## COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' MEETING

Official Account of Their Proceedings in Session This Week.

Meeting called to order on Jan. 2nd. Present, J. R. Walker, chairman; J. R. Miot, R. A. Conkling, J. C. Jones, J. F. Bell and W. R. Walker; with A. A. Stewart, clerk, and J. P. Brown, sheriff. Minutes were read and approved.

Constable's bond of L. S. Adams was approved.

Reports of Justices of the Peace J. M. Sanders, W. R. Roesch, H. G. Bronson, J. H. Baker, and C. T. McBride were received.

The clerk is instructed to have non resident hunting licenses printed to cover present law.

Tax collector's and county judge's report of licenses collected during the month of December for year 1904 and amounting to \$31.00 state and \$38.00 county was received.

Bonds of W. C. Peterson, J. E. Reed and C. T. McBride, as justices of the peace, were approved.

Tax collector's report of polls collected during the month of December, amounting to \$3.00 for the year 1904, was received.

Reports of D. S. Carlton, and Dan Sloan, cattle inspectors, were received.

Petition of C. A. Killer et al, citizens of fourth district, is granted, and R. S. Brown, J. S. Keen and J. G. Coats are appointed a committee to lay out the road as prayed for in said petition.

Letter of H. H. Hancock received, and the board regrets that it can't consistently comply with his request, as all persons in need of assistance must come to the county poor farm.

The treasurer's report was received, checked up and the paid warrants turned over with his report were destroyed by Messrs. Conkling and Jones. The treasurer had his usual certificate of deposit attached to his report.

Bill of Planters' Security bank is referred to the commissioner of that district for action.

Clerk's report of tax certificates redeemed or purchased during the month of November was received.

P. J. Hall is instructed to comply with the recommendation of the grand jury in regard to enlarging the court room. This work to be done under the supervision of the board.

Letter of E. W. Schuyler was received and on motion a copy is ordered mailed to the fish and game warden with request to take some action and report the same to this board at the February meeting.

On motion \$1,000 is ordered transferred from the fine and forfeiture fund to the feeding prisoners fund.

On motion the sheriff is allowed to purchase a table for use in his office.
