## Belle Glade Son Returns With Poetry and Song

Langston Hughes project to be held later this month

Langston Hughes, for Ron McCurdy, carried all of the truths of a Black man living in America. The poet's work seemed to speak to the struggles of the Afro-American, and

seemed to speak it in a way that was honest, and more importantly, direct – at least direct enough to be understood by the masses, whether they were black or white or brown.

McCurdy as a child was nurtured in this way, by parents who were educators in Belle Glade and understood the importance of a good education, and reinforced it through positive reflections on the work of strong figures such as Hughes.

Now, the University of Southern California professor is getting a chance to return to his native town and bring with him a presentation on a poem by Langston Hughes, set to music, videography, and spoken word. The work has attracted the attention of celebrities, like the famous rapper Ice T,

who have lent their voices to the project. This event is being called, "The Langston Hughes Project," and will be held at the Dolly Hand Cultural Arts Center on Thursday, January 29. It is being presented in part by the center's student activities department.

Already, the presentation has received some critical acclaim, but Belle Glade represents a special arena for Mr. McCurdy.

His father was principal at Glades Central for a short time, and then at Lake Shore for many years. His mother taught at South Bay Elementary for 30 plus years. With two parents steeped in the educational system, McCurdy

## Sexual Assault Posted on Facebook Leads to Arrest

24-year-old man  
accused of raping  
15-year-old girl

A man was arrested last week after a posting a shocking video on Facebook – him raping a 15-year-old girl. Authorities arrested the man, Jeffrey Browning, 24, of Belle Glade on sexual assault charges after he reportedly captured the scene on his cell phone.

The shocking nature of the crime itself was enough to land the man in

jail; posting it to a public online forum for all to see was unspeakable.

A probable cause affidavit outlined how the suspect went about the crime: he locked the girl inside of a room and choked and slapped the young girl before sexually assaulting her. The report mentions that the girl at times struggled to breathe.

The girl said she tried to fend off the suspect, urging him not to assault her, but he would not listen.

After 15 years of success in North America, the Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC) will open up to the entire world for the first time in 2013. Anyone, from anywhere on earth, can participate by visiting [www.birdcount.org](http://www.birdcount.org) and

reporting the kinds and numbers of birds they see during the 16th annual count, Feb. 15 to 18.

For the past five years the Clewiston area was in the "Top 10" for the number of birds reported during the GBBC. Last year 124 species, for a total of 123,704 birds,

were submitted for Clewiston. Other area communities reporting were LaBelle with 46 species and 1,389 birds, Felda 15 species with 840 birds reported, Moore Haven with 38 species with 601 birds, and Okeechobee with 80 species and 2,626 birds.

Last year Florida reported the most individual birds in the United States, including 3,286 House Sparrows. These common birds, which were first introduced in the United States in 1851, live and breed throughout Florida.

House Sparrows aren't related to other North American sparrows. These noisy active birds are larger, have a rounder head, shorter tail, and stouter bill than most American Sparrows. Adult males have gray heads, white cheeks, a black bib, and rufous neck while females are plain buffy-brown with gray-brown underparts. Their

backs are striped with buff, black, and brown. Juveniles are similar to the female, but have buffier underparts and soft textured feathers. The oldest recorded House Sparrow live to be 15 years and nine months old. Their songs are one or a series of "cheep" or "chirrup" notes. Females rarely sing. The male and female's call is a single "cheep" note.

These sparrows are often seen taking dust baths. They throw dust and soil over their body feathers as if bathing with water. House Sparrows are commonly found in shopping centers where are seen hopping on the ground as they forage for grains, seeds, discarded food, and insects.

These cavity nesters prefer to nest in man-made structures such as eaves of buildings, street lights and nest boxes, but will also nest in tree cavities or weave a nest of thick vegetation. Between March and July the female lays three to seven white, pale blue, or pale green eggs speckled with brown and black. The eggs are incubated for 11 to 14 days with the young fledging at 15 to 17 days.

