## GDS Football Field Has New Name: Schlechter Stadium

During the first Glades Day School play-off football game last Friday night, Nov. 18, a very special dedication was made. The football field was dedicated to J.O. and Eleanor Schlechter for

their limitless support of the school over the past 40 years. The field was given a new name, "Schlechter Stadium" and a rock with a plaque was placed at the entrance of the field signifying the dedication. Many past and present board members were present as current Chairman of the Board, Brian Lohmann, made the following presentation.

"In the early 70's the Board of Trustees of Glades Day School decided to build campus in Belle Glade, adding to the already existing Pahokee

campus. The late Mr. Fritz Stein approached Mr. Johnny Schlechter about working on the committee formed for this purpose. ## Glades Day Wins Regional Championship

Glades Central shuts out Merritt Island in regional semifinal

Full throttle in 48 minutes.

In what was yet another epic battle between Class 2A powerhouses Glades Day and Jupiter Christian, it took a game-ending tackle close to the goal line to decide this one.

The Gators defense took a huge stand with just five seconds left in the game, as Colton McKillican's timely tackle on Jupiter Christian sophomore running back Nate Cannon – a second-and-goal from the Glades Day 3-yard line – sealed a thrilling 43-36 win for the home team.

The Nov. 28 Class 2A regional final, played at Schlechter Field, will be one that McKillican – the game's unsung hero – won't soon forget.

"I saw the quarterback (Jupiter Christian senior Kedric Bostic) roll out and I was just trying to stay with the pitch," the junior linebacker said of perhaps the Gators most clutch play of the season.

"He just pitched it to the running back (Cannon) and I was just right there to make the tackle."

With that play, Glades Day (9-3 overall) effectively ended Jupiter Christian's state title dreams for the third year in a row.

"I can't believe it," said McKillican, who also caught two interceptions in the game. "I'm just so glad we're still

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# Inland Birding Fun: Sandhill Crane (SACR)

Two of the six Sandhill Crane races are found in Florida. One is the non-migratory Florida Sandhill Crane sub-species which breeds throughout much of the peninsula and is listed as a "threatened" because of loss of habitat.

The second species is the Greater Sandhill Crane, which migrates in large flocks to Florida in the winter. The migratory species returns to

their Canadian breeding grounds in February or March (according to the Breeding Bird Atlas).

The Florida Sandhill Crane is a large heron-like gray bird with a long neck which is kept straight in flight. Its long dark legs can be seen trailing behind its body while flying.

Their long, dark pointed bills are used to dig or prod the ground while foraging for grains, seeds, insects and vertebrates. Adults have a red forehead, white cheeks and large wingspan.

These popular birds are known for jumping up and down, with wings open and their bill pointing upward during courtship dances. Their deep rolling trumpet or rattling calls can be heard from a long distance.

Sandhill Cranes have a long lifespan, living up to 20 years, and do not breed until they are two to seven years old. Florida Sandhill Cranes nest from late December to June.

Both parents help build a large nest of sticks, reeds, grasses and mosses, which is generally located near the water. Incubation duties of the two buff olive eggs are shared by the parents for 28 to 32 days.

The chicks will leave the nest a few days after hatching, but stay nearby for 10 to 14 days. The

young fledge at about 67 days; however they will stay with their parents for up to 10 months.

Juveniles are buff colored with little or no red on crown.

The Florida Sandhill Crane's habitat includes freshwater ponds, marshes, prairies, pastures, lawns and golf courses. They are currently being reported along S.R. 29 north of LaBelle, Keri Road (832) and Devils Garden Road (833).

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

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## District-Wide Conditions for Nov. 29


The 16-county region remains under a water shortage warning. The drier-than-normal forecast for the next several months of the dry season indicates there could be a return to water shortage conditions in the spring. The District continues to store as much as water as possible while providing flood control when needed. South Florida is now under the District's Year-Round Landscape Irrigation Rule that limits residential and business landscape irrigation to two or three days per week based on location. Some city and county governments have adopted local ordinances that differ from the District rule and may further limit landscape irrigation. To determine watering days and times in your area, contact your local government or visit [www.sfwmd.gov/2days](http://www.sfwmd.gov/2days).

