Portrait: The Oldest Barber in Belle Glade

Willie Clark stood over his customer in the breeze of the open shop door. It was a chilly day in Belle Glade and Clark donned a puffy, blue, fitted jacket over his collared shirt.

Clark wavered over his customer,

clippers in hand.

The customer sat silently as Clark carefully, skillfully trimmed above his upper lip, tracing the line marked by his mustache, removing the few stray hairs that disrupted the clean, straight edge. Clark glanced at the customer's face through his thick-lensed glasses,

checking his work before returning the clippers to the quiet man's face.

Clark did not smile as the two strangers stepped into his shop, one man and one woman; and if he lifted his head to take in the newcomers, it went unnoticed.

The 95-year-old barber answered

the few questions the visitors asked of him.

Slowly, however, as the visiting man asked more and more questions, and let the silence that followed linger

South Bay Readies for '14 Commission Elections

Commissioner suspended last Dec. vying for former commissioner Walker-Turner's seat

Residents in the city of South Bay are gearing up for the elections on March 11 that will decide the fate of five candidates vying for two city commission seats.

One of those vacant seats was occupied by former city commissioner Shirley Walker-Turner. Walker-Turner was suspended from the commis-

sion twice in 2013 after being accused and then found violating the Sunshine Law.

Gov. Rick Scott first suspended Walker-Turner when she, along with two other South Bay commissioners, were accused of privately agreeing to approve a \$25,139 payment to former city manager Corey Alston for unused vacation time.

Walker-Turner was re-elected in a special election in May 2013; Gov. Rick

Scott reinstated her as commissioner, pending the outcome of her trial. When she was found guilty of violating the Sunshine Law this past December, Gov. Scott once again suspended her from the commission.

Two other commissioners, Linda Johnson and John E. Wilson, were also convicted of violating the Sunshine Law last year. Wilson is running for commissioner in the upcoming election, this time to fill the seat left by

Walker-Turner.

Also running against Wilson are former city clerk Virginia K. Walker and South Bay resident R.L. Thomas Jr. Walker ran against, but lost to, Walker-Turner in the special election in May 2013, when Walker-Turner was re-elected after being suspended.

High Speed Chase Yields Shooting Suspects

Shooting cleared with arrest of two Pahokee men on multiple charges

Just minutes after a shooting targeted two Pahokee men, Palm Beach County Sheriff's deputies found themselves in pursuit of a vehicle that matched the one involved in the crime. Reaching speeds in excess of 100 miles per hour, the chase would end in an open field in Belle Glade with the suspects bailing, eluding capture for another 24 hours before they were captured.

The shooting happened on Feb. 13, at approximately 10:33 p.m. in the area of South Lake Avenue and Rardin Avenue in Pahokee. Two victims, whose names were withheld,

ner, which begins at 6 p.m. and ends at 9 p.m., and will feature an entertaining program by Greg Miller of "The Big Year" book fame. Miller will be available to autograph "The Big Year" books and video, as well.

One of inland Florida's specialty birds that birders will be looking for during the Festival is the Swallow-tailed Kite. The Swallow-tailed Kite is a graceful black and white raptor that the Calusa called, "Ta-ti-na," which means "spirit that soars." The Swallow-tailed Kite rarely flaps

its wings while flying, but it almost continuously rotates its tail -- often to nearly 90 degrees -- in order to hold a heading, make a sharp turn or trace tight circles while drifting across the sky.

It has a relatively small beak and feet for a raptor, which results in a diverse diet of small prey that includes insects, reptiles, amphibians, small birds and a small number of mammals. These graceful flyers frequently eat while flying and get water by skimming the surface and gathering water in their bills. Their vocalization is a shrill, "klee-klee-klee."

