## ANOTHER GREAT AIRSHIP

Count Zeppelin's New Craft Will be an Improvement on the One Recently Destroyed

Friedrichshafen, Aug. 9.—Undismayed by the destruction of the airship whose successful flights crowned his years of thought and labor, Count Zeppelin has given orders for material with which he will duplicate his former craft. The aged inventor promises to do even greater things in his mastery of the air, in improving upon many points in which the derelict ship was deficient.

The count, at first broken-hearted at the accident which befell the product of his genius, has regained the courage that enabled him to make his early experiments, and the new airship will be rushed to a speedy completion.

## KEHOE-MAYS CONTEST

In the Third District Will Probably Not be Decided Before the Regular Election

Tallahassee, August 9.—In the Kehoe-Mays contest in the third congressional district, Judge Malone sustained the writ of mandamus requiring the district committee to canvass the returns showing Mays the nominee by a majority of 49 votes.

Twenty days were granted by the court in which to allow attorneys for Kehoe to make answer. In any event the case will probably be appealed to the supreme court, which is now in recess and will not convene until October.

Even if this case is advanced over all others, a final decree will not be given until the eve of the election in November. Thus will the question of right between the contesting candidates in the end be submitted to the people of the district for determination. As it stands, Kehoe is the nominee of the party and Mays has announced that he would run independent.

## ARRIVED AT AUCKLAND

The American Battleship Fleet Now at Anchor in the Principal Harbor of New Zealand

Auckland, N. Z., Aug. 9.—Sixteen white ships, comprising the battleship division of the United States Atlantic fleet, under command of Rear Admiral Charles S. Speery, arrived here at 8:40 o'clock this morning and anchored in two columns in the roadstead, abreast the city, after a voyage of thirty-three days from San Francisco, including a stop-over of six days at Honolulu. They will remain here until next Saturday.

The ships arrived trim and clean, and with no evidence of their long cruise apparent above the water line. The officers are gratified with the warmth of the welcome awaiting them and are looking forward to a pleasant stay in Auckland. The weather conditions promise to be fine.

The city is elaborately decorated in honor of the visit of the Americans and thousands of persons already have come into the city in order to assist in paying homage to the officers and men.

She had a few vigorous things to say about the Thaws, and incidentally was engaged herself in what her fellow passengers described as a very exciting love affair. Her admirer was Anthony J. Drexel, Jr., the twenty-year-old son of the rich Philadelphia family, who was returning from school at Eton.

"Harry Thaw certainly ought to be very grateful to Evelyn for going on the stand and telling the story she did for his sake," Miss Forsythe said. She added, quite calmly: "You know, there wasn't a bit of truth in Evelyn's story." Asked to explain she declined. But she repeated her assertion that Evelyn's story was a story, pure and simple.
