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## Pahokee Seeks to Find a Plan 'B' for Restaurant and Bar

Pahokee's city commission brainstormed possible solutions to the ongoing restaurant and tiki bar situation at a special meeting called Tuesday night.

Gary Brandenburg, the city's attorney, informed the commission that Robert Lambert, the owner of Cruise America Associates, was no longer interested in leasing the marina.

Mr. Brandenburg recommended that the city perform another Request for Proposal (RFP) but with a longer leasing term so that the selected company would be able to recoup the funds invested in remodeling, staffing and purchasing supplies. He also recommended that the new RFP lease be for five years with one five-year leasing extension.

Mayor Colin Walkes asked the commission if they would consider awarding the RFP to the next highest bidder of the RFP's two candidates, which would be Conchy Mo's. Vice-mayor Diane Walker agreed with offering the restaurant to Ernest Lumpkin (Moe) and Cathy Morelli for a year while the commission performs the RFP.

Commissioner Keith Babb offered another idea — that the city run the restaurant, campground and marina but hire someone to manage each part. This is the same idea Mike Brandt offered the commission back when talks of beginning the RFP process began. Mr. Brandt offered to use the equipment he had purchased but have the city purchase food and other supplies; he would operate the restaurant as a city employee so the restaurant could remain open and the city could recoup losses obtained by Wayne Gray, the property's previous tenant. The city declined the offer.

Commissioner Allie Biggs asked

Mayor Walkes if he had an email from Mr. Lambert that he would like to share with the commission and audience. He stated he did not. She read the letter into record. The letter addressed to the mayor thanked him for the opportunity to participate in the negotiation of the tiki bar and restaurant and reaffirmed Mr. Lambert's belief that the facility, with proper care, could be profitable for both the city and a business owner.

He stated that if the city were to reopen the bid for a longer term he would be interested in bidding again, but considering all of the remodeling necessary to bring the facility to standard and the 11-month leasing timeframe it would be impossible to make the venture work. Mr. Lambert also offered to assist the commission with the marina even if he is not considered in a future bid.

After the letter was read, the mayor stated that he was able to find the email; it had automatically been routed into his "junk mail" folder.

A discrepancy was brought to the table as to when Mr. Lambert received the lease contract. Vice-mayor Walker explained that he should have received it between July 8 and July 10. Lisa Adams, a Pahokee resident and unpaid representative of the RFP, attempted to clarify the discrepancy in the dates and the delay of Mr. Lambert's signing of the lease.

Mayor Walkes asked Ms. Adams to "sit down and be quiet" because no public comments were allowed in this particular meeting. "No, I will not be quiet; these people have a right to know," she exclaimed. "Come on, people, you are being lied to." Mr. Brandenburg instructed Ms. Adams

### Community members and officials discuss key economic development projects at a recent brainstorming session

The city of Pahokee invited community members to a brainstorming session inside city hall on July 23 to share ideas about what the city could benefit from now and in the future from an economic development standpoint.

The discussion was the first of four planned brainstorming sessions which officials hope to use as a catalyst for one major economic development project.

Attendees, which included local officials, residents and prospective investors, bounced around ideas about

what Pahokee needs, as a city, to grow and prosper.

Residents and officials suggested a few key economic development projects at the session, including a new hotel, a major restaurant, a water park and a new city hall.

Mayor Colin Walkes said the brainstorming session went very well and the city received a lot of important input from residents. Community members, said Mayor Walkes, showed a vested interest in their community as they discussed project ideas they support and do not support.

"We're holding another brainstorming session next Thursday. We're going to hold four community

brainstorms. Once we're done with the brainstorms, we're going to go through with one viable project," said Mayor Walkes.

The second session, which will be held on Thursday, Aug. 7 at 6 p.m. in city hall, will serve to narrow down the potential projects presented in the first session. Eventually, the city hopes to narrow down its scope to one project and discuss how to move forward financially with that project.

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# FWC Releases Information in Wildlife-Feeding Case

**FLORIDA FISH AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION COMMISSION**

After a black bear attack on April 12 in a Lake Mary neighborhood, the FWC was notified about alleged feeding of wildlife.

