MURDER IN THE SECOND DEGREE

Ten o'clock Friday night in Sumterville court Wm. J. Lane, charged with the murder of Geo. F. Offerman, was found guilty of murder in the second degree. A big sensation was produced Saturday afternoon when counsel for defense were arguing for a new trial and introduced affidavits that Attorney Alfred Abrams for the state had employed detectives to watch the jury and that one of the jury, W. L. Baker, before the trial said defendant ought to be hanged. Counsel for state will be heard Monday and the matter will be sifted to the bottom. Lane was released on \$5000 bond to appear in court Monday.
