LORDS ON THEIR LAST LEGS

Agitation to Abolish the Upper House of Parliament has Been Greatly Reinforced

London, Oct. 12.—After a vacation which has lasted since August 1, the British parliament resumes its sessions today. Although the favorable action on the old age pensions bill and prospects of speedy consideration of other reform measures have somewhat appeased the popular wrath against the house of lords, there are indications that the spirit of revolt will soon break out afresh. The socialists and labor party have declared unceasing war upon the lords, and prophets are not lacking to declare that the upper house of parliament, as now constituted, is on its last legs.

Those who are in a position to know declare that King Edward himself will not oppose a reorganization of the house of lords on modern lines, realizing, as he does, that the perpetuity of the monarchy depends upon concessions to the rapidly growing sentiment of democracy.

Certainly, if the time given to the transaction of business or the ability displayed by members is a criterion, the upper house is far inferior to the commons. On an average, a sitting of the house of lords does not last more than half an hour. The house is supposed to "sit" 4:15, and it expires "rises" for the day in time to allow the lords to get home and dress for 3 o'clock dinner. On many occasions the sittings of the house of lords do not last more than fifteen or twenty minutes. Only rarely when rejecting some big bill sent up by the commons—does the house prolong its sittings past the dinner hour.

The art of oratory has been almost wholly lost in the house of lords. The speeches are made in a drawing, affected tone, which is highly polite. No peer is ever supposed to show excitement. Even a display of more than the barest interest is not encouraged. Some of the lords indulge in what is known as the upper house "lisp." Others prefer the drawl, which is supposed to be more soothing.

NOTICE OF ELECTION

WHEREAS The Legislature of 1907, under the Constitution of 1885, of the State of Florida, did pass three Joint Resolutions proposing amendments to the Constitution of the State of Florida, and the same were agreed to by a vote of three-fifths of all the members elected to each house, that the votes on said Joint Resolutions were entered upon their respective Journals, with yeas and nays thereon, and they did determine and direct that the said Joint Resolutions be submitted to the electors of the State at the General Election in November, 1908.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, H. CLAY CRAWFORD, Secretary of State of the State of Florida, do hereby give notice that a

General Election will be held in each county in Florida on Tuesday next succeeding the first

Monday in November, A. D. 1908, the said Tuesday being the

Third Day of November

for the ratification or rejection of the said Joint Resolutions proposing amendments to the Constitution of the State of Florida, viz:

A JOINT RESOLUTION proposing an amendment to Section Nine (9) of Article Five (5) of the Constitution of Florida relating to judicial salaries.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That Section Nine (9) of Article Five (5) of the Constitution of the State of Florida be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows, viz:

Section Nine (9). The salaries of Justices of the Supreme Court, Circuit Judges and Judges of Criminal Courts of Record shall be fixed by the Legislature.

That the foregoing amendment of Section Nine (9) of Article Five (5) of the Constitution of Florida is hereby agreed to, and the same shall be submitted to the electors of the State for approval or rejection at the next general election of Representatives hereafter, as required by Section One (1) of Article Seventeen (17) of said Constitution.

JOINT RESOLUTION proposing an amendment to Article Twelve of the Constitution of the State of Florida relative to education, to be known as Section Sixteen of said Article, providing for the levy of a special tax for the support and maintenance of the University of the State of Florida, the Florida Female College, the Institute for the Blind, Deaf and Dumb, and the Colored Normal School.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the following amendment to Article Twelve of the Constitution of the State of Florida, to be known as Section 16 of said Article, be and the same is hereby agreed to and shall be submitted to the electors of the State at the next general election of Representatives, to be held in the year 1908, for ratification or rejection.

Sec. 16. A special tax of one mill on the dollar of all taxable property in the State shall be levied annually for the support and maintenance of the University of the State of Florida, the Florida Female College, the Institute for the Blind, Deaf and Dumb and the Colored Normal School, which shall be paid in to the State Treasurer and set apart by him to the credit of the State Board of Education, to be apportioned and disposed of for the benefit of said institutions as required by the act creating and maintaining the same, known as Chapter 5384, of the Laws of Florida, approved June 5, 1905.

JOINT RESOLUTION proposing an amendment to Section Thirty-five of Article Five of the Constitution of Florida, relating to establishments of Courts.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the following amendment to Section Thirty-five of Article Five of the Constitution of Florida is hereby agreed to and shall be proposed and submitted to the electors of the State for approval or rejection at the next general election hereafter, that is to say, said Section Thirty-five of said Article shall be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 35. No courts other than herein specified shall be established in this state, except that the legislature may provide for the creation and establishment of such additional judicial circuits as may from time to time become necessary, and for the appointment by the Governor and confirmation by the Senate of additional circuit judges therefor, whose terms of office and general jurisdiction shall be the same as is herein provided for the circuit judges herein already provided for and may clothe any Railroad Commission with judicial powers in all matters connected with the functions of their office.

The votes cast in compliance with said proposed amendments, and the canvass, declarations and returns thereon, shall be subjected to the same regulations and restrictions as are provided by law for general elections in the State of Florida.