FWC staff investigated and determined that one subject in the neighborhood and two others in a nearby town were intentionally feeding bears and other animals. Investigators worked with the State Attorney's Office of Florida's 18th Judicial Circuit to charge Eugene D. Cifers (DOB 10/25/50) of Lake Mary and Corey D. Zeak (DOB 02/11/86) and Lori E. Clem (DOB 12/10/84), both of Longwood, for violating Florida Administrative Code 68A-4.001 and Florida Statute 379.401(2)(a)4,(2)(b)1.

These are second-degree misdemeanors. Today Cifers pleaded not guilty; his case will be revisited in July. Clem and Zeak pleaded no contest, and each was sentenced to the following: 6 months probation, with the condition that they may not feed wildlife; a \$200 payment to the FWC's Wildlife Alert program; 25 hours of community service. After the mid-April attack, the FWC had to put down several bears in the Lake Mary area due to public safety risks because these bears demonstrated they were overly habituated to people and human-provided food. DNA samples taken from one of these bears matched samples collected from the clothing of the woman who had been attacked in this area. There are several ways to reduce the chances of

human-bear conflicts. People should secure garbage until the morning of pickup and not allow pet food, bird seed or other food items to be left out overnight. Most importantly, residents should never intentionally feed bears. "People who feed bears don't realize the serious results of their actions," said FWC Bear Management Program Coordinator Dave Telesco. "Feeding bears may reduce their natural fear of people, which can lead to someone getting seriously injured and bears being killed." People with any information regarding the intentional feeding of bears should contact the FWC's Wildlife Alert hotline at 888-404-FWCC (3922). Those who supply relevant information may be eligible for a reward, and they can remain anonymous.

# Palm Tran Phone System for Customers

Palm Tran Connection, the paratransit division of Palm Beach County's public transportation system, has implemented a new, upgraded phone system that enables users to access automated information regarding their door-to-door transportation service 24 hours a day without speaking to a live agent. Features of the new interactive voice response system include an automated trip confirmation phone call every evening that will list an individual's trip information

for the next day. Customers will be reminded of their pick-up and appointment times automatically. Another important feature for customers is the ability to call the automated customer service line 24 hours a day to confirm or cancel trips without speaking to a representative. Customers also have the option of providing an email address to receive an automated email each evening that lists the next day's trips.

These capabilities will reduce the number

of no-shows, missed trips, and same-day or late cancellations for Connection vehicles. They will also reduce the number of incoming calls to Connection, in turn shortening on-hold wait times for customers. Connection's call center handles on average 15,000 calls per week.

### Rocket Attacks and Israel

What should the Christian (not just American) response to the Middle East conflict be? First we must pray for peace -- as with any nation. We know Israel was chosen by God from all the peoples of the world -- and this climaxed in Jesus Christ, the Messiah. "The LORD your God has chosen you to be a people for his treasured possession, out of all the peoples who are on the face of the earth" (Deut. 7:6). God also promised the disputed land from the time of Abraham onward. God said to Moses, "This is the land of which I swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, 'I will give it to your offspring'" (Deut. 34:4).

A problem arises because both the blessed status of the people and the privileged right to the land are conditional on Israel's keeping the covenant God made with her. God said to Israel, "If you will indeed obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession among all peoples" (Exodus 19:5). When Israel suffered in captivity in Babylon, Daniel prayed, "O Lord ... we have sinned and done wrong. ... To you, O Lord, belongs righteousness, but to us open shame ... to all Israel ... in all the lands

to which you have driven them, because of the treachery that they have committed against you" (Daniel 9:4-7). Israel has no absolute divine right to the land of promise when she is breaking the covenant of promise.

This does not mean that other nations have the right to molest or attack Israel. She still has human rights even if she has forfeited her divine right for a time. Israel as a whole today rejects her Messiah, Jesus Christ, God's Son. God promised that to Israel "a Son is given; and the government shall be upon His shoulder, and His name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6-7). But with tears this Prince of Peace looked out over Jerusalem and said, "Would that you

... had known on this day the things that make for peace! But now they are hidden from your eyes ... You did not know the time of your visitation" (Luke 19:42-44).

