Sex Offender Laws Relaxed in County

County eases restrictions on distance between sexual offender residences and schools, parks

At their July 22 meeting, Palm Beach County Commissioners voted in favor of a measure that would amend the county's ordinance relating to sexual offender and sexual predator residence prohibition. Before the vote, the county's ordinance prohibited sexual offenders and predators from establishing a permanent or temporary residence within 2,500 feet of a location where children regularly congregate. Those places included schools, playgrounds, parks

and public bus stops.

Commissioners voted to amend the ordinance so that it would fall in line with the state's law prohibiting sexual offenders and predators from establishing residences within 1,000 feet of those specified locations. The vote also removed public bus stops from the list of specified locations.

The amendment was passed without discussion at the July 22 meeting

Glades-area libraries offer adult literacy program, with success stories to boot

Retha Pouch has worked in the fields for most of her life. She said she could read OK, but her ability stopped at big words.

"When I first started, I used to get frustrated when I would try to read. I couldn't get the words," said Pouch. "But now, I can read."

Pouch attributes her success to the Palm Beach County Library's Belle Glade Branch, whose Adult Literacy Program brought her together with tutor Mary Catherine Luikart.

"Every time I come, Mary is here and she teaches me a lot. The words I can't get right, she'll say, read the sentence, but skip that word and come back. And I do that and I read it," said Pouch.

"And does that ever make me feel good," said Luikart, who has been

Former South Bay Mayor Celebrates 90 Years

Ray Sullivan turns 90, celebrates with community birthday party

"Here I am at 90 years old. I don't know what the end is, but the Lord is keeping me living," said a smiling Ray Sullivan Sr. as he celebrated his 90th birthday at the South Bay Crossroads Center on Aug. 2.

Ray Sullivan visited Clewiston when he was 16 years old and made a bee-line back to the city as soon as he graduated high school in Hardee County. Sullivan worked as a field clerk for U.S. Sugar before someone told him to apply for a job at one of the Royal's stores in Belle Glade. It was there that Sullivan met his wife, Judy, for the first time.

"I walked right past her [in the store] and didn't even know it. She was 23 at the time. Why she picked the ugliest man in town, I don't know," joked Sullivan as he reminisced about his late wife. The two spent 64 years together and raised four children, Ray Sullivan Jr., Gail Rushing, Marion Primmer and Judy Ann Sullivan.

Sullivan shared both memories and laughs with old friends at his birthday party on Saturday. He spoke of the trees he planted around 1944 on Fourth Avenue in South Bay, which he was able to watch grow over the next 60 years. "The littlest one turned out to be a huge monster," he said.

Just as those trees grew, so too did

the friendships fostered between Sullivan and the community of the Glades. Sullivan said there were friends at his party with whom he grew up and hasn't seen for many, many years.

Sullivan served the community of South Bay as councilman and mayor, and worked at several South Bay businesses, including The Lunch Box, The South Bay Variety Store, Wilson's Superette and Sullivan's Sunoco.

Friends and family came to celebrate Sullivan's fruitful 90 years, but no one seemed to enjoy the party quite like he did.

"I get to see all these pretty women," said Sullivan. "I'll try to make sure I kiss every one of them."

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

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New Critical Wildlife Area Will Protect Nesting Birds

FLORIDA FISH AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) designated a small island in Martin County, known locally as Bird Island, as a Critical Wildlife Area (CWA). The spoil island, also identified as MC2, is an important nesting site for a variety of wading birds and one shorebird species.

For protection of these birds, the entire island, its breakwater structure and the waters immediately surrounding are closed to public access throughout the year in order to create a protective buffer. The buffer will be marked by signs and will vary from 30 to 150 feet in width.

The FWC accomplished this designation with the support of various partners including Martin County, the town of Seawall's Point and several other stakeholder groups.

Based on the abundance and diversity of birds using the island, biologists consider Bird Island one of the top 10 waterbird colonies in south Florida. The two-acre island provides nesting habitat for at least 17 bird species, eight of which are state or federally listed as species of special concern or endangered, respectively, and roosting habitat for many more.

Bird Island is the first CWA to be established by the Commission in more than 20 years. CWAs are established by the FWC to protect important congregations of one or more species of wildlife from human disturbance during critical life stages. Human disturbance can cause wildlife to abandon high-quality habitat that is necessary for their survival. Currently, there are 18 CWAs throughout Florida, which are managed for nesting and wintering shorebirds, wading birds, gopher tortoises and bats.

Located next to the town of Seawall's Point, Bird Island is one of seven spoil islands in Martin County created as a result of dredging in the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway.

Household size and income criteria will be used to determine eligibility. An application can not be approved unless it contains complete eligibility information. Once approved, meal benefits are good for an entire year. You need not notify the organization of changes in income and household size.

