## McAlpin man dies in Saturday wreck

### Robbie known to always smile, laugh

A McAlpin man was killed in a Saturday afternoon wreck after crashing into a fence and tree on 86th Street, according to the Florida Highway Patrol.

Robert Roy Newman III, 23, was driving westbound in a white 2002 Toyota Rav-4 SUV around 5:15 p.m.

on 86th Street, about .2 miles east of Live Oak, when he failed to negotiate a curve to the left. The Toyota traveled off the roadway onto the north grass shoulder where it struck a fence and tree, according to FHP.

FHP reported that excessive speed was a contributing factor for the crash.

## Woman faces additional charges following standoff

A Branford woman faces additional criminal charges following an alleged suicide attempt that evolved into a four-hour standoff on Tuesday, March 26, according to the Suwannee County Sheriff's Office.

According to a SCSO report, Janice Wilson Thomas, 49, was in possession of a .380 caliber semi-auto pistol on Tuesday when she did shoot at a deputy and threaten to shoot other deputies on the scene. Thomas was later found to be a convicted felon through a check of her criminal history, which showed she was guilty of a charge of possession of cocaine in 2005 in Columbia County. Thomas was then charged with possession of a firearm by a convicted felon.

On March 26, at approximately 4:30 p.m., an officer responded to 4347 284th Street, Branford, in reference to Thomas, who allegedly attempted to commit suicide by pills. While en route, the officer was advised by dispatch that the husband stated he had heard a gunshot and Thomas was not responding to him calling for her.

## Update: Cash advance robber still at large



The man who robbed a cash advance store in Suwannee County March 11 and believed to be the same one who robbed a Bank of America in Columbia County a week later is still being sought, according to the Suwannee County Sheriff's Office.

According to Suwannee County Sheriff's Office Chief Deputy Ron Colvin, on Monday, March 11, a call came in about 4:27 p.m. of a robbery at Advance America Cash Advance at 6828 Suwannee Plaza Lane, Live Oak.

The store clerk said that the individual had been in the store and around the area several times that day prior to robbing the store. When the man entered the store, he demanded cash and obtained an undetermined amount of money. The clerk did not see a gun, although the man said he had one. The man then fled on foot.





Campos said Newman always had a way to catch


the eyes of many in whatever he did.

When the officer arrived at the scene, he was informed by the husband that Thomas was locked in her bedroom located on the northwest side of the home. When the officer walked inside the home and found the bedroom door locked,

he then knocked on the door and announced Sheriff's Office, and there was no answer. The officer repeated the statement several times before attempting to kick the door open, with the end result of having to shoulder the door open. When the door opened, the officer entered the room

and observed Thomas sitting cross legged on the bed and pointing a gun at him. As he ducked back out of the bedroom door, the officer heard a gunshot. He then exited the home and took cover outside.

Thomas later exited the home multiple times holding the gun in her right hand threatening to start shooting and threatened to commit suicide if they (law enforcement) did not leave.

Around 8 p.m., Thomas exited the home without the gun and was ordered to the ground and taken into custody.

Thomas was arrested and transported to the Suwannee County Jail. She is being charged with attempted murder on a law enforcement officer and nine counts of aggravated assault with a firearm on law enforcement officers, and possession of a firearm by a convicted felon.

## Let's GROW Suwannee!

In our first *Let's GROW Suwannee!* article last month, we gave details about the jobs that will be created by Klausner Lumber One in our Suwannee County sawmill. Since then, North Florida Workforce has posted the first positions and a job fair will be held in the next several months.

The figures in that first article came from an Economic Impact Analysis prepared by the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity's Labor Market Statistics Center. The study projected that 734 temporary jobs will be created during the construction phase of this new facility: 513 direct jobs in construction, 75 indirect jobs in construction supply industries, and 146 induced jobs because of the spending of those in the direct and indirect jobs.

When the sawmill is in full operation, there will be 940 projected jobs: 350 direct jobs in the mill, 415 indirect jobs in the timber industry, and 175 induced jobs. We know that Suwannee County alone cannot supply the workers needed for construction or operation of this plant therefore the analysis was based on a five-county region.

How much money will these new jobs bring?

During the construction phase, salaries are projected to be \$29.8 million. If an equal number of employees came from each of the five counties that would mean that almost \$6 million of additional income will flow into Suwannee County!

When the sawmill begins operation, those jobs will mean a labor income gain of \$36.8 million annually over the region. Again, if those workers come equally from five counties that will mean \$7.36 million of additional income in Suwannee County every year!

While we divided these figures between the 5 counties equally, we can be pretty sure that more employees will come from Suwannee County than the counties that are farther away from the sawmill.

One more figure to look at is the Gross Domestic Product (GDP), a widely accepted measure of economic activity. It measures the value of all goods and services produced, or more simply, it tells how much monetary value there is to what everyone is doing. Because of the Klausner sawmill, the regional GDP is projected to increase by \$56,621,358.

