Shooting, Plane Crash Mark Weekend

BELLE GLADE AND
PAHOKEE INCIDENTS
UNDER INVESTIGATION

It was a particularly tragic week for the Glades area, with a number of stories grabbing headlines around the county.

Shooting in Belle Glade

On Saturday, Dec. 1, a woman was shot in the face following an altercation at a club in Belle Glade. The incident happened at about 2:30 a.m. in the 500 block of 16th St. at the "Ballroom Club."

According to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, the club was hosting a rap party at the time of the shooting. Officials say that's when the fight broke out inside the club and spilled out into the parking lot area, where the gunshots were heard.

The woman, who has not been identified, was airlifted to Delray Medical Center.

Glades Central's Season Ends in Class 5A Playoff Loss to Miami Jackson

Glades Central rebounded in an amazing way, winning eight games in a row after a 0-4 start to this season.

After much discussion about whether or not Glades Central was still a relevant team in Palm Beach County – if not the nation – they did turn out to be the area's last team standing.

Despite the Raiders 33-24 loss to Miami Jackson in the Class 5A-Region 4 finals on Nov. 30 – the defeat effectively ended Glades Central's 5A state title run – they were never out of the game and they showed why they'll al-

most always be a team worth watching from start to finish.

Glades Central (8-5 final record) led 10-0 in the first half, thanks in part to a 3-yard run into the end zone by senior triple-threat Will Likely (8 catches, 100 yards; 10 carries, 35 yards, TD) with 3:50 left in the first quarter.

And sophomore Giovanni Lugo added a 37-yard field goal with 10.4 seconds left in the first. The Raiders second scoring drive, made possible by Likely's 24-yard punt return into Jackson's territory, gave them a 10-0 lead going into the second quarter.

But Glades Central couldn't hold on, as Miami Jackson junior quarter-

back Quinton Flowers (7-for-15 passing, 178 yards, 3 TDs, 1 INT) connected on a 12-yard strike to wide receiver Devondre Powell (3 catches, 48 yards, 2 TDs) in the end zone to cut Glades Central lead to 10-6 with 3:07 left in the first half.

And after the Generals (8-4 record) forced a three-and-out on Glades Central's offense, their special teams blocked a Raiders punt in the end zone with 1:22 left in the first half. Miami Jackson's Sumondrae Williams recovered it for the touchdown to give his team a 12-10 lead that went into halftime.

"We left some points on the

board," Glades Central offensive coordinator Reidel Anthony said. "We made a bunch of little mistakes in the first half and Miami Jackson took advantage of them."

Abrams (3-for-8 passing, 36 yards, lost fumble) was taken out of the game in Glades Central's final offensive series in the first half. He was forced to sit out the rest of the way due to concussion-like symptoms he reportedly suffered in the first quarter.

In came Lugo, who will likely be Glades Central's starting quarterback

Holiday Health and Safety

The holidays are a time to celebrate, give thanks, and reflect. They are also a time to pay special attention to your health and the health of your family.

Follow these tips to have a safer and healthier holiday season:

- Watch the kids: Keep your children with you at all times while you are shopping. Accompany and supervise your children in public restrooms. Have a plan in case you become separated. If your kids are old enough to understand, have a pre-designated spot to meet if you get separated. Teach children to look for people who can help, such as a uniformed security officer, or a salesperson.

- Kid safety: Keep a watchful eye on your kids when they're eating and playing. Keep potentially dangerous toys, food, drinks, household items, choking hazards (like coins and hard candy), and other objects out of kids' reach. Learn what to do for children who are choking. Make sure toys are used properly.

- Wash your hands often: Keeping your hands clean is one of the most important steps you can take to avoid getting sick and spreading germs to others. Wash your hands with soap and clean running water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and clean water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.

- Stay warm: Cold temperatures can cause serious health problems, especially in infants and older adults. Stay dry, and dress warmly in several layers of loose-fitting, tightly woven clothing.

