Graham Found Guilty

Jury finds man responsible in murder of Jimmy McMillan

Days after the murder of Jimmy McMillan in 2012, residents of the city of Belle Glade showed their solidarity and marched for peace. Corey Graham's conviction this week serves to put an end to this chapter in the city's history.

A verdict was reached in a case that seemed to galvanize the Glades communities, as a jury found Corey Graham, 20, guilty in the murder of Jimmy McMillan.

The verdict was handed down at the Palm Beach County Courthouse last Thursday, August 15, providing some closure for the community in this closely watched case.

The crime had been noted both for its senselessness and the outpouring of support for the victim's family that resulted. In a show of solidarity, citizens from all sides of the racial

spectrum marched together in condemnation of the murder.

Jimmy McMillan, 49, was well-liked in the community. His involvement in a modest grocery store operating out of the predominately black section of Belle Glade, and his constant support of his customers — he was known to extend credit to people with little money — was well-known.

News of his murder after a failed robbery attempt at the store in early January 2012 drew outcries from every corner of the city, leading up to the suspect's identification and arrest.

The harbored feelings and resentments came to a head last week at the courthouse in West Palm Beach.

After the jury made the announcement of Graham's guilt, and with sentencing being considered, a flurry

of verbal volleys flew across the courtroom, with the family of McMillan and the suspect himself sharing an exchange of insults.

Connie Deaton, whose knees shook with nervousness and anger on a cold January morning as she pleaded for help in solving her brother's murder, last Thursday seemed aroused with anger.

"I hope you rot in hell!" she yelled to Graham.

The courtroom erupted in activity, with Graham firing back at Deaton. Deputies cleared the courtroom and the judge rescheduled the sentencing.

Graham will receive his sentencing in early September. With the first degree murder conviction, however, Graham will spend the rest of his life in prison with no chance of parole.

Musings on True Professionals: Respect for Real Educators

I have noted the proliferation of honorific titles people like today, one of the most common being "doctor." One medical professional is lobbying to have the title restricted to medical doctors (this came as no surprise to me!) and was reminiscent of years gone by when the "doctor" was involved in healing of people and given respect in his community. Nowadays, there are scads of "doctors." It's interesting to me to look at how the title is sometimes conferred.

Certain religious institutions offer doctoral degrees for a few summers of home reading and a rather lengthy "term paper." "Schools" offer them with varying degrees (no pun intended) of rigor and they seem to have an appeal to some who simply must have that title. For me, it came after three and a half years of full-time study and earning two Master's degrees, one from a secular university and one from a seminary. My school

was accredited (many are not accredited) by the U.S. Department of Education and regional accrediting agencies. My work was in one of the healing arts -- an adjunctive skill to my ministry.

In Jesus' day, "Rabbi" was a title of dignity and given to designate those specially revered. Jesus cautioned His followers that there was an equality among them, that they were to follow the one Master and Teacher (Matthew 23:10). He even took exception when a ruler called Him "Good teacher ..." (Luke 18:18), not being concerned about being called "teacher" or "rabbi" but "good." God alone was designated as "good," Jesus' teaching came with a sense of place and humility.

He was revered by the ruler because of what He did and taught, not because of titles. I regard it as unfortunate that we do not hold "teacher" in the same esteem as it once was held: an honorable profession worthy of being respected with the same dignity as that of all true profes-

sionals. Many of them have levels of education equivalent to those in the healing arts and have much to offer to those they serve. I was behind a teacher recently at a check-out counter. She was stocking up on school supplies -- crayons and pencils, notebooks and book-bags. There were too many items to have been a purchase of her own children; it was obvious to me that she was a teacher. I told her, "I hope they appreciate it!" and watched as a three-digit total was rung up. She smiled and commented that she was trying to take advantage of the tax rebate that comes annually for school items. Her purchase was sizeable enough to make this rebate worth seeking on a teacher's salary. I knew I was in the presence of a professional, one worthy of being called "teacher" in the fullest meaning of the term.