None of these figures include the jobs, salaries, or output from the other industries that will be moving to Suwannee County because of the sawmill. We continue to meet with companies that are interested in using byproducts from Klausner. You should be aware that NONE of them have asked that land be given to them; all of them plan to purchase their needed land.

It is true that Klausner has been given land for their enterprise. When the investment in buildings and equipment by the Klausner folks is visible (as we observed in Germany), along with a number of collocating companies, the money spent by the county in preparation will be clearly seen as the investment in our future that it is!

One final note: Are you a small business owner? When you started your business did you encounter roadblocks, regulatory burdens, or other issues? A group from the state level is cooperating with the Florida Chamber of Commerce and seeking information about your experiences. A meeting in Live Oak is planned for April. The focus of this project is to make it easier and more efficient for Florida businesses to startup. Please call me (386-362-3071) if you would be willing to shed light on issues that were most burdensome to you as you began your business.

# Minority student needs

Professor Craig Frisby is on the faculty of University of Missouri's Department of Educational, School and Counseling Psychology. His most recent book is "Meeting the Psychoeducational Needs of Minority Students." It's a 662-page textbook covering a range of topics from multiculturalism and home and family influences to student testing and school discipline. There's no way full justice can be given to this excellent work in the space of this column, so I'll highlight a few valuable insights he makes that would help educators do a better job with minority students.

Quack multiculturalism is the name Frisby gives to the vision of multiculturalism that promotes the falsehoods and distortions that dominate today's college agenda, sold under various names such as "valuing diversity," "being sensitive to cultural differences" and "cultural competence." He identifies different brands of multiculturalism such as boutique, Kumbayah, light-and-fluffy, and bean-counting multiculturalism. Insider language used to promote multiculturalism includes terms such as "practice tolerance," "celebrate diversity," "equity with excellence" and "differences are not deficits." Escalating costs and budget crunches don't stop colleges from hiring vice presidents, deans and directors of diversity.

Multiculturalism teaches that one set of cultural values is equal to another. That means if black students talk, dress and comport themselves in a certain way, to criticize them is merely cultural imperialism. Frisby cites college textbooks that teach: "Racism is what people do, regardless of what they think or feel" and "Institutional racism is characterized by practices or policies that systematically limit opportunities for people who historically have been characterized as psychologically, intellectually, or physically deficient" and "One can view the clock as a tool of racism that the monochromic dominant society uses to regulate subordinate groups."

All of this boils down to teaching undergraduate and graduate students and professionals in the fields of psychology and education to be non-critical and feel sympathy for blacks and other minorities. I might add that such sympathy doesn't extend to Japanese, Chinese and Jews, who are even more of a minority.

Frisby gives many examples of multicultural lunacy.

One particularly egregious one was the 12th annual White Privilege Conference (WPC) held in 2011 in Minneapolis, Minn., and sponsored by the University of Colorado's Matrix Center for the Advancement of Social Equity. The WPC is "built on the premise that the U.S. was started by white people, for white people." Among the 150 work-

shops offered during the conference were "Making Your School or Classroom a Force for Eliminating Racism," "Helping Non-White Students Survive Academia -- The Pinnacle of White Dominance" and "Uprooting Christian Hegemony." This vision of the mission of education might help to explain why students, particularly minority students, emerge from high school and college with little reading, writing and thinking ability.

Frisby turns his attention to school discipline and criminal behavior. He discusses the atmosphere at one New York school, which is by no means unique among schools. Teachers experience being pushed, shoved and spit upon by students. A male teacher transferred to another school after a student threatened to rape his wife. In this kind of atmosphere, should anyone be surprised that only 3 percent of the students were at grade level in English and only 9 percent in math?

The fundamental problem crippling low-income minority students is school behavioral disorder. Its visible manifestations are graffiti, broken and vandalized furniture, fights, sexual activity, drug use in the bathrooms and rowdy behavior. Frisby says we should tell students exactly how to behave and tolerate no disorder. That's not rocket science, except for today's liberal establishment who run our schools and colleges.

You say, "Williams, what Frisby says simply reflects the insensitivity of privileged white people." But what if I told you that Professor Craig Frisby is a black professor at the University of Missouri who has a record of fine scholarship? My read of his book is that it supplies more evidence that the actions of soft-minded, guilty white liberals have done far more harm to black people than racists of the past could have ever done.

March marks the golden anniversary of the 1963 United States Supreme Court case of *Gideon v. Wainwright* which held that every person charged with a serious offense has a constitutional right to a lawyer. In *Gideon*, it was recognized that in an adversarial system of justice, lawyers are necessities, not luxuries, and when poor people who cannot afford a lawyer are haled into court, a fair trial and confidence in the outcome can only be assured when counsel is afforded to them.