Application forms are being sent to all homes with a letter to parents or guardians. To apply for Free or Reduced-Price Meals, households must complete the application and return it to the school. Additional copies are available at the principal's office in each school. The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

Households that receive SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) or TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) are required to list on the application only the child's name, SNAP/TANF case number, and signature of adult household member.

Foster children will receive free benefits regardless of the child's personal income or the income of the household.

Households with children who are considered migrants, homeless, or runaway should contact the district liaison **Jodi Bell at (863) 674-4108**.

For the purpose of determining household size, deployed service members are considered a part of the household. Families should include the names of the deployed service members on their application. Report only that portion of the deployed service member's income made available to them or on their behalf to the family. Additionally, a housing allowance that is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative is not to be included as income.

All other households must provide the following information listed on the application:

- Total household income listed by gross amount received, type of income (e.g., wages, child support, etc.) and how often the income is received by each household member;
- Names of all household members – check the "no income" box if applicable; if household member is a child, list school name for each;
- Signature of an adult household member certifying the information provided is correct; and
- Social security number of the adult signing the application or the word "NONE" for this household member if he or she does not have a social security number.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size changes, the school should be contacted. Children of parents or guardians who become unemployed should also contact the school.

Under the provisions of the Free and Reduced-Price meal policy

Sheila Sheltra will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent or guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he or she may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. If the parent wishes to make a formal appeal, he or she may make a request either orally or in writing to

Finding a Better World; Not Without Difficulty

I remember hearing about students trying to be helpful in one of their science classes. Caterpillars were in the process of morphing into butterflies. The students observed the cocoons and waited as they were developing. One impatient student felt he could help the process along and decided to open a

cocoon to let the newly-forming butterfly out. The butterfly was not fully developed and was short-lived. The nourishment needed was not absorbed and exercise gained by going through the struggle to escape was denied. Good intentions ended badly; a greater lesson was "let nature take its own course."

Too often people try to be of help by intervening in a course of events and things may take an unexpected turn. I have found at times that the best way to help is to leave things alone. Things may take an unexpected turn along the way but a whole new world is opened up. I've been complimented by having students tell me, "there's a lot more to this than I imagined," when we covered human behavior, or when they didn't think they'd like a course but became fascinated with

it.

A good friend had to take early retirement because of health problems. We kept in touch and he began volunteering at the zoo in the community where he found himself. One day he told me, "There's a whole world in there," and he talked about the nature and personalities of the animals he had come to know. I've shared some of the "worlds" I've been blessed to encounter with others over time. They've remarked with a certain sense of awe that, "There is a whole other world here."

Yes, in my Father's house there are many mansions. Recent lessons in scriptural readings related the story of Jacob wrestling with God (Genesis 32:32ff). Jacob was concerned about restoring relations with his brother, Esau, but

their alienation had left him afraid. He hoped to pacify his brother with gifts and sent the gifts ahead to his brother while he stayed behind. Finding himself alone, he encounters someone who wrestles with him all night. His opponent was strong and wrenched Jacob's hip socket; but Jacob refuses to give up the fight. When the man asks finally to be let go, Jacob replies "I will not let you go unless you bless me (32:26)." Jacob learns that he has been wrestling with God! God changes his name: Jacob is to become Israel. Sources reveal that "Israel" means "struggles with God."

tutoring Pouch at the Belle Glade library for almost a year. "There's nothing better than volunteering and helping someone.

Luikart taught second, third and fifth grade in Palm Beach County before she retired.

But the great thing about the library's program is anyone can become a tutor, said Adult Literacy Coordinator Elizabeth Braunworth.

Tutors complete a two-hour orientation class and online tutoring workshop, where they learn the Laubach Way to Reading. Tutors and tutees meet in one of the Palm Beach County Library branches in Belle Glade, Pahokee or South Bay, and tutors must teach their students for a minimum of six months at least once a week in the library.

Pouch and Luikart meet every Tuesday morning from 10 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. in Belle

Glade. Pouch's main goal is not only to learn how to read better, but to take her newfound ability and apply it to a new career.

"I really wouldn't mind doing childcare. I've been working in the fields all my life. I want to get a decent job," said Pouch.

Part of each lesson focuses on an individual's specific goals. For Pouch, that means learning to read and write well enough that she can fill out a job application. For others, it is working on their handwriting.

Whatever goal the tutee has, she can be proud of the outcome that her hard work and constant dedication brings: the ability to read.

"I hate not being able to get the words right. But I know I'll never give up. Until I got here and started reading with Ms. Mary, I was frustrated. But I got here and I work through it with Ms. Mary," said Pouch.

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Back to School Health, Safety and Well-Being

Reminder: vaccinations are important; take the necessary precautions to protect your children

With only a few weeks left of summer break, parents are probably thinking about getting their child ready to go back to school. Along with school clothes and school supplies, parents should make sure preventative health measures are included on their child's back-to-school checklist. Success in school starts with keeping students healthy and safe.