The Swallow-tailed kite migrates from South America to nest in Florida swamps, and may be seen from the end of February to September flying above roadways and trees in the inland counties searching for food. Large numbers of birds gather at staging roosts in South Florida in late July and August before they migrate south for the winter. Hendry-Glades Audubon volunteers will host pre-festival birding trips on Saturday, March 8 and Sunday, March 9 at STA5 (Stormwater Treatment Area 5). 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Cold Weather Aids 2014 Manatee Count

FLORIDA FISH AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Biologists with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) reported a preliminary count of 4,831 manatees in Florida during this year's statewide aerial survey, conducted in late January.

Over two days (Jan. 24 and 27), a team of 20 observers from nine organizations counted 2,317 manatees on Florida's east coast and 2,514 on the west coast of the state. The final numbers will be available following verification of survey data.

"This year's manatee count is the third highest we have recorded since the first statewide aerial survey in 1991," said Gil McRae, director of the FWC's Fish and Wildlife Research Institute.

"We are encouraged by the relatively high count, especially given the high number of manatee deaths documented recently. Information on warm-water habitat use from this year's survey will be integrated with manatee survival and reproductive rates to update future population projections."

The goal of the aerial manatee survey is to count as many manatees as possible, providing researchers with a minimum number for manatees in Florida waters and a snapshot of where they are at the time of the survey. Weather conditions and manatee behavior during the survey have a large effect on survey counts. Because these factors vary from year to year, this count cannot be used to determine long-term population trends.

"After two winters of above-average temperatures, this year we received several consecutive, strong cold fronts that helped to gather manatees at warm-water sites where they could be more easily counted," said FWC manatee biologist Holly Edwards.

The surveys highlight the importance of warm-water habitat to manatees in the winter, increasing researchers' understanding of manatee distribution and relative use of these areas that are essential to manatee health and survival. The survey information helps managers better protect this endangered species.

Researchers have been conducting statewide aerial surveys since 1991, weather permitting, to meet the state's requirement for an annual count of manatees in Florida waters. Statewide aerial

surveys were not conducted during the winters of 2012 and 2013 due to warm-weather conditions.

Florida residents can help manatees by purchasing a manatee specialty license plate and a manatee decal. Funds from the license plate and decal support manatee research and conservation. 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Jurisdiction Over Lake Okeechobee Releases Argued

Senator Negron Calls on Congress to authorize state jurisdiction over Lake Okeechobee releases, C-43 Reservoir

Florida State Senator Joe Negron (R-Stuart), chair of the Senate Select Committee on Indian River Lagoon and Lake Okeechobee Basin (IRLLOB), called on Florida's Congressional Delegation on Feb. 22 to push for federal legislation to remove the Army Corps of Engineers' sole jurisdiction over Lake Okeechobee releases and to include authorization of the C-43 Reservoir project in the federal Water Resources Development Act of 2014 (WRDA).

"Over the last few months, the Army Corps has demonstrated a willingness to be more proactive and coordinate with the South Florida Water Management District to manage lake levels. This experience demonstrates the state water managers and the Army Corps can work effectively together," wrote Senator Negron in a letter to Florida's Congressional Delegation. "However, the fact remains the Army Corps has sole jurisdiction and authority over lake levels and acts within that authority even when those actions conflict with the state water managers' better judgment. We need your help to permanently and officially rebalance this delegation of responsibility and authority."

The Army Corps' authority to manage the water level of Lake Okeechobee is derived from Congress. Utilizing this authority, the Army Corps under-

"Within the next few weeks, Congress will consider the 2014 Water Resources Development Act. Within this legislation, you have the opportunity to authorize the C-43 Reservoir project, which will benefit the Caloosahatchee region by allowing for the storage of excess lake and local basin water during the wet season for use during the dry season," said Senator Negron. "Florida has done our part to prepare the way for federal approval of this needed water storage project. The state has purchased the land and approved the plan for the reservoir. Federal authorization of the C-43 Reservoir is essential if Florida is to remain proactive in balancing the risk of a dike breach or failure with ongoing environmental impacts.

"With the wet season scheduled to begin in just a few months, federal action is needed to address several recommendations designed to better manage lake levels, regulatory releases and water quality," concluded Senator Negron. "I look forward to working with you to implement these recommendations and to better protect Florida's interests in the future."

took a risk assessment of the Herbert Hoover Dike after the flooding in New Orleans from Hurricane Katrina.

