Pinetta, Lee Score High On Revamped FCAT Writing Skills

Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT) writing skills scores were released on Friday, May 21, with Pinetta Elementary and Lee Elementary School fourth graders scoring high.

Pinetta Elementary fourth graders led the pack with a score of 90 percent. Lee Elementary School fourth graders came in second with a score of 89 percent. Madison County High School 10th graders scored 81 percent. Madison County Central School fourth graders scored 54 percent.

Madison County Central School eighth graders scored 53 percent. Greenville Elementary School fourth graders scored 39 percent. These scores are based on the Florida Department of Education moving the cut score down on the test to a 3.0.

Health And Healing Fair Focuses On Senior Needs

The community Health and Healing Fair 2012 is a mix of vital wellness and disability information targeted to seniors age 60 and over. The free event takes place this Wednesday, May 23, from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. in the Senior Citizens Council of Madison County dining hall, 1161 SW Harvey Greene Drive, just off State Road 14 South in Madison.

Sixteen vendors are participating in this free event, with door prizes and refreshments to be provided. Seniors may also tour the Senior Center's 10,000 square foot building. A Public Hearing begins at 10 a.m. in the Madison Senior Center's multipurpose room arranged by the Area Agency on Aging for North Florida to discuss their Aging and Disability Resource Center and the direct service they provide to health and wellness programs. In addition, they welcome public input regarding known and perceived needs of seniors and their caregivers in the community.

The Area Agency on Aging offers the SHINE program to address seniors' health insurance needs and they'll also provide free telephone support for qualified seniors through Florida Telecommunications Relay.

Other vendors attending on May 23 include: vision screenings by Eye Savers, North Florida Pharmacy, Big Bend Hospice, Florida Department of Health, Lake Park of Madison, Caregivers Support Group, Madison County Memorial Hospital, Madison County Community Bank, Curves of Madison, Covenant Hospice, Madison County Emergency Management, Tri-County Family Health Care, North Florida Hearing and Balance, Madison County Extension Office and Amedysis.

Seniors are invited to see the newly installed HUR fitness and rehabilitation equipment in the Madison County Senior Center's fitness room, which uses pneumatic air for great conditioning.

SRWMD Urges Water Conservation As Drought Continues

The Suwannee River Water Management (District) continues to urge all water users to conserve in light of ongoing drought conditions.

"We're asking everyone to reduce water use, particularly lawn and landscape irrigation, which typically consumes half of the water used for

residential supply," said District Acting Executive Director Charlie Houdier.

The 12 months ending on April 30 had the lowest rainfall total (37.46 inches) of all May-April periods since 1932, and was the third driest of all 12-month periods. The District's aver-

age 12-month deficit rose to 17.1 inches, with some areas experiencing more than 25 inches of deficit.

River flows are extremely low, and gages on some rivers are setting new record low flows for this time of year. Part of the Santa Fe River near High Springs has nearly stopped flowing.

Levels at all monitored lakes are below average. Groundwater levels continue to decrease, with almost all of District monitor wells setting new record lows for the time of year and many setting new historic lows.

Most of the springs on the Santa Fe

Red, White & True Mysteries

She was a real-life “mother of invention”

Maria Sklodowska was born in 1867 in Warsaw, Poland. While there's a good chance that you don't recognize her name, there's an even better chance that you've heard of her.

Maria's family included her French husband Pierre and their daughter, Irene. Pierre was co-winner of the Nobel Prize in Physics in 1901, while Irene won the Nobel Prize in Chemistry in 1935. Their other daughter, Eve, was a successful author.

Maria is the only person in history to have both a spouse and a daughter (or a son) win Nobel prizes, but that wasn't even her greatest accomplishment. During her long career as a scientist, she and her husband also discovered two of the elements on the Periodic Table of Elements, and a third element is named after them. If you took chemistry in high school, then you're familiar with the Periodic Table of Elements. Pierre's research led to what is now known as alpha, beta and gamma rays.

When Pierre died in 1906 at age 46, Maria was left to raise her two young daughters by herself. How did Pierre die? As a result of a traffic accident, in which he was run over by a horse-drawn wagon!

This wasn't the first time Maria experienced a deep loss. Her mother had died when Maria was only nine, and Maria grew up in Poland during the time it was occupied by Russia. In addition, her first boyfriend broke up with her because his parents didn't approve of him marrying a woman from a poor family.

Despite the success that her husband and daughters achieved, it's unlikely that this mother of invention ever felt overshadowed by her family. Earlier, I mentioned that her husband

was co-winner of the Nobel Prize in Physics in 1901. Who was the other co-winner? It was Maria, his wife.

