Fain Poppell Appointed To School Board

Gov. Rick Scott has appointed Fain Poppell to fill the vacant District 1 School Board position.

Poppell will replace Abra "Tina" Johnson, who was removed last year by the governor in the wake of alleged voter fraud following her election to the Board in 2010.

Poppell is a Gadsden County native, who was born and raised on a farm. He is a 1963 graduate of Quincy High School. He attended ABAC (Abraham Baldwin Agriculture College) in Tifton, Ga., for one

year before transferring to North Florida Community College where he received a degree in Civil Engineering Technology in 1968.

Poppell then worked for engineering and surveying firms in Tallahassee until he became registered by the state as a land surveyor. Following registration, he and his family moved back to Madison County in 1976 to set up a private surveying firm.

Married to the former Linda Smith, he is the father of two daughters and the grandfather of four children. Please see School Board, Page 3A

Truck Driver Dies In Accident

A truck driver tragically met his demise in a two-truck accident on Friday evening, June 15, in the parking lot at Love's Truck Stop in Lee.

According to a Florida Highway Patrol report, Lance Charles Oliver, 43, of New Braunfels, Tex., was driving a 2006 Freightliner tractor-trailer combination north in the rear parking lot of Love's Truck Stop, located at 3204 SE County Road 255.

At the same time, a 1999 Freightliner tractor-trailer, driven by Nelson Andrea Labrada Fernandez, 42, of Hialeah, was properly parked and occupied by Fernandez in the same parking lot directly in front of Oliver's semi.

Oliver's truck began traveling forward after he experienced some type of medical condition. The front of the truck collided with the front of Fernandez's truck, Please see Truck Driver, Page 3A

Madison Getting Water Restrictions

Madison's residents will soon join other cities in the Suwannee River Water Management District in observing water-conservation measures. The city commissioners learned of the regulations at their regular meeting on June.12.

Brian Kauffman, District Facilities Director of the SRWMD, presented dire warnings about water shortages due to the area's drought this year. He said that the area is at a Stage 3 water shortage, with a 54" deficit through May 2012. Madison's deficit

stands 25" below normal. "This follows several years of drought," said Kauffman.

Kauffman noted that the aquifer is at an all-time low, and the Suwannee River is lower than it has ever been since measurements began in 1931. "At some points above White Springs, you can walk across the river because there is no water there," he said.

Kauffman explained that city residents will be assigned times and dates for landscape watering. He told the commissioners, "If you want to, you can allow us to deal with infractions through law enforce-

ment. That will carry a \$500 fine and possibly jail time for a second-degree misdemeanor." However, he suggested that the commissioners can pass an ordinance setting consequences so that offenders will not have to go through the court system.

Following more discussion, the commissioners decided to take the ordinance idea under consideration. Mayor Jim Stanley said that he wants to do more research. The watering restrictions will be in place until August 30 when the situation will be reevaluated.

## Red, White & True Mysteries

**Dr. Franz Mesmer created a new word and a new method of therapy**

Part of the definition, according to Webster's New World Dictionary is: "... to spellbind or fascinate."

The word is taken from the name of Dr. Franz Mesmer. We'll get to that part in a minute.

Franz Mesmer was born in Switzerland in 1734. As a doctor, he associated with some pretty notable people, such as Mozart, King Louis XVI, Dr. Joseph Guillotin and Ben Franklin, although not always in ways that benefited him.

Dr. Mesmer practiced what he called "animal magnetism," which caused his patients to go into a trancelike state. Today we know it by another name.

Dr. Mesmer was also known for the glass harmonica that he used in his therapy sessions with his patients. It was Ben Franklin, not Mesmer, who invented the glass harmonica. Mesmer even let his friend Mozart play his harmonica starting in 1773.

As the headline of this story says, Dr. Mesmer created a new word. Or should we say, he had a word named after him. Unlike Dr. Guillotin, Dr. Mesmer did not mind that his last name became part of the word for which he is remembered.

