WAILLES' THOROUGH WORK

In Securing and Presenting Testimony to Congress Obtained Over a Million Dollars for the State of Florida

Following is the testimony given before the State Senate Judiciary Committee by the late lamented General Robert Bullock:

General Bullock's Testimony

Robert Bullock being first sworn, testified as follows:

Q. At one time you represented the Second Congressional District of the State of Florida in the congress of the United States?

A. Yes sir.

Q. During what time?

A. I was elected first in 1888, and then again in 1890, taking my seat in congress in 1891. My seat was contested, however prevailed and kept my seat.

Q. During what time did you have any communication or transactions with Mr. S. I. Wallis?

A. During my first term in congress my seat was being contested. I was almost continuously engaged in the preparations of the defense of my contest, and that consumed so much of my time, I had very little time to devote to other business. I had heard before I went to congress that Mr. Wallis had a contract with the governor of the state of Florida for the collection of Florida's Indian War Claims, and I recognized him as such.

Q. At what time did you have any communication or transactions with Mr. S. I. Wallis?

A. In fact, I could not have done this work so thoroughly without the aid of Mr. Wallis. When I had succeeded in getting a unanimous report from the committee of the house, I reported the same with the bill to the house for the calendar. The senate having previously reported the same bill, which occupied a good position on the calendar of the house, I then asked and obtained leave to substitute the senate bill for the house bill on the calendar. It being then the day of my second term I had great doubts of its being reached for action by the house and so expressed myself to Mr. Wallis, who suggested that he thought we should try and secure from the committee on rules a day for its discussion. I answered that I thought that would be a good thing, but "I am physically unable to do such work as the canvass of this house involves, but shall be glad to avail myself of your suggestion, providing you will canvass yourself as you are so well acquainted with so many of the members." That was done and a petition signed by two-thirds of the house to the committee on rules was secured, and that committee set the 17th day of December for its consideration. In this connection I want to say that all along I had the impression that Mr. Wallis had heard that the speaker being anxious to make an economical congress as possible in contrast with his predecessor, would not take so large an amount of money should be taken out of the treasury at that time. In fact, Mr. Crisp told me on one occasion that it was a very large amount of money to pay out of the treasury in its depleted condition. I then had a discussion with Mr. Crisp as to the justice of Florida's claim and its payment could not be rightfully deferred by so rich a government under any such consideration of economy. The day set by the committee on rules coming on, at least two hours was spent by the house in this discussion, with Mr. Mallory and Senator Pasco present, who aided me in the discussion. It being Saturday, a difficult day to have a quorum. A quorum was called which carried the bill to another day. I feel satisfied could a vote have been taken at that time, fully three-fourths of those present would have voted to make the senate bill a law. It will be seen that I have not mentioned among the others the presence of Senator Call, and knowing his attitude upon this question I had not sought his presence, and I had not done so because he had told me that our efforts to collect this claim would be all in vain and the time consumed in the same thrown away. But Wallis and his friends, said he will have to answer for refusing to accept \$20,000 for which the bill passed the senate and was defeated by Wallis and his friends in the house, and the state would have had that much money said he, and now they will never get a dollar. In the course of this interview with Senator Call in the senate I discovered that he knew very little about the Indian war that gave rise to this claim, as was demonstrated when I was telling him of some of the efforts and services of Col. Samuel St. George Rogers with his regiment in that war. He said to me, "I was mistaken, that Col. Rogers never had a regiment in that war. Knowing he and Rogers to have been old intimate friends, and I said to him, "Call I am astonished at you for I served personally in that war alongside of Col. Rogers on several occasions, and with various companies of his regiment, and I am astonished that you seem to know nothing about it." Hearing

WIND'S DEADLY WORK

Fierce Storms Prevail in the Mississippi Valley—Great Destruction to Life and Property
Memphis, Tenn., April 8.—High winds are still prevailing over the Mississippi valley where a cyclone last night killed eight people and did incalculable damage to property. Five deaths occurred at Aberdeen, Miss., where a crowd of people were caught under the ruins of the Illinois Central depot, which was demolished by a tornado. Five bodies have been taken from the ruins and the searching of the ruins is still in progress. The storm swept northward. Among other cities reported today are Miami, Ind.; Marion, Ill., and several towns in Butler county, Ohio. Two other deaths are reported, due to lightning.