I have shared in their ranks, teaching at a Church school, at the college level, in ministerial training programs and in ministry for many

years. The work of being a pastor is teaching on many levels; much of the work is on a one-to-one level and involves sharing between two persons with the hope that the seeker may benefit from a fellow searcher. One of my mentors, a college professor who entered the ministry later in life, shared some Greek etymology, Education, he said, comes from Greek, meaning "to bring out," and has to do with being able to draw out of us what was already inside, making us realize what we knew all of the time.

"Education" is putting it into words, asking the right questions, pointing out what was there, making us realize for ourselves ... and being that genius who can do it. Education in faith is finding what fills that God-sized hole in a heart and showing us who fills it. The rabbi is the one who did it. Those who bring out the best in us, who we really are, deserve our respect and honor. Their presence, dedication and love for their work is an honor that no title can bring.

New Health Findings Can Help Combat Common Ailments

From high blood pressure to cancer, serious ailments often strike, despite efforts to maintain good health.

With the rapid pace of medical advancements and treatment options emerging, conventional medical wisdom can sometimes lag behind innovations in disease management. Furthermore, there's often little attention paid to nutrition's role in health conditions.

"Our healthcare system is a disease model, not a prevention model, and reimbursement is based upon sickness, not wellness. We need to better integrate all facets of care," says Dr. Steven V. Joyal, chief medical officer with Life Extension, Inc., an organization dedicated to increasing the functional human lifespan.

It's this thinking that spurred the creation of Life Extension's 2014 edition of the Disease Prevention and Treatment Book, which seeks to fill those gaps. From cancer to multiple sclerosis, the book offers 1,400 pages of information on integrating pharmaceutical treatment options, nutritional support and lifestyle changes for optimal health.

For example, high blood pressure: A major risk factor for heart disease, stroke, congestive

heart failure and kidney disease, high blood pressure threatens the life of every third American adult.

Intensive lifestyle changes can ease blood pressure management. When this isn't enough, pharmaceutical options can help. For example, blood pressure is best controlled with lower doses of multiple antihypertensive medications rather than a single large dose of medication. Furthermore, side effects can be greatly reduced.

"Many patients are lulled into a false sense of security by normal blood pressure readings at their periodic doctor's visits. But quite frequently,

patients experience gaps in control, putting them at risk for stroke and heart attack," says Joyal.

Joyal recommends considering the following: With an inexpensive at-home blood pressure monitor, take readings at multiple times throughout the day, tracking values over time. A doctor can determine whether to modify the current treatment regimen based upon the results.

Stay fit and exercise. A healthy body weight and high degree of cardiorespiratory fitness reduce hypertension risk, and can help one achieve better control if one is already suffering from hypertension.

Hold the salt. High sodium intake can make high blood pressure worse. Read labels. Even if one is not adding extra salt to meals, many pre-packaged convenience foods, meats and cheeses contain significant amounts of sodium.

Get plenty of beneficial nutrients, especially potassium and magnesium, which are important for vascular health.

Rheumatoid Arthritis

Rheumatoid arthritis could pose more than just a risk to comfort. Systemic inflammation hastens the onset of other age-related diseases, including cardiovascular disease.

"For optimal longevity, we need to integrate

lifestyle changes with pharmaceutical treatments, rather than blindly assume that all a patient needs is more medication," says Joyal.

In addition to doctor-prescribed treatments, Life Extension researchers have scoured medical literature, finding several nutrients that help support health in rheumatoid arthritis patients: fish oil, krill oil blend, Gamma linolenic acid, vitamin D, vitamin B6, green tea extract, quercetin, and folate.

By taking advantage of new findings in medicine and science, optimal health may be better achieved.



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Belle Glade is Awarded \$1 Million for Street Repair

The city of Belle Glade has released the long awaited list of roads to be repaired with newly secured funding. Months back, Commissioner Michael Martin and Vice Mayor Mary Wilkerson traveled to Tallahassee to petition the state for funds to repair the city's streets.

City officials competed with other cities in Palm Beach County for the state's attention to matters important to their respective cities. Commissioner Martin said, "This is the most important trip that a city official can take to request funds that the city desperately needs."

Belle Glade received \$1 million of the requested \$12 million of state and federal funds. The efforts are not only part of the city's beautification plan but are also desperately needed, officials said. Many of Belle Glade's roads are in such disrepair that some neighborhoods have large potholes while others have bumps that look like small hills.