When the builders rejected the Cornerstone, Jesus said, "The kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people producing its fruits" (Matt. 21:43). God has saving purposes for ethnic Israel (Rom. 11:25-26). But for now His people are at war with God in rejecting the gospel of His Son (Rom. 11:28). God has expanded His saving work to embrace all peoples (including Arabs in general, and even Palestinians) who will trust His Son and depend on His death and

resurrection for salvation. "Is God the God of Jews only? Is he not the God of Gentiles also? Yes, of Gentiles also, since God is one. He will justify the circumcised by faith and the uncircumcised through faith" (Rom. 3:29-30).

The Christian plea in the Middle East to Palestinians and Jews is: "Believe on the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved" (Acts 16:31). The future is bright -- when both Jewish and Gentile followers of King Jesus inherit the earth (not just the land), without lifting sword or gun. Until then justice must rule.

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# Chikungunya Fever: Message to Travelers

According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), local transmission of chikungunya is now being reported in other countries in the Caribbean. Since the end of June 2014, the following Caribbean countries have reported cases of chikungunya: Anguilla, Antigua, British Virgin Islands, Dominica, Dominican Republic, French Guiana, Guadeloupe, Guyana, Haiti, Martinique, Puerto Rico, Saint Barthelemy, Saint Kitts, Saint Lucia, Saint Martin (French), Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Saint Maarten (Dutch), Turks and Caicos Islands, U.S. Virgin Islands. Travelers who go to these islands in the Caribbean are at risk of getting chikungunya. In addition, travelers to Africa, Asia, and islands in the Indian Ocean and Western Pacific are also at risk, as the virus is present in many of these areas. The mosquito that carries chikungunya virus can bite during the day and night, both indoors and outdoors, and often lives around buildings in urban areas.

The CDC recommends that anyone traveling to the Caribbean should protect themselves from mosquito bites. However, some people may be more likely to get chikungunya because of certain risk factors. Travelers in high-risk groups should discuss their travel plans with their health care provider.

The high-risk groups include the following:

- People who have arthritis
- People with serious underlying medical conditions (such as high blood pressure, heart disease or diabetes)
- People older than 65
- Women who are late in their pregnancies, because of the risk to babies born at the time their mother is sick
- Long-term travelers, including missionaries and humanitarian aid workers and people visiting friends and relatives
- People who might have difficulty avoiding mosquito bites, such as those planning to spend a lot of time outdoors or staying in rooms without window screens or air conditioning.

Chikungunya is an illness caused by a virus that spreads through mosquito bites. The most common symptoms of chikungunya are fever and joint pain. Other symptoms may include headache, muscle pain, joint swelling or rash. Chikungunya disease rarely results in death, but

the symptoms can be severe and disabling. Most people who get sick feel better within a week. In some people, the joint pain may last for months or years.

There is currently no vaccine or medicine to prevent chikungunya. The only way to prevent chikungunya is to prevent mosquito bites. Preventing bites can be difficult but it is important, as anyone can get sick after just one bite. Follow these steps to reduce the chances of being bitten by mosquitoes during a trip.

#### Prevent mosquito bites:

Cover exposed skin by wearing long-sleeved shirts, long pants and hats.

Use an appropriate insect repellent as directed.

Higher percentages of active ingredient provide longer protection. Use products with the following active ingredients:

- DEET -- Products containing DEET include Off!, Cutter, Sawyer and Ultrathon
- Picaridin -- Cutter Advanced, Skin So Soft Bug Guard Plus and Autan (outside the US)
- Oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE) -- Repel and Off! Botanicals
- IR3535 -- Skin So Soft Bug Guard Plus Expedition and SkinSmart

Always follow product directions and reapply as directed.

If you are also using sunscreen, apply sunscreen first and insect repellent second.

Follow package directions when applying repellent on children. Avoid applying repellent to their hands, eyes, and mouth.

Stay and sleep in screened or air conditioned rooms.

Use a bed net if the area where you are sleeping is exposed to the outdoors.

#### If you feel sick and think you may have chikungunya:

Talk to a health care provider if you feel seriously ill, especially if you have a fever.

Tell them about any of your travels.

Get lots of rest and drink plenty of liquids.

