Program Prepares Low- Income Children for School

Students to receive
much needed school
supplies

Gas prices are going up, food is getting expensive, the light bill gets higher with each passing month, these are just a few examples of the financial burdens families face.

This time of year adds another burden to families of school-aged children—school supplies. Most of the items needed for school like crayons, pencils, and glue are small enough to fit in the palm of your hand but their prices add up rather quickly sometimes, sucking up a family's entire weekly earnings.

The Community Back to School Bash (BASH) is a non-profit organization that coordinates with other local non-profits throughout Palm Beach County to help disadvantaged students from pre-K through 12th grade get the supplies they need to start their school year off on the

Immunizations Are Not Just For Children

Adult immunizations are one of the most effective ways to stay healthy.

August is recognized as National Immunization Awareness Month to increase awareness about immunizations across the lifespan.

Many adults don't realize that immunizations are not just for children, adults also need immunizations to keep them healthy and protected from disease.

Over time, immunity from childhood vaccines can fade and allow renewed risk for new and different diseases.

According to the American Lung Association, influenza, or flu, is a serious respiratory illness that is easily spread from person to person and can lead to severe complications, even death. Each year in the U.S., influenza and its related complications result in an estimated 226,000 hospitalizations and anywhere from 3,000 to 49,000 deaths.

The American Lung Association's "Missed Opportunities: Influenza & Pneumonia Vaccination in Older Americans" report shows that the flu shot can be up to 70 percent effective in preventing hospitalizations for both influenza and pneumonia in those over 65.

Fortunately, all Medicare consumers are eligible for flu vaccines once a flu season in the fall or winter. A flu vaccine is necessary every year because flu viruses are always changing. It is recommended for adults over age 50, residents of long term care facilities, health care workers, those with chronic medical conditions, as well as certain others.

In 2009, 1.1 million people in the U.S. were hospitalized with pneumonia and, according to the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention

(CDC), more than 50,000 people died from the disease.

These numbers could be dramatically reduced by vaccinations. The pneumococcal vaccine is covered for all Medicare consumers, and can be administered at any time of the year. The vaccine is recommended for all those age 65 or older as well as those with chronic heart, lung, liver or kidney diseases, residents of long term care facilities and certain ethnic populations.

"People need to stay current on their immunizations as an adult, just as they did when they were young," says Dr. Ed Sobel, Medical Director for Quality Insights of Delaware, the Medicare Quality Improvement Organization for Delaware. "A flu and pneumonia vaccine in the fall could potentially save your life, so call your doctor today and ask about them."

Vaccine recommendations for adults are based on a variety of factors including age, lifestyle, high-risk conditions, type and location of travel, overall health status, medical history and previous immunizations.

To help individuals understand what vaccines they might need, the CDC encourages adults to review the Adult Immunization Schedule [PDF - 264 KB] or take a simple quiz to determine which vaccines are needed. The results of this quiz can then be printed out and shared with your health care provider(s).



Can You Recognize A Staged Crash?

Florida Highway Patrol cautions motorists

By knowing more about staged crash fraud schemes, Florida's motoring public can avoid such schemes by criminals who prey on innocent motorists. The Department of Financial Services' Division of Insurance Fraud, the National Insurance Crime Bureau and the Florida Highway Patrol have collaborated to help stop staged crashes in Florida.

The great majority of crashes are unintentional, but there are some committed purposely. Criminals see staged crashes as an easy way to obtain money from insurance companies. They use paid witnesses, unethical attorneys and corrupt medical providers to promote and gain from the fraud.

Basic schemes are (click the hyperlinks below to view visual demonstrations):

Swoop and Squat: The driver of Vehicle 1, who is in on the scheme, purposely drives a short distance in front of an innocent driver, when the driver of Vehicle 2, also in on the scheme, suddenly swoops in front of Vehicle 1.

The driver of Vehicle 1 hits his brakes and causes a rear-end collision with the victim behind him.