The word which is named after Dr. Franz Mesmer is "mesmerize."

What makes it even more interesting, though, is that this mesmerism, or animal magnetism, was actually the forerunner to hypnotism as therapy. The full definition, according to Webster's, is: "To hypnotize; especially to spellbind or fascinate."

Dr. Mesmer was so good at convincing patients that he could cure them that it was unclear whether it was his animal magnetism or his salesmanship that cured them. There may have been a "placebo effect." Remember, this was during the 1700's - a period when leeches were commonly used to bleed patients of whatever ailed them.

King Louis XVI (that would be King Louis the 16th if you're keeping score at home) offered Dr. Mesmer a lifetime pension if he would sign a contract to stay and work in Paris. Soon after he rejected the offer, the king appointed a special committee to investigate Dr. Mesmer. The committee included Dr. Guillotin, Antoine Lavoisier (who, along with Louis XVI, later became a "customer" of Dr. Guillotin) and Ben Franklin.

The committee's negative report on Dr. Mesmer essentially ended his career, and he was exiled to his native Switzerland. During his career, the popular Dr. Mesmer had many followers, and he expanded his practice throughout the major cities of Europe by teaching his methods to his followers.

Dr. Mesmer is considered by many to be the father of hypnotism. Two of his followers, James Braid and the Marquis de Puységur, later put it into practice.

In 1815, Dr. Mesmer died at the age of 81. The priest, at Mesmer's request, played the glass harmonica at his funeral.

## John Sands And The Sagan March

I never had the opportunity to know former NFCC vice president John Sands, but I recently watched a video taped by the late Bernard Wilson where John described his World War II experience. It was fascinating.

John was born in 1920 in southern Arkansas. He was finishing college when America entered the war and volunteered to join the Army Air Force. The pay for an aviation cadet was \$75 a month compared to \$21 for a regular recruit, so John made an economic decision.

He was selected to train not as a pilot but as a bombardier and assigned to a B-24 Liberator unit training in the Western US. In late 1943, he shipped out to a bomber base in Norfolk, England near the town of Wendling, west of Norwich. The B-24s were assigned to the 8th Air Force Second Air Division and Wendling was the home of the 392nd Bomb Group. John was a member of the 597th Bomb Squadron.

He was on his 19th mission, well over half way through with his tour, on April 22, 1944. The target was the rail yards in Hamm, Germany. More than 800 8th Air Force bombers participated in this mission, escorted by hundreds of fighters. John was a substitute bombardier on Captain Wyeth Everhart's aircraft, so it was not his assigned crew.

Over the target area, German FW-190 fighters attack the bombers. John could see them approaching from the front quarter; his only protection was a Plexiglas nose. The fighters' 20mm shells impacted the right wing and set the number 4 engine on fire. Almost immediately, some of the gunners bailed out from the rear of the aircraft.

The pilot turned his crippled ship west and exited the target area. More than an hour later over Belgium, it became

apparent that the right wing would soon fail, so the remaining crewmembers including John Sands jumped from the burning aircraft. Eleven of the 12 crewmembers were captured by the Germans. The navigator, Harold Kornman was picked up by the Belgium underground and evaded capture for more than two months until liberated by the invading British Army.

About his capture, John had this to say: 'I considered myself fortunate. A German Army squad in a half-track followed my parachute down and captured me as soon as I touched the ground. They didn't mistreat me at all. I was taken to Brussels for interrogation. My questioners were only interested in which aircraft shot me down and who got the credit.'

Soon, Lieutenant Sands was loaded on a 40/8 (capable of carrying 40 soldiers or 8 horses) rail car with a packed house for a tortuous trip across Germany. After a week, they arrived in Silesia in southwestern Poland at the Stalag Luft III near the town of Sagan. This was one of two prisoner of war camps reserved for officers. Nearly all were British and American flying officers. There were tens of thousands.