The city worked with the Florida Department of Transportation to determine which roads needed the most attention and how much each road would require in funding. East Canal Street North between Main Street and Southeast Seventh Street North is the first road on the city's prioritized list; the road is expected to cost almost \$72,000.

Northeast Third Street between East Canal Street North and Northeast Avenue H will cost the most to repair with a price tag of more than \$76,000 and is planned to be the second road to be repaired. Other roads include Southwest Second Street, Northwest First Street, Southeast Ninth Street, Fleming Drive, Sara Road, and Vaughn Circle.

Florida Senator Joseph Abruzzo played a key role in Belle Glade's request for funding being granted. He is also working with city officials to help Belle Glade with other projects.

Mayor Steve Wilson expressed his gratitude to Senator Abruzzo.

"I wish to extend special appreciation and recognition to our State Legislators, especially Senator Abruzzo, and county representatives for making this vital project a reality," he said.

"I would also like to recognize the Belle Glade City Commission, our city manager, Lomax Harrelle, and staff for their dedicated efforts and perseverance. Without everyone's untiring efforts this project would have remained a dream," he said.

"I'd also like to acknowledge the value of our citizens input in this project, as they assisted the city in determining and prioritizing the roads that were in dire need of repair. I feel extremely blessed, as this project will not only beautify our city, it will enhance the safety of our residents and visitors, and bring about much needed jobs."

Task Force, narcotics agent, and executive officer of the violent crimes division are some of the roles he has filled throughout his career. 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Inland Birding Fun: Common Grackle

Common Grackles breed in most areas in North America east of the Rocky Mountains and south of the tundra. Of the three subspecies of this bird, the one known as the Florida Grackle (*Q.q. guiscual*) lives year-round from Southeastern North Carolina south through Florida. The existing subspecies of Common Grackle are distinguished by the color of their back, tail, belly and, to a lesser extent, their head.

Florida Grackles appear to be black from a distance, but normally have a greenish-black back, blue-green tail, purple head and purple-blue belly. These large, lanky birds are smaller than Boat-tailed Grackles.

Their head is flat and they have a slightly downward-curved bill that is longer than those of most blackbirds. Males are slightly larger than females. Young birds are dark brown with a dark eye that turns bright gold when they become adults.

The oldest recorded Common Grackle lived to be 22 years and 11 months old. Common Grackle fossils, which have been found from

Florida to Ontario, have been dated to the Pleistocene Era 12,000 years ago.

These noisy, gregarious birds communicate with body motions, as well as sounds. Males will make a threatening bill-up display, which consists of an upward movement of the head so the bill is almost vertical, or they will spread their tail feathers into a keeled "V" shape accompanied by exaggerated flapping of the wings in response to another male.

Common Grackles songs include a variety of squeaks, whistles and croaks. The typical song of males and females is a guttural "readle-eak," followed by high-pitched clear whistles. They

make a short harsh "chaa" or "chitip" call when alarmed, taking flight or being approached by other grackles. Males' singing decreases through incubation, but they will make a short nasal call while perching in the nesting colony.

These birds prefer habitats near fresh water in cypress swamps, pine forests, hammocks, orange groves and suburban areas. Large flocks are often seen foraging on lawns for seeds or in feedlots and on agricultural fields for grains such as corn or rice. They also eat invertebrates and mice, wade into water to catch small fish, rob eggs from birds' nests and eat adult birds.

Migrating Common Grackles return to their nesting ground from mid-February through early March, with males arriving about a week before the females. In Florida, egg laying may begin as early as March or as late as July.

Females usually choose the nest site and build the nest with occasional help from the male. The bulky nest is built in trees, cattails, bushes, broken stubs, old woodpecker holes and, occasionally, the underside of an active Osprey nest. It is located about two feet above ground or water and is made of coarse grasses, pine needles, roots, twigs, roots and mud. The female lays one to seven slightly glossy eggs, which she incubates for 10 to 14 days while the male remains close by, guarding the nest from predators. Both parents feed the helpless young by forcing food into the hatching mouths. The young fledge at 16 to 20 days of age.

