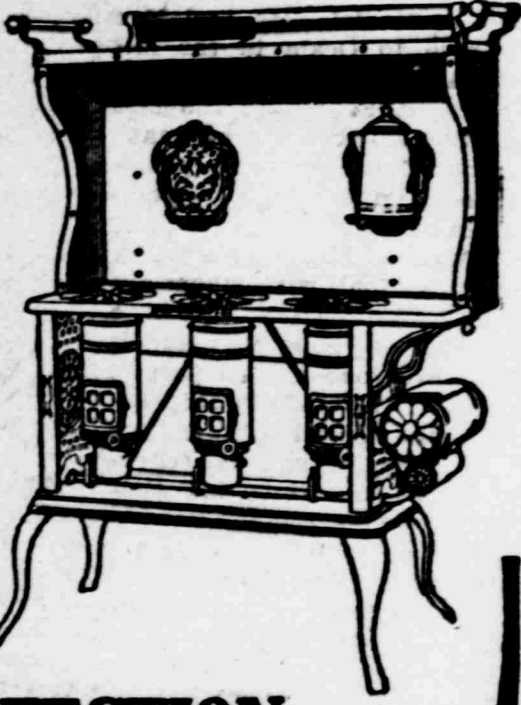

SECOND BRIGADE REUNION

Program of the Exercises to be Held in Ocala June 2nd and 3rd

Headquarters 2nd Brigade Florida Division U. C. V. Ocala, Fla., May 18, 1909. (General Orders No. 5)

1st. As per general orders No. 4, issued April 24, 1909, the 15th annual meeting and reunion of the Second Brigade, Florida Division, U. C. V., will be held in the courthouse at Ocala, Fla., Wednesday and Thursday, June 2nd and 3rd, 1909, and will convene June 2nd at 10 a. m., in which all Confederate Veterans, Daughters of the Confederacy and Sons of Veterans are cordially invited to participate.

2nd. The major general commanding the division, and brigadier generals commanding brigades, and their staff, and all past major generals, and brigadier generals of the division are especially requested to honor us with their presence and wisdom on this occasion.

3rd. Program: Music by the Metropolitan Band. Prayer by the chaplain, Major H. C. Martin.

Address of welcome by Mayor John D. Robertson, on behalf of the people of Ocala.

Address of welcome by Col. John M. Martin, of Ocala, Fla., on behalf of Marion Camp No. 56, U. C. V. Response by Brigadier General J. C. Davant of Brooksville, Fla.

Annual address. Presentation of brigade sponsor Miss Matilda R. Pasture, of Stanton, Fla., and her maid of honor, Miss Sue Anderson, of Ocala, Fla., by Brigadier General H. W. Long.

Presentation of sponsor for Dickson Chapter, U. D. C., Miss Florence Walters, and her maid of honor, Miss Grace Hatchell, both of Ocala, Fla.

Presentation of sponsor for Marion Camp No. 56, U. C. V., Miss Mary E. Burford, of Ocala, Fla.

4th. Business session of the brigade will be held at the courthouse at 3 p. m.

Thursday, June 3rd 5th. Visitors will be given a free ride in automobiles over some of Marion county's improved roads, leaving the Ocala House at 8 a. m.

6th. A business session will be held at the courthouse at 11 a. m.

7th. The members of Dickson Chapter, U. D. C., in accordance with a time-honored custom of theirs, will celebrate the anniversary of the birth of Jefferson Davis by spreading a bountiful repast in the Gary Grove for the members of Marion Camp, and on this occasion for them and all veterans attending the brigade reunion.

After all have participated, brief extemporaneous addresses will be delivered by prominent visitors in commemoration of the life of this great and good man, after which the veterans and daughters will move in procession to the monument to the memory of Marion county's Confederate dead, erected upon the public square of Ocala, which will be decorated by the daughters, after which a short reminiscence of these great men will be made by the brigadier general, and others, should time permit.

The following rates have been secured by the committee of arrangements by the hotels and boarding houses: The Ocala House, \$2 per day; the Montezuma, \$1.25; the Florida House, Arms House, and all boarding houses, \$1 per day.

The reception committee will meet the trains and furnish all useful information to delegates and visitors as they arrive.

The railroad officials of the state have been requested, and doubtless will give the usual rate of one cent per mile for round trip tickets, plus 25 cents. Tickets to be on sale June 2nd and 3rd; good until July 5th.

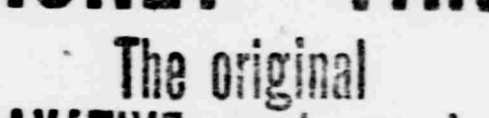
