A woman called the sheriff's office moments after a man pointed a gun at her and threatened to kill her. Still shaken, she was able to tell deputies who the man was, and deputies man-

Belle Glade Family Given New Home After Father's Death

Family gets a new start thanks to community

A Belle Glade widow and her five children get a new start at life thanks to the generosity of the Season to Share program and many residents in the Glades. Susanna Rodriguez's

husband and brother were tragically killed in an accident on their way to go fishing two years ago.

Since the accident, Ms. Rodriguez went from being a stay-at-home mom to working 14-15 hours a day in the sod fields to provide for her children. The family of six lived in a small, one bedroom trailer without hot water, air-conditioner, and infested with rats.

Selena Smith, Communications Director for Family First of Palm Beach County, explains that Ms. Rodriguez was one of 13 families chosen to

participate in the Palm Beach Post's Season to Share program. The participants are nominated by nonprofit organizations based on their dire circumstances. Their story is featured for readers and donations are accepted on the families' behalf.

"With the \$72,000 that was collected for the family from generous Post readers, Families First was able to

Carol was educated in music at Florida State University (BA) and Ohio State University (MA, Piano Pedagogy). She loved her music and taught piano throughout her lifetime. She traveled to many places in the United States and Europe accompanying her husband. Her love of music and the piano even extended to Germany, where she taught several students in German. During this time she visited many sites in Europe, including Tivoli, in Copenhagen, Denmark, several extraordinary places in Italy including Vienna, Florence, Rome, and the Vatican. The places in the United States where she lived were New Martinsville, WV; Los Angeles, Calif.; and lastly Dublin, Ohio. Carol and Dan were staunch members of the Episcopal church for nearly all their married lives until doctrinal changes caused a permanent split. She was also a group leader and member of the Association of Research and Enlightenment, a spiritual organization based on the readings of Edgar Cayce, also known as the Sleeping Prophet. Carol will be interred at Port Mayaca Memorial Gardens near the site where her dear parents Oda Daniel Carpenter and Ruth Shive Carpenter were buried and not far from where she was born, Pahokee, FL. She was lucky and blessed to have a family that loved her and as important loved each other. Thanks be to our Lord for her life with us.

John B. Boy, 96

LABELLE — John B. Boy, of LaBelle, passed away peacefully July 16, 2013 in Lehigh Acres. He was born Mar. 25, 1917 in Johnson City, Tenn., to David C. and Kathleen Boy and was the second of three brothers.

He graduated from Georgia Tech with a degree in mechanical engineering. During his time at Georgia Tech, John was on the Honor Roll, a member of Omicron Delta Kappa and Tau Beta Pi, Phi Eta Sigma, Bulldog Club, Pi Delta Epsilon, A.S.M.E., Skull and Key, Interfraternity Council, Technique Editor in Chief, Yellowjacket, Blue Print, Student Council, ANAK Vice-President and Athletic Association Student Member.

Following graduation, he worked for Proctor and Gamble at the Buckeye Oil Company until WWII broke out and at that time enlisted in the U. S. Navy. He served our nation throughout the entire war and became the Captain of three different ships - a subchaser, USS C350, a patrolcraft, USS PC613 and destroyer escort, the USS Holton, DE-703. John and his crew from the USS Holton held annual reunions that were filled with great passion and memories of their younger years. While in the Navy on assignment in Miami, John met and married the love of his life, Nancy Adams, who predeceased him.

Shortly after the war, John went to work for United States Sugar Corporation in 1946. Through his engineering ingenuity, he improved the efficiency and productivity of sugar cane harvesting by converting/re-designing track mounted tractors to rubber tires which was combined with his successful redesign of sugar cane loading machines. Those redesigns allowed the Florida sugar cane industry to begin a process of mass production in the fields and factories which ultimately led to the size and efficiency of today's industry.