The month before their arrival, Sagan had been the location of the Great Escape, later brought to the theater in a 1960s movie. When John Sands arrived, the senior American and British captives were in charge of the prisoners. They ran the prison camp and had vowed there would be no more foolhardy escape attempts. German guards managed the security.

The commanders ensured that a strict code of discipline was in effect throughout the camp. Food was especially bad and consisted of black bread and blood sausage. The prisoners used cigarettes from Red Cross packages to buy fresh

vegetables from the black market using guards as couriers. The POWs weight gradually dropped on a mere 700 calories per day.

Recreation was an important ingredient to a content camp. John volunteered to dig stumps for what would become a ball field. Fifteen men were assigned to each 16x28 foot room with the senior man designated as barracks commander. Whoever sliced the bread took the last slice. I bet you could measure it with a micrometer.

Mundane camp life came to an abrupt end just before midnight on January 27, 1945. The prisoners were given 30 minutes notice to prepare to march out away from the approaching Russian Army. In the cold, blowing snow of a European winter, more than ten thousand prisoners began to walk to the southwest.

All order and discipline broke down as individual survival became paramount. John remarked that keeping your feet dry and healthy was the most important thing. If you fell out of the march, you were as good as dead. They marched for days, then weeks. Their source of warmth was a greatcoat packed with straw or whatever insulation could be found. Food was sporadic. The guards who were elderly home guard gave their weapons to younger, healthier prisoners. Sometime in April, the guards just walked away and the prisoners were left to their own devices.

George S. Patton's 3rd Army caught up with the captives and set them free. Shortly afterward, they were flown to LeHarve, France to return to the U.S. by ship. Before the captain would let them aboard, he insisted they be deloused. Arriving in New York weeks later, John was surprised to learn that he had been promoted to captain. His back pay amounted to more than \$7000, a small fortune in 1945. John remarked, 'up to that point, I never imagined there was that much money, let alone that it would be mine.'

He was mustered out of the Army in San Antonio a month later; so ended a remarkable saga in the life of a young man from Arkansas.

Kauffman said that large water-users in the county will be contacted with separate restrictions and instructions.

In other business, the commissioners received the annual audit report from Mack Waters. Waters said that the audit was good; however, the city needs to address an \$82,000 shortfall in the fire pension. He said that the problem has been in communications with past city managers.

Commissioner Judy Townsend asked Fire Chief Alfred Martin, "What can we do about this?"

Martin replied, "See that it gets paid in."

City Manager Tim Bennett and City Clerk Lee Ann Hall agreed that the deficit will continue to grow until something is done. They also agreed on a positive response to a January 24 letter from the actuary notifying them of the situation. The commissioners took no action.

The board voted to hire Kyle and Jones as the city auditors for next year.

They approved by a 3-2 vote a change in the Future Land Use Map to allow housing for a veteran at the old Bernard Wilson house at the intersection of Rocky Ford Road and Hwy. 145. They also approved 3-2 the second reading of a change in the zoning map for the same location. Those voting against the measure were Townsend and Rayne Cooks.

The commissioners also discussed a design for the proposed park on Martin Luther King Drive. They suggested some changes, but did not vote on the design.

#### WHO IS INCLUDED IN THE MEDICAL BENEFITS SETTLEMENT?

The Medical Class includes (1) clean-up workers and (2) certain people who resided in specific geographic areas in coastal and wetlands areas along the Gulf Coast during specific periods in 2010. The website [DeepwaterHorizonSettlements.com](http://DeepwaterHorizonSettlements.com) has detailed descriptions and maps to help you determine whether a geographic location may be included in one of these zones. Additionally, you can call 1-866-992-6174 or e-mail [info@DeepwaterHorizonMedicalSettlement.com](mailto:info@DeepwaterHorizonMedicalSettlement.com) to find out if a geographic location is included.