Maria earned a second Nobel prize in 1911; this one was in chemistry. By the end of World War I, she was possibly the most famous woman in the world, even though you've probably never heard her name before now. You see, Maria Sklodowska changed her first name to the French version of her name, Marie, when she moved to Paris. She changed her last name when she married Pierre.

You learned about her in science class, except that you learned about her by her married name of Marie Curie, the woman who discovered radium. Her work continues to benefit anyone who receives radiation treatments for cancer.

Which of the Periodic Table of Elements did Marie and Pierre Curie discover? Radium and Polonium. In fact, it was Maria who coined the term “radioactivity.” The element that's named after them is known as curium.

In addition to being the first woman to win a Nobel prize, Marie Curie was also the first woman to:

- Teach at the university level in France.
- Be part of the only mother-daughter combination to win Nobel prizes.
- Win two Nobel prizes.

Marie Curie died on July 4, 1934, in a nursing home. In a twist of irony, she is believed to be the first person to die of radiation poisoning, and it was probably her own radiation experiments that eventually killed her.

Florida Boy

I still enjoy singing “We're the Boys from old Florida,” not because I attended the UF, but because I have always been a Florida boy. I was born and raised in the Sunshine State and returned here as my Air Force career was winding down. My roots are firmly planted in Florida sand.

I was born in the Okeechobee region. Actually, I was born in Arcadia, the seat of Desoto County. That was the most accessible hospital to my parent's home in Moore Haven on the west side of the lake. Remember the old state licensing system before 1972 where the first set of numerals represented the population rank of each county according to the 1940 census? Dade was 1; Duval was 2; Madison was 35; and 67 (of 67) was Glades, my first home. If you think Madison is rural, imagine tiny Glades County where the county seat was smaller than Greenville!

By the time I was a year old, Dad had been transferred to Gainesville by the US Department of Agriculture. Except for short stints in Lakeland and Raleigh, NC, Gainesville was my home until I turned 18 and departed for points west and my military career.

A lot of my friends question my southern lineage “because I don't talk right.” Can't help that; I've never had much of an accent. Linguists with a trained ear can pick up just a hint of a southern drawl, but most laymen can't. Typically, they place me from somewhere in the Midwest like Iowa. That's OK – my birth cer-

tificate is official. Now my Dad was the root of my southern lineage – he arrived from Nebraska in 1926 at the age of six with his family. The Boyles were a farm family that raised livestock, first in Clay County and then, Suwannee. As a boy, I spent a lot of time on my grandparent's farm about five miles southeast of Live Oak. It was a place of great adventure.

My Mother is the source of my “Yankee blood.” She was born and raised in Kansas. So how did Florida and Kansas meet? It happened on a blind date in Tulsa, Oklahoma on January 2, 1943. My Father was an Army officer and Mother worked in an aircraft manufacturing factory. That little event called World War II mixed up a lot of family bloodlines. My parents came from completely different backgrounds but, as the saying goes, “love conquers all.”

I came along in 1948 and being the first boy was a big deal. My Mother was one of two daughters and the first four grandchildren were all girls. Then I broke the mold.

I've often said that my two best history and civics teachers were my parents. As I traveled across Florida as a boy with my Dad, we'd often stop for another lesson on Florida's colorful and historic past – the Dade Battlefield; Arcadia stockyards; Fort Barrancas; the Edison home; the Four Freedoms Monument; etc. I was instilled with the pride of being a Floridian, and I'm proud to say, never lost it.

One of the things I appreciate so much about Madison is that it is “the heart of old Florida.” I once suggested that that should be our motto. Florida has changed during my lifetime so much, from a population of barely 3 million to 20 million. The Florida of yesteryear is best symbolized by Madison. The character of our community has remained unchanged.

are near or below record low levels. Treehouse Spring in Alachua County had no observable flow for the first time in its record. Manatee Springs continued to set new low average monthly flows, and Fanning Springs saw the intrusion of river water during high tides because of low spring flow.

The three-month precipitation outlook issued by the Climate Prediction Center is for equal chances of above-normal, normal, or below-normal precipitation through July. Above-normal temperatures are expected through July.

District staff continues to evaluate the need to declare a Phase III Water Shortage Order to require water

use restrictions for all users. Under the water shortage order, restrictions, and some exemptions, would apply to residential, agriculture, commercial, and industrial users. Water shortage restrictions are intended to reduce the demand on water supplies during drought

For now, a water shortage advisory is in effect, which urges all users to conserve. Residents and others within the District fall under mandatory limits on lawn and landscape irrigation and water use permit holders are required to implement water conservation plans.

Tonya McClure Of Tallahassee Lenders' Consortium Speaks To Rotary

Florida has one of the highest rates of foreclosure in the nation, but the Tallahassee Lenders' Consortium has one of the lowest.