- Manage stress: The holidays shouldn't cause problems with your health. Be aware of your actions, try not to over-commit or overspend. Try to balance your work, home, and play. Get support from your family and friends. Try to keep a relaxed and positive outlook.

- Travel safely: Whether you're traveling across town or around the world, keep safety in mind. Do not drink and drive, and don't let someone else drink and drive. Wear a seat belt every time you drive or ride with someone in a motor vehicle. Always buckle your child in the car using a child safety seat, booster seat, or seat

belt according to their height, weight, and age.

- Be smoke-free: Avoid smoking and breathing other people's smoke. If you smoke, quit today! Call 1-800-QUIT-NOW or talk to your health care provider for help.

- Get check-ups and vaccinations: Exams and screenings can help find problems before they start. They can also help find problems early, when the chances for treatment and cure are better. Vaccinations help prevent diseases and save lives. Schedule a visit with your health care provider for a yearly exam. Ask what vaccinations and tests you should get based on your age, lifestyle, travel plans, medical history, and family health history.

- Prevent injuries: Injuries can occur anywhere and some often occur around the holidays. Use step stools instead of furniture when hanging decorations. Leave the fireworks to the professionals. Wear a bicycle helmet to help prevent head injuries.

- Fire Safety: Most residential fires occur during the winter months. Keep candles away from children, pets, walkways, trees, and curtains. Never leave fireplaces, stoves, or candles unattended. Don't use generators, grills, or other gasoline- or charcoal-burning devices inside your home or garage. Install a smoke detector and carbon monoxide detector in your home. Test them once a month, and replace batteries twice a year.

- Handle and prepare food safely: As you prepare holiday meals, keep you and your family safe from food-related illness. Wash hands and surfaces often. Avoid cross-contamination by keeping raw meat, poultry, seafood, and eggs (including their juices) away from ready-to-eat foods and eating surfaces. Cook foods to the proper temperature. Refrigerate promptly. Do not leave perishable foods out of the refrigerator for more than two hours.

- Protect pets from rabies: Pets are considered family members. Keep them healthy and safe as well. Your pet should have regular checkups and be sure to keep rabies vaccinations up-to-date.

Do something positive for yourself and those around you and you will be happier and healthier!

Inland Birdwatching Fun: Barn Owl (BANO)

Barn Owls are the world's most far ranging owls with up to 46 different races being described worldwide. The North America form is the largest, weighing more than twice as much as the smallest race which is found in the Galapagos

Islands. A Barn Owl is larger than a Screech Owl, but smaller than a Great Horned Owl.

These medium-sized owls have long, rounded wings and a short tail. Their legs are long and the head is smoothly rounded, without ear tufts. They are pale with dark eyes and have a white heart-shaped face with a mix of buff and gray on the head, back and underwings. At night they appear to be all white. Barn Owls are known locally as the "Ghost Owl" or "Monkey Faced Owl". Females are more reddish and more heavily spotted on the chest than males.

These birds don't hoot the way most owls do; instead, they make a long, harsh scream or a soft purring call. They will make loud hisses when disturbed. The oldest known North American Barn Owl live to be at least 15 years and five months old.

Barn Owls are found in open grasslands, marshes, agricultural fields, forests, suburbs and cities. Their diet consists mostly of small mammals, particularly rats, mice, voles, bats, rabbits, and birds. They also eat insects and amphibians.

The female makes a simple cup-shaped nest that she lines with her own regurgitated pellets, wood, and twigs which she shreds with her feet. These owls use their nest site which is built in a tree cavity, old building, abandoned machinery or rock crevice for roosting throughout the year. The female usually lays five to seven eggs, but as many as 11 have been found in a clutch. The eggs

are incubated for 30 to 34 days with the young fledging at 55 to 62 days old.





November Edges All-Time Dry Record for the Month

Despite scant rainfall, regional water supplies remain adequate

rainfall deficit while the Southwest Coast recorded a 1.88-inch deficit.

