Pahokee city commissioners presented a “key to the city” last week to the Glades area representative on the Palm Beach County School Board, Marcia Andrews, recognizing her diligence in representing the area’s interests before that board and in many other places.

Said Pahokee Mayor Keith Babb: “It is indeed an honor to present our key to the city to school board representative Marcia Andrews. Ms. Andrews has been an outstanding school board member. She’s always here in the city

of Pahokee anytime we need her, at all of our signature events, whether it’s the Martin Luther King celebration, our prayer walk or our back-to-school bash. (She supports) all of our programs, all of our services that we provide, and a lot of them don’t necessarily deal with education or kids, but she understands that to build a community, it takes the entire village, and she’s one of those persons that we consider one of our ‘Dream Team.’”

He noted that the first key to the city he’d presented was to Palm Beach County Mayor Melissa McKinlay and said it was appropriate

PBSO, Forensic Imaging Investigators have release a photo based on a reconstruction of the skull remains. The male is white, possibly Hispanic, approximately 40 to 70 years of age and

Belle Glade plans infrastructure enhancements

Belle Glade City Commissioners approved enhancements for the municipal airport at the July 16 meeting.

The meeting's agenda included updates about the city's economic and employment opportunities, infrastructure enhancements, and resolution approvals. The commissioners adopted two resolutions that involved enhancements at the municipal airport in Belle Glade.

One resolution focused on entering a joint participation agreement with the State of Florida's Department of Transportation (FDOT) to fund Taxiway Charlie Design Services; and the other resolution was approved to construct a new sewer line at the airport in collusion with FDOT.

After the discussion many opportunities for new business and employment opportunities were presented in the city manager's report.

"I am happy that the city is bringing in new employment opportunities," Uzuri Collier, a Belle Glade resident said. "Often times people do not have jobs because they lack experience or expertise – so I applaud the city for meeting the people where they are by making these options available," she added.

City Manager Lomax Harrelle presented several updates about enhancements to the city. Residents can look forward to continued improvements to infrastructure because of grants and projects in place. Over \$1 million will be allocated to begin improvements to inner-city sidewalks in 2019.

Mr. Harrelle also noted that the city secured a \$380,000 grant to fix city drainage

in areas of Avenue H, Southwest Avenue K, Southeast Third Street and Northwest Third Street. The aforementioned streets are being restructured because they have the potential to flood or have flooded in the past.

Mr. Harrelle said that the county's water and waster water project is in its third year and moving along swiftly. Investing about \$100 million in the project, the county continues to restore the cleanliness of the area and repave roads when the work is done.

City parks are also getting a new look. The 1¢ sales tax will be used to integrate old playground equipment with state of the art equipment at Lake Shore Park and Hand Park – and the parks at Northeast 21st Street and Southwest Fourth Street will receive new equipment. It is projected that \$1 million will be invested into city parks.

"The City of Belle Glade stepped up for

our kids to enhance the parks for the youth," Mayor Steve Wilson said. "The whole objective is to have something for our kids to do recreation wise – and its effective immediately," he added.

Belle Glade has various infrastructure and economic development projects underway. Residents can get involved and share their feedback on these projects by attending the regular commission meetings held on the third Monday of each month at 6:30 p.m. The meetings are held at the Belle Glade City Hall, 110 Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd West in Belle Glade.

In other business, with safety being a top priority for the city, the commissioners recognized Robert Way, a public works employee of two years who received the June 2018 Employee Safety Award.

to honor, "with the second key during my turn, Ms. Andrews, a wonderful fighter for the Glades area and the City of Pahokee altogether."

During the presentation to Ms. Andrews, the mayor called her "a part of the city's family" and that, having a key, she never again needed to let anyone know when she was coming.

"This is indeed a great honor," said Ms. Andrews. "I've never received a key to the city, and so to be able to get the key to the City of Pahokee means everything to me. I've always thought I belonged here ... and so I didn't need this key to know that I belonged here ... but certainly receiving the key officially ... it tells me now that I truly AM here, I am a part of you. I love the city of Pahokee ... and as we build Pahokee, it's part of my dream. I'm going to be here for you. Thank you so much for this honor."

