## Pahokee to Buy Out Marina Tenant

The Pahokee Commission voted unanimously to authorize the city's attorney to issue the buyout payment to Wayne Gray, the marina's current tenant, at a special meeting called on Monday, December 23. According to the agreement, the move would give the city immediate possession of the property.

The \$25,000 buyout would dissolve the lease agreement with Mr. Gray and all equipment on the premises would become the city's. According

to City Manager Derrek Moore, Sheryl Carter, a former employee of Mr. Gray, will run the campground until a full RFP has been performed.

It was also stated that a local realtor, Cindy Findley, has been accepting rent payments from the campground tenants, booking reservations, and collecting the reservation deposits for the campground. Ms. Findley explains that this arrangement just happened when people began questioning where they should pay their rent while

This is the 12th anniversary of the Christmas ride for the Glory Riders, a Christian based charity organization, and PBSO. Santa Claus led the motorcycles and a convoy of several trucks loaded to their tops with Christmas gifts to be given to the children.

Although the Glory Riders often go on other rides to Small Wonders

and other places, the Christmas ride to Small Wonders is one of their largest events because so many come together to make the holiday brighter for the young residents.

Small Wonders is a home that has been upgraded to accommodate the medical needs of handicapped children who otherwise would have nowhere else to go. Small Wonders provides the children with a Christian family life. The facility houses on average of 15 children at any given time.

## Area H.S. Seniors Show Out in South Florida All-Star Game

MIRAMAR - Seven of our area's high school seniors were selected to play in the 19th Annual Nike South Florida All-Star Game on Saturday, Dec. 28.

Played at Ansin Sports Complex in Miramar, five Pahokee players and two Glades Central players suited up for Team Florida (Palm Beach and Broward counties) in a defensive slugfest with Team Dade (Miami-Dade County), which turned out to be a 10-6 loss.

Despite the defeat, all of them stood out in a nice way.

No one from Team Florida scored a touchdown. However, senior wide

receiver and starter Ronquavion Tarver (Glades Central) did haul in his team's longest reception, a 21-yard catch from senior quarterback Danarius Graham (Deerfield Beach) on the game's final possession.

Tarver was also targeted for an end-zone pass by senior quarterback Nick Jeanty (Miramar) late in the third quarter. Down 7-3 to Team Dade, Tarver seemed to be open for the potential go-ahead touchdown, but Jeanty's third-and-goal pass from the Dade 4-yard line was ruled as an incomplection.

But Team Florida had to settle for a 21-yard field goal by kicker Jon Semarae (Cypress Bay) with 2:30 left in the third, which cut Team Dade's lead to 7-6.

Semarae was 2-for-3 on his field goal attempts, which included a 28-yarder he made with 23 seconds left in the first quarter.

Team Dade added a field goal late in the fourth, when kicker Jorge Powell (Belen Jesuit) connected on a 30-yarder with 1:35 left to seal the win. But the Miami-based squad had to earn every point, thanks in large part

# Tips for Taking Better Photos

From selfies to portraits of lunch, more people these days are taking photographs in more places. But there's a big difference between great photos and throwaways -- and a big difference between great photographers and anybody with a smartphone.

"Anyone can learn to take better photos," says Lucas Gilman, a professional adventure photographer whose work for such magazines as National Geographic and Sports Illustrated has taken him all over the globe.

Gilman is offering photographers of all levels tips for producing more compelling photography:

## Don't Wait

Shoot images in the moment. Never put anything off until tomorrow. The weather could change, the leaves on the trees could blow. Anything that can happen will.

## Think Narrow

When photographing a scene that mixes bright and dark, the camera will lose much of the detail and one will end up with overexposed white and underexposed black.

Instead, look for mid-tones with little difference between the brightest highlights and darkest shadow. Flowers and trees, for example, are often best photographed on overcast, drizzly days.

## Golden Hour

"My favorite time to shoot is right after sunrise or just before sunset, when the sun is low in the sky. It makes for more interesting and dramatic lighting," says Gilman. "Shoot around these hours and you'll be amazed at the great images you make."