The results showed the federal government had failed to maintain the dike, which was found to be in serious disrepair. In response, the Army Corps implemented the 2008 Lake Okeechobee Regulation Schedule (LORS 2008). Under this schedule, the Army Corps holds less water in the lake during the wet season in order to reduce the risk of a dike breach or failure. While this schedule addresses ongoing flood

"I am asking Congress to remove the Army Corps' sole jurisdiction over Lake Okeechobee releases and to direct the Army Corps to develop an interim risk assessment and lake-level schedule to account for the rehabilitation that has been completed or is ongoing to repair the Herbert Hoover Dike," continued Senator Negron.

In a report released on Nov. 5, 2013, the Senate Select Committee on IRLLOB recommended amending the operational jurisdiction of the

failure is less than 10 percent.

The report notes procedures should be established for when the risk of failure exceeds this threshold, including federal notification that would provide the state 24-hours' notice to assess liability and decide whether to maintain control, or to temporarily release authority to the federal government.

The Select Committee report also recommended appropriating \$15 million to support construction of the C-43 basin project, in anticipation of final passage of a federal WRDA bill.

Who is the Bad Partner?

The Florida Legislature is discussing whether to use political might to seize control of the management of Lake Okeechobee and water reservoirs from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, and turn control over to the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD). This proposal is a bad idea. It overlooks the history of the management of Lake Okeechobee and related water bodies, in regard to the Clean Water Act.

First, Florida petitioned the federal government for the construction of the Herbert Hoover Dike and the Central and Southern Flood Control Project to provide flood relief and water supply sources for agricultural and urban development in southeast Florida. This expensive effort, in conjunction with navigation projects for the Kissimmee, St Lucie and Caloosahatchee Rivers, resulted in a fair weather water management system that is unable to adapt to increasingly common drought and flood conditions.

Second, Florida, through its agency now known as the South Florida Water Management District, managed water for the benefit of agriculture and urban water supplies -- a reasonable effort until the effort abandoned any concept of environmental water supplies for estuaries or preserved wetland systems, such as the Everglades

to prevent further degradation and restore national resources. The lawsuit dragged on for years until Governor Chiles symbolically surrendered the state's sword, which resulted in a court-overseen and court-monitored settlement agreement.

Third, as part of the partnership, the state of Florida and federal govern-

ments for water supply purposes that led to the deterioration of the Herbert Hoover Dike. As a result, the Army Corps had to institute new regulation schedules to protect the dike's primary purpose of flood prevention. Additionally, SFWMD practiced favoritism for water supply deliveries, while shunting flood waters to communities that

Corps' domain or interest.

The quality of the environment is key to the economies of the east and west communities. Experience has demonstrated that without the creative tension of the partnership, both partners receiving input from affected parties, that one agency will be swayed to the interests of favored stakeholders/lobbyists, to the detriment of the other stakeholders -- notably the silent stakeholder: Nature. This is a situation that needs both the belt and the suspenders of state and federal government, because, otherwise, our pants have kept falling down. Trying to co-opt the federal role in management, while expecting the federal dollars, indicates the lessons of the lawsuit have been forgotten. It is possible that some Florida interests think they have gotten all they want from the effort to date, and thus, the rest can be abandoned. We on the west coast know that our needs have not been addressed, except through temporary and discretionary relief, and that we need equitable attention from both partners.

Eliminating one will only result in harm to our communities, our economies and our environments.

Dry conditions increase the risk and danger of wildfires

Dry weather conditions can cause grass, plants and trees to turn brown and be really dry. Our dry weather increases the potential for wildfires, and it's important for the community to know what common-sense steps they can take to protect themselves and their families, as well as when to seek medical attention. Smoke from wildfires is a mixture of gases and fine particles from burning trees and other plant materials. Smoke can hurt your eyes, irritate your respiratory system and worsen chronic heart and lung diseases. Fortunately, most persons who are exposed to thick smoke will not have health problems. How much and how long you are exposed to the smoke, as well as your age and degree of susceptibility play a role in determining whether or not someone will experience smoke-related problems. If you are experiencing serious medical problems for any reason, seek medical treatment immediately.

