Worker Killed in EAA

Construction worker drowns after bulldozer falls into pond during Everglades Restoration project

A construction worker was killed while working on an Everglades Restoration project near South Bay recently.

Clarence Grant, 74, was killed on Aug. 16 when the bulldozer he was operating slid into a 30-foot-by-30-foot hole filled with water along a dirt road off of U.S. 27. Grant was contracted to work on the A1 Flow Equalization Basin (A1-FEB) project, part of an Everglades Restoration project conducted by the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD).

According to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, Clarence Grant was operating a bulldozer at the A1-FEB, back-filling a retention area, when

he apparently backed up too close to the edge of the deep, water-filled hole. Another crew member attempted to signal to Grant that he was close to the edge, according to the sheriff's office, but Grant continued to back up and the large bulldozer slid down into the hole.

The bulldozer was submerged in water to the roof line and the crew member reportedly tried to open the door to let Grant out of the cab, but the door would not open. The crew member reportedly went to get help, but when he returned Grant was unresponsive.

Workers were able to get Grant out of the bulldozer and attempted CPR, said the sheriff's office. Grant was transported via Trauma Hawk to

Lakeside Medical Center where he was pronounced deceased at 9:28 a.m.

Flow Equalization Basins are constructed with the intention to better manage water and nutrient flow into the greater Everglades system. The basins capture and hold water, providing a consistent flow to nearby Stormwater Treatment Areas, which help increase their year-round performance.

The A1-FEB is located off of U.S. 27 southwest of the city of South Bay near STAs 2 and 3/4. The basin encompasses roughly 15,000 acres and is designed to hold approximately 60,000-acre-feet of stormwater.

'The Last Smile'

The Sun interviews Tandra Jones

Tandra Jones is never at a loss for words. Her conversation flows freely with any stranger she meets. She is the family support worker for the Federation of Families of Florida, based out of the Lighthouse Café in downtown Belle Glade. Through her work she helps people apply for food stamps, Medicaid and cash assistance. The Georgia transplant has also helped clients enter drug rehab programs. One recent Thursday, her conversation turned to the memory of her mother.

"Sometimes God does things and puts you in places to better you for certain journeys that you have to take in life. When I came down here and I saw how everybody else was doing when the season was over with, they would hang out

at the loading ramp and sit up under their trees and do their little drugs and drink their little alcohol all day long. And I tried it for a month and at the end of that month I thought, 'It cannot happen. It can't happen. I gotta do one of two things: I either have to find me something to do, or I gotta go back to Georgia.' So I started doing volunteer work at the Weed and Seed and I did that volunteer work for one year, and when they got the position open for my job, they gave me the position.

"My mother died on Mother's Day. I used to tell my co-workers my mom was so mean and she was hateful, even in the end, until the last three weeks of her life. I never really got a chance to see her smile in 25, 30 years. I didn't get that genuine feeling from her.

"The phone rang, at 10:30, and it was this lady, Ms. Christine, and she said, 'Well, Ms. Tandra, I'm sorry to call your house so late, I just got the number and I just wanted to talk with Carrie for a minute.' I said, 'Well, Ms. Christine, I can put the phone up to her ear, but mama hasn't responded to a word in five days.' She said, 'Well, I just want to whisper a prayer to her.'

"And you're gonna think this is crazy, I put the phone up to her ear, and I had my blinds cracked just a little bit. And my mom was kind of

dark, she was a red woman, but those last four or five days, she began to get dark. And as this lady was praying for my mom, you could see this light shining through my bedroom window and the more she prayed for my mother, the more my mom began to smile, and the more her color started to come to her. She was smiling so hard and this smile was so different from anything that I had seen in my mother's face in the past. I have two sisters that's deceased so I asked her, 'Mama, you wouldn't happen to leave me and go visit my sisters would you?' This lady told me yes. Mama didn't say a word in five days and she answered me yes. And I talked to her and I told her how much I loved her and how much I would miss

her and it was a pleasure, even all of the bad days that I thought were bad, the things that she was saying and she was doing. I learned that, when we're in pain, and when we're hurting, we are angry and we're angry with the world. "I was able to be there when she needed me most."

Grant was working for Central Florida Equipment Rentals, Inc., out of Medley, Fla., at the time of the accident. According to case documents from the Occupational Safety and Health Review Commission (OSHR), this is not the first time Central Florida Equipment has seen a death on its work site: In 2008, the Occupational Safety and Hazard Administration (OSHA) investigated a similar incident where a worker drowned after his truck fell into a retention pond

on July 22, 2008 in Homestead, Fla.

