Veteran of AIDS/HIV campaign continues serving community

The story of Sandra Chamblee is one about the journey of a self-proclaimed country girl into the throes of one of greatest medical epidemics her generation had ever seen. It is a story of hope in the face of hopelessness, and perseverance in the face of dogged challenges.

In her time as a Belle Glade resident, Ms. Chamblee has carved out a

niche that she hasn't always sought, but nevertheless stepped up to, as an advocate for those three tiny dots on the map that border Lake Okeechobee on its southeastern tip - the Glades.

The affable, bright-spirited attitude of Ms. Chamblee, the unassuming way she reaches out to all those she meets, with an approach that is both

Vote to Evict Marina Operator

Pahokee's city commissioners voted unanimously at Tuesday night's commission meeting to begin legal proceedings and have Wayne Gray evicted from the city's marina.

Mr. Gray owes the city six months of rent to the tune of \$13,500.

The commission and the attorney discussed buying the equipment and stock of liquor from Mr. Gray.

The initial amount agreed upon was \$30K; however, Gary Brandenburg, the city's attorney, stated that Mr. Gray called him the next day to change the amount because he believed he was underestimating the value of the inventory.

After much discussion and upon the advice of the city's attorney, Gary Brandenburg, the commission came to a consensus at Thursday's workshop that they would deny any monies presented by Mr. Gray because he had failed to follow through on many promises made. Mr. Brandenburg stated that he felt as though Mr.





The Gift of Being You

True relationships among people mean being who we really are. It is when we can say what is on our mind, be ourselves, act by our own principles and just be. That is the gift of real friendship -- no holding back, no worries about being politically correct, no concerns about being liked. It comes in friendship and marriages. It is present in childhood before we learned to conceal true feelings and worried about saying what we thought. Jesus quotes the Psalmist when He says: "Out of the mouths of infants and children your majesty is praised above the heavens (Psalm 8:2, quoted in Matthew 21:16)." The simplicity and honesty of it all leads to great insights. Over the years, I've encountered people who feel that they must play a certain role to succeed and are afraid of being themselves.

They were among clergy friends and acquaintances as well as lay persons. There are people who will quote scriptures or famous sayings and when asked "Do you really believe that?" come up with another answer; shifting from one role to another. All of this ultimately leads to some unhappiness and a great deal of frustration. I reflected on this topic as I read the confrontation between Jesus and some Pharisees (John 8:23ff).

Jesus spoke of being the light of the world. He was challenged: "Here you are as your own witness, your testimony is not valid (v.13)." Jesus replied "My testimony is valid, for I know where I come from and where I am going." It is evident that He realizes He is on a journey, but because He knows where He comes from and where He is going, He is secure within Himself. I've noticed that about people who do not adopt roles to play, speak of things they really don't believe or try to act in a way that isn't really them. They are consistent, the same from beginning to end and comfortable with who they are. They

do not live in different "compartments" in their lives and there is oneness in them.

The Lord is regarded as "Jesus Christ, the same yesterday and today and forever (Hebrews 13:8)"; this is the example He gives to us all. "Simply, let your 'yes' be 'yes' and your 'no' 'no'; anything beyond this comes from the evil one (Matthew 5:37)." Years ago, of my acquaintances was the Dean of a Nursing School. She would tell about the young ladies who had images of what it was to be a nurse, all dressed in white with a white cap and pin, and maybe a doctor in the offing. Very early in the program there were operating rooms to be prepared, babies to be changed, helpless persons in need of intimate assistance and the glamorous role that was envisioned soon wore off. One nursing student approached me one day when she was confronted with several persons on her ward that were dying. We spoke of the original call to be the healer and comforter, beyond uniforms or perceived roles, and bringing a gift of wholeness and self to someone at a crucial moment. It was about being that part of each of us that gets us involved in the first place, "I know where I came from and I know where I am going!" I've watched people in all walks of life that I've regarded as successful, comfortable with self and not pretending to be anything else. They're on that journey from beginning to end and they show it in relations with others and confident within themselves.

Nobody doubts and nobody questions their authenticity. Each of us has a religious vocation too, to learn who we are and from where we came. It also points to where we are going. It also is being true to oneself, and having a valid testimony by our presence. I'll bet you've seen them too. Maybe that's our true calling: be who we are, be who God made us to be. Roles are for actors, authenticity is for God's creatures.

Florida Gas Price

Average retail gasoline prices in Florida have fallen 2.5 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.41/g Sunday. This compares with the national average that has fallen 0.7 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.24/g, according to gasoline price website FloridaStateGasPrices.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Florida during the past week, prices yesterday were 10.6 cents per gallon higher than the same day one year ago and are 23.3 cents per gallon higher than a month ago. The national average has increased 3.9 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 10.4 cents per gallon lower



than this day one year ago.