Avoid spreading the disease by preventing more mosquito bites.



## Gas Price Update

Average retail gasoline prices in Florida have fallen 4.9 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.43/g Sunday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 8,237 gas outlets in Florida. This compares with the national average that has fallen 4.9 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.51/g, according to gasoline price website GasBuddy.com. Including the change in gas prices in Florida during the past week, prices yesterday were 15.6 cents per gallon lower than the same day one year ago and are 17.7 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has decreased 16.5 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 11.7 cents per gallon lower than this day one year ago.

"The national average as of today has been on decline for a month straight," said GasBuddy.

com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "The drop in gas prices during the middle of the summer certainly has been welcome relief to families and individuals alike who are hitting the road during the peak of the summer driving season. The national average now stands at its lowest point since March of this year, and will likely drop under \$3.50/gallon by mid-week. No states in the lower 48 feature average prices over \$4/gal, and just 4.1 percent of all stations GasBuddy tracks stand over that level, which is a drop from 8.7 percent a month ago. In addition, a month ago, nearly 75 percent of gas stations were charging over \$3.50/gal, while today we see just 38.2 percent of all stations over that level - an impressive decline in price that GasBuddy alerted motorists to weeks ago," DeHaan said.

# SFWMD Offers Recreational Hunting Opportunities

In an ongoing effort to provide recreation opportunities on its public lands, the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) has approved continued seasonal hunting in Miami's Rocky Glades and the C-23/C-24 area on the Treasure Coast. In addition, more acres are now available for hunting use at the Lake Marion Creek and Southern Glades management areas.

Open for a ninth season, hunters will have access this year to approximately 5,143 acres in the popular Rocky Glades Public Small Game Hunting Area in western Miami-Dade County. Non-native reptile hunting is also available there. Open for a seventh season, hunters will have access this year to approximately 1,185 acres in the

C-23/C-24 Public Small Game Hunting Area in St. Lucie County. The SFWMD Governing Board also authorized expanded hunting for the 2014-2015 season in the following areas:

In Miami-Dade County, the District incorporated 357 additional acres for hunting into the Southern Glades Wildlife and Environmental Area. Hiking, biking, fishing and wildlife viewing are also available. Approximately 342 additional acres adjacent to the Lake Marion Creek Wildlife Management Area in Polk County were opened to hunting. The larger 8,083-acre management area is part of the headwaters of the Kissimmee Chain of Lakes, and includes activities such as hiking, camping and wildlife viewing. All hunt-

ing activities are administered by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC), in partnership with the SFWMD. The South Florida Water Management District continues increasing recreational access to its public lands while managing them to support environmental restoration, water supply, water quality and flood control missions. At present, the District owns 621,000 acres of land that are open to the public. Many of these properties are in their natural state or have enhancements such as picnic tables, informational kiosks, campsites and hiking trails.



# Emphasizing the Health Risks of Using Illegal Synthetic Drugs

## FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

The Florida Department of Health urges all residents and visitors to consider the health risks of using illegal synthetic drugs. Taken to achieve the high associated with drugs, such as marijuana, ecstasy and cocaine, these synthetic substitutes are life-threatening and addictive. Within the past week, up to 30 individuals in Alachua County became severely ill after using such substances. "As we have seen recently in Gainesville, these illicit synthetic drugs are dangerous to Florida's children, adults, families and visitors," said Dr. John Armstrong, state surgeon general and secretary of health. "These drugs destroy lives and threaten public health and safety."

Synthetic marijuana, often known as "K2" or "Spice," is one of the substances whose popularity is "alarmingly high," according to the Office of National Drug Control Policy. Labels on Spice products often claim that they contain

"natural" psycho-active material taken from a variety of plants. Spice products do contain dried plant material, but chemical analyses show their active ingredients are synthetic cannabinoid compounds.

The adverse effects of synthetic marijuana use may include agitation, extreme nervousness, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, a racing heartbeat, elevated blood pressure, tremors and seizures, hallucinations and dilated pupils. Spice may also raise blood pressure and cause reduced blood supply to the heart. In a few cases, it has been associated with heart attacks. Regular users may experience withdrawal and addiction symptoms.