In other business, the city commissioners:

- Unanimously adopted a resolution setting their tentative millage rate for the 2019 fiscal year, required under the state's Truth in Millage law, at 6.5419 mills, and their rollback rate of 6.2271 mills. One mill equals \$1 of tax for every \$1,000 of a property's assessed valuation. The rollback rate is the tax rate with which the city could raise the same revenue as was garnered from the previous year's tax rate, taking into consideration the change in the value of the properties in the city.

- Passed a resolution authorizing the campground, marina, prefabricated restroom, pavilion and landscaping agreement between A. Genesis Construction LLC and the City of Pahokee in the amount of \$118,700. It was a last-minute add-on to the agenda due to a looming state deadline to get all the projects involved in the marina/campground/restaurant renovation under contract in time to fulfill state grant requirements.

- Learned from City Manager Chandler Williamson that the city's Back to School Bash will be Saturday, Aug. 4. "We've already contacted most of our sponsors, and I think we anticipate having about 20-25 vendors, providing health, wellness, community services, etc. (information) ... and we have all of our volunteers back again this year. It's from 10 until 2 this year and it will be at the high school," he said.

WEST PALM BEACH — Clerk & Comptroller Sharon R. Bock's office is now accepting credit card payments over the phone for those with traffic tickets and criminal court fines or fees. The service is designed to make it easier for customers to meet their court-ordered financial obligations.

The Clerk's office has contracted with the Court, an independent payment processing company, to accept phone payments from customers who wish to pay by credit card.

To use the service, customers call the Clerk's customer call center at 561-355-2994 between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Monday through Friday. A Clerk employee will verify the amount owed before seamlessly transferring the caller to a Court representative to complete the credit card transaction. A 6 percent service charge from the Court is added to the payment amount for each credit card transaction.

Before the launch of this new service, customers with criminal fines, fees or payment plans were required to make payments either by mail or in person. This service gives them a more convenient way to comply with their court obligations.

Board of County Commissioners Briefs

At the July 10, Board of County Commissioners meeting, the board took the following action:

- Fire Rescue – accepted a Florida Department of Health emergency medical services matching grant in the amount of \$137,730 for a Chronic Disease Management Project (CDMP) for the period of May 23, 2018 through June 30, 2019, and approved the addition of a grant-funded on-call Chronic Disease Management Project coordinator position at an hourly rate of \$29.42 on a temporary basis for the duration of the one-year program. The required match for the grant is \$45,910 (25%), which will be funded from Fire Rescue's contingency reserve.

- Fire hydrants – adopted a resolution setting the special assessment rate to fund fire hydrant maintenance and rental fees charged to the county by the city of Riviera Beach or its utility special district in a certain unincorporated area within the county's Fire Rescue jurisdiction and the city's water utility services area.

- Millage – authorized staff to submit proposed millage rates for the FY 2019 budget to the Property Appraiser's Office. The proposed rates for countywide, Library and Fire Rescue MSTU are at the current millage rate and above rollback. The millage rate for the Jupiter Fire MSTU is below the current year millage rate and below rollback. Two public hearing dates for preliminary and final adoption of the FY 2019 budget were set: Sept. 4 and Sept. 17 at 6 p.m. in the sixth floor chambers of the County Governmental Center.

- Supervisor of Elections – approved a budget transfer of \$840,000 to the Supervisor of Elections (SOE) to cover the cost of a special election. The state will reimburse the SOE for the election, but it is not expected in the current fiscal year.

- Affordable housing – approved the appointment of nine individuals to serve on the Commission on Affordable Housing (CAH): Leonard Tylka, Miguel Jose Muniz, Laurel Robinson, Ezra M. Krieg, Joseph E. Gray, Corey W. O'Gorman, Gail Williams, James T. Houston and George A. Campbell. Establishing an affordable housing advisory panel is required as a condition of receiving State Housing Initiatives Partnership (SHIP) funding from the Florida Housing Finance

Corporation.

- SHIP – approved Fiscal Year 2018-2019 State Housing Initiatives Partnership (SHIP) budget allocations for affordable housing strategies as follows: purchase assistance \$900,000; owner-occupied housing rehabilitation \$327,667; foreclosure prevention \$60,000; administrative costs \$143,074. These are state funds that require no local match.