## Working the Subject

Once you've found your spot and the light is right: shoot, shoot, shoot. Take different shots from different angles and unusual viewpoints.

"Don't be afraid to take ten shots and edit out nine later," says Gilman.

## Shooting landscapes

Something dynamic in the foreground adds depth and scale. Look for a high vantage point, such as a balcony or rooftop. Study the light, especially when shooting from high angles. Shadows can be your best friend, and make for very interesting photos.

## Protect

"Photography is about making a fleeting moment permanent, whether it's a kayaker hurtling over a waterfall or the look on your daughter's face when she opens that gift she's been hoping for all year," says Gilman. "These events can't be recreated. Reliable photo storage is critical for protecting your work."

A reliable external hard drive data back-up system allows you to seamlessly transfer and store all your digital content with one system.

### Not a Trivial Pursuit

The world is full of fascinating facts. Did you know that your foot is the same length as your forearm and your nose is about the same length as your thumb?

Kissing helps prevent tooth decay. Laughter is a proven way to lose weight, and you will weigh less if you weigh at full moon.

People only use about 35 percent of their brain when thinking, but regardless of how much you use your brain, you won't be able to fold a normal size piece of paper in half more than 7 times, nor can you hum if you plug your nose and close your mouth. However, blueberry juice will boost your memory.

Trivia buffs know that when cats are happy or pleased, they squeeze their eyes shut and that the elephant is the only animal with four knees, but is also the only animal who can't jump (which might be a good thing!)

If you yelled for eight years, seven months and six days, you would have produced enough sound energy to heat one cup of coffee. (Hardly seems worth it!) The day after Thanksgiving is the busiest day for plumbers in the US. (I don't even want to go there!)

It's interesting to know that a sheet of Bounce in your belt loop will repel mosquitoes or that two-thirds of all people tip their heads to the right

when kissing. But what does all of that mean in the long run? Maybe 15 minutes of fame on Jeopardy. Knowledge is a wonderful thing, but it's one thing to have knowledge and another to have wisdom. The Bible tells us, "Be careful then how you live, not as unwise people but as wise, making the most of time, because the days are evil. One of the differences between living foolishly and living wisely is what we do with the time we have.

A breakdown of the average life of 75 years goes something like this: sleep - 25 years; work - 16.7 years; TV - 9.3 years; eating - seven years; travel - six years; leisure - 4.5 years; illness - four years; dressing - two years; religion - half a year.

So, is this how we spend our lives? Eating for seven years, spending two years getting dressed, or one-third of our lives sleeping? Someone once told me that the tragedy of life is not that it ends so soon, but that we wait so long to begin living it. We need to start living our lives wisely.

If I live to be 75 years old, I have about 6,967 days left to live. That's all, just 6967 days. So, I need to manage myself within the time I have left. But wait a minute! I may not have that many days left!

We have no guarantee of even one more day

to live. No one has the guarantee that tomorrow will come for him. All anyone has is right now. Consequently, our time on this earth is valuable because it's very limited. Once a minute is gone it's gone and gone for good. We don't have rewind buttons. We can't go back and replay our lives, and we aren't guaranteed to have the same chances next year to make up for those we failed to take this year.

What will make a difference is how we use the hours that we have left; to take the knowledge that each of us has and apply it with wisdom to make the most of the time we have remaining. Today is the first day of the rest of our lives. Let us live each day to its fullest, prioritizing and remembering what is really important. If we do that our lives will not be a trivial pursuit.

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# Learning More about Florida's other Blue-Colored Crab

While I try hard to keep track of the more than 500 marine fish and invertebrates the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) manages, I sometimes field calls about things I don't deal with on a daily basis. Like when an angler wants to know about using barnacles as bait (yes, you can). Or, most recently, when a reporter wanted to know more about blue land crabs. Specifically, can she move them from behind her car when trying to leave for the day?