Panther Sightings Reported in South Florida

The public has reported hundreds of sightings of Florida panthers to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's (FWC) website. The website was launched a year ago and is a place for people to record when and where they saw a panther or its tracks.

As of August 2013, the public had submitted 790 sightings to MyFWC.com/PantherSightings.

Only 12 percent of the reports included a photograph and could be evaluated by Commission biologists. Of those with photos, the majority were

confirmed as panthers. Other animals identified by FWC biologists were bobcats, foxes, coyotes, dogs, house cats and even a monkey. Most often, the reported animal or tracks belonged to a bobcat, not a panther. The verified panther reports were largely confined to Southwest Florida, the well-documented breeding range for panthers in the state. There were also several verified sightings in South-Central Florida.

"The public's willingness to share what they have seen or collected on game cameras is in-

credibly helpful and shows us where panthers presumably are roaming in Florida," said Darrell Land, who heads the FWC's panther team. "We thank everyone using the Report Florida Panther Sightings website and encourage others to participate in this citizen-science venture.

"As the population of this endangered species grows, the FWC expects more Florida panthers to be seen in areas of the state where they have not lived for decades," Land said. "To properly plan and manage for the expansion of the pan-

ther's range in Florida, information about where the panthers are is vital."

The FWC has a new "E-Z guide to identify panther tracks," available at www.FloridaPantherNet.org. The Florida panther population is estimated to be 100 to 160 adults and yearlings, a figure that does not include panther kittens. As recently as the 1970s, the Florida panther was close to disappearing, with as few as 20 animals in the wild. Learn more about Florida panthers at www.FloridaPantherNet.org.



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
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Raising Awareness Naegleria Fowleri Infection

The Florida Department of Health in Hendry and Glades counties continue to raise awareness about *Naegleria fowleri* in light of the recent confirmed case.

There is a standard process that the Department of Health follows for all diseases, regardless of the disease. That process involves interviewing the family to ask about possible exposure sources.

The Department of Health is working closely with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the CDC provided the testing that confirmed the case in Glades County.

The exact water source of exposure cannot be exactly identified because the amoeba occurs naturally in warm freshwater sources such as rivers, lakes, ponds, canals and ditches.

Because the amoeba is found in most freshwater sources, and because of the inconsistency

in test results, the CDC does not recommend specific testing of freshwater sources.

For informational research, the CDC does collect information such as water temperatures, water depths, water clarity and air temperatures in the surrounding areas of where a case has been confirmed. The low number of infections makes it difficult to know why a few people have been infected compared to the millions of other people that used the same or similar waters across the U.S.

There were local news reports questioning

exposure risks from water sprinklers. According to the CDC, there are no reports of infections from this route of exposure in the U.S. and it would be very unlikely that this activity could lead to infection.

If the sprinklers are using canal water, there would be a slightly higher risk, but it would still be very unlikely to contract the disease, since people would not generally force that water up their nose.

The organism is most commonly found in warm freshwater (lakes, rivers, ponds, canals and ditches). It should be removed in treated

tap water that uses filtration and disinfection and would not be expected to be found in groundwater from private wells (the water is cooler than ideal for *Naegleria* growth and there would not be abundant bacteria for *Naegleria* to feed on).


Ways to reduce your risk of infection:

Limit the amount of water going up your nose.

Hold your nose shut, use nose clips or keep your head above water when taking part in warm freshwater-related activities.

Avoid water-related activities in warm freshwater during periods of high water temperature and low water levels.

Avoid digging in or stirring up the sediment while taking part in water-related activities in shallow, warm freshwater areas.



Fitting the Puzzle

PIONEER PARK ELEMENTARY

Every school has its own unique personality, just like every neighborhood, just like every child. Sometimes, we focus on details or zoom in on missing gaps and need a little guidance in seeing the “big picture.”

Principal Mary Ford, after treating her staff to a delicious, down-home style breakfast (thank you, Ms. Vera Canty and staff!), preliminary greetings and general back-to-school housekeeping, had a surprise for her faculty.

