BE HAPPY

John Ruskin began to preach the Gospel of beauty as the salt of the social order, and the cult has not wanted for votaries since. One of the strongest, sweetest voices uttering saving truths during the past few years has sounded from France, that beautiful home of the greatest lovers of beauty since the time of the Greeks. Providence has permitted France to be the leader in many of the greatest phases of human evolution, and it is now from the great metropolis of modern civilization, from "the world's heart of sophistication," from Paris, that has come a trumpet call to the life beautiful, because of its simplicity. Charles Wagner, the Alsatian pastor, whose volumes, "Youth," "Courage," "Justice" and "The Soul of Things," have been called away from the artificial, complex life of today, has recently published another book entitled "The sects and the passers-by."

"I believe," says he, "that thousands of our fellow men, suffering the consequences of an ugly life, will be grateful if we try to give expression to their discontent, and to justify the request for real naturalness, which vaguely oppresses them." Our life, our art, our literature, M. Wagner believes, suffers from the want of simplicity. It is "irrelevant, overwrought, falsely imagined." Rarely is it given us "to contemplate in line, form, or color, that simplicity allied to perfection which commands the eyes as evidence of the mind. We need to be rebaptized in the ideal purity of immortal beauty which puts its seal on the masterpieces; one shaft of its radiance is worth more than all our pompous exhibitions." Our lives are too hurried to be beautiful, he thinks, "Our children," he says, "are heirs to a joyless world. We bequeath them cares, hard questions."