Smoke can cause coughing, scratchy throat, irritated sinuses, shortness of breath, chest pain, headaches, stinging eyes and runny nose. If you have heart or lung disease, smoke might make your symptoms worse. People who have heart disease might experience chest pain, rapid heartbeat, shortness of breath and fatigue. Smoke may worsen symptoms for people who have pre-existing respiratory conditions, such as respiratory allergies, asthma and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) in the following ways:

- Inability to breathe normally ;
- Cough with or without mucus ;
- Chest discomfort; and,
- Wheezing and shortness of breath.

When smoke levels are high enough, even healthy people may experience some of these symptoms

You can limit your exposure to the smoke by: Staying indoors whenever possible, using air conditioners and keeping windows closed while driving in a vehicle. Individuals can reduce the amount of smoke particles in their vehicles by keeping the windows closed. The car's ventilation systems typically remove a portion of

the particle coming in from outside. For best results, individuals may want to use the "re-circulate air" feature found in most cars, which will help keep the particulate levels lower. If you do not have an air conditioner and if it is too warm to stay inside with the windows closed, seek alternative shelter.

How to protect your family from smoke:

- Pay attention to local news coverage or health warnings related to smoke.
- Use common sense when outside conditions are smoky. Avoid prolonged outdoor activities. It is especially important to limit time spent outdoors for children and persons with existing medical conditions.
- Stay indoors and run your air conditioner, if you have one. Keep the fresh air intake closed and the filter clean to prevent bringing additional smoke inside. For best results, run the air conditioning with recirculated air.
- Help keep particle levels lower inside.

When smoke levels are high, try to avoid using anything that burns, such as wood fireplaces, gas logs, gas stoves and even candles. Do not vacuum, which stirs up particles already inside your home. Also do not smoke tobacco.

Follow the advice of your healthcare provider about taking medicines and following your asthma management plan if you have asthma or other lung disease. Call your healthcare provider if your symptoms worsen.

If you are asked to evacuate your home, be sure to bring your important family documents, valuables and your family disaster supply kit. Your disaster supply kit should contain enough food, water and supplies to sustain your family for at least three days. Do not forget any medications or special items such as a first aid kit. It is extremely important for families to create their own disaster plan before a disaster strikes so they are quickly able to determine what valuables they may want to bring, what items need to be stored and how to preserve keepsakes.

Murphy and Rooney Urge ACOE to Complete Kissimmee Restoration

Murphy (FL-18) and Tom Rooney (FL-17) recently sent the following letter to United States Assistant Secretary of the Army (Civil Works) Jo-Ellen Darcy in support of the Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) making the final policy decisions necessary for the Kissimmee River Restoration Project to be completed. This project is vital to helping restore flows and addressing water quality issues in the northern Everglades. Once completed, the project has the potential to alleviate water flows into Lake Okeechobee by raising the levels of Lakes Kissimmee, Cypress and Hatchinehaw.  Thank you for your recent visit to the great state of Florida and your continued interest in and support for restoration efforts of the Everglades.

As we are sure you understand, approval of the final stage of the Kissimmee River Project is crucial to helping restore flows and addressing water quality issues in the area. In 1992, Congress authorized the Kissimmee River Restoration Project, which de-channelizes the Kissimmee River to restore its oxbows and natural path. Once the Kissimmee River Restoration Project is complete, more than 40 square miles of the river's floodplain ecosystem will be restored, including almost 20,000 acres of wetlands and 44 miles of historic river channel. Additionally, the project has the potential to add 100,000 acre feet of storage to the watershed, which will help alleviate water flows into Lake Okeechobee by raising the levels of Lakes Kissimmee, Cypress and Hatchinehaw another 1.5 feet. The project also maintains the flood reduction benefits of the original Kissimmee River channeling.

