THR RAILROAD SHOPS.

THAT Fort Pierce has made remarkable progress during the past five years is admitted on every hand that it is in the bounds of possibilities to make even greater progress in the next five years is also admitted and thoroughly believed by those who are closely identified with the business interests of the city.

One thing that will do a great deal toward the further development of Fort Pierce is the extension of the railroad shops and the establishing of new shops at this division point. Two years ago this matter was gone into and the officials of the railroad intimated that they were willing to make extensions and improvements that would mean much to the city, provided they could secure additional track room for sidings and new shops.

Immediately after this announcement the Board of Trade was called together and the situation explained. Every owner of property along the railroad where land was wanted signed an agreement to sell a sufficient amount of land for siding at a reasonable price. In most cases the amount was left blank for the railroad to name the price. This was submitted to the railroad people but no action was ever taken by them. Now comes the same rumor that the railroad company wants more roow for expansion.

The action taken by the Board of Trade Saturday morning was in connection with this matter and for the purpose of ascertaining what land was needed for the comtemplated improvements, and it is hoped something definite will be understood when the new committee confers with the officials. Everybody here wants to see the shops and yards expand for the more work to be done, the more peo- ignated as ple will locate in Fort Pierce.