OSHA testified that Central Florida Equipment employees were "exposed to a drowning hazard that could cause death" and the company was ordered to pay a \$4,900 penalty -- reduced from a \$7,000 maximum penalty because of the company's small size and the fact that it had no prior history of violations, according to the case documents. The final order is still pending review from OSHRC.

Central Florida Equipment did not immediately respond to calls for comment on the recent case involving the death of Clarence Grant.

Mr. Grant's case remains under investigation.

Aggressive Driving

My deputies have made many strides in improving driving in Palm Beach County.

Let's start with aggressive driving. We've significantly reduced incidents of aggressive driving across our community, making roadways safer for all of us.

In the past six years, my deputies have written more than 10,000 citations for aggressive driving, often for a combination of speeding, improper lane changes, and being reckless toward other drivers. Many of those citations were handed out on Interstate 95 and other busy thoroughfares, including Yamato Road in west Boca Raton, where we had many complaints about aggressive driving and we responded quickly to address the problems.

The Sheriff's Office got help in reducing aggressive driving from our other law enforcement partners, who we worked with on public aware-

ness campaigns to educate motorists about the dangers of driving improperly.

By now, many of the violators have gotten the message: if you drive aggressively in Palm Beach County, you will pay the price for your actions.

For all the progress that we've made on our roadways, there is still room for further improvements.

My traffic division is now focused on slow drivers, who cause accidents or "near misses" because other drivers are trying to get around them. Florida, like all other states, discourages people from continuously traveling in the left lane on multi-lane roads and highways. You should use the left lane only when necessary, for passing, then get back over to the other lane.

We've had terrible accidents in our community that resulted from drivers going too slow in the middle or fast lanes. My deputies are pulling over slow drivers and giving them warnings or citations for failing to drive the speed limit.

Distracted drivers are a problem, too. These are drivers who are looking at their cell phones or texting while driving or they are simply not

paying much attention to their surroundings and end up endangering themselves and all vehicles and pedestrians around them. Just like with slow drivers, we've had an unfortunate share of tragedies involving distracted drivers, particularly inexperienced teenage drivers, who were killed because they didn't focus on the road.

We are also addressing pedestrian accidents, which we've had a lot in Palm Beach County. Too often, pedestrians get hit when they cross in the middle of the road instead of at crosswalks. We encourage pedestrians to increase their visibility at night by carrying a flashlight when walking and by wearing retro-reflective clothing. And again, whenever possible, pedestrians should cross the street at a designated crosswalk. Like with other initiatives, my agency is working on reducing pedestrian accidents by partnering with state transportation officials to educate pedestrians on how to use crosswalks correctly.

So, overall, we're taking many positive steps to make driving safer in our county. Please do your part in driving carefully so we can make sure our roadways are safe for everyone.

Warning Consumers of Utility Bill Scams

Attorney General Pam Bondi advises Floridians to be wary of utility bill scams. In recent utility scams, someone calls and claims to be a representative of a utility company and tells the customer that their utility bill is overdue and payment must be received or services will be shut off immediately. Scammers use devices that alter the caller ID to look like a utility customer service number.

Payments are requested in uncommon ways, such as wiring the money, prepaid cards or gift cards. The latest targets of this scam include restaurants and other businesses that can't afford to have their utility services abruptly shut off;

however individual consumers are just as likely to be targeted.

Consumers can protect themselves from utility scams by following these tips:

- Never provide personal information over the phone or through email.

- If contacted by a suspicious person claiming to be the customer's utility company, the customer should contact his or her utility company and notify them of the recent communications and check the billing status of their current account.

The Ferguson Aftermath and The Dream

Americans commemorated, on Aug. 28, 51 years since America's greatest speech was given: Dr. Martin Luther King's 'I Have a Dream' address at the Lincoln Memorial. Yet, as the aftermath of the Ferguson riots demonstrate, in many ways that dream remains unfulfilled. Certainly we have come a long way from the Negro League baseball in the 1940s, from Brown v. Board of Education in the 1950s, and even from the civil rights movement of the 1960s. Minorities have more opportunities and Americans generally have greater exposure to other cultures than ever before.

Amidst this optimism, however, one must also be a realist. I am therefore not shocked when events like Ferguson occur, since I believe in man's depravity -- his fallen nature. Even today, one hears a racial slur, senses a racist undercurrent at a child's sporting event or reads about an overt act of racially motivated violence, and our hearts sadden. Then we remember as Christians that we belong to a fallen and divided race.

