

BRYAN AND KERN

(Continued from First Page)

with a powerful undercurrent already in motion toward the nomination of Kern for second place.


Kern the First Name Offered.

On the call for states, Indiana presented the name of Kern; Colorado, through former Governor Thomas, placed in nomination Charles A. Towne, of New York; Connecticut presented Archibald McNeill, and Georgia, Clark Howell.

For a time it looked as though a ballot would be required. But the steady line of states which joined in seconding Kern's nomination soon made it apparent that the chances of all other candidates had been extinguished.

Votes Given to Kern.

Mr. Towne in person was the first candidate to recognize the decisive nature of the Kern movement, and in a ringing speech he withdrew his name

from consideration and pledged his support to the ticket of Bryan and Kern.

Delegate J. T. Hill, of Georgia, who in nominating Mr. Howell had made quite a hit with the convention, rose and withdrew Mr. Howell's name, and seconded Kern for Georgia.

Withdrawal quickly followed from the supporters of McNeill, of Connecticut, leaving the Indiana candidate alone in the field. The withdrawal of the Connecticut candidate was accomplished by a motion that the nomination of Kern be made by acclamation.

Convention Adjourns.

The motion was carried with a deafening shout, and the great assemblage broke into clamorous demonstration on the accomplishment of its work and the completion of the democratic national ticket.

The nomination was made at 4:23, and the convention adjourned without date.

TEXT OF PLATFORM.

As Adopted by Convention at Denver, Colo.

We, the representatives of the democracy of the United States, in national convention assembled, reaffirm our belief in and pledge our loyalty to the principles of the party.

We rejoice at the increasing signs of an awakening throughout the country. The various investigations have traced graft and political corruption to the representatives of predatory wealth and laid bare the unscrupulous methods by which they have debauched elections and preyed upon a defenseless public through the subservient officials whom they have raised to place and power.

Economy in Administration.

The republican congress in session just ended has made appropriations amounting to \$1,008,000,000, exceeding the total expenditures of the past fiscal year by \$90,000,000 for the fiscal year, and leaving a deficit of more than \$60,000,000 for the fiscal year. We demand that a stop be put to this frightful extravagance, and insist upon the strictest economy in every department, compatible with frugal and

Misuse of Patronage.

We demand that the house of representatives shall again become a deliberative body, controlled by a majority of the people's representatives and not by the speaker, and we pledge ourselves to adopt such rules and regulations to govern the house of representatives as will enable a majority of its members to direct its deliberations and control legislation.

Misuse of Patronage.

We condemn as a violation of the spirit of our institutions the action of the present chief executive in using the patronage of his high office to secure the nomination of one of his cabinet officers. A forced succession in the presidency is scarcely less repugnant to public sentiment than is life tenure in that office.

Publicity of Campaign Contributions.

We demand federal legislation forever terminating the partnership which has existed between corporations of the country and the republican party under the expressed or implied agreement that in return for the contribution of great sums of money wherewith to purchase elections, they should be allowed to continue substantially uncontrolled in their efforts to encroach upon the rights of the people.

Tariff Revision.

We favor immediate revision of the tariff by the reduction of import duties. Articles entering into competition with trust-controlled products should be placed upon the free list,

and material reductions should be made in the tariff upon the necessities of life, especially upon articles competing with such American manufactures as are sold abroad more cheaply than at home, and graduate reductions should be made in such other schedules as may be necessary to restore the tariff to a revenue basis.

Trusts.

A private monopoly is indefensible and intolerable. We, therefore, favor the vigorous enforcement of the criminal law against guilty trust magnates and officials, and demand the enactment of such additional legislation as may be necessary to make it impossible for a private monopoly to exist in the United States.

Railroad Regulations.

We assert the right of congress to exercise complete control over interstate commerce and the right of each state to exercise like control over commerce within its borders.

We demand such enlargement of the powers of the interstate commerce commission as may be necessary to compel railroads to perform their duties as common carriers and prevent discrimination and extortion.

Labor and Injunction.

Experience has proven the necessity of a modification of the present law relating to injunctions, and we reiterate the pledge of our national platforms of 1896 and 1904 in favor of the measure which passed the United States senate in 1896, but which a republican congress has ever since refused to enact, relating to contempt in federal courts and providing for trial by jury in cases of indirect contempt.

We favor the eight hour day on all government work.

We pledge the democratic party to the enactment of a law by congress, as far as the federal jurisdiction extends, for a general employers' liability act, covering injury to body or loss of life of employees.

We pledge the democratic party to the enactment of a law creating a department of labor represented separately in the president's cabinet, which department shall include the subject of mines and mining.




BRYAN HEARS NEWS.

Reiterates That He Will Not Seek a Second Term.

Fairview, Lincoln, Neb., July 10.—The following statement was made by William Jennings Bryan when he received announcement of his nomination as the candidate of the democratic party for president:

"The presidency is the highest official position in the world, and no one occupying it can afford to have his views upon public questions biased by personal ambition. Recognizing this responsibility to God and his obligation to his countrymen, he should enter upon the discharge of his duties with singleness of purpose. Believing that one can best do this when he is not planning for a second term, I announce now, as I have on former occasions, that if elected I shall not be a candidate for re-election.

"This is a nomination as purely from the people as can be, and if elected my obligation will be as purely to the people. I appreciate the honor the more because it came, not from one person of a few persons, but from the rank and file, acting freely and without compulsion."

Bryan Pleased with Party Platform.

Fairview, Lincoln, Neb., July 10.—"I am very much pleased with the platform. It is clear, specific and strong, and I am grateful to the committee for the work that they have done in starting the issues. I am sure that the platform will greatly strengthen us in the fight upon which we are entering." is a statement of W. J. Bryan upon reading the platform adopted at the democratic national convention.