Dr. Matthew Shoemaker, area superintendent, arrived just in time for Ms. Ford’s enthusiastic announcement, “The bus is here, we’re going on a field trip!”

Ms. Cleola Pringle good-naturedly served as tour-guide while teachers traveled by yellow school bus through neighborhoods in Pioneer Park’s attendance zone.

“This is the trailer park! This is Okeechobee Center! We are now entering Glades Glen, but some of the kids still call it Palm Glades!” exclaimed an excited Ms. Pringle.

There was light chatter, eyes out the window. It was early, there were no children in yards, streets or sidewalks; still, if you listened closely enough, you might just hear it ... the echoes of the past, traces of the present and hints of the not-so-distant future.

There -- if you caught it -- was the plastic, weighted on the rooftop of a trailer, flapping in the breeze, a bitter reminder of the utter devastation of the hurricanes that swept our area eight years ago. Many Sugar Bears returned to school while living in shelters, grateful for the clothes, shoes, toys, books and furnishings donated toward starting over. They were excited to finally return to some semblance of normalcy, which Pioneer Park then represented, and were joyous to have survived with their families intact.

As one little kindergartner exclaimed, braids bouncing jauntily, “We don’t have a house no more! But, I’m still alive!” Perhaps you remember, Pioneer Park rose like a phoenix to an ‘A’ following the hurricane. Maybe you saw a bike suddenly left on its side by the side of the road, and recalled an innocent childhood outing that ended abruptly and led to sirens and the chop of helicopter wings.

This image whispered of a tragic drive-by shooting of an older sibling, the broken family touched by the outpouring of love when the teachers presented classmates’ cards of caring, compassion and support, the mother deeply moved by the communal embrace in her time of deepest need. Or did you see the pretty little garden lovingly tended by the Grandmother, struggling to hold her family together, grateful for the house-call that brought her Grandchild home to her immaculate living room? Maybe you heard the echoes of gratitude and hospitality she lavished and the rapt attention given while discussing her precious Grandchild.

Oh, yes, there, in the abandoned window, the diva poster, a trace of the present, a hint of the future, the girl with stars in her eyes, the teachers who encouraged her gift, the after-school singing and dancing lessons, the tears in the eyes of staff and families when she sang in the spring, touching hearts a final time before moving on.

Finally, that Internet Cafe sign, hinting at the learning games and technology expertise carried over into the home-life, the future blogger changing tomorrow’s world with his dreams inspired during a lesson when maybe he was acting out and we didn’t even know he was listening. This field trip offered a tiny glimpse into the missing puzzle pieces linking our students and families so indelibly with Pioneer Park. Back at the school, after analyzing our data, Ms. Ford pointed out that “research shows, when kids set goals, are shown positivity, are motivated and encouraged, it will help them move!”

She introduced the Sugar Bear mentoring program, rolling out for 2014, and explained that every available staff member will serve as a mentor to students.

“If our school treasurer, Ms. Beavers, can teach math, she will be paired to mentor a student needing support in math skills!” explained Ms. Ford, adding that effective mentors build supportive relationships with students.

Ms. Ford pointed to the four corners of the media center with the numbers one through four prominently displayed. She explained that when students are performing below grade-level expectations, there is often a series of blaming. Teachers can blame last year’s teacher, parents and home life, the student’s learning capacity

and behavior, or teachers (themselves), when scores fall below desired levels.

Ms. Ford said, “Here’s the scenario, as an ineffective teacher’s thinking, choose a corner where you most place blame for low scores.” She next invited a representative from each corner to express their reasoning. Dramatic comments flooded the open forum.

“See those teachers over there?” said Ms. Ford. “They didn’t teach a thing last year, they just didn’t care! How am I supposed to make up an entire missed grade level? What am I supposed to do when parents won’t enforce homework? Do you expect me to undo six years of lax home disciplinary attitudes? How can I possibly teach when they fill them up with candy and soda every morning and won’t put them to bed at night? Who can teach him when he won’t look or sit still? She won’t listen, she’s too busy playing or talking! I always get the kids who act up all the time, how am I supposed to teach?”