Racism is an area where actions speak louder than words. Many people say that they are more accepting of people from other ethnic backgrounds. They say they are seeking more diverse friendships. Yet unless we individually decide to cross some of the usual boundaries, we will always stay within the lines, and Dr. King's dream will remain less than fully fulfilled.

One place where we ought to always be crossing boundaries is the church. The Bible says, 'There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus' (Gal. 3:28). This verse does not obliterate real social distinctions of ethnicity, class or gender. Yet it insists that we have a fundamental unity in Christ that keeps those distinctions from dividing us. God's Spirit is at work to bring us together in Christ. And this must be reflected in our worship.

This raises a very practical question: What kind of relationships are you forming? How does your life demonstrate the truth that God is making one people in Christ? This is not simply a black and white issue, because skin color is not the only thing that divides us. We are divided by culture, education, economics and even social

class. These barriers can only be crossed by the love of Christ working in us to help us know and care for those who are different from us.

As Christians, we have a remarkable opportunity to know people from many different ethnic and cultural backgrounds. We can worship together, which is a foretaste of Heaven, when people from 'every nation, tribe, people, and language' will gather at God's throne (Rev. 7:9). But we must do more than worship together. We can also know one another. We can care for one another. And we can love one another, showing the world that there is no color line in the kingdom of God.

National Childhood Obesity Awareness Month

Although some progress has been seen lately, childhood obesity is still a major public health problem.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), approximately 17 percent of U.S. children are obese, and certain groups of children are more greatly affected.

Research shows that children who are overweight or obese as preschoolers are more likely than children of normal weight to be overweight or obese as adults and suffer lifelong physical and mental health problems.

Childhood obesity puts kids at risk for health problems that were once seen only in adults, like type 2 diabetes, high blood pressure and heart disease.

There are no simple solutions to childhood obesity. The problem is influenced by many different factors, such as the lack of community places to get physical activity or a lack of access to healthy foods like fresh fruits and vegetables.

Research shows that fruits and vegetables are important in promoting good health and are important when someone wants to lose or manage weight. Fruits and vegetables are naturally low in fat and calories and contain lots of water and fiber (both help you to feel full). Additionally, these foods also contain essential vitamins, minerals and fiber that may help protect chil-

dren against health conditions later in life.

A diet rich in fruits and vegetables is important for everyone, and especially children, because it helps with their growth and development.

Children can eat or drink fewer calories and stay full longer by substituting fruits and vegetables in place of foods with higher-calorie ingredients, such as added sugars and solid fats.

Childhood obesity can be prevented. Communities, health professionals and families can work together to create opportunities for kids to eat healthier and move more.

We can all use this month to raise awareness about the obesity epidemic and show people how they can take steps toward a solution. Here are just a few ideas:

- Encourage families to make small changes, like keeping fresh fruit handy or going on a family walk after dinner.
- Motivate schools to be healthier. Help them provide healthy food options and daily physical activities for students.
- Ask healthcare providers to be leaders in their communities by supporting programs to prevent childhood obesity.

By working together, states, communities and parents can help make fruits and vegetables the easy choice for children and adolescents and help decrease childhood obesity.

Palm Beach BOCC Briefs for Sept. 9

At the September 9, Board of County Commissioners meeting, the board took the following action:

Palm Tran Connection - approved a selection committee's recommendation of three vendors to provide Palm Tran Connection's paratransit services: MV Transportation, Inc. for run package A; First Transit, Inc. for run package B; and Maruti Fleet and Management, LLC for run package C. The proposed seven-year contracts are in the amounts of \$72.67 million, \$76.2 million, and \$35 million, respectively. If approved by the board in October, the new companies will begin service Feb. 1, 2015.

Trespass ordinance - approved on preliminary reading and to advertise for public hearing on October 21 a Palm Tran trespass ordinance that provides a mechanism to temporarily enjoin individuals who have damaged property, violated certain laws, harmed or threatened others, or interfered with Palm Tran's operations from returning to or entering onto property used for Palm Tran fixed-route service.

Movers - adopted a new schedule of fees and fines for the Palm Beach County Moving Ordinance, lowering the late fee for renewal of a moving company's operating permit application from \$250 to \$75.

Hospital liens - withdrew direction to staff to draft an ordinance authorizing hospitals in

Palm Beach County to place a lien on proceeds of personal injury settlements or judgments to cover payment for services rendered to a patient.