#### WHAT DOES THE MEDICAL BENEFITS SETTLEMENT PROVIDE?

The benefits of the Medical Benefits Settlement include: (1) payments to qualifying people for certain acute (short-term) and chronic (ongoing) medical conditions occurring after exposure to oil or chemical dispersants; (2) provision of periodic medical examinations to qualifying people; and (3) creation of a Gulf Region Health Outreach Program, consisting of projects to strengthen the healthcare system. Benefits (1) and (2) will be provided only after the Court grants final approval and any appeals are resolved.

#### HOW TO GET BENEFITS FROM THE MEDICAL BENEFITS SETTLEMENT

You need to submit a Claim Form to request benefits. You can get a copy of the Claim Form by visiting the website or by calling 1-866-992-6174. Claims can be

submitted by mail. If you have questions about how to file your claim, you should call the toll-free number for assistance.

The deadline for filing a Claim Form is one year after the Medical Benefits Settlement becomes effective (that is, after the Court grants "final approval" and any appeals are resolved). The exact date of the claim filing deadline will be posted on the website. It is highly recommended that Medical Class Members complete and submit their claim forms promptly. Please read the Economic and Property Damages Settlement notice because you may also be eligible for a payment from that settlement.

#### YOUR OTHER OPTIONS

If you do not want to be legally bound by the Medical Benefits Settlement, you must Opt Out or exclude yourself by **October 1, 2012** or you won't be able to sue BP over certain medical claims. #### WHO IS INCLUDED IN THE ECONOMIC & PROPERTY DAMAGES SETTLEMENT?

The Economic and Property Damages ("E&PD") Settlement Class includes people, businesses, and other entities in the states of Louisiana, Alabama and Mississippi, and certain counties in Texas and Florida, that were harmed by the oil spill. The website [DeepwaterHorizonSettlements.com](http://DeepwaterHorizonSettlements.com) has detailed descriptions and maps to help you determine whether a geographic location may be included in the E&PD Settlement. Additionally, you can call 1-866-992-6174 or e-mail [questions@DeepwaterHorizonEconomicSettlement.com](mailto:questions@DeepwaterHorizonEconomicSettlement.com) to find out if a geographic location is included.

#### WHAT DOES THE ECONOMIC & PROPERTY DAMAGES SETTLEMENT PROVIDE?

The E&PD Settlement makes payments for the following types of claims: (1) Seafood Compensation, (2) Economic Damage, (3) Loss of Subsistence, (4) Vessel Physical Damage, (5) Vessels of Opportunity Charter Payment, (6) Coastal Real Property Damage, (7) Wetlands Real Property Damage, and (8) Real Property Sales Damage. There is no limit on the total dollar amount of the E&PD Settlement; all qualified claims will be paid.

#### HOW TO GET BENEFITS FROM THE ECONOMIC & PROPERTY DAMAGES SETTLEMENT

You need to submit a Claim Form to request a payment. You can get a copy of the various Claim Forms by visiting the website or by calling 1-866-992-6174. Claims can be submitted online or by mail. ## Rotary Youth Camp Opens For Another Summer

At Rotary Youth Camp, children can enjoy swimming, archery, horseback riding and all the other traditional summer camp sports and games, along with arts & crafts, skits, nature study, dance and karaoke.

However, the summer campers at the Rotary camp are all physically challenged in some way. Many are in wheelchairs.

Rotary Youth Camp, Inc. for the Physically Challenged provides a chance for these children to experience the fun of a traditional summer camp experience in a safe environment – one that takes their special needs into account: buildings that are close together rather than spread out, sidewalks to accommodate wheelchairs and walkers, and one-to-one ratio of counselors to children. Currently, the camp is located off highway 90, near Gretna.

Tallahassee Rotarian Charles Rockwood conceived the idea of a summer camp for physically challenged children many years ago when he was part of the Quincy Rotary Club, and Madison Rotarian Jargo Clark created the foundation that accepted donations for the project, said Leslie Smith, Executive Director of the Rotary Youth Camp.