John later became Executive Vice President of the Corporation in 1961 which led to his promotion to President/CEO in 1970, a position he held until his retirement in 1987. He became Vice-Chairman of the Board of Directors at that time. Under his leadership, the Corporation not only prospered by tripling its production, but he led the way in charitable giving to the surrounding communities of swimming pools, youth centers, an auditorium, day care facilities, housing projects and multiple scholarship programs. Two of his proudest achievements during his tenure as President were the creation of an Employee Stock Ownership Plan whereby the employees would own 47% of the Corporation and the commencement of the diversification of the Corporation into the growing/processing of citrus.

John was the beloved and respected leader of the sugar industry as noted by the numerous accolades that he accumulated and/or achieved during his career which included "Sugar Man of the Year", Florida Agriculture Hall of Fame, Honorary Doctor of Humanities-Florida Atlantic University, "White Hat" award by Agribusiness Institute, President of the Florida Sugar Cane League, President of the Florida Sugar Marketing and Terminal Association, State Director of Florida Chamber of Commerce, Council of 100, Florida Land Council, Florida Farm Bureau, 1975 Citizen of the Year for Clewiston, Florida and Dedication of the Sugar Festival in 1992.

He is survived by daughter, Betsy Terrill (Jim); sons, John Boy, Jr. (Connie) and H. Lane Boy; grandchildren, Jamie Terrill, Christopher Smith, Jennifer Price, Suzanne Boy, Stephanie Crawford, Rachael Boy; and ten great-grandchildren.

Visitation was held Thursday, July 18, 2013 from 6-8 p.m. at Akin-Davis Funeral Home in Clewiston, Florida.

The Funeral Service was held Friday, July 19, 2013, 11:00 a.m. at Evangel Assembly of God, Clewiston, Florida with Rev. Samuel Thomas Ph.D. officiating.

The Hidden Costs of Owning a Pet

America is a nation of pet lovers. About half the nation's households include a dog or a cat, and they spend \$53 billion yearly on pet expenses, ranging from food to vet bills to toys.

Some go a bit overboard. A whopping \$370 million is spent on pet costumes yearly. But even more shocking is the toll our animals take on our electronics budget. American pets have bitten, chewed, licked and otherwise damaged over eight million electronic devices, amounting to over \$3 billion in repair and replacement costs.

Considering that one of every three devices damaged by pets is a smartphone, this could mean up to \$800 in replacement costs whenever your animal runs amok.

The risk of pet-related accidents increases the more pets are treated as family members. According to new research from SquareTrade, if you drive with your pet in your lap, you're over twice as likely to damage your device. And letting a pet sleep in bed with you triples your chances.

Meanwhile, giving your pet too much independence can also increase risk. Two-thirds of

pet-related accidents involving devices happened while the pet was unsupervised.

Accidental Personalities: Every furry friend comes with its own unique personality, and unique set of dangers.

For example, the SquareTrade study found that 21 percent of accidents happened while the owner was using the device.

A temperamental personality can also be a red flag -- 17 percent of pet owners believe their animal friend damaged their device because it was angry with them.

And homes with different pet species are more susceptible to mishaps. Those with both a cat and dog are four times more likely to have accidents with electronics compared to homes with one or the other.


Fido Protection: Despite the growing popu-



larity of pet insurance, many owners don't realize this kind of insurance doesn't cover damage caused by their pets. In fact, three out of four devices damaged were not covered by any kind of warranty.

While there's no sure way to prevent pet-related accidents, consumers can protect themselves by getting a protection plan. For example, some protection plans cover against accidents, like a device getting batted off the kitchen counter, falling in a water bowl or finding its way into the wrong paws. They also cover mechanical and electrical issues, like antennae and Wi-Fi failure, a broken dock connector, or touch-screen failure.

Pets all need exercise, training and attention from their owners, but they sometimes find inconvenient ways to show us.