Morikami Park - approved a conceptual master plan for future development of and improvements to the 188-acre Morikami Park west of Delray Beach.

The plan proposes adding 34 acres to the Morikami Museum and Japanese Gardens, 25 acres for preservation and trails, 15 acres for open-field parking, 16 acres for future/institutional use, and 11 acres for a proposed Japanese inn (ryokan) and restaurant.

Wellfields - approved on preliminary reading and to advertise for public hearing on October 21 an amendment to Unified Land Development Code updating the county's wellfield zone of influence maps.

Marina - approved a dockage agreement with the town of Lake Park for the lease of boat slips at the Lake Park Harbor Marina. Palm Beach County Fire Rescue requires dockage for two boats in order to provide emergency marine rescue services to the Lake Park area.

Retirements - recognized Water Utilities Director Bevin Beaudet and Library Director John Callahan, who are retiring this month.

Administrator's contract - approved a contract amendment with County Administrator Robert Weisman setting a salary increase

and effective date the same as other employees. Mr. Weisman will retire August 31, 2015, after 34 years with Palm Beach County, 23 as administrator.

Executive search - approved a contract in the amount of \$24,250 with NP&S Management, Inc. (dba S. Renee Narloch & Associates) as the consultant for the executive search for a new county administrator.

New TrophyCatch Website Meets 'I Do'

FLORIDA FISH AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) staff were at the world's largest tackle trade show when it came to Florida, the "Fishing Capital of the World," in July. ICAST attracted 11,000-plus attendees, all of whom were professionals involved with recreational fishing.

FWC staff took this opportunity to thank the industry for its contributions. They also highlighted the importance of recreational fishing in Florida while showcasing programs that benefit Florida anglers and resources. Among these are the latest TrophyCatch website and a new "I Do" campaign.

Recreational fishing provides an \$8.9-billion benefit to the state's economy, which supports 79,200 fishing related jobs greater than in any other state. Florida fishing license fees and federal aid provide critical investments to enhance recreational fishing and boating. State statutes ensure "revenues from fees paid by hunters and sport fishers may not be diverted to purposes other than the administration of fish and wildlife programs by the FWC." This is a guarantee that your license money will not be diverted to other purposes.

In addition to fishing license fees, a percentage paid on the purchase of fishing equipment and motorboat fuels, and import duties on boats are placed into a federal trust fund administered by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. States and territories are then allocated their share based on the number of paid fishing-license holders and the state's land and water area.

On the freshwater side, these funds allow the

Division of Freshwater Fisheries Management to produce more than 3 million sport fish per year for stocking public waters, including about 2 million largemouth bass. Biologists evaluate fish populations and angler use in fresh waters

throughout Florida. When combined with public input and research on the ecology, genetics and life history of Florida's freshwater sport fishes, this information allows the FWC to focus management activities, such as habitat restoration, stocking and aquatic plant management, to ensure sustainable use.

Boating access and safety also benefit. Fuel purchases for boats are a major source of Sport Fish Restoration (SFR) funds, so 15 percent of those dollars go to boating programs. These include an average of 30 boating-access projects annually with local government entities. In addition, the FWC maintains more than 240 boat ramps statewide, and provides location and access information on about 1,700 public boat ramps (MyFWC.com/BoatRamps).

Through TrophyCatch, the FWC has partnered with the fishing industry to reduce the need for regulations and to bring extra value to anglers. Rewarding anglers for releasing trophy bass, rather than prohibiting their harvest, ac-

complishes many of the same goals and has additional benefits. TrophyCatch is a citizen-science, data-collection program that rewards anglers who document and release bass heavier than 8 pounds. By providing valuable rewards,

donated by industry partners such as those at ICAST, TrophyCatch acquires hard-to-obtain information about when, where and how trophy bass are caught in Florida. That information helps determine which conservation efforts are most effective. It also encourages live release of trophy bass and keeps the mature females in their native waters.

Thanks to Brandt Information Services, a new TrophyCatch website (TrophyCatchFlorida.com) was introduced at ICAST. Every angler who fishes in Florida should go online and register. Registering makes you eligible for a drawing for a Phoenix bass boat, powered by Mercury Marine and equipped with a Power-Pole shallow-water anchoring system and MotorGuide trolling motor all donated by the industry to support this conservation effort. While on the site, check out the rules and be sure to have a scale, camera and tape measure with you next time you go fishing. If you catch, document and release a qualifying bass, you will earn at least \$100 in gift cards from

Bass Pro Shops, Dick's Sporting Goods and/or Rapala, as well as a shirt from Bass King Clothing, certificate, decal and bragging rights on the Web and with your social media friends.

