

**IS CUT DOWN IN
FLOWER OF YOUTH.**

**Alfred B. Heath Succumbs to
the Pitiless Disease,
Appendicitis.**

Alfred B. Heath, eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Heath of Holly Hill died in this city Monday night, following an operation for appendicitis, which had taken place Tuesday of last week.

He had suffered several previous attacks, the first occurring a little more than a year ago, while he was at Narragansett Pier, R. I. Last July he had another severe attack, which the attending physician, Dr. J. A. VanValzah, insisted was appendicitis and advised an operation on his recovery, but Alfred shortly afterward went North and while there was treated by one or more physicians for acute indigestion.

He returned to Daytona recently with Dr. E. L. Potter and family, whose automobiles have been in his charge for the past three or four years, and while getting the cars ready for shipment to California Monday of last week he was seized with a severe pain, as in previous attacks.

Dr. C. C. Bohannon was called and pronounced it a case of appendicitis and advised an immediate operation. Alfred was removed from Seabreeze to this city and the operation performed by Dr. Bohannon, assisted by Doctors Howe and Channing, but the disease had been of too long standing and the operation came too late to save his life, which was merely prolonged for a few days.

The funeral was held Tuesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock from the residence at Holly Hill, Rev. A. J. Wilder rector of St. Mary's Episcopal church officiating, and the interment was at Pinewood Cemetery.

Alfred was a handsome young fellow in his twenty-third year and the large concourse of mourners from both sides of the Halifax and the profusion of flowers spoke eloquently of the high esteem in which he was held in the several communities.

His sorrowing parents, his brother, Kenneth, and his aged grandfather, W. B. Heath, who comprise the family circle here, have the deep sympathy of the public in their bereavement.

Dr. and Mrs. E. L. Potter, to whom Alfred had endeared himself during his several years in their service and in whom they placed the utmost confidence, will greatly feel his death. He was to have joined them in a few days, to be with them at Los Angeles during the winter.

A Young Old Man.

She has been fitted by Joseph Osborne with a 12-horse power Standard engine, which drives her at a speed of about eight miles per hour. The cabin is nearly finished and everything is conveniently arranged, a standing board or platform in the bow for the use of the pilot, being especially ingenious in manner of folding it out of the way when not in use.

There are four berths in the main cabin and the large galley contains another. The engine room can be entirely cut off from the rest of the boat and there is a convenient toilet room. The boat is screened throughout. In fact she is a very comfortable and nice appearing craft.

The power boat which Mr. Hall is building for Mr. Baker has been delayed because of the non-arrival of some necessary material.

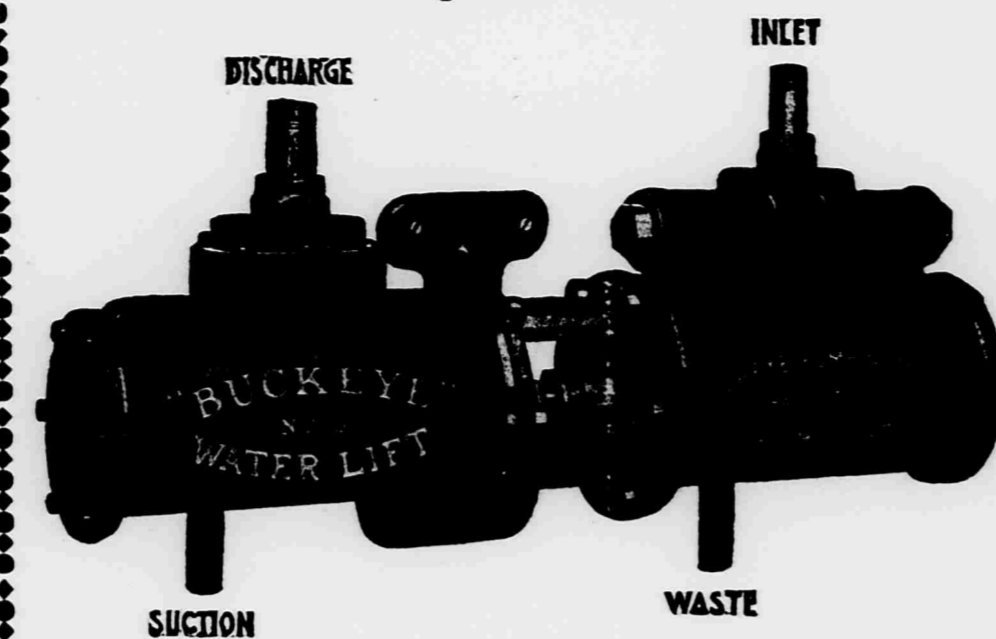

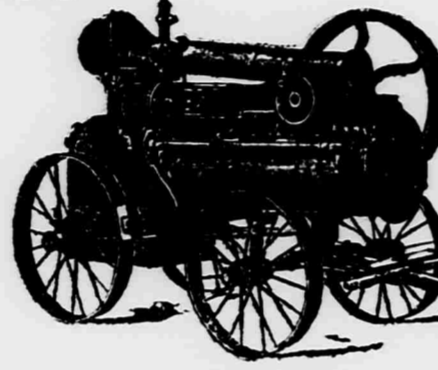

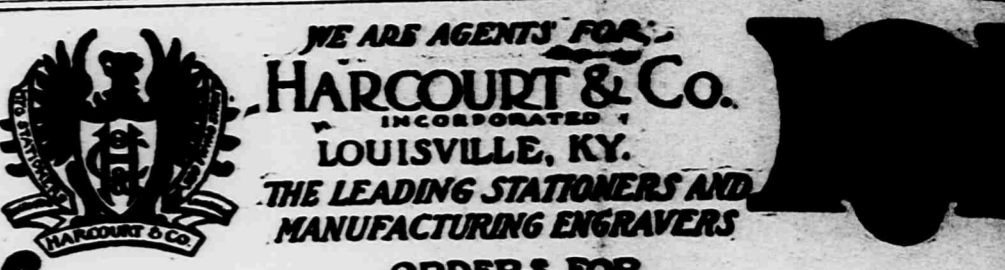
