FATAL PLAY OF A MONSTER FISH

Harry Lovett of Savannah Borne to the Bottom of the Sea by the Plunge of a Porpoise

(Savannah News, July 21.)

Struck down by a giant porpoise at play in the sea, three-quarters of a mile off Tybee beach, Harry, the 16-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. John J. Lovett, was killed by the big fish early yesterday afternoon and was carried down before the eyes of Wily, son of Dr. and Mrs. W. F. Brunner, with whom he was swimming.

The story adds another to the sea's mysterious tragedies. Such a death as the young victim met is hardly expected out of fiction. It is more tragic than the usual death by drowning in the sea and bears a tinge of horror.

The two lads were two miles from the beach at Bohan's pavilion, where they began to swim, and going with the sweep of the tide were almost as fresh as when they entered the water. Their destination was Lazaretto creek after a swim through the mouth of the Savannah river.

Struck Without Warning

They were swimming easily along. Wily Brunner several yards ahead of his companion. They were talking and laughing. No thought of the impending horror entered their minds. Suddenly a swirl in the water just ahead of the foremost swimmer attracted his attention and over his head a long dark shape went.

Without giving the younger swimmer even a chance to cry out, hardly time for the expression of his face to change, the shape taking the form of a fish at least ten feet in length, crashed directly into young Lovett and the two, lad and fish, disappeared into the water together.

Except the ripple their passage left, the sea was undisturbed. Nothing was left behind to tell the story. One moment young Brunner was swimming along chatting gaily with a friend; the next he was alone, and somewhere in the depths of the ocean about him was the form of his companion killed as quickly as though a bullet had been fired into his heart.

Left alone young Brunner waited for his friend to appear. The moments passed and no sign of the lad was seen. With the passing of several minutes came the certainty that young Lovett was dead and that hope must be given up of saving him. Then, almost choking with tears and the sense of horror that came to him, the remaining swimmer struck out for the beach line nearly a mile away, tooting back occasionally in the forlorn hope that even then he might see his companion.

Landing, he hurried to Fort Stevens, reported the loss of his friend, and when a number of soldiers left the fort to go to the beach nearest the scene of the boy's death, Brunner caught a Tybee train, and still in his bathing suit rode to Bohan's. He then went to the camp of the Benedictine Cadets at the south end of the island, where young Lovett, a well loved member of the cadet corps, had been spending several weeks with the command.

His tear stained face gave the first intimation that something was wrong. The story he told cast the camp into sorrow and the tiny flag on the staff near camp headquarters was placed at half-mast. Those who walked down the beach to the spot where young Brunner landed erected a stake in the sand and made a marker of handkerchiefs to indicate in which direction the tragedy occurred.

The marker is within a few yards of the first jetty, several hundred yards from the Tybee postoffice and just at the southern end of the sea wall. Three-quarters of a mile straight out into the sea is the spot where young Lovett was killed. At night from 10 o'clock until after midnight, men patrolled Tybee beach on horseback, and in vehicles hoping that the lad's body might be washed ashore by the tide.

ROJESTVENSKY ISN'T DEAD

Berlin, July 22.—The announcement sent out from Bad Nauheim that Admiral Rojestvensky, who commanded the Russian fleet which was annihilated by the Japanese in the recent war, had died there July 19th, was incorrect. The mistake arose from the death of a Russian of the same name.

LUSITANIA BREAKS ANOTHER RECORD

Liverpool, July 22.—The Lusitania, which arrived here yesterday, broke her eastern record to Queenstown over the long course from Sandy Hook, making the distance in five days and thirty-seven minutes.

FAMOUS SCHOOL HAS A FIRE

LaGrange, Georgia, Female College Burned Sunday

LaGrange, Ga., July 21.—The Southern Female College, one of the oldest Baptist colleges for women in the South, was destroyed by fire early Sunday morning, entailing a loss of \$40,000.

The fire originated in what is known as the College Chapel, which adjoins the main college building, soon after 4 o'clock, and spread quickly to the main building. By heroic work the Sarah Farrell Lyceum building was saved.

It is stated that there was no insurance whatever, the policy having been allowed to lapse only a short time ago.

The Southern Female College, established in 1842, has ranked among the leading educational institutions of the South. Dr. John E. Adamson was its first president, was succeeded after a few years by Prof. Milton E. Bacon, who presided for fifteen years or more. The next ten years Prof. Henry E. Brooks and Prof. John A. Foster were at its head. Then came Prof. L. F. Cox, under whose direction the institution grew into great favor and who was its president for nearly thirty-five years. He was succeeded by his son, Prof. Charles E. Cox, whose death occurred about one year after assuming management. In September Dr. G. A. Nunnally, now of Lake City, Fla., was made president and was assisted by his son, Prof. A. P. Nunnally. Four years later Dr. M. W. Hutton was elected to succeed Dr. Nunnally.

The college was situated on one of the highest and most beautiful locations in LaGrange. The grounds, and buildings belonged to L. J. Ronder of LaGrange.