Customers of the West Palm Beach and Lake Worth utilities remain under local orders that limit landscape irrigation to one day per week.

After months of cutbacks as directed by the District's water shortage orders, permitted water users such as nurseries, agriculture, golf courses and utilities are required to continue following the water use conditions in their permits.

## Advent: Getting Ready But With Hope

As I reflected on everyone waiting to see what will happen, I thought about another time of waiting; also something people are waiting for these days. As Christmas approaches, we get ready and wait for the "big day." This season in Church calendars is called "Advent" – or more literally "what is before the coming."

It is a time of preparation for Christmas; the stores are telling us, decorations are appearing around the community, people are shopping and soon it will be Christmas. The difference between waiting to see what will happen in the world's economies and the waiting for the coming of Christmas is quite different. One is about not knowing what will come, the other is knowing what will happen and what it will bring.

The world waited for the coming of the Messiah long before Jesus was born and then He came. Waiting was not hopeless. People knew that the Lord would come and with Him the gifts of salvation and eternal life.

Our waiting today for what will come in the future as a result of our economic situation does not offer that same hope. With this wait comes uncertainty and fear; that's something else. As I thought about this contrast, I had to ask "Which 'waiting' will finally give the hope that is to be fulfilled?"

Have we had other difficult times and God has provided for His people? Have we also been on the brink of disasters in the past, and overcame the difficulties to go on and have a newer and better life? Is the story of Thanksgiving, just passed, about people who left comfort and security of home, took a dangerous ocean voyage, set up home in a yet-untamed land, and then gave thanks because they had come to the end of a wait and were now ready to build?

This season of getting ready for Christmas is about an Advent – preparing for the coming of the Lord, knowing that He has come and will come again. On that certainty rests the hope of all who wait. Those who wait with faith do not hope in vain (cf. Romans 8:18ff). This time of waiting where our Church calendars coincide with waiting by the worldly calendars give us a choice: do we wait in hope or with apprehension.

The Lord's coming is a certainty; that's where I will wait – in hope.

in the playoffs and have a chance to win the state title again."

It almost didn't happen.

Jupiter Christian (9-3 overall final record) stormed its way back from a 36-14 halftime deficit in stunning fashion, as the Eagles scored 22 unanswered points in the second half to tie the game up at 36-36.

Then, Glades Day legend-to-be/junior running back Kelvin Taylor (34 carries, 345 yards, 4 TD) powered his way to the end zone on a fourth-and-goal play at the Jupiter Christian 2-yard line with just 1:17 left.

Taylor, who scored three of his four touchdowns in the first half, had runs of 19, 3, 17, 6, 8, 2, 1, 1 and 2 yards on a 9-play, 60-yard drive that began with 5:01 left in the game.

The game-winning drive, combined with Blake Brady's extra point, proved to be the difference in the regional final.

"All the credit goes to my teammates," Taylor said. "My offensive line did a great job blocking for me. Our team played very hard to the last minute. We pulled together as a team; that's how we came out with the victory."

Taylor said he was amazed at how Jupiter Christian came back in the second half.

"You just got to give them (Jupiter Christian) a lot of respect because they always fight to the last minute," Taylor said. "They (the Eagles) have a great coaching staff, great players, and a lot of heart. We knew we had to bring our 'A' game to come out on top."

Glades Day's defense had its hands full with Bostic (17 carries, 124 yards, 1 TD; 14-for-26 passing, 183 yards, 2 INT, 1 lost fumble), as the UCF-bound playmaker engineered the comeback, thanks to a combination of nifty runs and passes to multiple receivers for most of the second half.