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Minimizing CWD Risk in Florida

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) will hold a public meeting Aug. 8 in Gainesville to discuss possible options for minimizing the risk of chronic wasting disease (CWD) coming into Florida.

The meeting is at the Paramount Plaza Hotel, 2900 S.W. 13th Street, Ballroom A/B, from 6:30-8:30 p.m. and is open to the public.

CWD is not known to affect people but is a contagious neurological disease affecting deer, elk and moose. The disease is always fatal, and there is no known cure or vaccine. So far, the disease has been discovered in 22 states, two Canadian provinces and South Korea.

The meeting will begin with a presentation by Commission staff on the significance of CWD and will include a discussion on possible solutions for minimizing the risk of the disease being brought into the state. 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Inland Birding Fun: Great Crested Flycatcher

Great Crested Flycatchers breed throughout the Central and Eastern United States, as well as Southern Canada.

They winter in humid forests from Mexico to Northern South America and from Central Florida to Cuba.

In Florida they arrive on their breeding grounds in late March or early April and migrate south between mid-August to the middle of October.

This medium-sized songbird is a large sturdy built flycatcher with a bright yellow belly. It has a cinnamon-colored tail and wings, pale wingbars and a large, broad-based, dark bill. Immature birds quickly molt into adult-like plumage. When resting they will tilt their head to one side inquisitively.

Great Crested Flycatchers are more often heard than seen. They make the same far-carrying "wee-eep" calls on their breeding and wintering grounds. This species also makes a noisy grating call.

These birds prefer living in open areas in woodlands, old orchards and urban areas with large shade trees. They are often seen hovering around in the top of the canopy foraging for insects and other invertebrates, or picking small fruit.

They catch flying insects, glean insects off of leaves and will drop down from trees to take their prey on the ground. They prefer to fly from place to place on the ground instead of walking.

Their nests are found in natural cavities, nest boxes or other structures, such as mail boxes or rain gutters. These nest cavities are usually filled with leaf litter, hair, feathers, small twigs and trash, which are piled to the top of the cavity hole.

Many of the nests contain snakeskin or crinkly materials, such as cellophane, plastic wrappers or onion skin.

Egg laying in Florida usually takes place in April, May or June.

The female will lay three to eight creamy white to pinkish-brown streaked eggs, which are incubated for 13 to 17 days. The young are

born helpless, but are covered with some down.


Both parents care for the young, defend the nest vigorously from predators and will remove the fecal sacs.

The nestlings fledge when they are 13 to 17 days old, but remain with their parents in the nesting area for about three weeks.

Great Crested Flycatchers are being reported nesting near homes, in parks and wooded areas in inland Florida. Listen for their loud calls or find them watching quietly from exposed perches.

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
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Crossword Puzzle

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Gas Price Update

Average retail gasoline prices in Florida have risen 6.0 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.61/g Sunday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 8,237 gas outlets in Florida.

This compares with the national average that has increased 3.2 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.68/g, according to gasoline price website GasBuddy.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Florida during the past week, prices yesterday were 22.2 cents per gallon higher than the same day one year ago and are 12.1 cents per gallon higher than a month ago.

The national average has increased 9.9 cents

per gallon during the last month and stands 19.0 cents per gallon higher than this day one year ago.

"The national average has seen the upward trend continuing, with average prices climbing across an abundance of the U.S.," said GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "The price of WTI oil continues to rise to levels not seen in quite some time, and that may continue, at least for the time being, to put more upward pressure on gasoline prices. While the worst may be behind us, I do believe the week ahead will likely feature another rise in the national average," DeHaan said.

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
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Emergency Scams Increase with Summer Travel

"Hi, Gram, I need your help and you have to promise not to tell Mom and Dad. I got arrested in Mexico and I need \$2,000 bail money ..."

"Grandpa, I'm in London with my college roommate. You remember Carol? We were robbed last night in a pub and now I have no money to get home."