- PBC Action Plan – adopted a resolution approving the Palm Beach County Action Plan for Fiscal Year 2018-2019 authorizing the county administrator or designee to execute standard forms and certifications for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) programs, as well as funding agreements and other documents necessary for implementation. This action approves a total of \$9,307,278 in federal funding.

- Property maintenance – approved on preliminary reading and to advertise for public hearing on Aug. 14 an ordinance revising provisions in the property maintenance code to improve public safety and welfare, ensure that developed and vacant properties and abandoned golf courses meet minimum maintenance requirements, update swimming pool barrier requirements, require owners of multiple occupancy structures to provide for extermination within the structure and make changes recommended by the County Attorney's Office.

- Youth Services – conceptually approved Youth Services Department allocations for funding in the areas of health and wellness, and educational supports, for the period of Oct. 1, 2018, through Sept. 30, 2019, with two one-year extensions at the option of the county, in an estimated total amount of \$863,697.

- Public Safety – approved an interlocal agreement with the Health Care District of Palm Beach County to provide nursing staffing services to disaster relief shelters through May 31, 2023.

- Juvenile Justice – directed staff to continue discussions with the ReentryTask Force, the Department of Juvenile Justice and the state regarding a partnership to create a juvenile transitional step-down facility in Palm Beach County. Staff will also explore federal funding and regional partnerships with Miami-Dade and Broward counties.

BELLE GLADE — A new barbering program is about to get underway on Palm Beach State College's Belle Glade campus, and the timing couldn't be better. With many licensed barbers nearing retirement age, and millennial males clamoring for the latest hair and beard styles, the demand for new barbers is growing fast.

PBSC's Barbering program launches Aug. 23, and space is still available in the evening program. Those interested may attend an information session on Tuesday, July 31, from 4-6 p.m. at the TEC Building Patio on the Belle Glade campus, 1977 College Drive. Prospective students may also visit www.palmbeachstate.edu/programs/Trades-BG for program details or call 561-993-1175.

"We are so excited to bring this new opportunity to the Glades," said Dr. Gloria McAllister, program director for Postsecondary Adult Vocational certificate programs on the Belle Glade campus. "There will be many job opportunities for our barbering graduates to work in existing businesses or to start their own shops."

In fact, local barbers concerned over the lack of new talent asked PBSC to start the program. The Belle Glade campus already had Cosmetology, Facial Specialty, and Nail Technician programs housed in a brand new salon environment. With this fully equipped facility in place, the barbering program took shape. "This program is great for men and women, and we have both genders enrolling in the program," McAllister said. "More and more shops are unisex, and both groups need to have knowledge of the full range of services. By adding barbering to our existing cosmetology offering, we can prepare professionals for all clientele."

In the 20-month program, students gain expertise in hair cutting and styling, beard and mustache trimming, shaving and skin care services, and hair coloring and chemical processes (hair relaxing and permanent waving), as well as barbershop management. As a public institution, PBSC's low tuition rate saves in-state students thousands of dollars over private schools. In addition,

financial aid is available.

Program graduates are eligible to apply for their Florida Barber License and sit for the required licensing exam. Upon passing the exam, graduates will become licensed barbers, qualified to perform all barbering services in Florida. "I really want to expand my career choices," said Judi Austin, who recently enrolled. "The barbering program will give me that opportunity. I can't wait for classes to begin."

Hickpochee Avenue, in the City of Labelle, Florida, why the prayers of said Complaint should not be granted and why the proceedings for the Bond Resolution and the Bond, the application of proceeds of the Bond for the purposes set forth in the Bond Resolution, and said Bond when issued pursuant to the Bond Resolution should not be validated and confirmed as therein prayed.

The Palm Beach County Criminal Justice Commission (CJC) recently graduated its 35th class of Citizen's Criminal Justice Academy participants. The 32 attendees who completed the program in the Glades were of various ages and backgrounds. They came together for five consecutive weeks to learn about the criminal justice system. Speakers from local, state and federal law enforcement agencies served as subject matter experts.