The next scenario invited “effective” teachers to choose a corner. While the majority of teachers moved to number four, the “teacher” or “personal responsibility” corner, some remained in opposing spots, playing devil’s advocate.

Ms. Ford then asked for spokespersons to expound on their views and convince others to change. Some speakers then persuaded others to join their group.

However, Ms. Shalanda O’Neal, math coach, eloquently explained, “The factors of former teachers, home life, parents and student abilities are variables beyond our control! We have to combine the only constant we have, ourselves, with student learning, and we must take that equation and run with it!”

She further stated, “We have to realize that we are given this amazing opportunity to positively impact and make a difference in a student’s life!”

Ms. Ford agreed, “We can’t change a student’s former circumstances. We are starting with right now! We have the tools, teachers have the knowledge and our students have the ability! Use what you have!” Ms. Ford stressed the pain an uncaring, ineffective teacher can inflict. “A mean teacher inspired me to become a teacher!”

She also explained that each teacher has a “bag of tricks” they go into when handling

student discipline. She invited suggestions and wrote those behavior management tips on an anchor chart as they were called out.

She asked, “Can you choose one of these that works all the time?” No one answered.

“The reason no one answered is because nothing works all the time!” said Ms. Ford. Teachers agreed that every student and every situation is unique. Ms. Ford asked, “Are these effective strategies?” while writing “screaming, “sarcasm,” “belittling and embarrassing,” and “arguing” on a board.

“Arguing. Why is arguing ineffective? Because the student is in front of peers, he must save face and has to win! You are the adult, I expect you to act like it! So everyone agrees these don’t work?” asked Ms. Ford. Everyone agreed. “Good! Then I will never see these behaviors exhibited by my teachers!” Ms. Ford forcefully spoke these words with a determined look and strode across the platform to a rapt silent audience.

She next asked groups to discuss, and then answer on anchor charts, three questions: How do you see our school? How do families view us? How do outsiders view us?

When the group captains brought their anchor charts together, it was truly amazing to see the cohesiveness in answers. Most said they saw our school as unique and caring, they felt the parents saw us as supportive and giving and most felt outsiders viewed us as poor and under-achieving.

Ms. Ford finally asked, “Now, among your group, choose one word describing how you want everyone to view us by the end of this brand new school year!” Each group chose the word “achievers” or a synonym thereof.

“I’m glad you originally chose the word unique,” said Ms. Ford. “Our school and students are unique, their needs are unique and so are our teachers. We are going to join these special qualities with our mentoring program, our knowledge of and belief in our kids and our goals for being ‘achievers.’ By the end of this year, that word will be the banner for our school!”

With this fitting together of the visionary puzzle, our leader sent us forth to impact student learning in school year 2014.

New Web and Smartphone Reef Map

The Board of Palm Beach County Commissioners and its Department of Environmental Resources Management (ERM) are pleased to announce a new natural and artificial reef map, available online and as a Smartphone app.

Since its inception in 1987, ERM has deployed artificial reefs using materials such as ships, concrete and lime rock boulders. With assistance from the Palm Beach County Reef Research Team citizen divers, ERM staff regularly monitors these reefs. Global Positioning System (GPS) is an integral component of this monitoring because it allows divers to locate and navigate the reefs that need to be surveyed. Once divers have located the reef, they use Geographic Information System (GIS) tools to analyze the GPS locations, allowing them to draw relationships between fish populations and a particular reef location.

In order to draw attention to the importance

of artificial reefs and to help recreational divers and sportsmen locate them, ERM created a web-based and Smartphone map that draws the reef location data in real-time from its survey database. Map users can view important information such as GPS coordinates and reef depth. In addition, the Smartphone app will also show the user’s location, which can be beneficial when navigating to a reef. The maps were created using existing county resources and Environmental Systems Research Institute’s (ESRI) ArcGIS online and Smartphone app.

participant is a Silver Gloves Champ and one female participant is winning in her category.

The crime prevention program is part of a non-profit corporation that seeks to build a positive relationship between youth, law enforcement and the community, using sports and other recreational activities. Deputy LeStrange explained that PAL is not just another program.

“PAL is based on the conviction that young people -- if they are reached early enough -- can develop strong positive attitudes towards police officers in their journey through life toward the goal of maturity and good citizenship,” he said.