Consumer scams are a serious problem in North America, and this is one of the most common: the Emergency Scam, where the scammer poses as a friend or family member in trouble, often overseas, and requests that money be sent.

It's sometimes called the Grandparent Scam because seniors are often targeted by scammers pretending to be grandchildren.

During the summer travel season, there is an increased potential for Emergency or Grandparent Scams to occur. More people are traveling and whenever people are vulnerable, fraudsters will generally attack.

Emergency scams play off people's emotions and strong desire to help others in need. Scammers impersonate their victims' loved ones, often using information they've picked up on social media, and make

up an urgent situation – I've been arrested, I've been mugged, I'm in the hospital. The scammer makes an urgent plea for help ... and money. In most cases, the scammer asks for money to be wired immediately. The victim often responds quickly and without checking first to see if the pleading voice on the other end of the phone really is their grandchild or other loved one.

Better Business Bureau (BBB) has partnered

with Western Union in an effort to educate consumers about how to protect themselves from Emergency Scams during the summer travel season.

Western Union offers these "Money Transfer Never Evers" to help consumers avoid scams:

Never use a money transfer service to send money to someone you have not met in person.

Never send money for an emergency situation without verifying that it's a real emergency; ignore the caller's plea not to tell others; confirm through other friends and family.

Never send funds received by check until it officially clears in your account, which can take several days, or more.

mately 8:49 p.m that day.

Speaking to deputies, the woman told deputies she was sitting in her vehicle near the intersection of Southwest Fifth Street and Southwest Avenue B when a man she knows by the street name of "Poosie" approached her.

She knew Poosie by his last name too, having gone to school with him. Poosie, who she identified as having a scar on his chest from previous open heart surgery, had also shot her older brother in the past.

The woman said Poosie asked for a ride for "food", a term she took to mean to buy marijuana. When she refused, the suspect quickly grew

irate, pointing a handgun at her and threatening to "murk" her, meaning to kill her.

Deputies scoured the area in search of a suspect fitting the description, finding individuals who seemed to match the suspect but were not. Before long, deputies caught up with the man at 225 Southwest Fifth Street, the same location where the incident occurred.

Ricardo Terrell, the suspect, was ordered to stop at gunpoint, with deputies noting his previous criminal history and the nature of the crime. According to the report, even after he was in handcuffs, Ricardo did not ask why he was being arrested.

He did, however, become irate, yelling at the deputies and requesting to speak with a sergeant. No gun was found on Terrell.

He was arrested and charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon.

purchase a three-bedroom, two-bathroom brick and mortar home for them in Belle Glade," said Ms. Smith. Ms. Rodriguez now has much less to worry about. The organization purchased the home, paid the first year's taxes, and two months of water and electricity.

All of the repairs, painting, landscaping, and items were performed or donated by Glades residents.

"We would like to thank Grace Construction, Badcock Furniture, Hispanic Belle Glade Church, Tripp Electric, and everyone who help in any way to get this family back on their feet," said Ms. Smith.

Through an interpreter, Ms. Rodriguez tells how grateful she is.

"I can't understand why God blessed me like this. I don't deserve it," she said. It all seems so surreal to the children; Ms. Rodriguez said she

has to explain many of the things to the children like why the house is cold and her little girl does not sweat anymore.

Most children have to be reminded to take their showers, but the Rodriguez children continually ask if it is time for their shower because Ms. Rodriguez no longer has to heat water up on the stove for baths. Ms. Rodriguez's 4-year old son claimed his title as "man of the house" by claiming his seat at the head of the family's new kitchen table.

The children are excited to begin a new school year at a new school but they have no school supplies, uniforms, and very few articles of clothing. Ms. Rodriguez had to throw most of their clothes away because their trailer was infested with rodents and they would eat holes in everything they came in contact with.

It took a trailer donated by Ford to house the group's supplies and equipment and a convoy of 12 large vans to transport the 80 volunteers from eight different churches from the Philadelphia area to Pahokee.