It is the only camp in the region for children of all disabilities. For example, there are camps designed specifically for autistic children and Down's Syndrome children, but the Rotary camp is the only one in the area that accepts children with any disability that would make it difficult or impossible for them to participate in ordinary summer camps. The only requirement is that the children must be able to communicate so they can tell their counselors if they don't feel well or if something is wrong.

Rotary pays the way for each camper, because as Rockwood pointed out, caring for a special needs child will often wipe out a family's finances.

Staffers for the camp often use their entire va-

cation and more to work the Rotary Youth Camp, and are paid \$300 for three weeks of very intense work.

There are also challenges to running the camp itself. Although the camp is growing, and has applied for and received grants, the organization may have to find different facilities in another location in the near future; one facility possibly being considered is the 4H Camp at Cherry Lake.

Additionally, there is a great need for an extra session for young adults. At least three of the campers who have been coming to the camp for years are now 20 or older, but there is often no other place they can go, and one of the young adults is being cared for by her elderly grandmother, who needs the break every summer that the Rotary Camp provides.

For those who wish to donate supplies, the staff has a wish list of items: paper towels, toilet paper, napkins, paper plates, plastic eating utensils, 16 oz. Solo cups, 10-12 oz. paper cups, bleach, Clorox

Cleanup, sponges, bathroom cleaner, non-latex gloves, liquid Children's Tylenol and Children's Benadryl, Tylenol Cold and Flu, Sudafed, ibuprofen, acetaminophen, crayons, scissors, construction paper, computer paper, markers, pens, colored clay, scotch tape, poster board, cardboard boxes for craft projects, pillows and blankets. They could also use some bigger-ticket items like Wii entertainment systems with assorted games and accoutrements, a karaoke machine with CDs for all age groups, and a digital camera with video. Also, if anyone has frequent flyer miles to donate, they would be greatly appreciated.

For the summer of 2012, the camp's scheduled dates are July 23-28 for the older group and July 29 – Aug. 3 for the younger group.

When July and August roll around, the hot mid-day sun makes fishing miserable in Big Bend waters. However Big Bend anglers have two cooler alternatives that still let them harvest the sea's bounty, scalloping and shrimping.

**Get Your Own Scallops**

Scalloping is a cool activity in the midsummer's heat because you actually get into the water and swim after them. Scalloping out of Steinhatchee is very good at this time of year. In fact this is the only time of year you can catch your own scallops, since scallop season is open only from July 1 until September 10 and only from the the Pasco/Hernando County line to the Mexico Beach Canal. Scalloping is closed over the entire Florida peninsula from the Georgia state line to the Pasco/Hernando County Line and the Florida Panhandle west of the Mexico Beach Canal.

You will need to buy a recreational saltwater fishing license before you catch scallops, and you are limited to 2 gallons of whole scallops per person with a maximum of 10 gallons per boat. If you clean the scallops before returning to the dock, the limit is 1 pint of scallop meats per person with a maximum of 1/2 gallon per boat. Unless the scallops are running large, the 2 gallon whole scallop limit cleans out to considerably less than 1 pint of meats. The only equipment you need are a mask, swim fins, and a snorkel, plus a mesh bag for your catch. It does help to have a boat to get you to where the scallops are, but you can often hitch a ride with experienced friends. If not, boat rentals are available in Steinhatchee.

Scallopers run out and then go either north or south for several miles until the inshore waters become clear. Then they slowly motor inshore to a water depth of 3 feet or so while staring at the bottom looking for scallops (it helps to wear polarized sunglasses). The immediate vicinity of any large collection of boats is usually a good place to begin, for at peak scallop season 100 or more boats will be on the best spots. Don't worry about all those boats. Scallops have been abundant in recent years and limits easy to come by. Just keep moving around until you find an area that has not been picked over, all the while maintaining a good lookout so you don't run over any snorklers who often stray well away from their anchored boats.