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# Two Florida Pros Tangle at the Finish Line for Top Honors

When your very first fish of a three-day tournament is 9-pounder, it could be fortune. When your very last fish of that three-day tournament is another 9-pounder, it could be fate.

But when you win that same three-day tournament by a tiebreaker, someone from above is looking out for you.

That's exactly how the week went for EverStart rookie pro Ben Todd of Pierson, Fla. His first fish of the tournament on Thursday was 9-pounder.

Then late this afternoon, with a small limit in his box and just minutes left in the fishing day, Todd hooked and landed another 9-pounder and won the EverStart Series event on Lake Okeechobee by a tiebreaker.

Todd's total weight – 59 pounds, 3 ounces – was the exact total weight of runner-up Trevor Fitzgerald who mounted a gallant charge for the title with an impressive 25-pound-10 ounce catch today.

But since Todd was ahead of Fitzgerald going into the final day, Todd got the winning hardware and the \$40,000 check to go with it.

"You see that right there," Todd said, seconds after his weight stopped at 16-3, the exact weight he needed to win. "That was not me. The Lord did that...not me."

Indeed it was a magical week for the 32-year

old Todd who works on his family's farm in Pierson. It started with a 31-7 limit on day one. Then waned to an 11-9 limit on day two. And then surged again with the magic digits 16-3 today, thanks to the tournament winning 9-pounder.

Todd found his winning area late on Tuesday afternoon.

"I made one quick pass down through there, had 10 bites and shook them all off," he said.

"But I saw two of them as I was shaking them off and they were big. I did not return to the area until Thursday morning. My first fish of the day was 9-pounder and that kind of set the tone for the day as I kept catching big ones."

Todd's key stretch included a line of reeds "in the middle" around the J&S area, which was protected from the predominant east wind that occurred throughout the event.

"I was not fishing the very outside reeds," Todd detailed. "And I was not fishing all the way inside near the bank, either. This area had a line of reeds going down through the middle."

The whole area was maybe three acres in size. And it's not like the fish were bunched up in a tiny spot. I caught them all the way down this line of reeds that ran north and south."

Todd's key lures were a Gambler Fat Ace and a Tightlines UV UVenko. The Fat Ace was in a river bug color and the UVenko was in black and

blue.

He rigged the lures Texas-style with a 5/0 Gamakatsu flipping hook and topped them with 3/8-tungsten weights on 50-pound test PowerPro braid.

"The fish were spawning around the reeds," he explained. "I couldn't see the beds and I couldn't see the fish, but I could just tell by how they were set up, they had made beds around those reeds. I'd pitch the bait in-between and around the reeds and just let it fall into where I thought a bed would be. I'd start the day with the Gambler Fat Ace and then when things got slow or I was re-fishing some of my stretches, I'd switch to the UVenko to give them a different look. I think that UV technology really gives the lure a different appearance in the water – something they've never seen before."

"Today it was all the UVenko," he added. "I caught small fish early, but late in the day all the boats disappeared and things got calm and quiet and I got that indescribable feeling that maybe another big female or two was moving up. I kept looking at my watch...30 minutes left...20 minutes left...10 minutes left and then that big one bit. When I got her in the boat I knew I had a shot at winning."

Brandon McMillan of Clewiston, ended the week in third place with a three-day total of 56

pounds, 3 ounces worth \$10,000.

'Big Mac' (a nickname coined by McMillan's sponsor, Lionel Botha, owner of Halo rods) is usually considered a committed mat puncher but this week he sampled the big jig bite as well.

"The risk in committing to mat punching is that there is a lot of wasted time moving from one mat to another," McMillan explained.

"A lot of times I kick the trolling motor on high and have to troll 30 or 40 yards to the next mat without fishing and that's a lot of down time. If the mat bite is really strong, I don't mind that kind of down time. But if the mat bite is so-so, it adds up to a lot of lost fishing time."

"So I purposely stayed in water that offered a mix of both punching mats and pitching a jig to reeds," he continued.

"That way, as I moved from one mat to another, I could pitch reed clumps in between with the jig. And I ended up catching a few bonus fish from the reeds, so it worked out well."