Participants are supervised by and interact with officers who reinforce the positive values and attitudes instilled in them by their parents.

“Studies have shown that if a young person respects a police officer on the ball field, gym or classroom, the youth will likely come to respect the laws that police officers enforce,” said Deputy LeStrange. “Such respect is beneficial to

the youth, the police officer, the neighborhood and the business community.”

According to Deputy LeStrange, the relationship between sports and juvenile delinquency has been the subject of much discussion. Experts agree that sports can serve as an effective and powerful solution to delinquency.

“The idea that sport serves as a deterrent to delinquency was first espoused in the English public schools during the nineteenth century,” he said. “Sport was used as a substitute for stealing, bullying and drinking that dominated the leisure hours of the English students.”

Deputy LeStrange explains that youth sports programs have contributed significantly to the reduction of delinquency and instills certain desirable educational, social and personal values that prevent the occurrence of delinquency.

“PAL is a most effective tool in this effort,” he said.

ACCIONES PROPUESTAS: La FAA informó al Condado de Hendry que la solicitud preliminar para la participación del Aeropuerto de Airglades en el Programa Piloto de Privatización de Aeropuertos (PPP) fue aceptada el 18 de octubre de 2010. La carta también indicaba que el Condado de Hendry puede seleccionar un operador privado, negociar un acuerdo y presentar una solicitud final. El operador privado ha sido seleccionado; se han presentado borradores de los contratos de gestión y de compra a la FAA para su revisión; y una solicitud final está siendo preparada para ser presentada a la FAA en 2014. - Nuevo Centro de Distribución de Carga Aérea Percecedera, incluyendo todos los servicios de inspección asociados tales como el Departamento de Agricultura de los EE.UU., Aduanas y Protección de Fronteras de los EE.UU., y Administración de Seguridad del Transporte
- Nuevas Instalaciones de Mantenimiento, Reparación y Reconstrucción (MRO), incluyendo instalaciones para Pintura de Aeronaves y andenes de estacionamiento de aeronaves asociada
- Nuevas Instalaciones de Rescate de Aeronaves y Anti-Incendios (ARFF)
- Nuevas Instalaciones de Equipos de Soporte en Tierra (GSE)
- Nuevas Áreas de Anden para Aeronaves para apoyar 10 aeronaves de fuselaje ancho
- Nueva Torre de Control de Tráfico Aéreo (ATCT)
- Nuevas Instalaciones de Almacenamiento de Combustibles, incluyendo Anden de Hidrantes de Reaprovisionamiento de Combustible
- Nueva Bodega e Instalaciones de Distribución
- Acceso Vehicular y Estacionamiento para Vehículos y Camiones
- Mejoras del sitio incluyendo Drenaje, Detención de Aguas Pluviales, Servicios Públicos, etc.
- Establecimiento de Dos (2) Sistemas de Aterrizaje por Instrumentos (ILS) Categoría III, incluyendo los Sistemas de Luces de Aproximación (ALS) asociados, preparación del sitio e instalación de equipos

PREPARACIÓN DE LA EA: Las acciones de la FAA relacionadas con la privatización del Aeropuerto de Airglades y el desarrollo de una nueva pista para aviones de carga (e instalaciones relacionadas) requieren análisis ambientales, coordinación y documentación conforme con las disposiciones de la Ley Nacional de Política Ambiental de 1969 (NEPA) y la orientación contenida en el Manual Ambiental para Aeropuertos (Airport Environmental Handbook) (Orden 1050.1E) de la FAA y las Instrucciones de Implementación de la NEPA para Acciones Aeroportuarias (NEPA Implementing Instructions for Airport Actions) (Orden 5050.4B) de la FAA. Preparation of an Environmental Assessment and Scoping Meetings for Airglades Airport, Hendry County, Florida

SUMMARY: Pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969, Hendry County is preparing an Environmental Assessment (EA) to address the proposed privatization and subsequent development of a 10,000-foot air cargo runway and related cargo and aircraft maintenance facilities at the Airglades Airport, 1090 Airglades Blvd., Clewiston, Florida 33440. Once completed, the EA will be submitted to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) for the agency's decision to either prepare an Environmental Impact Statement or issue a Finding of No Significant Impact. To ensure all issues and public concerns related to the proposed actions are identified and considered in the EA, the County will hold one governmental agency Scoping Meeting and one public Scoping Meeting.