Scallops seem to prefer areas of bottom covered by the thin, round-bladed manatee grass more than the flat, broad-bladed turtle grass. Patches of brown algae and the edges of old propeller scars also are favorite hiding places. Once a few scallops are seen laying on top of the sea grasses, drop the anchor, put up a dive flag (it's the law), and go get 'em. Scallops are easier to find when the sun is high overhead. If a tidal current is running, swim up current so you can look down, end-on between the blades of the sea grasses that have been pushed over onto their sides by the current.

Once you are done catching them, cleaning your scallops can be a chore. Put your scallops on lots of ice in a big cooler as soon as you catch them. Chilled scallops will open their shells, making cleaning easy, whereas warm scallops will very effectively demonstrate the original meaning of the English verb "to clam up."

To open a scallop, use a scallop knife or sharp spoon to cut the muscle that closes it. Hold the shell dark side up and hinge away from you. The muscle will be on your right, not far from the hinge. Insert the knife or spoon between the top and bottom shells from the right side, just in front of the hinge, and cut the muscle away from the inside of the top shell. Open the scallop and discard the top shell. Then scrape off and discard all of the innards except the sweet, white muscle about the size of the last joint of your finger. Do this by gently scraping off the dark innards, starting from the hinge side of the muscle and scraping over the muscle towards the front. Properly done, this will peel the innards from the muscle, leaving it attached to the bottom shell. (Some people accomplish this step with the aid of a small Shop-Vac. Reportedly they simplify clean-up of the Shop-Vac by thoroughly spraying its inside with Pam.) Cut the muscle from the bottom shell and ice it down promptly. Have an experienced scalloper help you get started -- once you learn the trick, cleaning scallops is really quite easy. Finally, look up a good recipe and enjoy!



## Tobacco Free Madison Meeting Next Week

The Tobacco Free Madison Coalition is holding its next meeting Wednesday, June 27, at 3:30 p.m. It will be held in the Madison County Central School library, and all Madison County residents, Partnership members and other interested

parties are invited to attend.

According to a new Surgeon General's report, "Preventing Tobacco Use Among Youth and Adults," released earlier this year, nearly nine out of ten smokers start by age 18, and 99 percent of smokers are caught in the nicotine habit by age 26.

With the emergence in the last few years of new candy-flavored tobacco products wrapped in bright, colorful, eye-catching packages, the lure for potential young tobacco users has never been stronger; however, the tobacco industry denies that these products are designed to appeal specifically to young people.

The FDA banned flavored cigarettes (other than menthol) in 2009, but that ban did not apply to other tobacco products (cigars, cigarillos, blunt wraps and smokeless products like "dip" and "chew"), which are currently on the market.

Additionally, the

marketing for those products not affected by the FDA ban has increased greatly since 2009. Some common examples of flavored tobacco products include peach-flavored dip, grape-flavored cigars and pina colada flavored blunt wraps.

The flavoring also masks the unpleasant tobacco taste first-time users experience, making it easier to become initiated into habitual use.

Some of the chemicals in these specially flavored products have also been manipulated to reduce or eliminate the nauseous feeling commonly associated with first time tobacco use. The more pleasant that first-time experience, the more likely first-timers just wanting to "see what it's like" will be drawn into an expensive life-long addiction.

The additional impact on the economy of tobacco-related illness and lost productivity is paid for in large part by non-smoking taxpayers.

Tobacco Free Madison wants to reduce young people's initiation into a lifetime of tobacco addiction and thereby reduce the health and economic impact on Madison County.


Strategies include pulling aside the curtain and showing teenagers and parents what lengths tobacco companies are willing to go to snag new users into an expensive lifetime of addiction for the sake of huge profits. Also, by providing information on the benefits of a healthier, statistically longer life (an average of 12 years longer than that of a smoker) the coalition hopes young people will make informed decisions about tobacco use. However, anti-tobacco coalitions everywhere face a formidable opponent in the tobacco industry's multi-billion-dollar advertising budget.