Florida has strong ties to *Gideon*. The case involved a crime committed in Florida, and the original petition to the Supreme Court was written from a cell at Florida State Prison. As a result of the case, Florida became a leader in providing counsel to indigents through the Public Defender system.

Statewide, lawyers working in Public Defenders offices are recognized as among the best lawyers in the state. Each year Florida's Public Defenders also run nationally recognized training sessions.

Last year, the 18 dedicated Assistant Public Defenders of the Third Judicial Circuit Public Defender's Office handled almost 9,000 cases. Ask any judge or prosecutor and they will tell you the criminal justice system could not function without the hard work of these lawyers. While the majority of our funding comes from the legislature, invaluable support is also provided by the county commissions in each of the seven counties in the circuit. Representing the poor is truly a joint effort only made possible by the efforts of too many people to name.

The 50 year anniversary of *Gideon* is not only an appropriate time to recognize the Assistant Public Defenders and staff of the Third Judicial Circuit Public Defender's Office, but also to give thanks to all of those who make it possible for a United States citizen to walk into court realizing they will receive a fair disposition because they are entitled to a lawyer.

### Five year run coming to a close

The Branford High School After School Program which is funded through a state grant may be coming to an end soon if alternate funding isn't found. The program's actual name is 21st Century Community Learning Center. It was attained through the Department of Education, according to BHS Site Coordinator Karen Koon.

"It's a program that addresses our target audience which is 'at risk' students for drop-out," said Koon. "The focus is drop-out prevention. We provide credit retrieval that helps them academically stay on target. We are in our fifth year of a five-year grant, so this is the last one."

Koon said that presently there are after

school programs at both Suwannee Middle School and Suwannee High School and she and others just want to give Branford students the same opportunities. It's the fifth and possibly final year of the highly successful program because the same grant usually can't be attained a second time around, according to Koon.

"They (state of Florida) typically only award it one time," said Koon. "We got the grant at the elementary (Branford Elementary School) several years ago. Even if we applied for the grant again, we probably wouldn't get it because they like to spread it out."

Koon said it was going to be tough to acquire the funding and even harder on the kids who benefit if the school is unable to have the program anymore.

She said the number varies, but presently

they average about 25 students. They are able to provide academic enrichment which a lot of them don't get allowing the kids to build robots, constructing, rocket-launching and other types of experiments and activities during the day.

"It's been very beneficial to many of our students," said Koon. "It's not only school. We offer academic enrichment, personal enrichment, we offer adult education and parent involvement."

She said they allow students to also explore any interests in the arts and music and since they don't have tennis courts on campus, they occasionally have what she described as a "walking field trip" to Hatch Park.

"We give them that experience which most of our little kids wouldn't get with the tennis and music," said Koon.

Koon is also the coordinator for the Nation-







# “Are Expired Medications Still Safe?”

It is 2 a.m. and that cough and stuffy nose you have been battling is still keeping you up. You reach for the nighttime cold relief medicine only to find it expired a few months ago. If you take a dose to ease your symptoms, will you be putting yourself at risk?

This situation is a relatively common occurrence. Many medicine cabinets are stocked with over-the-counter drugs as well as prescription medications that may be past their expiration dates. It is a good idea to routinely discard expired medicines, but if you happen to take a drug that has passed its expiration date, you will most likely suffer no ill effects.

According to the Harvard Medical School Family Health Guide, the expiration date on a medicine is not the dates when a drug becomes hazardous. Rather, it marks the period of time after which a drug company can no longer guarantee the efficacy of

the medication. Since 1979, drug manufacturers selling medications in the United States have been required by the Food and Drug Administration to stamp an expiration date on their products. This is the date until which the manufacturer can still guarantee full potency of the drug.

Expiration dates also may be a marketing ploy. Francis Flaherty, a retired FDA pharmacist, has said drug manufacturers put expiration dates on products for marketing purposes rather than scientific reasons. It doesn't make financial sense to a company to have products on the shelves for years. Therefore, most drug manufacturers will not do long-term testing on products to confirm if they will be effective 10 to 15 years after manufacture.

The U.S. military has conducted their own studies with the help of the FDA. FDA researchers tested more than 100 over-the-counter and prescription drugs. Around 90 percent were proven to still be effective long past the expiration date -- some for more than 10 years. Drugs that are stored in cool, dark places have a better chance of lasting because the fillers used in the product will not separate or start to break down as they might in a warm, humid environment. Storing medicines in the refrigerator can prolong their shelf life.

Although a pharmacist cannot legally advise consumers to use medication past an expiration date, most over-the-counter pain relievers and drugs in pill form should still be fine. Certain liquid antibiotics and drugs made up of organic materials can expire faster than others. For those who still want to err on the safe side, routinely clean out medications from cabinets once they expire. However, if an expired medication is taken by mistake, there's little need to worry about potentially adverse effects.