Pursuant to Rules 28-106.201 and 28-106.301, Fla. Admin. Code, initiation of an administrative hearing shall be made by written petition to the SFWMD in legible form on 8 and 1/2 by 11 inch white paper. All petitions shall contain:

1. Identification of the action being contested, including the permit number, application number, District file number or any other SFWMD identification number, if known.
2. The name, address and telephone number of the petitioner and petitioner's representative, if any.
3. An explanation of how the petitioner's substantial interests will be affected by the agency determination.
4. A statement of when and how the petitioner received notice of the SFWMD's decision.
5. A statement of all disputed issues of material fact. If there are none, the petitioner must so indicate.
6. A concise statement of the ultimate facts alleged, including the specific facts the petitioner contends warrant reversal or modification of the SFWMD's proposed action.
7. A statement of the specific rules or statutes the petitioner contends require reversal or modification of the SFWMD's proposed action.
8. If disputed issues of material fact exist, the statement must also include an explanation of how the alleged facts relate to the specific rules or statutes.
9. A statement of the relief sought by the petitioner, stating precisely the action the petitioner wishes the SFWMD to take with respect to the SFWMD's proposed action.

A person may file a request for an extension of time for filing a petition. The SFWMD may, for good cause, grant the request. Requests for extension of time must be filed with the SFWMD prior to the deadline for filing a petition for hearing. Such requests for extension shall contain a certificate that the moving party has consulted with all other parties concerning the extension and that the SFWMD and any other parties agree to or oppose the extension. A timely request for extension of time shall toll the running of the time period for filing a petition until the request is acted upon.

If the District takes action with substantially different impacts on water resources from the notice of intended agency decision, the persons who may be substantially affected shall have an additional point of entry pursuant to Rule 28-106.111, Fla. Admin. Code, unless otherwise provided by law.

Mediation

The procedures for pursuing mediation are set forth in Section 120.573, Fla. Stat., and Rules 28-106.111 and 28-106.401-405, Fla. Admin. Code. The SFWMD is not proposing mediation for this agency action under Section 120.573, Fla. Stat., at this time.

RIGHT TO SEEK JUDICIAL REVIEW

Pursuant to Sections 120.60(3) and 120.68, Fla. Stat., a party who is adversely affected by final SFWMD action may seek judicial review of the SFWMD's final decision by filing a notice of appeal pursuant to Florida Rule of Appellate Procedure 9.110 in the Fourth District Court of Appeal or in the appellate district where a party resides and filing a second copy of the notice with the SFWMD Clerk within 30 days of rendering of the final SFWMD action.

Palm Beach County Awarded for Model Practice

NACCHO Recognizes Florida Health Palm Beach County for Practice Tuberculosis Identification and Treatment

The National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO) has selected Florida Health in Palm Beach County's Tuberculosis (TB) screening program as a model practice for the country.

With the implementation of the Florida Tuberculosis System of Care, Florida Health in Palm Beach County began evaluating how to better identify persons with Latent TB Infection or TB

Disease.

People with Latent TB Infection, in most cases, have immune systems that "wall off" or control the TB bacteria and show no sign of illness. Individuals with TB disease have immune systems that cannot control the bacteria. As the bacteria multiplies, the individual gets progressively ill, experiencing fatigue, fever, weight loss, night sweats and, as it infects the lungs, uncontrolled coughing, phlegm,

bleeding and chest pain.

Florida Health Palm Beach County's Refugee Clinic councils, evaluates and tests 1,200 persons per year from countries where TB is more prevalent. The initial screening for TB uses a test called PPD, which is a solution injected just under the skin that contains mycobacterium antigens other than TB bacteria and can produce a greater incidence of false positives when the patient returns for a reading several days later.

