Back to School Health, Safety and Well-Being

With only a few weeks left of summer break, parents are probably thinking about getting their child ready to go back to school. Along with school clothes and school supplies, parents should make sure preventative health measures are included on their child's back-to-school checklist.

Success in school starts with keeping students healthy and safe. Parents should take their children to a healthcare provider for an annual "well-child" check-up and to make sure all vaccinations and medical records are in order. Healthy eating, adequate physical activity and good sleep patterns are also instrumental to success in school.

Parents should talk with their children about traveling safely to and from school. This includes planning safe routes for walking or riding a bike, reminding them to stay on the sidewalk, crossing the street only at designated crosswalks, and showing them how to properly wear a bicycle helmet if they are riding a bike to school.

If your child is old enough to start driving a car to school, please remind them of some of the basic rules of the road. Don't be afraid to talk to your teen about safe driving.

Allow them to take Driver's Education if it's offered at their high school. Ask your vehicle insurance company about programs available to teach teens about safe driving tips.

Children in Florida should never have to be without health care. Insurance can improve a child's access to medications and treatment they may need to control childhood illnesses and decrease absences from school. The state of Florida offers KidCare, a health insurance program for children from birth through age 18. Children can be eligible even if one or both parents are working.

"I'm very cautious," said Sasser. "I've always been aware of my surroundings. I'm just more aware of my surroundings now. I've got steady police action around me so I'm not worried."

In the wake of the incident, Palm Beach County Sheriff's Investigators recovered three bullets that were fired that night, tracing them back to a small caliber firearm.

Mayor Sasser said he knows who the man is that shot at him. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office does, too. He is hopeful that an arrest will be made soon in the case.

"I told them who it was. It confirmed who they were thinking as well," said the mayor, adding that the city's tough stance against crime certainly played a role in the shooting.

"It's due to the fact that we've been working very closely with the sheriff's department and all. Pahokee has had the largest crime reduction of any city in Palm Beach County, so when you start putting a squeeze in the criminals, you're bound to p--- off somebody."

He will not be shaken, and already he prefers to laugh about it than to dwell on it.

At the start of the interview, he is asked:

"How are you doing?"

"Well, and you?" he answers.

"No, literally, how are you doing?"

"Haha, I'm doing just fine," he says, managing a hearty chuckle.

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SFWMD Adds Access to CREW with Bird Rookery Swamp Trailhead

Rookery, Corkscrew ecosystem are popular public recreational spots

Bird watchers and outdoor enthusiasts alike have a new gateway into the Corkscrew Regional Ecosystem Watershed (CREW) management area in Southwest Florida.

The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) has completed an access enhancement to the popular Bird Rookery Swamp, opening a southern entrance point for the public to CREW. The work is part of the District's overall effort to facilitate recreational use of public land.

"Restoration often leads to new recreational opportunities, and the Bird Rookery Swamp trailhead and access to CREW is an example of this synergy," said Tommy Strowd, SFWMD Director of the Operations, Maintenance and Construction Division. "We will continue to take advantage of opportunities to increase access to public land so long as it is compatible with restoration and management objectives."

The rookery's new features include:

- Ample parking
- Informational kiosks
- Upgraded access to the existing boardwalk
- Americans with Disabilities Act compliant facilities, including a wheelchair access trail

Encompassing 7,017 acres, the Bird Rookery Swamp Management Unit is managed by the District in cooperation with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC). The site is a key component in maintaining the hydro-

logical balance of the greater Corkscrew Regional Ecosystem Watershed.

The District and its partners — representing businesses, environmental groups, landowners and governmental agencies — manage CREW for its numerous benefits to water storage, wildlife preservation and public recreation opportunities. The 60,000-acre watershed spanning Lee and Collier counties includes a majestic 5,000-acre marsh at its headwaters and the famous Audubon Corkscrew Swamp Sanctuary.

The vast majority of Bird Rookery Swamp features forested wetland dominated by bald cypress and red maple trees. There is also a mix of wet flatwoods and dome swamps bordering the western edge and an area of open marsh, dominated by sawgrass and Carolina willow in the center tract.

Many threatened and endangered plants and animals call Bird Rookery Swamp home. Florida panthers, black bears, white-tail deer, alligators and a menagerie of birds are just a sampling of Florida's native species utilizing the area.

Bird Rookery Swamp is also a great place for visitors to experience a glimpse of "Old Florida." Recreational opportunities such as biking, hiking and nature appreciation are allowed throughout the property. There is a 1,400-foot boardwalk near the public parking area that connects to a 12-mile loop of tram roads through some of the most beautiful natural habitats found in Southwest Florida.

To date, the District has opened 621,000 acres of land to the public. Many of these properties are in their natural state or have basic enhancements such as informational kiosks and hiking trails.

A long-fought issue, the point was driven home by that most recent accident, and the state seemed to roll up its sleeves to get the project started.

But it needed convincing first.

The long-standing protestation to a request to install guardrails was the fact that the distance between the road and the canals fell outside what the state guidelines call for guardrails.

An ardent proponent of the project was Jess Santamaria, Palm Beach County Commissioner representing the Glades. Santamaria led a campaign for the project, arguing to the department of transportation to fast-track the project before any more lives were lost.

His work also resulted in the involvement of the Palm Beach County Board of Commissioners, which sent a letter to FDOT asking for urgency in addressing the guardrail project.

The state listened and issued the work order on the \$4.3 million project. The bid was awarded in April and the project was estimated to be completed by the end of the year.

The guardrails will run along the north and south ends of State Road 80 for the entire 18 miles. As crews continue their work, they will inevitably construct near locations where the deadly accidents happened. Engineers hope that by safeguarding the sites, any future accidents will have better outcomes.

Sheriff's Corporal Sues Sheriff's Office

Leonardo Bailum seeks compensation, punitive damages for pain and suffering

Leonardo Bailum, a corporal at the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, is continuing his fight against the very organization which employs him. He officially filed suit at the Circuit Court of the 15th Judicial Circuit in Palm Beach County against the agency.

Bailum filed the suit earlier this month alleging a cover-up at the sheriff's office and what he describes as a concentrated effort to target him in light of a "whistle-blowing" incident.

Bailum alleges that he brought attention to issues at the sheriff's office but instead of resolving the issues, the organization instead removed him from his position. A long-time employee at the Belle Glade district, he has since been transferred to District 3 in North Palm Beach.

He is seeking "compensatory and punitive damages" for the mental and anguish and pain and suffering he claims he experienced through the ordeal.

The lawsuit names a number of PBSO officials, including Lt. Michael Morris, who is him-

self facing charges of misconduct for reportedly fixing tickets, and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement.

The language in the summary claims Bailum suffered relation for reporting a number of incidents involving other deputies with whom he worked.

Claiming that deputies acted inappropriately in a number of scenarios – one deputy reportedly refused to render aid to an injured man on U.S. 27, and lied on a domestic violence/child abuse report, another deputy is said to have arrested a mother who was transporting her child to the hospital for driving with an expired drivers license – Bailum says that the sheriff's office repaid him by making him the subject of two internal affairs investigations and transferring him from his district to another.

He claims that at least one of his supervisors, Lt. Morris, went so far as to lie on record about his association with the corporal.

The corporal worked as a field training officer, a role which entailed explaining the sheriff's office policies and procedures. He is no longer serving in that role.

Bailum said he is hoping that the lawsuit will finally show that he was in the right for reporting the events to his supervisors and maintaining that he should never have been transferred from the Glades area.

"Bailum is seeking to be made whole again for all wrongdoing and retaliation that he has suffered," the summary of his lawsuit reads.

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
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
