THE BOY BEHIND THE GUN

Mr. and Mrs. S. F. Hosmer, who are spending the winter in Ocala and are stopping at Mrs. McGrath's, were greatly pleased yesterday to receive a letter from the commander of the U. S. warship Brooklyn, now at the Charlestown, Mass., navy yard, telling them that their only grandson, Elmer Hosmer, now at Hong Kong, had received a promotion. He was transferred from the Brooklyn to a double turreted monitor at that place. The news is the more gratifying to Mr. and Mrs. Hosmer, as this lad, with forty others, went into the training school at Newport, R. I., during the Spanish-American war. At the examination and test after sixty days' study, each of the boys had to fire a cannon at a target anchored a mile distant in the water, six shots being allowed each lad. Of the forty boys only three hit the target the first time each, while young Hosmer struck it five times out of his six shots. The result was that within three weeks after the test he was made a gunner's mate with a salary of \$1400 a year and since then has shown his fitness for higher promotion and larger pay.

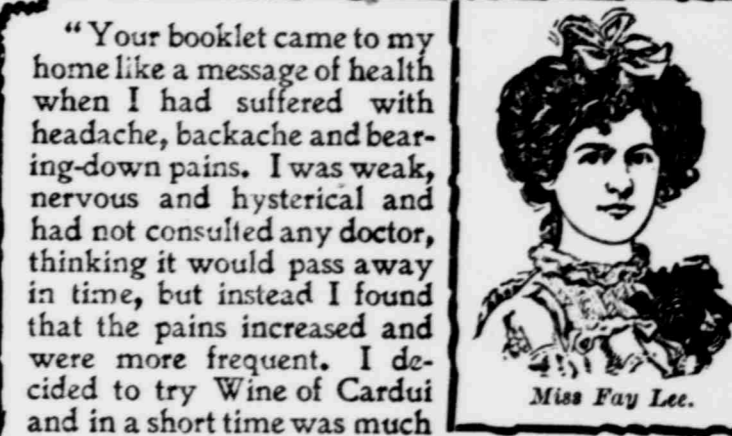