Drive Down: When a driver is trying to merge into traffic, a scheming driver slows down and waves the victim forward. Once the victim proceeds, the schemer crashes into the victim's vehicle and denies to law enforcement that he waved the other driver through and blames the crash on the other driver.

Panic Stop: The scheming driver of a vehicle drives in front of a victim. An observer in the schemer's vehicle waits for the victim to take his eyes off the road, for example to text or talk to a passenger, then signals the driver to slam the brakes to create a rear-end collision.

"I am excited that the Florida Highway Patrol is partnering with my office to take on staged auto accidents," said Jeff Atwater, chief financial officer of Florida.

"I know we could have no better ally in the fight against PIP fraud in Florida. With additional boots on the ground and a more proactive training approach, we can continue to bring these fraudsters to justice and save Florida families from outrageously high insurance premiums."

Tips to help drivers avoid a staged crash:

- Never tailgate.
 - Call law enforcement to a crash scene.
 - Use a camera to document any crash damage and the number of passengers in other vehicles.
 - Avoid people who suddenly appear at a crash scene and try to direct you to doctors and attorneys.
 - Be wary of physicians who insist you file a personal injury claim after a crash, especially if you are not hurt.
 - Avoid tow trucks that arrive on the scene without anyone having called for service.
 - If you are a witness of a crash, provide details to law enforcement officers.
- "We have to remember that staged auto crashes cost a billion-plus a year in fraud dollars,

and getting that money back into the hands of the residents of Florida is a must," said Governor Rick Scott. "By fixing the PIP laws and providing public awareness to Floridians, we are confident that our efforts will stop the fraud. In addition, fostering collaborations with the Florida Highway Patrol, NICB and CFO Atwater's office is just the beginning in this fight against fraud."


Gas Prices Update

Average retail gasoline prices in Florida have risen 0.8 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.41/g on Sunday. This compares with the national average that has increased 0.4 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.50/g, according to gasoline price website.

Including the change in gas prices in Florida during the past week, prices yesterday were 29.1 cents per gallon lower than the same day one year ago and are 23.9 cents per gallon higher than a month ago. The national average has increased 12.1 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 20.2 cents per gallon lower than this day one year ago.

"While motorists in many regions saw gasoline prices stabilize over the last week, it's only a matter of time before last week's rise in wholesale prices translates to a continued march higher on the retail level," said Gas-Buddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan.

"The late week rally in stocks seemed to also fuel commodities higher, leading me to believe that pump prices will again pick up over the next week," DeHaan said.

Inland Birding Fun: Pied-billed Grebe (PBGR)

The Pied-billed Grebe is a small waterbird with a short thick chicken-like bill that prefers to escape from predators by diving under water.

They swim like a duck, but they have lobes on each toe to provide extra surface area for paddling instead of duck like webbed feet. Wintering and resident Pied-billed Grebe are found in most types of wetlands in inland and coastal Florida.

This small stocky grebe is about nine inches tall. Adults have a small brown head and body and a whitish rump. In the summer they have a black ring on their bill and black throat. Their feet, which are set far back on their body, trail behind them when they are in flight.

The male makes a loud, throaty barking "kuk-kuk-kuk, kaow, kaow, kaow, kaow, kaow, kaow, kaw" sound while females make low grunting noises. They also make nasal chattering sounds.

Pied-billed Grebe's diet consists mainly of aquatic insects, crustaceans (especially crayfish), and fish. Like other grebes, they swallow hun-

dreds of their own feathers -- which is believed to help cushion their intestines against sharp fish bones.

They choose ponds, lakes, marshes, canals, and slow moving streams or river freshwater with emergent vegetation for nesting sites.

They frequently raise two broods during the spring and summer breeding season, but can nest throughout the year. Both adults build a nest that looks like an open bowl in a floating platform of decaying vegetation. The female lays five to seven bluish white eggs that are incubated for 23 days.

The active downy young can leave the nest within one day but don't swim well at first. They don't spend much time in the water the first week and sleep on the back of a parent.

For their first ten days, they will also climb on their parent's back in response to danger. At four weeks of age, the young spend day and night on the water and dive under water when danger threatens.