Doctors and nurses in the refugee clinic instituted an alternative form of blood testing called Interferon Gamma Release Assay (IGRA). IGRA is laboratory reviewed and does not require a return visit by the patient to read the results. The

new method proved to be much more accurate and produced far fewer false positives.

The more efficient testing allows for fewer patient visits for evaluation, and gets those with a positive result into treatment sooner. The IGRA method of TB screening is now recognized as a model practice that demonstrates exemplary and replicable qualities in response to a local public health need.

Savita Kumar, M.D., director of Public Health Residency for Florida Health Palm Beach County, was instrumental in developing the methodology and implementation of the testing and accepted the award on behalf of the department at the NACCHO national conference.

We Were Here: The People of Belle Glade

PEOPLE of the water
**FISH APLENTY:
LIVING OFF THE LAND AND LAKE**

A VAST VARIETY of fish, fowl, mammals, deer, reptiles, and amphibians assured ample calories, although rising and falling water tables shifted hunting and fishing strategies from season to season. Hunting gear included bows-and-arrows, atlatls (spear throwers), and clubs. Fishing tackle and techniques included lines, nets, traps, and weirs (dams set in waterways to trap fish). Forays to the coast brought back shark, shellfish, and other marine resources to the lake area. An archaeological assessment of animal bones at Fort Center found a high ratio of fish. Deer meat also provided a large number of calories. Some historical records relate that certain roots, possibly coontie (*Zamia floridana*, from which a flour can be made), were important as food.

Exhibit takes a look at the historic significance of the Belle Glade Culture

In 2011 the Florida Bureau of Historic Preservation issued a special call for museum traveling exhibitions on topics related to Viva Florida 500, Florida's recognition of the arrival of the Spanish in 1513. The Lawrence E. Will Museum: A Museum of the Glades of Belle Glade proposed an exhibition entitled "We Were Here: We the People of the Belle Glade Culture Welcomed You." The terms of an award required the exhibition to travel to smaller communities during the first half of 2013.

The names that many prehistoric American peoples who flourished for millennia called themselves have been lost. When modern scholars learn enough about an ancient people to judge that they were unique in the design of their implements, social structure, longevity, and even body features, the name "culture" is used to describe them.

The people who mastered living in the vast Kissimmee River/Lake Okeechobee/Upper Everglades watershed for 3,000 years are named the Belle Glade Culture after the mound where they were first identified in modern times through excavations of a large mound in Belle Glade by the Smithsonian Institution in 1934. They controlled the region from present-day Kissimmee

to Boynton Beach to the upper reaches of the Caloosahatchee River. The museum calls them "The People of the Water."

We Were Here is the first-ever comprehensive exhibition on the People of the Water. It was prepared by Archaeologist Robert Carr and his Archaeological and Historical Conservancy staff. Its introductory Viva Florida 500 tour took the exhibition for showings to Moore Haven, Lake Placid, Belle Glade, Okeechobee, Stuart, and Kissimmee – all areas the people occupied.

The Cultural Council is its first post-tour showing. This is most appropriate since three major Belle Glade Culture sites are in Palm Beach County: Big Mound City between Loxahatchee and Canal Point, Boynton Mound Complex near Route 441, and Belle Glade Mound.

There is rising scholarly interest in the little-known Belle Glade Culture, with much excavation and discovery yet to be done.

The next venue to host this exhibition is the Richard and Pat Johnson Palm Beach County History Museum from September 3, 2013 through June 29, 2014. Two stories will be told simultaneously in the exhibition – the history of the Belle Glade People and the experience uncovering the sites. Many of the artifacts discovered by our state's own "Indiana Jones" archaeologists will be displayed along with plenty of text and illustrations.

Generic Prayers ... or Something Else?

Naiman was a commander for the King of Aram (2 Kings 5ff). He did great things for the king, but he suffered from leprosy.

Needless to say, the king was worried about his "valiant soldier" and wanted things to be better for him. A slave girl that served Naiman's wife told her about seeing the prophet Elisha in Samaria. Out of desperation, Naiman tells his king about the possibility of being healed.

