SCIENTIFIC AND INDUSTRIAL.

SIX FIREMEN MET DEATH.

Blazing Building in Boston, Mass., Falls In Upon Them.

Six firemen, including a district chief, a captain and a lieutenant, were killed at a fire at Boston, Mass., Saturday morning which burned out the interior of a five-story building on Merrimac street, occupied by G. W. Bent & Co., manufacturers of beds, bedding, etc.

The alarm was sounded at 3:58 o'clock a. m. The building was filled with the most inflammable materials. It was joined on the east by a three-story tenement; on the west was separated by a narrow alley from a similar structure, while in the rear of the tenement houses on South Margin street is a narrow light well.

The contents of the building, valued at \$30,000, are a total loss. The damage to the building itself will bring the total up to at least \$75,000. This is partly covered by insurance.

The alarm was sounded at 3:58 o'clock a. m. The building was filled with the most inflammable materials. It was joined on the east by a three-story tenement; on the west was separated by a narrow alley from a similar structure, while in the rear of the tenement houses on South Margin street is a narrow light well.

The fire was nearly under control at the time of the accident. The men on engine No. 7 were on the fourth floor and engines 86 and 89 were on the second floor when the rear section of the roof collapsed, carrying down portions of all the floors through the basement and burying the firemen beneath a mass of debris.

MOB HANDLES ZOLA.

Trial of the Author in Paris a Sensational One.

The trial of M. Emile Zola and M. Perreux, manager of the Aurore, who are being prosecuted by the government as the result of a letter which the novelist caused to be published in the Aurore in December last, strongly reflecting upon high officials connected with the Dreyfus case, opened at Paris Monday in the assizes court of the Seine.

The most keen public sentiment was manifested in the case. Hundreds of people surrounded the court, anxious to gain admittance. The police measures taken to insure order were most rigorous. The first day's session was uneventful.

When the court opened Tuesday there was a terrific struggle to enter, people fighting their way with blows and kicks toward the courtroom.

The trial proceeded amidst great excitement. When adjournment was reached there was a big crowd outside the lower court and as the people were leaving the building, a man cried "vive Zola," "down with France."

The crowd remained outside yelling "Conspuez Zola!" etc., led by a number of young barristers, in their robes, who roughly handled M. Zola's sympathizers until a detachment of republican guards cleared the approaches to the court.