During the Breeding Bird Atlas I Survey Pied-billed Grebe were reported breeding in inland Florida west of Lake Okeechobee. The Breeding Bird Atlas Survey (2012-2016) is underway with 90 percent of survey conducted May through July.



Household size and income criteria will be used to determine eligibility. An application can not be approved unless it contains complete eligibility information. Once approved, meal benefits are good for an entire year. You need not notify the organization of changes in income and household size.

Application forms are being sent to all homes with a letter to parents or guardians. To apply for Free or Reduced-Price Meals, households must complete the application and return it to the school. Additional copies are available at the principal's office in each school. The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

Households that receive SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) or TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) are required to list on the application only the child's name, SNAP/TANF case number, and signature of adult household member.

Foster children will receive free benefits regardless of the child's personal income or the income of the household.

Households with children who are considered migrants, homeless, or runaway should contact the district liaison **Jodi Bell at (863) 674-4108.**

For the purpose of determining household size, deployed service members are considered a part of the household. Families should include the names of the deployed service members on their application. Report only that portion of the deployed service member's income made available to them or on their behalf to the family. Additionally, a housing allowance that is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative is not to be included as income.

All other households must provide the following information listed on the application:

- Total household income listed by gross amount received, type of income (e.g., wages, child support, etc.) and how often the income is received by each household member;
- Names of all household members – check the "no income" box if applicable; if household member is a child, list school name for each;
- Signature of an adult household member certifying the information provided is correct; and
- Social security number of the adult signing the application or the word "NONE" for this household member if he or she does not have a social security number.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size changes, the school should be contacted. Children of parents or guardians who become unemployed should also contact the school.

Under the provisions of the Free and Reduced-Price meal policy **DARRELL HARRIS** will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent or guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he or she may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. If the parent wishes to make a formal appeal, he or she may make a request either orally or in writing to

spired me to start this little business. I was given \$90,000 after my accident and with that I bought a house for my children. My wife had four children of her own and I used the money to help raise them and bring them up.

They're strong adults now but I spent all of my money on them, who weren't mine, and now I have my youngest daughter, who is turning 19, and I need to provide for her. She wants to go to the Army, and she wants to continue going to college, because none of that mattered to all of the others. But it is hard. I went to the social security office to apply for disability, but the people I've gotten there say to me, "Sir, you are very young, you can still work." I tell them that there is a lot of pressure on me, the jobs there used to be aren't there anymore. At my stand, I sometimes invest \$200 and I have difficulty getting that little bit back.

Q: What is your pet peeve?

A: For me, it is envy and hatred. I don't like it when people think less of other people, and subjugate them because, one day maybe, that little person might become much more. I was a police officer in 1985 and 1986 in Mexico – I came to this country in 1984 but went back to leave more money with my parents.

But in the time that I was an officer, the experience taught me to become a very important member of the community, to be helpful to the town, and to look after the rights of people who

were being hurt. I do not like to see when people are battered for no better reason than they were not liked.

Sometimes that exists: people like alcoholics might become upset that a friend of theirs won't drink with them and they try to hurt and damage that person. I say if someone wants to live without drugs and without problems, let them; if someone wants to live with his drugs and his problems, it's okay, every man has a right to make his own life.

Q: What scares you?

A: I used to have a fear, a certain fear, that

on a long trip somewhere, and suddenly, armed men might attack me. That is what I feared. Because of that, I always avoided going to dances, or to parties. My grandfather taught me this. My father was not around much so my grandfather taught me that anyone who goes to bars goes looking for something.

They want to get drunk, and afterward when they end up disrespecting someone else, they will either be killed, or kill themselves. That is why it is better to avoid those situations, not to look for trouble from anyone. I went to jail for 60 days for a DUI. That doesn't really exist in Mexico, where a person could have an open container or could

drink two or three beers without any problem. But I was a prisoner for 60 days here, and I didn't like being in jail, in captivity like some animal, a cat. I was 24 or 26 years old then and now I'm an example for law enforcement because I haven't had a trouble with them since. I don't like alcohol anymore. I left it.