"The National Weather Service says this week begins with much of California under a 'hard freeze warning' and separate storm systems tracking across the Great Lakes region and from the Gulf Coast to the northeast, bringing snow, sleet and freezing rain from the Lower Mississippi River Valley northeastward to New England," said Gregg Laskoski, senior petroleum analyst, GasBuddy.

"Under conditions like that, consumer demand usually declines and that often results in a nominal decrease in retail gas prices," Laskoski added. "That may be what lies ahead this week."

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
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Inland Birding Fun: Brown Pelican

Brown Pelicans generally breed on islands along the Pacific coast from central California south to Middle and Central America and the Atlantic coast from North Carolina to the West Indies, Chile, and Venezuela.

During the first Breeding Bird Atlas surveys in 1991

three nests were discovered on Lake Okeechobee near Clewiston. Nesting in South Florida begins in the fall months.

These Pelicans are the smallest of the six different species found in the world. Brown Pelicans have an awkward gait on land, but are strong swimmers and fliers. They have an 84-inch wingspan and can reach a length of 48 inches. Adults are grayish-brown and have a pouched bill.

During breeding season the plumage on the head and neck turns bright yellow, but fades to dull yellow and brown during non-breeding. Juveniles have almost completely brown plumage with a whitish belly and breast. The oldest known Brown Pelican lived to be 43 years old.

Adults are usually silent. During wing-jerking displays, they force air from their lungs and pro-

duce a low, hoarse sound. When defending the nest Brown Pelicans will snap their bills together with a loud popping sound. Nestlings make a shrill rasping squawk when they beg for food.

These seabirds spend most of their lives on or near the ocean where they usually forage during the day, but will also feed at night during a full moon.

They will work in flocks to corral their prey or dive headfirst into the water from heights up to 65 feet in order to scoop up fish near the water's surface.

Brown Pelicans scavenge dead animals; eat invertebrates including prawns, and steal food from other sea-

birds. Before swallowing their food they drain the water from their pouches while gulls and terns often try to take fish out of the Pelican's beak.

Brown Pelicans are highly social birds who will nest in colonies of several thousand pairs.

The male selects a nest site on the ground or exposed tree top where he per-

forms a head-swaying display in order to attract a mate. The nest site can range from a depression on the ground lined with grass, sticks and seaweed to well-built platform in a tree. The female builds the nest in 7 to 10 days while the male gathers smaller sticks for her.

Two to three white eggs are laid which are incubated by both parents with their feet for about 30 days.

Pelicans regurgitate predigested fish for the young birds and feed them whole fish when the young are older. The fledglings can fly and fend from themselves when they are three months old.

Gray used him to delay the proceedings by three weeks.

"I don't particularly care for that," he said.

At the workshop, Vice-Mayor Felicia Hill said that she would not consider accepting the rent and called the situation a "learning experience" for herself and the commission.

"I was one of the ones who supported Wayne

Gray," she said. "I am very disappointed. I apologize to the citizens."

In the workshop prior to Tuesday's commission meeting, Mr. Gray addressed the city commission and explained that he stopped by city hall earlier in the afternoon to present Mr. Moore with a check for the past due rent. He stated that Mr. Moore denied the payment and directed him to attend the commission meeting to speak with the commissioners regarding the matter.

Mayor Colin Walkes explained to Mr. Gray that the commission will be voting later in the commission meeting to give the city attorney the

authority to begin the eviction proceedings and they would not be accepting his payment.

Mr. Gray stated that as far as he was concerned that he was not six months behind in his rent and that the city, instead, owed him \$3,500 for the upkeep on the property's bathrooms.

After much debate, Mr. Gray threatened the commissioners with a lengthy fight.

"I'm gonna fight it," he said. "I have put \$330K of my family's money into this. I urge you to reconsider."

Mayor Walkes asked Mr. Gray to stay for the commission meeting; however, he left before the

workshop ended.

In the commission meeting, Mr. Brandenburg summarized the situation to the commissioners and the citizens. He explained that in addition to Mr. Gray being six months behind on the rent, he also has not insured the property or kept the restaurant and campground open for business as per his contract. He also called the amount for the bathrooms a "fabrication".

Commissioner Allie Biggs moved that the city attorney begin the eviction proceedings first thing Wednesday morning. As soon as the motion was made, the audience erupted in applause.

Park offers tram tour

HIGHLANDS HAMMOCK STATE PARK—Highlands Hammock's ever popular park tram tours have resumed for the fall/winter season and are now offered regularly.

The tram tour is a guided, narrated tour of the park providing interpretation of nature and history. Visitors have a unique opportunity to view birds, alligators, and other wildlife relatively close-up in areas of the park restricted to public access.