Second-half scores came from junior running back Jesse Stephanos (6-yard TD run with 9:20 left in the third; Glades Day up 36-20), Cannon (8-yard TD run with 2:31 left in the third; Glades Day up 36-28 after a successful two-point conversion run) and Bostic (8-yard touchdown run with 5:23 left in the fourth; Glades Day up 36-34).

Bostic followed that with a two-point conversion pass to Cannon (nine catches, 123 yards; 16 carries, 68 yards, 3 TD) to tie the game up.

After Taylor's go-ahead score, Bostic nearly led the Eagles to another potential tie, thanks mainly to a hook-and-ladder play that resulted into a 26-yard catch by Eagles senior Isaiah Nelson with 52 seconds left.

The trick play, which took the Eagles from their own 35-yard line to the Gators 39-yard line, set the stage for what happened next.

Two clutch runs of 4 and 7 yard by Bostic, followed by a 12-yard pass to Cannon, took Jupiter Christian to the Glades Day 15-yard line with just 16 seconds left.

On the very next play, Bostic sliced the Gators defense on a 12-yard run that took his team to Glades Day's 3-yard line with eight seconds left.

A downed play on first-and-goal – which made it just five seconds left – was followed by Bostic's final called play of his high school football career.

"We ran the option weak," Bostic said. "I ran it and if somebody converges on me, I was going to pitch it to my tailback. We just weren't able to get the block we needed for Nate and their guy just came in for the tackle."

And with that, Glades Day has earned the right to play on the road against Admiral Farragut (St.

Petersburg) in tomorrow night's Class 2A state semifinal game – set for a 7:30 kickoff time.

"It was a tough one," Glades Day head coach Pete Walker said. "It was really hard to take. We didn't come out with the same intensity in the second half like we did in the first. But when we had to have it, we were able to come through in the end."

In celebratory mode after a hard-fought win, Walker offered little else in his analysis other than this:

"It's over and we're moving on to Round 3," Walker said.

Notes: Glades Day senior quarterback opened the game's scoring off a wide-open Jose Penton for 44-yards to make it 6-0 with 8:23 left in the first quarter.

Gators junior backup running back Nigel Allen also scored in the game, as he scampered his way into the end zone for an 8-yard touchdown run with 5:33 left in the first half – a 28-8 lead for Glades Day.

Glades Central 35, Merritt Island 0: Raiders senior quarterback Tanner Redish (15-for-23 passing, 278 yards, 3 TD) connected with fellow senior Jaime Wilson (seven catches, 114 yards) for all of his touchdown passes to lead Palm Beach County's top team in a rout of the Mustangs.

Glades Central (No. 24 in the latest RivalsHigh100 national high school rankings; No. 33 in the latest ESPN/Powerade FAB50 national high school rankings) also got its scores from junior running back Arron Baker (nine carries, 133 yards, 1 TD) and junior triple-threat playmaker Will Likely (6-yard touchdown run in the second quarter for a Raiders 21-0 lead).

The Raiders, who moved on to the Class 5A-4 regional finals, will play in front of its home crowd tomorrow night against Norland (Miami) in what's widely expected to be the state's game of the year.

Both teams are nationally ranked in multiple polls and both teams are currently ranked in the

top five of this week's Flavarsity.com statewide all-classification poll.

Norland (Flavarsity.com's No. 4 team) and Glades Central (Flavarsity.com's No. 5 team) will be playing for the right to move on to next week's Class 5A state semifinals.

Norland (No. 56 in the latest RivalsHigh100 national rankings; No. 12 in the ESPN/Powerade FAB50 poll) is slightly favored to eke out a road win over Glades Central. However, the Raiders

(12-0 overall) have not lost a home game since the 2007 Muck Bowl – a 34-24 loss to Pahokee.

To stun Glades Central's home base on tomorrow night, the Vikings (12-0 overall) will have to be at its absolute best on offense, defense and special teams for all 48 minutes of play.

Anything short of that will very likely result in another win for the Raiders, who are seeking its first state championship since 2006 and seventh overall.

