## Glades Students Struggle with Reading FCAT 2.0

At four local schools, half of third grade students at risk for retention

With the implementation of FCAT 2.0 and the more stringent guidelines it relies on, all eyes were on Palm Beach County schools last week as results were released highlighting how third graders fared this year.

The new evaluation methodology, aimed at gauging the effectiveness of learning in the state, had many educators and parents wondering how their schools might perform under the new system. One of the underpinnings of FCAT 2.0 seemed to focus on early learning, and determining and addressing weaknesses at the elementary

## Glades Central Drops Spring Game in Loss to Atlantic

*Pahokee squeaks by Port St. Lucie to win its spring football game*

In Glades Central's May 25 spring football game against Atlantic (Delray Beach), all of the scoring came during the first half of play.

None of it was done by the Raiders, however.

The Eagles scored a 14-0 road vic-

tory by a combination of three things: a respectable ground game, a dominating defense from start to finish and a game-changing special teams play on the opening drive.

Atlantic scored its first touchdown on the game's very first play, thanks to a 95-yard kickoff return by Brisly Estime that helped give his team a 7-0 lead with 11:44 in the first frame.

Glades Central's David Bailey had seemingly put his team in position to tie the game up on his own kickoff return - a 98-yarder for a touchdown with 11:27 left in the first.

However, a blocking penalty call on Glades Central's special teams nul-

lified the score and killed the Raiders best chance to reach the end zone the entire game.

Other than an 11-yard run by Glades Central's Arron Baker (three carries, 20 yards) early in the first quarter, there wasn't much offense going on for the Raiders.

It was a tepid offensive performance for Glades Central, as the Raiders were limited to just 83 total yards for the entire game.

And Glades Central, who used Giovanni Lugo and Andre Tom-

### STEAM Team Visits

The Palm Beach Cultural Council's STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math) team visited Pioneer Park Friday, May 25 to ignite student discovery of the Everglades. Ms. Hillary Allgood from the Palm Beach Zoo helped Ms. Mattie Walker's fourth grade class research alligators and write an alligator awareness newsletter.

The four-page, glossy, magazine style newsletter was illustrated with detailed photographs and typed by students. Articles included the fol-

lowing: Alligators Are Important! Where Do Alligators Live? What do Alligators Look Like? Alligators Help Raise Their Young. What Do Alligators Eat? How Do Alligators Have Babies? What Animals Benefit From Alligators? Feeding Alligators?

The last article ended with: "Once an alligator has been fed they will always come back. This leads to nuisance alligators who are then removed. Pioneer Park students would like to remind you to not feed alligators."

The students designed a ferocious gator mascot logo for their Alligator Awareness newsletter. Ms. Allgood writes, "Mrs. M. Walker's fourth grade class participated in an eco-stewardship project with the Palm Beach Zoo hoping to spread the word about alligators!"

They worked diligently to learn everything they could on the topic of alligators, and then wrote about it! The class hopes that you will see why the alligator is so dear to their hearts and hope you will use the information they have offered to help protect them too!" Mrs. M. Walker's students would like to thank the Cultural Council of Palm Beach County for their support and funding for this project. They would also like to thank the Palm Beach Zoo for providing the guidance they needed to complete their project. Another Everglades educator with the STEAM team visited Ms. Fletcher's third grade class.

Ms. Josette Kaufman, Executive Director of the Arthur R. Marshall Foundation taught students about the amazing Everglades inhabitants. Ms. Kaufman detailed the diverse animals sharing in the food chain, circle of life and native habitat of this wondrously wild landscape in our own Florida backyard. Students enjoyed Ms. Kaufman's visual presentation on native animals and their adaptations while examining and handling pond apples, gator heads and other objects from the Everglades. Ms. Kaufman is fulfilling the Arthur R. Marshall Foundation's focus on Everglades education, restoration, and outreach.

### Young Authors' Conference

Kindergarten through fifth grade students are gearing up for the Young Authors' Conference on June 5th, 2012. Students write books based on their personal stories or topics of interest ranging from fiction to nonfiction, poetry and plays. The fourth graders, who have been researching Florida in Ms. Jeannie Brown's reading class, chose to plan their books around their research topics. Students chose between printing or handwriting, personal illustrations, home photographs or public domain professional photos for their books.