Q: Pretend you are on your deathbed, who would you want by your side?

A: Well, those are situations where a person might ask for his parents, but my father is dead and my mother is very ill. I think I would want a child, my daughter or son, someone who is close to me. I would like to tell them to take charge of what I have planted, and look for ways to continue harvesting our crops.

Q: Can you tell us about your paintings and drawings?

A: Yes, they are therapy for me. If I am sitting alone, and I'm very mad or very tired, my mind wanders and something comes to my mind and I draw it. I am satisfied with it when the drawing takes a long time for me to finish; when I struggle very much for that last touch to give it form and give it its name. If it makes me work, then I'll say, "Ha! I've finished you."

I think my artwork carries a lot of significance. Look at this one, "Okay mom, hungry. Like anything, o tacos, fajita, picantes, salsa, el sabor, ice cream." The little boy demands his mother make him food.

He wants something from the kitchen, anything, but his mother instead makes him tacos, and they are very spicy, so he yells and says it is too hot. Then the little cat says, "You see? You should have a little more respect for your mother, and be more obedient, you know?" They're my little depictions of the world of the poor.

Don't Get Goosed

My friend Jackson recently came to visit his grandparents armed with a new slingshot. Unlike David in the Bible, Jackson picked up one stone at a time instead of five; and then would run hunt another stone when he missed his target. After much running back and forth between stones and misses, he finally connected with his target.

It reminded me of another story I heard of another Jackson who was visiting his grandparents with a newly acquired slingshot. He practiced all around the ranch, but could never hit what he wanted. Heading back to the house for lunch, Gigi's pet goose honked at him. On impulse, Jackson took aim and let a rock fly. The rock connected and the goose dropped dead. Panicking, he hid the goose in the bushes. Jackson turned and saw his brother, realizing that Charlie had seen it all.

After lunch, Gigi asked Charlie to take out the garbage. Charlie told Jackson to do it, whispering, "Remember the goose!" Jackson took out the garbage.

Later Grandpa asked if anyone wanted to go to the store. Gigi said, "I'm sorry, but Charlie still needs to clean the stables. Charlie smiled and said, "That's already taken care of. Jackson said he'd do it." Again Charlie whispered, "Remember the goose!" Charlie went with Grandpa while Jackson stayed and mucked the stalls.

This went on for several days. Jackson was

doing both his and his brother's chores. Finally he couldn't stand it any longer and confessed to Gigi that he had killed the goose.

"Remember your failures." "Remember, what you do doesn't matter!" "Remember, you're a loser!" "Remember, you're a failure!" "Remember, they're too big, too strong." "Remember, you're not appreciated!" Also, there are people in our lives who want to cook our goose; people who like Charlie, who for one reason or another try to keep us prisoner; people who are constantly whispering in our ear: "Remember the goose!"

Don't listen!

The church uses cleansing water in the sacrament of baptism. A sacrament takes something simple, like water, and lets it remind us of something spiritual, like grace. By the waters of baptism we are reminded that by grace, God claims

us as His own, cleanses us from our sins and "goose-like mistakes", and calls us into service.

We desperately need to remember our baptism and what it means in our lives. Instead of "Remember the goose!" we need a new whispering in our ear: "Remember your baptism."

The heavens opened at the baptism of Jesus and a voice spoke from heaven: "This is my Son

in whom I am well pleased and whom I love." Somebody reading this needs to hear that same message today in the depths of their heart. Remember who you are. Hear once more the Holy Spirit say, "You are my child, whom I love, with you I am well pleased."

Don't get goosed. Remember your baptism, and be blessed!

right foot. Services offered not only include notebooks, folders, pens, and pencils but also included are school physicals, immunizations, gently used clothing, new/used uniforms, and haircuts. Families receive a free meal and are able to attend a financial seminar presented by State Farm Insurance.

The facility is set up as a store where children get to do their own shopping and pick out grade-appropriate items of their choice with the help of a personal shopper.