In recognition of the importance of license fees and SFR funds, the Wildlife Foundation of Florida, "Florida Sportsman" magazine and other valued partners also launched the "I Do" Florida fishing license campaign at ICAST (FloridaFishingLicenseCampaign.com). This campaign encourages all anglers, even those who are exempt, to buy a Florida fishing license to contribute directly to improving fishing opportunities. Every new paid-license holder, in addition to the cost of the license, helps the FWC attain approximately \$8 more from SFR. So you spend \$17 but generate \$25 to support your sport and conserve our fish and their habitats.

"Let's buy a license as an investment in the outdoors we cherish," said Karl Wickstrom, founder and editor in chief of "Florida Sportsman." "Think of it not as a burden but a bargain." Go to License.MyFWC.com or call 888-FISH FLORIDA (888-347-4356) to order your license and to ensure access to a lifetime of fun, safe and sustainable fishing opportunities.

Improving Everglades Water Quality

Everglades Agricultural Area again achieves phosphorus reduction goals

SOUTH FLORIDA WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT

For the 19th consecutive year, water flowing from farmlands in the Everglades Agricultural Area (EAA) achieved phosphorus reductions that exceed those required by law.

Implementation of improved farming techniques, known as Best Management Practices (BMPs), produced a 63-percent phosphorus reduction in the 470,000-acre EAA farming region south of Lake Okeechobee for the Water Year 2014 monitoring period (May 1, 2013 – April 30, 2014). The requirement is a 25-percent phosphorus reduction.

“Everglades restoration relies on a suite of water quality improvement strategies, and BMPs are an essential component,” said Daniel O’Keefe, Chairman of the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) Governing Board. “Reducing phosphorus and exceeding these requirements year after year reflects a long-term commitment to water quality improvements by South Florida’s farmers.”

Examples of BMPs include refined storm-

water management practices, on-farm erosion controls and more precise fertilizer application methods. These and other management practices by agricultural growers reduce the amount of phosphorus transported in stormwater runoff that reaches the Everglades and its connected water bodies.

BMP Program Delivering Successful Results

To meet the requirements of Florida’s Everglades Forever Act, the amount of phosphorus leaving the EAA must be 25 percent less than before reduction efforts started. A science-based model is used to compute the reductions and make adjustments to account for the influences of rainfall. Over the program’s 19-year history, the overall average annual reduction from the implementation of BMPs is 55 percent, more than twice the amount required by law.

When measured in actual mass, 180 metric tons of phosphorus were prevented from leaving the EAA and entering the regional canal system, which sends water into the Everglades, during the Water Year 2014 monitoring period. Over the

past 19 years, the BMP program has prevented 2,854 metric tons of phosphorus from leaving the EAA.

Just west of the EAA, in the 170,000-acre C-139 Basin, a BMP program has been in place for the past 10 years. In November 2010, the program requirements were enhanced to better control the nutrient runoff. For the Water Year 2014 monitoring period, data show the actual mass of phosphorus discharged from the basin during that time was 28 metric tons. Ongoing work continues to focus on improving phosphorus reductions in this basin, which historically has reported elevated nutrient levels in its soils and runoff.

Stormwater Treatment Areas Provide Additional Improvements

Water leaving the EAA and C-139 Basin receives additional treatment in one of several Stormwater Treatment Areas (STAs) before entering the Everglades. These constructed wetlands are filled with native vegetation and use “green” technology to further reduce phosphorus levels.

Since 1994, the network of five STAs south of Lake Okeechobee—currently with 57,000 acres of effective treatment area—have treated 14.8 million acre-feet of water and retained approximately 1,874 metric tons of phosphorus that would have otherwise entered the Everglades. Last year, the STAs treated approximately 1.3 million acre-feet of water, retaining 81 percent of phosphorus from water flowing through the treatment cells.

Through the end of April 2014, more than 4,582 metric tons of phosphorus have been prevented from entering the Everglades through treatment wetlands and the BMP program combined.

Overall, Florida has invested more than \$1.8 billion to improve Everglades water quality since 1994.

Additional improvements in Everglades water quality are being achieved by Governor Scott’s Restoration Strategies initiative, which includes more than 6,500 acres of STA expansions and construction of 116,000 acre-feet of additional water storage.
