#### THE NEW LIEN LAW

The Legislature of 1901 enacted a new

whether the defendant shall appear or not, to ascertain whether the work was done or material furnished, and if payment was made for the same.

In an action under this law, in Jack sonville, in which its aid was invoked to recover from an owner for work done and materials furnished by a sub-contracter, and in which a demurrer was filed questioning the validity of the law. Judge Call has rendered a decision of unusual interest to all parties engaged in building operation, in which he holds the law to be unconstitutional, particularly the seventh section, the substance of which is given above, on the ground, as the case is reported, that said section seeks to deprive persons of property without the process of law.

Whatever may be the aspects of the case decided, in the matter of its facts and details, the decision is one that should receive the attention of those who in order that litigation may be fore stalled. The case is quite likely to go to the supreme court for final adjudication, but in the meantime too great care can- 12 not be exercised by all concerned in building operations.