To date, over \$650 million has been invest-

ed in the project and construction is slated for completion by 2016. We understand the Corps is committed to seeing the project completed, but that the Corps and the State of Florida still must make some final decisions before the project can

reach this goal. We respectfully request to know what policy issues are still under consideration, their associated rationale, and the Corps' expected timeline for a final decision on these issues.

We also encourage the Corps to include in its response any recommended Congressional action that could aid in expediting and ensuring this project's timely completion, and we are ready to be of assistance if there's any way we can be helpful.

We look forward to your response and subsequent efficient decision-making on the final details of the Kissimmee River Restoration Project.

Gas Price Update

Average retail gasoline prices in Florida have risen 5.5 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.44 per gallon Sunday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 8,237 gas outlets in Florida. This compares with the national average that has increased five cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.40 per gallon, according to gasoline price website GasBuddy.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Florida during the past week, prices yesterday were 41.3 cents per gallon lower than the same day one year ago and are 10.5 cents per gallon higher than a month ago. The national average has increased 12.5 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 32.6 cents per gallon lower than this day one year ago.

"The rate of increase in the national average has accelerated over the last week, and the worst is likely yet to come," said GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "Oil prices continue to move higher as refineries continue their maintenance season, leading to a double whammy at the gas station. In addition, in another month we'll also start seeing refineries producing more expensive, cleaner burning summer gasoline, and that will likely keep upward pressure on retail gasoline prices. Just a handful of stations across the nation are seeing a price under \$3 per gallon and a few weeks from today, motorists along the West Coast, with perhaps a few other states, will be wishing for those current \$3 prices," DeHaan said.



were struck by gunfire after a dark SUV, that followed them as they walked, revealed three to four gunmen, one armed with an assault rifle, who opened fire on them.

One of the victims was struck once in the back as he tried to flee, while the other played dead on the street to avoid being struck. According to the report of the incident, the shooters were indiscriminate in their intent, and further investigation revealed about 45 spent casings at the scene.

With information that the SUV involved had a broken taillight, deputies spotted a vehicle matching the description heading south on State Road 715, between Pahokee and Belle Glade. When deputies attempted to pull the vehicle over, it accelerated and continued until it crashed in Belle Glade.

Deputies spotted at least two men exiting the vehicle, the men who ran from the vehicle being suspects they have dealt with on previous occasions. The men would disappear until the following night, when one was spotted hiding in a tree, shoeless and ignoring deputy

directives. Just 30 minutes later, the other was found hiding in a vehicle he unlawfully entered. It is uncertain what information led officers to their location.

Officers were able to match the recovered bullet casings to arms found inside the vehicle involved in the high speed chase – which included a Mac-11 semi-automatic handgun and an assault rifle.

One of the suspects, Marvin Moore, told officers he was only a driver in the incident, and that the three men he was traveling with, whose names he provided to deputies, suddenly jumped out of the vehicle and began firing gunshots. He admitted to fleeing from the scene and having physically possessed the Mac-

11 pistol within the last two days. He did not provide a statement regarding driving a getaway vehicle that had been reported stolen the day before the shooting.

Moore and Gage McKinley, the other suspect, were charged with two counts of attempted first degree murder with a firearm, two counts of aggravated assault with a firearm, and grand theft auto. Moore was also charged with fleeing and at-

tempting to elude police and grand theft auto, while McKinley was charged with felon in possession of a firearm and resisting an officer without violence.

Jess Santamaria believes he has been blessed in life and the District 6 commissioner wants to "pay it forward."

Santamaria plans to donate his commissioner's salary to the Homeless Coalition of Palm Beach County. The one hundred thousand dollars will go toward implementing the 10-year plan to end homelessness.