Anyone experiencing an adverse reaction to an illicit synthetic substance should contact their local poison center as soon as possible by calling 1-800-222-1222. If there is a life-threatening situation call 911 or go to the nearest Emergency Room.

# Red Tide Causes Large Fish Kill

## FLORIDA FISH AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) has confirmed a large-scale offshore fish kill in the northeast Gulf of Mexico. Citizens have reported observations of thousands of dead and dying bottom-dwelling reef fish, including grouper, hogfish, white grunt, triggerfish and snapper, as well as sea turtles and crabs, to the FWC's Fish Kill Hotline. Water quality is poor in the region with several reports of black water. On July 23, FWC Law Enforcement took scientists to collect fish, water samples and water quality data from six locations offshore of Hernando County. Sample analysis confirmed a bloom of the Florida red tide organism, *Karenia brevis*. Blooms of *Karenia brevis* in the Gulf of

Mexico are naturally occurring and have been documented since the 1700s

Satellite images from the Optical Oceanography Lab at the University of South Florida revealed an extensive surface bloom approximately 80 miles long and up to 50 miles wide in waters 40 to 90 miles offshore between Dixie and Pasco counties. Short-term forecasts of bloom movement by the Center for Prediction of Red Tides do not predict considerable movement of the bloom patch in upcoming days.

# The Summer Heat Is Here

## Never leave any child unattended in a vehicle

The Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles is reminding everyone to take additional steps to ensure that no child is left unattended in a vehicle this summer. This year, there have been two reported cases in Florida of children dying of heatstroke after being left in cars. Don't be distracted when leaving your vehicle and take a second look in the back seat to ensure a child is not left behind.

Getting into a car that has been sitting in the sun on a hot summer day in Florida can be unbearable. The inside of a vehicle can heat up by 20 degrees in just 10 minutes and cracking a window open does little to keep the vehicle cool. A child's body temperature can rise three to five times faster than an adult's and heatstroke in a closed vehicle can occur when the temperature is as low as 57 degrees outside. For the safety of your children, never leave a child unattended in a vehicle, even for a short period of time.

Florida law makes it a criminal offense to leave a child under the age of six unattended in a vehicle.

Tips for preventing heatstroke deaths in vehicles:

NEVER leave any child unattended in a vehicle.

Put something in the back seat that you will

need at your final destination like a purse, briefcase, cell phone or shoe that will remind you to look in the back seat.

If you see a child unattended in a vehicle, call 911.

After checking to make sure your vehicle is empty, always lock it and teach children not to play in vehicles.

Pets are also susceptible to heatstroke if left unattended in a closed vehicle, as well.

A study by researchers at San Francisco State University showed that, on average, 38 children die each year as a result of heatstroke after being left in a closed vehicle. Since 1998, 66 child heatstroke deaths have occurred in Florida for this reason, more than any other state.

sit down or he would have the deputies called to escort her from the meeting.

Another resident could be heard as saying, "Boy, she stays on top of them," referring to the documents Ms. Adams presented to support her claims of the dates.

After the meeting, Ms. Adams explained that Derrek Moore, the city's manager, mailed

the revised contract on July 10 but by then Mr. Lambert was out of the country. She further explained that when she explained this to the city manager, she was told that "there's internet all over the world."

She stated that when Mr. Lambert returned from his trip on July 21, he found the contract had been sent via Fedex to his home address instead of his attorney's office.

Ms. Adams further explained that she called the mayor to explain this to him and he stated that Mr. Lambert had until five o'clock the close of business Friday, July 25 to return the lease.


Mr. Lambert sent the city manager and city attorney a letter on July 25 stating that he regretfully would not be signing the final lease agreement.

The request must be filed (received by the Clerk) in the Office of General Counsel before the end of the time period for filing a petition for an administrative hearing.

Petitions filed by any persons other than those entitled to written notice under Section 120.60(3), Florida Statutes, must be filed within fourteen days of publication of the notice or within fourteen days of receipt of the written notice, whichever occurs first. Section 120.60(3), Florida Statutes, however, also allows that any person who has asked the Department in writing for notice of agency action may file a petition within fourteen days of receipt of such notice, regardless of the date of publication.

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
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