Margie Yansura, a coordinator for the event, says, "These children have limited experience in making the most basic choices for themselves due to their extreme financial situation, so this event is a rare treat for them."

Ms. Yansura states, "According to the National Retail Federation last year, the average family needed to spend \$549 per child to prepare them for school. In South Florida where the majority of the jobs are in the service industry, the family budget is spent on rent, utilities and food – with little left for the children."

Children eligible to receive these school supplies are underprivileged, in foster care, and are either homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

Participating families are established clients who have previously received assistance from agencies participating in the program. Ms. Yansura explains, "The location of the event is not published because it is by invitation only; qualifying families must present their formal invitation as admission for the event."

The BASH relies on tax-deductible donations of money, goods, and services from local individuals and other organization. This year they will need \$220,000 to provide backpacks and school supplies for more than 11,500 needy children in Palm Beach County.

The back to school event will be held in Belle Glade on Saturday, Aug. 18. Adult volunteers are needed on Thursday, August 16th to help sort items and also on day of the event from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Those who would like to volunteer may visit www.backtoschool-bashpbc.org to register. golf ball be tomorrow's victim?

That's where people like Deputy Stan Jackson come in. Deputy Jackson is a deputy whose full-time responsibilities are not found in apprehending and arresting the mostly young adult suspects who have been charged with shootings, but influencing kids when they are still young. Deputy Jackson knows that a young person's mind is impressionable, but he knows also that they remain impressionable to all influences, good as well as bad.

On Tuesday morning, a group of about 35 kids played "golf-baseball" on the sprawling grassy lot outside of the Okeechobee Center in Belle Glade under his supervision. The public housing project was teeming with kids huddled below a huge tree for shade, waiting their turn at bat.

Whoosh! A boy hits a ball into the field, where the other children are standing in strategic spots to catch the ball. They smiled so much that they must have forgotten just how boring golf is in the high school football epicenter that is the Glades.

Mixed into all of the athletic activities are worthwhile life lessons, said Deputy Jackson. Kids here taught many things, not the least of which is that deputies are humans too, and there is no need to fear them. The program runs all year long, but sees its biggest impact during the summer, when deputies pick up the kids at 8 a.m. each morning, and don't deliver them back

to their parents until 4 p.m. each day. During that time, kids certainly develop a new awareness of the duties of a deputy, Jackson said.

"I know that when they grow up, they won't be afraid of the sheriff's office," said the deputy.

Kids are taught crime prevention tips and are coached to turn away the temptations that drugs carry, told also not to join the infamous gangs that roam the city.

Along the way some of the kids have turned into bonafide golfing players, playing through full 9- and 18-holes of golf at the Sugarcane Golf Club in Belle Glade. The golf club has been very

helpful, said the deputy, extending its golf course to the program for use for free.

In the future, Deputy Jackson said he would like to see the program grow beyond the 50 kids it averages. He will be making a more aggressive push in the elementary schools to recruit kids. If there's one thing he can offer parents, it is that the children will be okay.

"They feel safe here because there's a deputy running the program," said Deputy Jackson. "We tell them that they got to stay away from things. 'If you know it's wrong, don't do it,' we tell them."

Model to Show How Citrus Greening Spreads within Tree

University of Florida researchers have created a mathematical model that shows how citrus greening is transmitted within an infected tree – an important step toward helping scientists understand the devastating disease.

The model, published this month by the journal Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, revealed that once a tree is infected, insecticides to control the pests that spread the disease may not be enough to halt the disease's progression in the tree, and instead may only slow its spread within the tree.

Removal of obviously diseased new growth, called flush, or shoots, is not a solution either. The model shows that even without showing symptoms, many shoots may already be infected so that infection of other parts of the tree can continue.

Citrus greening, known to scientists as huang-longbing, or HLB, was first detected in Florida in 2005. The disease was discovered in a backyard citrus tree in Los Angeles earlier this year and now threatens California's citrus industry.