The commissioner, who owns shopping centers and a hotel in Palm Beach County, was not born into a life of privilege. Santamaria experienced a difficult childhood in the Philippines. His father died when he was only three, leaving his mother to raise six children alone. The family became homeless after their house and much of the city of Manila was devastated during World War II. Left with just the clothes on their backs, he recalls, "I know what it is like to be hungry, for days at a time." Santamaria says his mother's tenacity and self-sacrifice enabled her to send him to an American Christian Brother's school. He credits his mother's example and a strong Christian education for his work ethic and desire to care for the disadvantaged.

"It's who I am. If I had a dollar, I would be ready to share 50 cents," said Santamaria.

Santamaria and his wife, Victoria, have passed on these family values to their three children.

"I applaud the State Board for taking action that will ensure our students are more successful," said State Board Chairman Gary Chartrand. "Their bold action today sends the message that Florida students are our highest priority and we want them to be ready for a successful future."

More than 19,000 comments and suggestions

to the standards were received during an unprecedented public review during three public workshops, online and by email.

In response to constituent concerns about English/Language Arts, there were 13 clarifications and the addition of cursive writing to fourth and fifth grade.

For mathematics, there were 24 clarifications, two deleted standards in kindergarten and first grade, and the addition of 60 new standards that include 53 for calculus at the high school level.

Also during the meeting, Commissioner Stewart provided an overview of the proposed school accountability system, designed to provide stability and clarity as the state transitions to a new assessment beginning in 2014/15. The proposal would ensure the accountability system is fair, transparent and promotes improvements in student achievement.

In other Board action, members approved a Bachelor of Science degree in Applied Health Sciences at Eastern Florida State College.



-- showing Clark that he wouldn't leave without sufficient conversation -- the old barber began to open up.

Or maybe, the man just asked the right questions.

"I'm engaged now," said Clark, the word *engaged* rolling off his tongue surprisingly easy for someone his age. Just like the word *boyfriend* seems reserved for a younger age group, the word *engaged* seemed equally reserved.

Engaged for over a decade, he said. Clark spoke of his beautiful, young fiance. A woman he put through school and who is now working as an educator in Palm Beach County.

"When do you think you'll get married?" asked the man.

Clark didn't know, but he seemed unperturbed by the passage of time; even with the obvious signs of it marked in the wrinkles on his face and hands.

Looking around his shop, it seems as if time had stood still and yet passed all the same: vintage signs hung on the wall gathering dust and grime, juxtaposed with President Barack Obama's face that stood out on a 2008 campaign poster signaling a change for the future.

The man asked about the poster. "Do you like Obama?" he wondered. "Yes," answered Clark with some hesitation. He had more to add.

"I never thought I would see the day when a white man would help a black man," said Clark, alluding to former president Bill Clinton, who backed President Obama during his campaign in 2008.

Clark turned his focus back onto his customer. His spotted hands shook as he held the clippers in the air, but the steadiness that allowed him to be so successful for so many years returned as he touched the clippers to the man's face.

Clark trimmed his customer's beard, his hairline and even the inside of his nose with the precision of a man much younger than he.

"They [the young people] don't come around anymore. People think an old man can't do what a young man can. Maybe that's true," Clark said.

The decades of working in the same barber shop was evident. Stacks of papers, boxes and random trinkets lay scattered on the floor and on top of tables. Barbershop necessities intermingled with the collection of random oddities, leaving room for Clark to work and nothing else.

Clark once said he came to Belle Glade "looking for better."

"When I was young," he said, "the most you could make was a dollar a day; come here, and

you made two."

The prices he presently charges stood tentatively in the background on a makeshift paper sign: Boy's Haircut \$6; Men's Haircut \$9.

The prices spoke of the times changed -- the times that Clark has been witnessing changing for over 90 years.

As Clark stood over his customer, going through the motions of his daily grind, the peaceful shop nestled comfortably on a street in downtown Belle Glade echoed the muffled sounds of the thousands that had walked through its doors and left their mark on the four walls that house *Willie Clark's Barber Shop*.

The peace was palpable and reminded the strangers, who grew up in much faster times, that the world as it once was still exists in the unlikely of places.

The strangers left, but took with them the peace that the shop, Clark and his silent customer afforded them.

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


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