Ms. Chris Boldin and the Young Authors' committee are busy preparing writers' packets for all participants. This is an annual event in which the community turns out to hear our young authors

reading their stories and cheering their published books. All of the books are gathered during the final week to be read by the judging panel and are rated on a points scale.

The winning entries from each grade enjoy a special dinner in their honor in which a professional published author gives a brief reading and writing tips.

The students' families enjoy the dinner with their honoree and watch as their child receives their trophy. We would like to thank those members of the community who visit each year to support our young authors and hear them read the stories and books which will become treasured keepsakes.

### Children's Author Visit

Author Michael Sterns shared his beautifully illustrated Kokopelli books with the students of Pioneer Park on Monday, May 21. Mr. Sterns shared his second volume: Kokopelli and the Islands of Change during his second visit with Sugar Bears. 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# Wet Season Start: It's Time to Reset Irrigation Timers


With the start of South Florida's wet season, rainfall alone is beginning to quench the needs of most lawns and landscapes.

This means irrigation system timers at homes and businesses in the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) can be dialed back to fewer days, shorter watering times or shut off altogether to conserve water for the future.

Irrigation system timers are often set for the dry winter months and forgotten, leading to sprinkling even during typical wet-season downpours. During an average wet season, from June through October, many lawns receive what they require and don't need supplemental irrigation at all, according to the University of Florida's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (IFAS).

Adjusting timers can make a difference because outdoor irrigation accounts for up to 50 percent of water use in South Florida, and up to 50 percent of the water applied to lawns is lost to evapotranspiration.

Installing rain sensors or soil moisture sensors to automatically shut off an irrigation system when enough rain has fallen and checking the

pipes and sprinkler heads for leaks are also key conservation tools.

In addition, residents can conserve water and still enjoy a tropical landscape by following Florida-Friendly Landscaping principles.

These include planting the right plant in the right place, utilizing mulch, and reducing storm water runoff. More information is available at

Because water conservation offers significant benefits, the SFWMD Governing Board in September 2008 approved a Comprehensive Water Conservation Program to encourage more responsible use of water resources throughout South Florida.

Numerous stakeholders worked with the Dis-

trict to define specific regulatory, voluntary, and incentive-based programs and in-depth education and marketing efforts that help to foster a year-round conservation ethic.

## Simple water conservation practices include:

- Washing only full loads of clothes and dishes;
- Replacing aerators in kitchen and bathroom sinks with models rated for 1.5 gallons per minute or less;
- Installing low-flow appliances, such as a dishwasher or energy-efficient washing machine;
- Installing low-flow water fixtures, such as shower heads with the WaterSense logo.

While reducing irrigation time during the wet season is encouraged, residents and businesses remain under the District's Year-Round Landscape Irrigation Rule that limits residential and business landscape irrigation to two or three days per week based on location.

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# Florida Celebrates Water Reuse Week

Florida Governor Rick Scott proclaimed May 20-26, as Florida Water Reuse Week to bring awareness of the importance of water reuse to meeting Florida's future water supply needs.

The Florida Department of Environmental Protection urges Florida's residents and businesses to celebrate Water Reuse Week to learn more about how easy it is to reuse water on a daily basis.

"DEP is committed to working with the Florida's water management districts, communities and businesses to ensure the environment is protected and future water supply needs are met," said Greg Munson, DEP Deputy Secretary for Water Policy and Ecosystem Restoration. "DEP strives to get the water right and reuse efforts can make a positive impact to both water supply and protecting our natural resources."

Leading the nation in water reuse, the state of Florida reuses more than 660 million gallons of reclaimed water each day to conserve freshwater supplies and replenish rivers, streams, lakes and the aquifers. Reclaimed water is often seen in landscaping, agriculture and golf courses, the use of which drastically cuts down on fresh water use. Florida uses reclaimed water to irrigate more than 280,000 residences, 500 golf courses

and hundreds more parks and schools.

