Beard Gets Busy as Soon as the Legislature Begins Business, but

> Doesn't Seem to Carry Much Weight

Tallahassee, April 8 .- In the senate yesterday morning that portion of Governor Gilchrist's message recommending that the anniversary of the birthday of Abraham Lincoln be made a legal holiday in Florida was the subject of a warm debate, on the motion of Senator Beard of Pensacola, tabled. The motion of the gentleman from Escambia was voted down by twenty-six to five.

Objected to Massey

An unexpected surprise was sprung during the organization of the legislature when Senator Beard questioned the eligibility of Senator L. C. Massey, of Orlando, to his seat, just as he was

taking the oath of office. The objections were on constitutional grounds but were voted down by the senate after completing its organization, and Massey was allowed his seat. He is an attorney for the state railroad commission and Beard claimed that this brought him under a constitutional class making appointees of the state inelegible to the legislature while holding such appointment.