Blue crabs, I asked?

"No. Blue land crabs," she replied.

Ah, yes. I've heard of these blue land crabs. While they are a commonly targeted species in south Florida, it is a rare day that I get a media call on the crabs.

I'm not from South Florida. And while I've caught, eaten, been pinched by and dissected more than my fair share of blue crabs, I've never even seen a blue land crab other than in pictures.

I quickly extended a call to co-worker Mason Smith, a South Florida resident and regional biologist, to learn more about Florida's largest semi-terrestrial crab.

Tell me more about blue land crabs.

They remind me a lot of ghost crabs on the beach – very fast and shy – but much larger. During the day, they stay just inches from their burrow (which may be more than six feet deep), and scurry into it when the slightest movement is detected. To catch one, you simply have to get close to the opening of the burrow and stand very still for about five minutes until the crab starts coming out again, then jump down and grab it with your hand (a dip net would also work).

What was your first experience with a blue land crab?

It was the day I toured an apartment complex in North Palm Beach. That complex has an amaz-

ing amount of black and red mangrove throughout the property. Underneath the mangrove trees were dozens of the large blue land crabs, each about six inches wide across the body, with massive burrows. Blue land crabs are rarely found more than five miles from the ocean, but they can also inhabit open fields of tall grass or open hardwood groves.

What did you think about them?

I thought they were very cool and immediately wondered if they were as edible as their more aquatic cousins. They are, by the way!

Tell me what it is like living in an area with blue land crabs.

It turns out they are a small tourist attraction – everyone stopped to look and show their kids on the way to the mailbox or front office. My son would always demand that we stop to see them on the way to the pool. The mangrove stands were actually divided from the roads by a concrete wall, so there were never any issues with them getting run over by cars. Depending on where they live, others in South Florida are not so lucky and may experience damage to their backyards and gardens from these crabs.

Are these important in South Florida? Why?

Yes, they are very important for South Florida's ecosystem and to the southern areas of Florida along the Gulf of Mexico. They consume mostly vegetation, especially the leaves of mangroves, and so are very important for nutrient-cycling for a healthy coastal shoreline. They also provide an excellent food source for a wide variety of predators. As adults, they provide food for many terrestrial animals – raccoons, foxes, large birds, etc. Although they live on land, the females walk down to the water to release the eggs where the larvae will hatch and float out to sea on an outgoing tide for several weeks before riding the tide back in as small juveniles. Many fish and other aquatic wildlife eat the eggs, larvae and small crabs during that time.

What do people do with them?

Throughout the broader Caribbean, they are eaten as a food source. This is less common here, but I have read about people in Florida harvesting them for food. (According to the University of Florida IFAS Extension office website, the meat is reported to be sweet and white.)

So back to the reporter's question, can you move them?

Yes, you can move them from behind your car or even shoo them away (though they tend to move out of the way pretty fast, some do get smashed), so long as you are not relocating them to another area. Relocating the crabs entirely, though not suggested, would be the same as harvesting them and would require the proper licenses (recreational or commercial) unless ex-

empt. They are subject to a closed season from July 1 through Oct. 31 (during spawning) and a recreational bag limit of 20 per person, per day other times. Trapping is prohibited (though you can take them by hand or with a dip net). The harvest of egg-bearing females is also prohibited, and blue land crabs cannot be taken from state parks or from the right-of-way of federal-, state- or county-maintained roads.

These regulations were implemented in 2003 after anecdotal information suggested the species may have been in decline. Puerto Rico adopted similar management measures around the same time. 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
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# Top Tech Tips for a Successful School Year

## You're Not Alone: Gastrointestinal Symptoms

Frequent and bothersome gastrointestinal (GI) symptoms are more common than one may think. While estimates vary, five to 15 percent of adults in the United States may be affected by chronic GI conditions, such as irritable bowel syndrome with constipation (IBS-C) or chronic idiopathic constipation (CIC).