Florida residents use more than 6 billion gallons of fresh water daily, while producing billions

of gallons of wastewater through daily activities such as showers, laundry and dishwashing. With simple actions to reuse water, Floridians can aug-

ment Florida's water resources and allow traditional sources of fresh water to be conserved. Saving water also translates to saving money on lower utility bills.

During Water Reuse Week and throughout the year, DEP also encourages residents to undertake water reuse and conservation practices to help to ensure safe, clean, and sustainable water resources:

- Collect rain water in buckets during storms which can be reused for irrigating yards, cleaning driveways and toilet flushing.
- Before emptying a pet's drinking bowl, use the unfinished or old water to water plants.
- Plant a rain garden that will capture excess stormwater runoff, limit topsoil erosion, reduce flooding, and enhance yard beauty.
- Take excess water from a bath or from washing dishes and put into the toilet for flushing.
- Wash fruits and vegetables in a pan, not under a running faucet, and reuse that water for gardening.

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

and deacons within the community, participation has been low. As a result, Bridges is placing the program on hold for the summer; the program will resume in September with many new ideas aimed at increasing participation.

The breakfast for May was held at Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church in Pahokee on Saturday, the 26th. Commissioner Diane Walker was among the community leaders to offer her gratitude to Bridges and the men in Pahokee who attend the breakfast in an effort to make a difference in the life of Pahokee's children. She also thanked Bridges for introducing the program to the community.

Bridges director, Cornesha Dukes-Chisholm, is

thankful for the men who have participated in the program. She states that they have shown great commitment for the cause and have encouraged many of their friends and family to become a part of the event. She also thanked her staff for their hard work in organizing the events and the volunteers who have helped with working at the events.

Rev. Willie Lawrence, associate pastor of Shiloh Missionary Baptist, spoke of his greatest pet peeve—adults complaining about children and teens but not taking the time to invest in their lives to make them better people. "Spending an hour a day is a rich investment in molding the future," he said.

Questions are asked each session in efforts to begin conversations between the children and their fathers or mentors. Questions range from "What's your child's favorite color?" to "What's your child's biggest fear?" One question proposed Saturday was, "What are you proud of your child for?" Even if participants were too shy to speak in the group, they were informed of the importance

of telling children what makes them proud.

The question that raised much conversation with the group was, "What does it mean to love your child?" or "How do you express your love to your child?" One father stated that many men feel providing financially for their children is considered evidence of love. Other men spoke of having schedules so busy that the eventual effect is that both father and child are complete strangers. One child spoke of the thing he missed most—having his father around to spend time with him and teach him things.

The event concluded with a challenge for the men: "Take your children to the park and play with them."

# Inland Birding Fun: Pileated Woodpecker (PIWO)

What large black woodpecker the size of a crow has bold white stripes down the neck and a flaming-red triangular crest? The correct answer is Pileated Woodpecker. This bird species lives and breeds in most of Florida. They are often heard whacking at dead trees or fallen logs in search of food. Pileated Woodpeckers have long barbed tongues that can be more than an inch long which they use to extract wood-boring beetle larvae, ants, termites, or other insects that are deep in wood. Nuts and fruit as well as bird seed or suet found in backyard feeders are often part of their diet.

These birds have a large body, skinny tail, and

long neck. Adult males have a red stripe on their cheek. Their white underwings and white crescents on the wings can be seen when they are in flight. Their call is a short loud clear "wuk wuk" or "cuk cuk" sound. The oldest known Pileated Woodpecker was 12 years and 11 months old.

Pileated Woodpeckers have long chisel-like bills about the length of their heads. When hammering in soft wood with their beaks, they will pull their neck back while using their feet to increase the strength of powerful blows they make in the soft wood. Both sexes drum on trees. Males will drum in late winter to establish or defend their territory. Both sexes drum during courtship, to summon a mate from a distance, or when an intruder is near the nest.

Pairs stay in the same territory year-round and form permanent bonds. When one dies the survivor might find a new mate. The pair will make the nest cavity. The male does most of the work excavating the cavity up high in a dead tree or utility pole, but the female will help. The entrance is oblong instead of round like most woodpecker holes. They will line the nest with leftover wood chips. Females will lay three to five white eggs between mid-March and mid-May which are incubated for 14 to 18 days. The young leave the nest cavity when they are 24 to 28 days old.