The story goes on: The King of Aram asks a favor from the King of Israel, but the latter is fearful. He remarks, "Am I God?" Nevertheless, when Elisha hears of his king's plight, he says, "Have the man come to me and he will know there is a prophet in Israel." Elisha is obviously a man of faith and not daunted by the difficulty of the situation. Naiman shows up at Elisha's house, complete with chariots, horses and contingent. Elisha sends out a messenger to say, "Go and wash in the Jordan seven times ... (v. 10)," and Naiman is

incensed. He talks about better rivers back home, surely the prophet would come out and wave his hand over him, but no, he sends only a messenger. Naiman's servants get hold of him and convince him to do what the prophet bids him to do.

He does it and he is healed. That is the story of many of us. We expect God to act in a certain way for us, but God chooses otherwise. We are anticipating what God should do and He goes and does something else. We call upon Him when our other "gods" let us down, and we don't like the answer.

I see God at work in strange ways sometimes, but He's in there working even if I don't always understand, or things aren't going as I think they ought to go.

That's something I've come to believe and

know. Elisha speaks for the God he knows and doesn't pull any punches. He tells his king, "Have the man come to me ..." and Naiman shows up.

Elisha is a man of faith in spite of the wrangling between kings, or the political ramifications of "what if we fail" or the trying to second guess the powers that be.

He will pray. He has faith his prayers will be answered, and his prayers were answered. Today, I've seen a lot of pray-ers who attempt to be "politically correct" and not offend anyone with their prayers, to try to be all-inclusive lest someone not like their offerings. I believe that when someone calls upon me to pray, they want me to use prayers that speak to the God I know and who will act. I

am not denigrating the prayers of others. They do the same thing and I respect their invoking God

as they understand Him. At one level, I believe we all offer such prayers. Elisha no doubt knew there were gods in Aram, but was called upon because of his faith in the God he knew.

In the meantime and in the tradition of Elisha and so many, many others, let us offer our best: that we contribute to the breadth and depths of the traditions of faith, with all of the richness and variety that may add to our understanding.

Belle Glade Elementary will enforce a mandatory dress code for the 2013-2014 school year. This dress code was developed in compliance with School Board Policy 5.182 and received majority approval from the School Advisory Council, Belle Glade Elementary Staff, and the community at large. This policy strives to enhance school safety, reduce peer pressure and student conflict, foster school pride and enrich the educational environment.

All students are required to wear the following: Long or short sleeve collared polo style shirts, any solid color. Pants, shorts, skirts or jumpers in khaki, black, navy, gray or green (no jeans). All pants and shorts must be worn on the waist with a belt if they have belt loops. Jeans will be allowed on Fridays only with a school spirit shirt or any solid polo shirt. Jeans may also be worn when the temperature drops below 50 degrees. All shoes must be closed at the toe and heel. Heelies, flip flops, sandals or slides will not be permitted at any time.

The registration dates are August 1 through 16 from 8 a.m. to 12 a.m. and 1 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. The following documentation is required in or-

der to register: two proofs of residence, child's birth certificate and updated shot records.

Kindergarten

The Palm Beach County Division of Mosquito Control has scheduled an aerial spraying for Friday evening (July 26) beginning at sundown, weather permitting.

The planned coverage area of approximately 190,000 acres will target populated areas west of the turnpike including Wellington, Royal Palm Beach, The Acreage and Loxahatchee, Jupiter Farms, Palm Beach Country Estates and Caloosa, and the Glades communities. The aircraft used is a Huey helicopter.

Aerial spraying is necessary to control the mosquito population that has increased during the recent heavy rains. To further help control mosquitoes, residents are asked to drain or minimize standing water on their properties.

If you are going to be outdoors after dark, use an insect repellent containing DEET and wear long pants and a long-sleeve shirt.