McMillan's lures of choice included a Gambler B.B. Cricket and a Zoom Z-Hog on a 1-1/2-ounce tungsten for punching and a 3/4-ounce 4X4 jig for pitching to reeds.




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# SFWMD Completes Everglades, Florida Bay Restoration Project

Start of operations builds restoration momentum in a new year

With two new pump stations in operation, the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) and its federal and state partners dedicated the completion of the C-111 Spreader Canal Western Project to help restore freshwater flows to Florida Bay, preserve clean water in Everglades National Park and maintain flood control for eastern communities.

"The completion of the C-111 spreader canal is yet another example of the Department working with its partners to get the water right," stated Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) Secretary Herschel T. Vinyard Jr. "Providing abundant and cleaner water is one step, among many, designed to restore America's Everglades."

District engineers reported all components of the project are operating as designed and the system performed well during the 2012 wet season testing.

With automated operation, the project stands ready to receive water and deliver benefits to the Everglades ecosystem. In addition, scientists will begin compiling data to evaluate project performance and environmental response.

"Witnessing the completion and operation of a project to help restore America's Everglades provides a sense of accomplishment and optimism for the future," said Joe Collins, SFWMD Governing Board Chairman.

"Today we have taken another step toward our shared restoration goals."

These goals are accomplished at the C-111 western project with a series of pump stations and canals that raise groundwater levels directly

outside the eastern boundary of Everglades National Park.

The higher water table creates a hydraulic barrier between the park and the urban areas of Miami-Dade County to retain fresh water in the park.

This also helps achieve healthy salinity levels in Florida Bay by restoring the quantity, timing and distribution of freshwater flows via Taylor Slough to the bay ecosystem.

Located at the southern tip of the Florida peninsula and spanning 850 square miles, Florida Bay is an integral component of the Everglades ecosystem and is a valuable economic resource for the region.

The bay's waters serve as a nursery for an array of aquatic life and are home to dozens of commercially and recreationally important species such as spiny lobster, snapper and pink shrimp.

A National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) study found that Florida Bay contributed approximately \$1.7 billion in the form of "destination spending" in one year alone.

This project provides significant momentum for another year of continued Everglades restoration progress.

With consensus between the State of Florida and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the District is also moving forward in 2013 with a suite of new restoration strategies for improving water quality in the Everglades.

Work includes:

- Implementing a science-based technical plan
- Completing six projects that will create more than 6,500 acres of new Stormwater Treatment Areas (STAs)
- Creating 110,000 acre-feet of additional water storage

said he had a learning that was different from the education that many others received. He understands the historical struggles of Belle Glade and its children.

"Belle Glade has always been a separate and unequal environment," said Mr. McCurdy. "It's very difficult for people of color."

McCurdy remembers his Belle Glade of four decades ago. He graduated in 1971, the first class to graduate from Glades Central High School. He was part of the grand experiment of the day – the merging of Lake Shore and Belle Glade High School; two schools that had in effect segregated student populations.

And he is coming back to the same place, at a different time. His greatest hope is to instill the same love for Langston Hughes and consequently the same determinedness for learning that he felt as a child and carried him into his

own adulthood.

"This is home for me, and this is a homecoming. At a very early age I was exposed to Langston Hughes, and I'm at a magical point in my adult life where I have a chance to present his work to others."

Does he believe that children will take the same lessons, or love for learning as he did?

"I hope so. I hope it does for them what it did for me as a child, which was to ignite a love of learning and a love for reading, and a love for stories. Langston Hughes was someone who had an ability to reach anyone. His poems connect to people of all different ilk. I'm hoping that when we're in town, we will have a chance to connect with the young people."



## Dr. Ronald C. McCurdy

Dr. Ronald C. McCurdy is professor of music in the Thornton School of Music at the University of Southern California (USC) and is Past-President of the International Association for Jazz Education (IAJE).

Prior to his appointment at USC he served as Director of the Thelonious Monk Institute of Jazz at USC. He has served as Professor of Music and chair of the Afro-African American Studies Department and served as Director of Jazz Studies at the University of



Minnesota.