Lake Okeechobee stood at 15.10 feet NGVD today, which is 0.30 feet above the historic average for this time of year.

2012-2013 Dry Season Forecast

South Florida is forecast to experience one of the few dry seasons having near-average rainfall in the past 14 years. Only two dry seasons, 1998-1999 and 2003-2004, have actually been about the historical average in that timeframe, with two above average and 10 below average dry seasons. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Climate Prediction Center forecast calls for equal chances of slightly above or slightly below average rainfall for the first three months of the upcoming dry season.

Among the official forecast highlights for the 2012-2013 South Florida dry season:

- Near normal precipitation is mostly likely during the first part of the dry season, from November to February.

- A drier-than-normal trend may characterize March and April.

- Average dry season precipitation: 12 to 15 inches in the interior and west to 15 to 21 inches in the east.

- Long-term average winter temperature: 64 to 66 F in the interior and west to 67 to 69 F in the east.

Eastern Palm Beach County had the largest rainfall deficit in the District, with 0.69 inches of rain, representing a deficit of 3.46 inches, or 17 percent of average. The Upper Kissimmee Basin and Martin, St. Lucie and eastern Miami-Dade counties all recorded rainfall deficits of more than 2 inches for the month. The East Caloosahatchee Basin also recorded more than a 2-inch



for the next two seasons.

Lugo (11-for-13 passing, 138 yards, TD) was a force to be reckoned with in the second half.

With 8:22 left in the third, Lugo dropped back and kept his poise in the pocket, as he found a wide open man in junior wide receiver Ronquavion Tarver for a 9-yard touchdown pass.

Glades Central's score initially gave the home team a 16-12 lead, but an illegal motion penalty was called on the Raiders offense, which subsequently negated the touchdown.

It proved to be a very costly mistake, as Glades Central wound up ending that pivotal possession with no added points on the scoreboard.

Glades Central, which found itself down 19-10 with 31.8 second left in the third quarter, was burned by an 80-yard touchdown strike from Flowers to Desmond Phillips (2 catches, 98 yards, TD).

"That was a great throw he made on us," Anthony said.

Glades Central recovered quickly from the setback, as Lugo engineered a quick touchdown drive that ended with a 13-yard touchdown pass to Tarver with 10:36 left. Lugo's touchdown pass – and his extra point – cut Miami Jackson's lead to 19-17.

Glades Central's sudden momentum came to a screeching halt, as a botched handoff from senior David Bailey to Likely on a first-and-15 play from the 50-yard line resulted in a costly fumble that Miami Jackson recovered.

Miami Jackson's Christopher Williams-Hall, who got the ball from the Glades Central 32-yard line, sprinted his way into the end zone.

Williams-Hall's score – plus an extra point by

Generals kicker Franklin Bonilla – gave the Generals a 26-17 lead with 8:47 left.

"There's three phases to a football game – offense, defense and special teams," Miami Jackson head coach Antonio Brown said. "They [Glades Central] have a special guy in Likely, so we had to contain him as much as possible."

Glades Central fought back on its very next possession, as senior running back Arron Baker (11 carries, 113 yards, TD) sidestepped a few defenders en route to a 24-yard touchdown run that cut the Generals lead to 26-24 with 7:45 left.

A key play on the Raiders scoring drive was a 20-yard pass completion from Lugo to Likely, which put Glades Central at Jackson's 33-yard line and ultimately set up Baker's score.

It turned out to be Glades Central's final touchdown of the season, as Miami Jackson methodically engineered a pivotal seven-play drive that ended with a 23-yard touchdown pass from Flowers to Powell with 3:57 left.

Powell's touchdown catch – plus an extra point by Bonilla – gave Miami Jackson a 33-24 lead that stood until the end.

"It was a big-time play for us," Brown said.

On Glades Central's final possession, Lugo found Likely on two passes for 28 yards, which allowed the Raiders to reach the Generals 42-yard line with 1:41 left.