Greening has cost Florida's economy an estimated \$3.63 billion in lost revenues since 2006 and poses a huge threat to the state's \$9 billion citrus industry, the nation's largest. It weakens and eventually kills infected trees. For now, there is no cure, although growers are using cultural management strategies to keep groves productive.

The disease is spread by a tiny insect called

the Asian citrus psyllid. UF Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences researchers have dedicated much time and effort to finding effective control strategies for the disease and its vector.

Ariana van Bruggen, the professor who supervised the model's creation, said having the model is "just a first step," albeit an important one.

UF Emerging Pathogens Institute Director J. Glenn Morris Jr., also an author of the paper, said the model gives scientists subtle hints about which direction to go with future research.

At the heart of the problem: The bacterium that causes the disease is nearly impossible to culture in a laboratory, meaning scientists can't isolate it and subject it to various substances to determine which, if any, might be effective against it.

Movement of the bacterium through the tree cannot be monitored, so it's difficult to determine if the tree is more resistant to the disease movement after chemical treatments. The model shows that resistance to internal movement of the bacterium is one of the most important factors affecting its spread.

"This model gives us hints about experiments we can do, where to look, where to focus our efforts to solve the problem," Morris said. "Creating a model to see if we can better understand the process of how the disease progresses in just one tree is a unique way to look at the problem."

The model confirms that the odds of killing psyllids with insecticide sprays can vary, depending on the timing of the first spraying, spraying

frequency and the effectiveness of the insecticide itself.

Expanding the model to follow the disease's progression as it moves from one tree to another is the next logical step for the research, van Bruggen said.

The other authors include Christinah Chiyaka,

a postdoctoral fellow with the Emerging Pathogens Institute who developed the model; Burton H. Singer, also of EPI and a National Academy of Sciences member, and Susan Halbert, of the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services' Division of Plant Industry.

District-Wide Conditions

The South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) is issuing the following briefing:

In the midst of the wet season, rainfall continues to boost groundwater and surface water supplies throughout the 16-county region. While some areas saw replenished water sources with an early start to the wet season in early May, others have been gradually recovering.

Lake Okeechobee levels have slowly increased over the last few weeks, although levels remain below normal for this time of year. On the west coast, rainfall and local basin runoff in the last few weeks improved water conditions and lowered salinity in the Caloosahatchee River. The District continues to recommend that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers follow established guidelines, which call for no lake releases to the Caloosahatchee at this time.

The District continues to monitor water levels and operate the system to capture as much water as possible while maintaining flood control.

Water Conservation Measures

• South Florida is under the District's Year-Round Landscape Irrigation Rule that limits residential and business landscape irrigation to two or three days per week based on location.

• Some city and county governments have adopted local ordinances that differ from the District rule and may further limit landscape irrigation. To determine watering days and times in your area, contact your local government or visit www.sfwmd.gov/2days.

• The City of West Palm Beach is no longer under an emergency order limiting landscape irrigation. Customers of the city's utility are to follow the District's Year-Round Landscape Irrigation Rule, which allows watering up to three days per week.

• Permitted water users such as nurseries, agriculture, golf courses and utilities are required to continue following the water use conditions in their permits.

Other Actions

Lake Okeechobee releases

• Since May, there have been multiple beneficial releases of water from Lake Okeechobee to the Caloosahatchee River, and estuary salinity levels have significantly improved. Wet season rainfall and local basin runoff are providing sufficient inflow to the Caloosahatchee to maintain favorable salinity levels in the upper estuary. Based on current ecological conditions and established guidelines in Adaptive Protocols, District staff on July 25 recommended no further releases at this time. Navigation

• The following locks on the north shore of Lake Okeechobee remain closed until lake levels rise to allow for safe navigation:

- S-135 at J&S Fish Camp in Martin County
- G-36 at Henry Creek in Okeechobee County
- S-127 at Buckhead Ridge in Glades County
- S-131 at Lakeport in Glades County

• The S-193 Lock, located on Taylor Creek on the north shore of Lake Okeechobee, is closed due to ongoing renovation work to refurbish the lock and ensure decades of reliable service.
