DISTRICT TELEGRAPH SERVICE

Mr. Sage Corrects a Slight Error in Yesterday's Announcement

Editor Star: The reading of the article in yesterday's Star in reference to the American District Telegraph Co. might create the impression that the call boxes are subscribed and paid for by individuals and firms desiring them. This would be an erroneous idea. These messenger call boxes are to be placed by this company free of any expense, wherever the company deems it profitable to do so. At present we will install about twenty-five calls, to be placed around or near the public square. These calls are for the use of the public to call messengers for telegrams to be sent, packages delivered, notes carried, or for any service a messenger can perform. No charge is made for bringing in telegrams and the public is invited to use this method, thereby saving the time of coming personally to the telegraph office. For delivery of notes and bundles a charge of ten cents is made for ordinary distance. If you haven't a box at your office or store, use one nearest to you. Contract work will also be done. Rates furnished on application. This service is now in operation with headquarters at Western Union Telegraph office. Call boxes are being shipped from New York and will be installed immediately upon their arrival. Would be glad to have telephones used while awaiting arrival of call boxes. Chas. K.