The tram departs from the Civilian Conservation Corps Museum, runs along the Loop Road under a densely shaded canopy of hydric hammock, passes through cypress swamp, and continues through pine flatwoods.

For the grand finale, the tram travels slowly down South Canal where alligators, turtles, water birds such as herons, ibis and egrets, and an occasional otter or water moccasin may be observed.

The tram is scheduled to run at 1 p.m. Tuesday through Friday. A 2:30 p.m. tram will be offered immediately following the 1 p.m. tour on these days, if required to meet visitor demand. During the busy winter season, a third tram may be offered at 11 a.m.

Weekend trams will be offered at 1 p.m. and 2:30 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays.

Tickets for the tram tour may be purchased at the Ranger Station and are sold only on the day of the tour. Tickets are \$5 per adult and \$3 for children ages 6-12. Children aged 5 and younger ride free.

Park entry fees of \$6 per vehicle (up to 8 people), \$4 for one adult or an adult with children under six years, and \$2 for visitors on bicycles or foot remain in effect.

During the extremely busy snowbird season from January through the end of March, visitors are advised to purchase tickets early in the morning to ensure seats, as trams tend to sell out quickly. The Ranger Station opens for business at 8 a.m.

Special trams may also be booked in advance for larger groups or organizations at a cost of \$74.90 tax included. Reservations and payment are made through the Ranger Station.



sweet and encouraging, are just a few of the reasons the woman, now in her 70s, has been highlighted for her work. She most recently received this year's Athena Award, an award of such distinction that seeing it given to someone from the Glades may have been one of Ms. Chamblee's proudest moments yet.

A Maternal Example

And there have been many proud moments for this mother of two, grandmother of five, not the least of which was watching her young, single mother working hard to support her and her sisters. Her mother sacrificed a lot to raise her kids, and her own contribution to the Glades would be reflected in Gove Elementary School being named after her.

Her mother divorced Sandra's father when Sandra was only seven because of his alcoholism, and moved with her children to the Glades to be closer to family. Sandra remembers herself, her four-year-old sister and six-month-old baby sister, being farmed out to families in Clewiston and the Glades while her mother earned her degree from the University of Florida, returning to the Glades to take a job as a teacher.

Years later, an encounter with an old classmate at her school's 50-year-reunion gave some indication of her mother's profound effect on the area. The man, with a Ph.D. now and in charge of the drama department at a university in Virginia, was especially grateful to Sandra's mother for allowing him to read aloud to the class, fostering a love for theatre in him as a young student.

Sandra remembers the conversation: "He said, 'Well, I have your mother to thank for this. I realized that the stage and performing was what my love was.' She fanned that spark in him as a fifth grader. Now, he's retired from that and they've named the theatre in his honor just recently. It just goes to show you these influences that teachers make in children are life-long."

But Sandra's mother fell deathly ill and, in her 40s, tragically died from breast cancer.

Sandra's mother had known she was dying and, in her final days in the hospital, she called Sandra and her husband, James Chamblee, both of whom were in their early 20s at the time, and asked them to watch over her two daughters, ages 16 and 19. The young couple agreed.

Sandra would have given anything to have her mother.

"I had already lost my father, who died when I was 13. To lose your parents at an early age is very difficult. If you still have your parents, value that, because no one can take their place when they're gone."

Sandra, who had attended Florida State but followed her heart and only stayed a year, suddenly found herself with new responsibilities. With her husband at her side, however, the two took all of it on and would persevere.

Greatest Encouragement

A local farmer, James Chamblee may have been the single most important person in launching Sandra's volunteer career when he respectfully turned down a seat on the local hospital board but offered his wife for the job instead. It was the 1970s and James thought Sandra could fill the role. "My wife would be great!" he told the hospital board. Sandra, who had been an active volunteer with a number of organizations already, got the first taste of what health care delivery in the Glades looked like, how it operated and what it needed to be successful.

Sandra and James understood what each needed of the other, and even when James may have become a little more hesitant about his wife's growing responsibilities, Sandra was always quick to remind him, "Well, I'm on this board because you suggested me!"

But Sandra only jokes, and, of all the things she appreciates James for, it was his willingness to let the community pull his wife in different directions that didn't always lead back to James. Sometimes, when the hospital was left without an administrator, Sandra being the only person on the board without another job, would step in and get caught up in ensuring that the hospital continued running, and all the while James was there to support her.

When they took in Sandra's two younger sisters, having had a child of their own already, the 23-year-old James did not flinch. "You look back at a young man taking on two sister in laws and taking care of them, put yourself in that position."

Their love story would continue for 47 years, when James died of an aortic aneurysm. She remembers him dearly.