"Glades Day School, and the entire Glades community, will be forever indebted to J.O. and Eleanor Schlechter.







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# Statistical Models Inspired from Facebook Could Help Endangered Animals

Some endangered animals may live in smaller habitats than scientists realize, leading to inflated estimates of their ability to survive, according to a new University of Florida study.

However, by predicting the animals' habitat movement using models employed to analyze human interactions on social networks such as Facebook, scientists with UF's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences find the animals' predicament could be better understood.

Conservationists can use this improved approach to better prioritize habitat restoration efforts for endangered species, said author Robert Fletcher, a UF wildlife ecology and conservation assistant professor.

The study appeared Monday in the journal *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences*.

Models are often used to predict the movements of animals when data are difficult to collect due to resource and time constraints faced by researchers. The ability to move to different habitat locations, known as connectivity, is important to the long-term survival of a species, because different locations provide additional resources, shelter and mating opportunities.

The study showed that social network models can predict connectivity better than currently

used models, which overestimated animal movement.

"These over predictions are problematic because we might falsely think that populations are viable when they may not be," Fletcher said.

In the study, researchers compared records of actual movements by the cactus bug and the Everglades snail kite to movement predicted by models.

One social network model in particular, known as sender-receiver, was remarkably accurate in predicting both animals' movements, despite that one animal was a bird that could potentially travel more than 100 miles and the other was an insect that only moves in a range of several feet.

Social network models have been used to try to predict relationships among people in social media as well as in disciplines, such as ecology, where they can help researchers understand which species may interact with each other.

This was the first time social network models have been applied to understand connectivity in conservation biology, Fletcher said.

Social network models can also be used to help manage pests, he said. One example is predicting where invasive species will move.

Study authors included doctoral students Miguel Acevedo and Brian Reichert, master's student Kyle Pias and wildlife ecology and conservation courtesy professor Wiley Kitchens.

## Gas Price Update

Average retail gasoline prices in Florida have fallen 3.8 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.30/g on Sunday.

This compares with the national average that has fallen 4.1 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.32/g, according to gasoline price website [www.FloridaStateGasPrices.com](http://www.FloridaStateGasPrices.com).

Including the change in gas prices in Florida during the past week, prices yesterday were 47.6 cents per gallon higher than the same day one year ago and are 10.9 cents per gallon lower than a month ago.

The national average has decreased 14.4 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 46.3 cents per gallon higher than this day one year ago.

"The national average in the U.S. is at its lowest since February 25, but remains at record highs for this time of year," according to GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan.

"While the downtrend in gasoline prices has certainly been welcome news for motorists, I see the trend short lived, and believe we may see continued volatility in the days ahead, but even with said volatility I do expect many Americans will see average prices between \$3.25-\$3.50 for the rest of 2011," he added.

# 'Tis the Season for a Flu Shot

Flu Season is here! Are you ready? Traditionally, Palm Beach County sees a rise in the number of flu cases beginning in late December and continues to rise until late February each year. The county has now begun to move from very low sporadic activity to a moderate level. At the peak, flu cases are classified as widespread.

There are a number of ways to prevent catching the flu. "Everyone should begin by getting a seasonal flu shot," said Palm Beach County Health Department Director Dr. Alina Alonso, "The seasonal flu vaccine is recommended for everyone over six months of age and especially persons over age 65, persons with chronic health conditions, such as asthma and COPD, diabetes, heart disease, some neurological conditions, and pregnant women."

Dr. Alonso also recommends the following as ways to prevent the spread of flu:

- Avoid close contact with people who are coughing or appear ill (remember people can be contagious one day prior to showing symptoms and for five days after)
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth
- Wash hands frequently with soap and water to lessen the spread of respiratory illness. If soap and water is unavailable, use alcohol based hand sanitizers
- Stay home if you are sick to avoid spreading illness to others
- If you have to cough or sneeze, cover your nose and mouth with the bend of your arm instead of hands and dispose of any used tissues.