Parents should take their children to a health-care provider for an annual "well-child" check-up and make sure all vaccinations and medical records are in order. Parents should talk with their children about traveling safely to and from school. This includes planning safe routes for walking or riding a bike, reminding them to stay on the sidewalks, crossing the street only at designated crosswalks and showing them how to properly wear a bicycle helmet. Healthy eating, adequate physical activity and good sleep patterns are also instrumental to success in school.

Please take time now to update your children's immunizations and get the required documentation they need to start school.

School requirements for the 2014-2015 school-year, grades K through 12

Effective since the 2011-2012 school year, there must be documentation of at least one dose of polio vaccine administered on or after the fourth birthday for students entering Kindergarten only.

The polio requirement is four doses, with the following exceptions: if the fourth dose is administered prior to the fourth birthday, a fifth dose is required; if the third dose is administered after the fourth birthday, a fourth dose is not required.

Varicella vaccine: one dose is required for grades seven through 12 (or healthcare provider's documentation of evidence of disease); two doses (appropriately spaced) are required for grades K through six (or healthcare provider's documentation of evidence of disease).

Tdap (tetanus/diphtheria/pertussis) vaccine is required prior to entering grades seven through 12.

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Back to School: Florida Health Palm Beach County Helps School Aged Kids Get Ready

The 2014-2015 school year is quickly approaching and Florida Department of Health in Palm Beach County is ready to help parents assure their students have the required immunizations.

Now is the time to prepare for the upcoming school year by reviewing students' immunization records, and schedule an appointment with a medical provider, for a physical and to update any required vaccines.

Florida Health Palm Beach County offers immunizations to school aged children at all of its health centers and on the immunization van that travels throughout the county.

The 2014-2015 school year requires all students in grades 7 to 12 to have proof of one dose of Varicella (Chickenpox) vaccine or have documentation from a provider of having chickenpox. These students also need proof of receiving one dose of Tetanus/Diphtheria/Pertussis (Tdap) Booster. All students in every grade should have

received other vaccines like Mumps, Measles, Rubella, Hepatitis B, Polio and have an up to date form 680 on file as proof of receipt.

Florida Health Palm Beach County will be conducting immunization outreaches to help parents and children get vaccinated and their records up to date. In addition to immunizations being offered at the Health Centers throughout the county, outreaches with the immunization van include the following locations:

Immunization Requirements School Year 2014-2015

Florida Certificate of Immunizations, Form DH 680, is the only document that the schools are permitted to accept as proof of immunization. This form is available through Florida Health Palm Beach County- School Health Division, Florida Health Palm Beach County Health Centers, and other local medical providers. Shots may be obtained through your local physician, local medical providers, Health Department Health Centers or Florida Health Palm Beach

County Immunization Van traveling throughout the area.

- Polio Series
- Measles/Mumps/Rubella (MMR)
- Hepatitis B Series (Hep B)
- Varicella

- Pneumococcal –children 2-59 months entering childcare

By the time a child starts school he/she should have already had all required immunizations. A physical is required for entrance to Pre-kindergarten, kindergarten and those entering 7th grade.

by all seven commissioners and applies to the unincorporated areas of the county only.

Reverend T. Michael Henderson lauded the amendment, saying the change "opens up some slivers of areas" where sexual offenders and predators can move without being in violation of county law.

Rev. Henderson is the director of Pahokee's Matthew 25 Ministries Village, which houses numerous convicted sexual offenders and predators looking to rebuild their lives based on Christian values.

Rev. Henderson said the county's restric-

tive 2,500-foot law was one of the reasons the Matthew 25 Ministry Village was started. With such restrictive laws, he said, many of these men were living under bridges and on the street. "That's why we started a place like this. And it's been successful," said Rev. Henderson.

Rev. Henderson said it was virtually impossible for convicted sexual offenders and predators to find adequate housing that wasn't within 2,500 feet of a park, school or other specified location.

"We're hoping it will lighten the load and give these fellas some options. Not all these guys are predators," said Rev. Henderson, before adding that Matthew 25 Ministries wasn't making a case for people who have committed a crime, instead it was making a case for a second chance.

"One of our members just graduated," began Kelly. "She is attending the University of South Florida and is trying to start the DreamCatchers up there. Another student from Clewiston High School has also been in talks with Kelly -- and now Caitlin -- about bringing the program to Clewiston. "We're trying to expand the program more in Florida and work together with those clubs. In California, they have a bunch of clubs that get together and have parties and things like that. We want to see the same thing in Florida," continued Kelly.

Caitlin is also excited about the plans to expand.

"It's really the most amazing thing," she said. "It's really cool to meet all these people who have become passionate about DreamCatchers. That was my dream since the beginning. To see it catch on in these tiny towns like Pahokee and bigger cities like New York. It just made me really believe that it could catch on anywhere."

Summer Food Service
