THE FLORIDA STATE FAIR.

(Received too late for last week.)

Editor Gazette-News:  
Thinking you might like to get a few  
words from me direct from the Fair  
grounds, I enclose these to you:

The different county exhibits are hand-  
somerly placed in the main tent, and are  
so varied and complete that a visitor  
unacquainted with the State, might well  
think this was amongst the wealthiest  
and most fully developed of any in the  
Union. The exhibit of citrus fruits, pine-  
apples, etc., are magnificent, both indi-  
vidually and collectively, and the same  
may be said of the exhibits of almost all  
the things known to man that are  
"pleasant to the taste." Florida grows  
them to perfection, and if you doubt it  
they are here on exhibition, as fine speci-  
mens as could be wished for or grown  
anywhere.

I thought I was well acquainted with  
the State and its productions (except  
those of the extreme northwest and  
southeast sections), but never had the  
possibilities of the State appeared so  
great as when seeing the fine display of  
the varied fruits, grains and vegetables,  
particularly the grape-fruit in the DeSota  
county booth, and the poultry exhibits  
would do credit to any State in the  
Union for variety, numbers and general  
excellence.

In fact, to be brief, it made me feel that  
any citizen of the State, having visited  
the Fair, might well be excused if here-  
after in his travels, he holds his head  
several inches further back and higher  
up and expands his chest, as he says: "I  
am from Florida."  
I regret that our county is not official-  
ly in evidence there. In fact, as far as I  
can ascertain, with the exception of  
Stetson University, I am the only ex-

ORANGES WILL BE LATE.

According to the present outlook, says  
the fruit World, oranges will be later  
than last year, and unless there are  
continued cold nights and weather favor-  
able to coloring the fruit, it is figured  
that the shipments will be two or three  
weeks later. Oranges, on the whole, are  
rather green yet, although there are a  
few districts where scattering groves  
are showing color and shippers are dis-  
posed to figure on a late season. No  
purchasing has been done, as far as we  
can learn, except in a few of the fancy  
fruit districts, where shippers wished to  
make sure of a supply of the best  
fruit. It was recently estimated that  
owing to the long drought in Florida,  
the orange crop would not exceed 600-  
000 boxes, but some orange men say  
that they have received later advices  
that the damage is not as great as  
thought at first.