AIRPORT INFORMATION: The Airglades Airport is a public-use, general aviation airport. The airport presently has a 5,905-foot paved runway, access taxiways, aircraft parking apron, aircraft storage and maintenance hangars, and a passenger terminal building. The airport supports business flights (including jets), recreational flying, flight training, and sky diving activities. The airport also supports a relatively new industrial park. The Florida Dept. of Transportation shows that the airport had 24 based aircraft in 2011 and generated approximately 11,527 aircraft operations the same year.

PROPOSED ACTIONS: The FAA informed Hendry County that the preliminary application for Airglades Airport's participation in the Airport Privatization Pilot Program (APPP) was accepted on October 18, 2010. The letter also indicated that Hendry County may select a private operator, negotiate an agreement and submit a final application. The private operator has been selected; draft management and purchase agreements have been submitted to FAA for review; and a final application is being prepared for submission to the FAA in 2014. The proposed actions and airport development expected to occur if the application is approved include:

- Acquisition of the Airglades Airport by a Private Developer for the construction and operation of a new Perishable Air Cargo Complex
- Acquisition of approximately 250 additional acres of land to accommodate the new north/south runway development
- New 10,000'x150' Runway including parallel and connecting taxiways
- New Perishable Air Cargo Distribution Center, including all associated inspection services such as U.S. Department of Agriculture, U.S. Customs and Border Protection, and Transportation Security Administration
- New Maintenance, Repair, and Overhaul (MRO) Facilities, including Aircraft Paint Facility and associated aircraft parking apron
- New Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting (ARFF) Facility
- New Ground Support Equipment (GSE) Facility
- New Aircraft Apron Areas to support 10 wide-body Aircraft
- New Air Traffic Control Tower (ATCT) Facility
- New Fuel Storage Facilities, including Apron Hydrant Fueling
- New Warehouse and Distribution Facilities
- Vehicular Access and Automobile and Truck Parking Facilities
- Site Improvements including Drainage, Stormwater Detention, Utilities, Etc.
- Establishment of Two (2) Category III Instrument Landing Systems (ILS), including associated Approach Light Systems (ALS), Site Preparation, and Equipment Installation

EA PREPARATION: FAA actions related to the privatization of Airglades Airport and the development of a new air cargo runway (and related facilities) require environmental analysis, coordination, and documentation conforming to the provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) and guidance contained in the FAA's Airport Environmental Handbook (Order 1050.1E) and FAA's NEPA Implementing Instructions for Airport Actions (Order 5050.4B). Hendry County will prepare the EA and assess the environmental, social, and economic impacts associated with the proposed actions at the Airglades Airport. The EA will consider the No-Action Alternative, the Proposed Action, and other reasonable alternatives identified during Scoping and the EA process. A Draft EA will be circulated for public and agency review and comment. After review of the Draft EA, a Final EA will be submitted to the FAA for the agency's decision to either prepare an Environmental Impact Statement or issue a Finding of No Significant Impact.

SCOPING COMMENTS: Comments and suggestions are invited from federal, state, and local agencies; governments; Native American tribe officials and representatives; the public; and other interested parties to ensure that the full range of alternatives and all issues and public concerns related to the proposed action are identified and considered in the EA. Written comments and suggestions concerning the scope of the EA should be mailed to Hendry County at the address listed below. Comments should be post-marked no later than October 19, 2013.

Public and Agency Scoping Meetings: Hendry County will hold one (1) public scoping meeting to solicit input from the public and interested parties and one (1) agency scoping meeting to solicit input from federal, state, and local agencies, governments, and Native American officials and representatives which have jurisdiction by law or have specific expertise with respect to any environmental impacts associated with the proposed project. The public meeting will be held from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. The agency scoping meeting will be held from 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. and is being held specifically for agencies, government officials, and Native American tribe officials and representatives.