But it wasn't enough, as the Raiders, who faced a third-and-35 situation from their own 30-yard line, failed to get the critical first down.

"We didn't win the game, but Lugo made some good throws and made the most of his opportunity out there," Anthony said. "He has a very bright future ahead of him."

Anthony recapped the game – and the season – for Glades Central.

"It was an up-and-down roller coaster for us," Anthony said. "We were always in position to win games, but we just didn't execute all the time. That's exactly how our losses turned out this season."

Plane crashes in Pahokee

According to reports, the veteran pilot with 60 years of flight experience, took off from Pompano Beach headed for Lakeland Linder Regional Airport the day before the wreckage was found. Without any definitive answers as to what caused the crash, the investigation was turned over almost immediately to the Federal Aviation Administration and the National Transportation Safety Board.

Street Beat Faces Uncertain Future

Despite a stellar 16-year history of excellent arts programs and increasing respect among child-centered community-based after-school programs serving a poverty-stricken Glades population, without help, Street Beat, Inc.'s days may be numbered.

Budget constraints caused largely by changes in local public grants programs have reduced the organization's programs over the past several years. Quality evaluations consistently reflect superb programs and administration. However, turns in the economy and priorities shifting from a focus on children to a need to serve homeless family with housing and nutrition, has affected community based after school programs.

A November 1st letter to the Glades Communities describes Street Beat's effort to keep the doors open for local children. It chronicles the beginning of the funding decline, from the loss of funding from one of its major foundation contributors because of that foundation's decline due to the Bernie Madoff "ponzi scheme." Further, elimination of Community Foundation grants due to an economy driven change in focus. The Children's Services Council through Family Central has affected the local non-profit negatively, as well. Once funded to serve 80 children on a daily basis, which only scratched the surface of need in the Glades region, Street Beat currently is funded to serve only 34 children.

Statistics show that 30 percent of Glades children are in families who live below the poverty line; 36 percent live in single parent households.

An average of 97 percent of students qualify for free or reduced fee lunches, and there are few resources that serve youth of working class families. As the only grassroots performing arts organization serving the communities of the Glades, through supportive out-of-school programming of arts training coupled with homework assistance and life-skills foci, Street Beat has touched more than 5,000 residents annually since 1996. It has grown from a small organization with a budget of \$27,000 to \$400,000-budget program, whose resume includes Kravis Center, City Place and Super Bowl performances by its now, volunteer only, highly acclaimed SBI Dance Program participants.



County Drainage Improvement Project Brings Relief to Residents

Residents of Pahokee's Citizens Villas subdivision are no longer experiencing flooding in their yards thanks to Palm Beach County's Disaster Recovery Initiative (DRI) and Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) programs. The Department of Economic Sustainability allocated \$320,000 to fund needed drainage improvements.

Under a contract awarded by County Engineering, AKA Services, Inc. recently completed the construction of new storm sewers and drainage structures to handle storm water runoff. The project involved work on 24 separate residential parcels and will improve the overall drainage of the area through the upgrades to the existing outfall and the installation of new outfalls.

Coordination with the property owners, utility companies, and the city of Pahokee were essential to bringing the project to fruition, and the results have already been noticeable. Fol-

lowing Tropical Storm Isaac, resident Lucinda Hood remarked, "Before the new drain, the water came right up to my house. Now, I have no problems."

DRI funds have been made available to states and local governments for long-term recovery needs following the 2004, 2005 and 2008 hurricane seasons. Florida's program has allocated more than \$318 million statewide for rehabilitation of damaged housing and storm water sewers, drainage and street improvement infrastructure.

Since 1974, Palm Beach County has helped urban communities develop decent housing and expand economic opportunities, principally for persons of low and moderate income, through the CDBG program. Among the eligible activities, the program funds the implementation of capital improvement projects to help alleviate flooding in low-lying areas.