This could mean as many as 13 million adults may suffer from IBS-C and as many as 35 million adults may suffer from CIC.

According to a survey, the majority of adults with these conditions may experience disruptive symptoms three to five days per month. Recurring abdominal pain and constipation, including hard stools and infrequent and incomplete bowel movements, may indicate IBS with constipation or, if one has these symptoms with little to no abdominal pain, chronic idiopathic constipation (CIC). Adults report that these symptoms impact their daily activities.

Research also shows that only 40 to 50 percent of these sufferers plan to talk to their physician about their GI symptoms within the next year.

Experts say that part of the problem is patients are uncomfortable discussing the specific symptoms of IBS-C or CIC.

"Patients often get embarrassed talking about their bathroom habits with a physician," says Dr. Steven Lamm, internist and author of "No Guts, No Glory." "There is no need to feel self-conscious."

You are not alone. Dr. Lamm recommends preparing for an appointment ahead of time to ensure a more effective conversation. Be ready to discuss the following with the doctor:

- Do you feel abdominal pain?
- How often do you experience hard stools

associated with constipation?

- Do you have fewer than three bowel movements a week?
- Are your bowel movements satisfactory, with a sense of complete evacuation?
- How long have you experienced these symptoms (a week, a month, more)?
- How frequently do you experience these symptoms?
- What have you tried to relieve symptoms (drinking more water, taking fiber or laxatives, increasing exercise)?
- Do your symptoms keep coming back?
- Has your life been disrupted due to your symptoms?

Unfortunately, there is no cure for these conditions, but there are ways to help manage symptoms, including dietary and lifestyle changes and taking laxatives. Also, keeping a symptom diary may help identify triggers that exacerbate symptoms.

Keep in mind, over-the-counter laxatives and stool softeners may help with occasional constipation, but they are not approved for long-term use without physician supervision and are not approved for IBS-C.

Candidates may be prescribed an FDA-approved medication for these conditions by a physician.

With open and clear communication between patient and doctor, managing bothersome symptoms may be possible.

the issues with the marina remained unsettled.

As Commissioner Keith Babb suggested in a recent meeting, Captain Tadpole will run the marina until the RFP is completed. Mr. Moore explained that the city will have to satisfy its past due Readiness-to-Serve charges with Palm Beach Water Utilities before water services can be restored but the power at the marina has already been turned on. Mr. Moore informed the commissioners that Mr. Gray owed multiple debts to various local business owners. The debts that the city are aware of totals to about \$63,000. The city manager informed them that some companies, like Cheney Bros., have sued Mr. Gray and placed a lien on the property to settle an outstanding \$10,000 debt. Other companies that were included in the list of creditors were Sysco, Palm Beach Water Utilities, Florida

Department of Revenue, and Glades Gas.

Regina Bohlen asked Gary Brandenburg, the city's attorney, if the city was going to deduct the debts that Mr. Gray owes multiple local businesses, local residents, and former employees from the total of the buyout. Mr. Brandenburg explained that because those were private business deals that did not involve the city, the city would not get involved with them.

Mr. Brandenburg did, however, clarify that Mr. Gray could receive all or none of the \$25,000 depending on how many liens on the property that the city would have to satisfy due to Mr. Gray's multiple outstanding debts. He stated that he is also considering the possibility of deducting the past due rent from the buyout amount.

The announcement that the number of liens on Mr. Gray's property could reduce the amount of the buyout caused residents to scramble to the courthouse on Christmas Eve to file their claims. However, former employees learned that they could not file a lien but would have to file their complaints with the labor department.

The recreational harvest season for snook closed Dec. 15 in Atlantic state and federal waters, including Lake Okeechobee and the Kissimmee River, and will remain closed through Jan. 31, reopening to harvest Feb. 1. Snook can continue to be caught and released during the closed season.

Florida and federal waters, including Monroe County and Everglades National Park, closed Dec. 1 and will reopen to harvest March 1.

This and other regular season closures are designed to help protect the species during vulnerable times, such as cold weather.