The Importance of Serving

Once, Sandra, sitting in on a board meeting in West Palm Beach, perked up when a man presenting maps with health information for Palm Beach County had forgotten to print out maps for the Glades area. Well, why not, Sandra asked? At the next meeting, the maps were drawn up, showing an urgent need in the Glades that might have gone overlooked. It underscores the need to keep Glades voices ringing loudly, said Sandra.

"That happens: people forget that we're out here sometimes. Oftentimes, people have come in and would want to tell us what we need versus ask what we need. I've always been pro-active to say, 'No, you need to listen to us because we're here and we know what the needs are.'" Having lived in the Glades 66 years, Sandra knows better than most what the Glades needs are. That kind of drive would serve Mrs. Chamblee well as she prepared for the biggest job of her life.

An Unnamed Epidemic

Before HIV had a name, or the acronym AIDS was widely known, the disease represented a frightening grasp slowly taking hold of the Glades. Sandra can still remember one of the first cases: a young Haitian man came into the hospital and died within days, with doctors unable to say what had caused his death. Over the course of the next few weeks, and months, and then years, more and more people, many of them Haitian, started coming in with similar conditions.

The virus would soon have a placeholder name that struck fear into the Glades: the 4H, representing the four most prevalent indicators for carrying the disease. Homosexuality among males. Hemophilia. Heroin use. And finally, Haitian origin.

Early on, Haiti had been identified as one of the major sources of AIDS in the world, and Belle Glade, with its reliance on its seasonal population, absorbed the disease into the community. Before long, a study conducted in the 1980s by the CDC led to the area's darkest hour: the Glades would be known as the AIDS capital of the world.

Being on the hospital board, Sandra was in the thick of it, and felt the alienation of the town as much as anyone else. In the early days of the disease, she attended a woman's meeting in Orlando and told a lady sitting next to her that she was from Belle Glade. When Sandra turned around, she noticed that the woman had gotten up and moved, even though she had been sitting in assigned seats. At a vegetable stand making

chit chat with the vendor, Sandra mentioned that she was from Belle Glade. The man held out a cigar box and told Sandra to drop the money in the box. "He didn't want to handle my money."

It was a difficult time for the community, and at a time when most locals wanted desperately to escape the stigma, Sandra plowed through with plans to conduct a second study in the 1990s with the CDC, this time taking a hands-on approach to review the results before they were to be published. The resistance from some who wanted the first study to go away was almost deafening, but Sandra somehow pulled through and helped to define what that second study would look like. No longer would the Glades be a passive participant in studies that would shape its future – it would be its most important player.

Sandra resigned from her position on the hospital board and, at the urging of one of the doctor's who participated in the first study of HIV and AIDS in the Glades, applied to oversee the second study. The project would transform into Glades Health Initiative, an organization that Ms. Chamblee served as executive director for the next 14 years – her first paid job after a life of volunteering.

"It was challenging and I guess I did it by the seat of my pants. I didn't really feel that I was up to the job, but I prayed hard about things when there were issues and I'd wonder, how am I gonna handle this? And we'd end up finding ways to do it." For the work that Sandra was tasked with, she traveled to places like Africa, where studies were being successfully carried out. Whenever she hemmed and hawed at the idea of traveling, she composed herself and redoubled her efforts.

Back then the work was intense; looking back now, Sandra is grateful "to be a little country girl that went to a lot of places and was really listened to and respected by the work that we did here."

Remember Me for the Good

Ms. Chamblee is a Glades resident through and through who always gave to the cause that she thought needed it most. Perhaps this story should be told in the present form, because despite all of the efforts launched and seen through by this woman, she continues offering her services, and begrudgingly talks about when she might finally retire – she would advise people not to hold their breaths, and in the words of her great-grandfather says: "I'd rather wear out than rust out."

You'll find her sitting on boards, with a disposition that belies her years of experience at the helm of many of them, eager to get the next business at hand started, and to offer someone else the lessons of her experiences.

As she takes a moment, however brief, to reflect on what she has accomplished, Ms. Chamblee attempts to answer the question of what her legacy as a person will be – what will the people who knew her say about her when she is gone?

The normally cheery, warmly unflappable woman has some trouble, though not a considerable amount of it, determining what her own contribution to the world will have been, and how, putting that aside for a moment, her friends and family will remember her.

"Oh, I don't know," Ms. Chamblee begins. "That I was a real person, and I think I am. That I was caring. I've never really thought about this, but that people will remember me ..." here, her voice nearly breaks, hanging in the space of time it takes for her to continue her sentence, a space during which the vision of her mother caring for her, and her husband supporting her all of her years might have come into focus, before she finishes what she had intended to say, "... that people will remember me for the good that I've tried to do."