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# Free Fishing Fun Coming Next Week

The first week of June is National Fishing and Boating Week. This year, start and end the week's festivities by taking advantage of one of Florida's license-free fishing days. Saltwater recreational anglers can fish without a license on June 2 and freshwater recreational fishers on June 9. There couldn't be a better time to get out on the water and try your hand at some of Florida's fine fishing on these two Saturdays.

Thirty-four states, including Florida and Georgia, will have license-free fishing days during the June 2 through June 10 National Fishing and Boating Week, a celebration of fishing and boating.

"Florida's license-free fishing days are an excellent opportunity to share the fun, excitement and togetherness of a fishing trip with the entire family. This also is a great time for experienced

anglers to introduce friends to the sport, even if they don't have a fishing license," said Nick Wiley, FWC executive director. "By having these events on weekends, we hope Florida residents and visitors will experience the joy of saltwater and freshwater fishing. We expect many will discover a healthy sport they can enjoy for a lifetime."

Saltwater anglers can try their hand at catching a red snapper, which will be open for harvest in Gulf and Atlantic state waters and Gulf federal waters on the June 2, saltwater license-free fishing day. Want to stick a little closer to shore? Try your hand at near-shore species such as spotted seatrout or red drum.

Now that school is out or almost out and people are in vacation mode, anglers will find June a great time to introduce a child to fishing or

encourage a friend who hasn't been fishing for a while to get on the water.

Almost everyone in Florida is within 45 minutes of a freshwater fishing hole. Dawn or dusk may be your best fishing times, but if you go mid-day, seek out the shadows around piers or fallen trees, or look for bass and bream under floating vegetation mats and in other shaded areas to enhance your success.

Fishing is a low-cost, wholesome form of entertainment, which is why the FWC offers four days when a recreational fishing license is not needed. Can't make the June 2 or June 9 license-free fishing days? The FWC also made Sept. 1 a license-free saltwater fishing day, which not only falls on a holiday weekend, but is during the popular bay scallop and spiny lobster seasons.

Each year, the first Saturday in April and second Saturday in June will be license-free freshwater fishing days.

The state's abundant resources, coupled with responsible freshwater and saltwater fish management, are why Florida is known as the "Fishing Capital of the World."

All other bag limit, season and size restrictions apply on these dates.

Readers need lots of practice and research indicates that students who do not read over the summer lose reading skills that have to be made up in the fall. Each student will be receiving a Summer Reading Folder which will include a reading log, books, times of the book exchanges and the Loula V. York public library summer schedule.

With this in mind, FCAT 2.0 established a simple premise: that third grade students scoring a Level 1 on the reading portion of the assessment test should be retained for another year to have a better chance of catching up.

While the recommendation remains simple, its execution may not be.

According to the scope of the FCAT, schools may also use previous educational indices to determine on an individual level whether a student should be held back or not.

It may be that fewer students than the percentage of those who scored a Level 1 on their FCAT will be held back, but that remains to be seen.

As it stands now, Glades schools fared poorly when compared to other schools in the district. Indeed, among all of the elementary schools in Palm Beach County, two Glades schools posted the worst numbers when it came to highest percentage of students scoring a Level 1 on reading, and lowest percentage of students scoring a Level 3 or higher, respectively.

A quick breakdown of the performance of local third grade students in the FCAT reveals very similar trends across schools in Belle Glade, Pahokee and South Bay, without a standout in exception.

At Gove Elementary -- the highest scoring school in the Glades -- slightly more than a quarter of its students scored a Level 3 or higher on the reading portion of the FCAT.

This is far less than the state average of 56 percent. One school, Pioneer Park Elementary, just narrowly missed single-digit percentage results in students scoring a Level 3 or higher on reading this year.


60 percent scored a Level 1, 12 percent scored a Level 3 or higher (lowest percentage in the county)

These numbers were in stark comparison to the overall statewide averages. Statewide, only 18 percent of students scored a Level 1, while most students, at 56 percent, scored a Level 3 or higher.

State officials certainly did note the struggle that schools with a sizeable population of minorities and English-language learners saw in their FCAT results -- a statement that holds true for many local schools in the Glades.