In 1997, Dr. McCurdy served as Visiting Professor of music at Maria-Curie Sklodowska University in Lublin, Poland. In 2001 Dr. McCurdy received the Distinguished Alumni Award from the University of Kansas. Dr. McCurdy served seven years as Director of Jazz Studies at the University of Kansas.

Under the direction of Dr. McCurdy, the University of Kansas Jazz Program gained national and international prominence. His instrumental and vocal ensembles performed at international and national music conferences and festivals throughout the world.

Dr. McCurdy released his first CD titled, "Once Again for the First Time" on the INNOVA label and is co-author of a vocal jazz improvisation series titled "Approaching the Standards," published by Warner Bros.

Dr. McCurdy received his undergraduate degree from Florida A & M University and his Masters and Ph. D. degrees from the University of Kansas.

ferred to give the girl a ride home but instead drove her to his aunt's home in Pahokee and hit her in the face while forcing her to perform more sex acts on him.

Confronted with the evidence, the man confessed to at least two attacks, as well as being primarily responsible for capturing the brutal scenes on video. He is being held in a Palm Beach County Jail on a \$200,000 bond.

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## Phone Discounts Available To CenturyLink Customers

The Florida Public Utility Commission designated CenturyLink as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier within its service area for universal service purposes. # Department of Health Encourages Flu Vaccinations to Reduce Illness

## Vaccinations available statewide

Though flu season has already started, the Florida Department of Health encourages residents and visitors alike to get vaccinated against influenza (flu). Compared with most other viral respiratory infections, such as the common cold, influenza infection often causes a more severe illness, and at times can lead to death.

"It is not too late to get vaccinated against the flu, and we encourage anyone age six months

and older to get a flu shot," stated State Surgeon General and Secretary of Health, Dr. John Armstrong.

"Influenza A is the most common flu type in Florida this season and is countered by the vaccine."

Be sure to watch for symptoms of the flu, which can include headache, fever, a severe cough, runny nose or body aches. Contact your primary care physician or a local hospital immediately if symptoms appear. This is particularly important for people at high risk for serious complications from flu.

For those with the flu, antiviral medication may shorten both the duration and severity of illness.

The Florida Department of Health urges the following preventive steps for the flu:

- Get vaccinated every single year, because as the flu types change, the vaccine changes.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth, because germs spread this way.

- Avoid close contact with sick people.
- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.

• If you are sick with flu-like illness, contact your primary care physician to determine whether you need antiviral medication. Stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone (except to get medical care or for other necessities).

J.C. Penny was 95 years old when he stated, "My eyesight might be getting weaker, but my vision is increasing."


Throughout the Scriptures, God's oldest always seem to be first team material. Look at Abraham and Sarah, Noah, and Moses. God uses the chronologically gifted.

## Ms. Jasmine's Reading Spot

Greetings to all and welcome back to the Reading Spot!

QAR is a questioning strategy that helps teach students that a relationship exists between the question given, the text, and the background of the reader. In this strategy, students are taught to use four question/answer relationships (QAR's) to find the information they need in order to answer the question.

- The teacher introduces QAR and explains the four types of question/answer relationships (QAR's)

- The teacher models the QAR process by using a short story. First read the story and questions to the students. Then identify which QAR's are evidenced through the questions given. Finally, answer questions and discuss.

- The teacher practices identifying the QAR's with the class.

- The teacher provides independent practice.

- The teacher gradually increases the length and complexity of the texts used with QAR.

- The students continue to use QAR throughout the year, across the curriculum.

QAR Descriptors/Questions for our students  
Right There - The answer is in the text and is usually easy to find. The information is found in one place.

Think & Search - The answer is in the selection, but you need to put together different pieces of information. Information comes from different places in the text.

Author & You - The answer is not explicitly stated in the story. You need to think about what you already know, what the author tells you in the text, and how it fits together.

On My Own - The answer is not text-based. You can even answer the question without reading the selection. You need to use your own experience and background knowledge.