Tallahassee Lenders' Consortium (TLC), a non-profit organization created in 1993 by the City of Tallahassee, has now expanded into other counties, including Madison, and established satellite offices.

Tonya McClure, Housing Administrator with the satellite office in Madison, located in the courthouse annex close to Allen Cherry's office, visited the Rotary Club to explain how TLC works.

"Our purpose is not just to help people obtain, but help them retain housing," she said, and TLC, which receives funding from HUD and is a charter member of NeighborWorks, is more than just an organization that facilitates loans for potential homebuyers. Before clients get loans through TLC, they go through pre-purchase counseling classes that help them understand how such financing works and help them get into financial shape so that they are ready to take on a mortgage.

In the pre-purchase counseling classes, clients not only learn budgeting and money management skills that may be lacking, they also pull their own credit reports and learn to look at them the same way a lender would. By seeing their finances through the critical eyes of potential lenders, they see what needs to be worked on and improved, and develop work plans to bring up their credit scores.

"We look at every little thing on the credit re-

port," said McClure, adding that, "We've worked with some clients for as long as two years" to help them learn how to manage financial matters and ready themselves for the mortgage process.

"It's very critical, for the times we're in, that we learn to be financially literate," she said. "A lot of people are financially uneducated. This stuff isn't taught in schools, so people don't have a clue."

Often, the fairly simple process of working out a budget for the first time, in black and white on a piece of paper, "is a real eye-opener."

"We equip families to be responsible homeowners," she said. "Our goal is for them to remain successful homeowners throughout the life of their mortgage."

In the worst-case scenario, if a foreclosure looms, TLC will walk clients through the process of trying to prevent it, whether it means renegotiation of interest rates or refinancing or, in worst-case scenarios, such as a job lay-off or medical crisis or other unexpected adversity - after all other options are exhausted, there is the Hardest Hit Fund. The Fund is a federal program available in several "hardest hit" states, including Florida, that addresses the current reality of homeowners in tough economic times: that what was once rare (foreclosure) is now commonplace. For qualified homeowners in economic distress, the Hardest Hit Fund offers mortgage assistance for up to six months or \$18,000.

"It does build better communities," McClure added. A home is one of the most stable possessions a family can have, and helping families stay in their

homes improves not only their quality of life but also that of the neighborhood and community.

Foot, Knee Or Ankle Pain? Don't Rule Out Gout

(NAPS)—Eight million Americans have gout. It's the most common form of inflammatory arthritis in men over the age of 40. However, its symptoms can be similar to those of a stubbed toe or ankle sprain, which is why so many people often misinterpret the pain associated with a gout attack for something else. Jim Belushi is one of them.

When the actor and performer's big toe became too swollen and painful to touch, he credited it to a jogging injury. But after a visit to his doctor, he found out that he actually had gout.

"When gout attacks for the first time, many sufferers mistake the pain for an impact-induced injury or a sprain," said Herbert S. B. Baraf, M.D., clinical professor of medicine at The George Washington University. "It is important to be able to recognize the signs and symptoms of gout and to seek proper treatment."

Now, knowing the importance of diagnosis and taking an active part in treatment management, Belushi is taking part in the "Check Out Your Gout" campaign to increase awareness surrounding gout and a more advanced form of the condition known as refractory chronic gout, or RCG.

Symptoms of gout manifest in painful flares that can include sudden inflammation, redness and swelling in the joints. Gout flares are common in the big toe but can happen in any joint of the body.

"When I first developed gout, I didn't want to do anything about it. I thought I could tough it out, but when the pain became too unbearable for me to perform on stage, I saw a rheumatologist and got my gout under control," said Belushi.

Gout is caused by a high level of uric acid in the blood. When this level becomes too high for the body to process, uric acid builds up and can crystallize in and around joints, resulting in a gout attack. In advanced cases, collections of uric acid crystals may deform joints and even cause visible lumps to form on hands, feet and joints. "It is important to seek the help of a rheumatologist to manage the underlying cause of gout: a high level of uric acid. Over time, gout attacks may become more frequent and severe, leading to joint destruction, deformity and other health issues," said Dr. Baraf.

"We're going to be doing a lot of things around Madison," Coffey told them. "So quit bullying and stay away from drugs."



There were volunteers representing several churches, including Fellowship Baptist,

Pine Grove Missionary Baptist, and First United Methodist Church; others were community leaders and parents.

Christi Annett, organizer of the event, said the idea for the luncheon came about a week ago, to do something for one of the larger schools. "Not everybody would want to tackle such a big school," said Annett, who called around and sent out numerous emails to make the event come together as quickly as it did. "We were fortunate. Everybody was so generous with their time and






